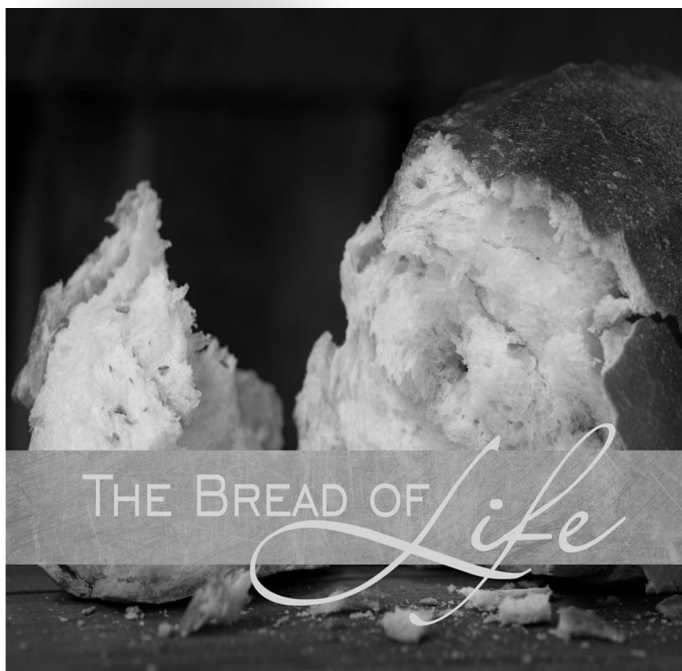

SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Baptism: For children under 5, please contact the Parish Office (273-8113) for an appointment to speak with a Priest or Deacon at least several weeks before the Baptism. For older children, contact the Office of Family Faith Formation (231-7344).

First Holy Communion: Children usually begin Religious Education studies in the First Grade and are prepared for Communion in the Second Grade. Call the Family Faith Formation Office (231-7344) to register your child the summer before the school year begins.

Confirmation: This Sacrament is currently celebrated in the Eighth Grade after 2 years of preparation. Please call the Religious Education Office (231-7344) for more information.

SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

Sacrament of the Sick: Call the Parish Office at any time to arrange for the Anointing of the Sick either at home or in the hospital.

Reconciliation: The Sacrament is celebrated every Saturday from 4:00 - 4:45 PM in the Church or by appointment.

SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

Marriage: Congratulations! Couples planning to marry should make an appointment with a Priest or Deacon at least eight (8) months in advance of the wedding to allow time for adequate preparation.

Holy Orders: Is God calling you? Call a Priest or Deacon to discern a possible vocation to the Priesthood, Diaconate or the Religious life.

DEVOTIONS

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament: Each Thursday from 12:30 PM until 5:15 PM. First Friday from 5:30 PM until 7:00 PM. Rosary after the 12:00 daily Mass.

Miraculous Medal Novena: Monday after the 12:00 Mass and First Saturday from 8:15 - 9:00 AM.

August 9, 2015—19th Sunday in Ordinary Time



Dear Friends,

"I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst" Jn

6:35. Jesus invites us to be nourished at the altar, but as in his time, so it is today that he gets easily misunderstood and interpreted according to personal likes and dislikes.

In the Bible as in life, we see our constant return to the table for the meal. That meal that we share means much more than just food. Nourishment is very important to all our bodies in order to function properly, but the food becomes only an excuse for the people to meet at the table. The food is shared; someone worked for it; someone provided it; and now that person shares it. That sharing becomes another form of spiritual nourishment: of our relationships, of our friendships, it becomes an act of self giving, an act of love. Sharing of food becomes a sharing of life. And that is why it is so important, as in biblical sense, as in our daily life. Those who don't know: how to share the meal, and don't know how to share the food, they don't know how to share the life, they don't know how to love. That is why, that sharing of the meal at home, at the friends' house, at the church, becomes source of this same communion of life and of love. It is a building factor for the family, for the friendship and for the church; as it becomes the source of communion and community with God himself. Jesus elevates that meal to the rank of the feast in heaven, where his guests will party for eternity with God himself. Let us not be surprised to hear about food, and meal, and drink in the church and at Mass, since it is most human of all human functions, and it is as well divine to have communion of life and of love with friends. As they say: ***"Tell me who your friends are and I will tell you who you are"***.

Did you read the article that Fr. Milciades wrote in the bulletin last week? See the copy on the website if you didn't; it tells of the many things that they do in his home parish. It is nice to realize that his parish is very similar to ours in being so humanly concerned about the health, and the needs of the people. I'm happy to have Fr. Milciades and Fr. Raphael with us to share their experiences, to share with us their life and the love for the Lord.

Fr. Raphael is substituting for Fr. Eden while on vacation. Hope he can write us an article about his parish experience in Haiti. Please let us express to them our gratitude for their help and service, as we are in Eucharistic Communion with them, let us be in communion of life also. God bless You always!!! Fr. Stan

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Queridos amigos.

"Yo soy el pan de vida; El que viene a mí, nunca tendrá hambre; y el que cree en mí, nunca tendrá sed." Jn 6:35. Jesús nos invita a ser alimentado en el altar, pero como en su tiempo, por lo que es hoy en día lo que es fácilmente incomprendido, y interpretado según los gustos personales y los disgustos.

En la Biblia como en la vida, vemos el constante retorno a la mesa para la cena. Esa cena que compartimos significa mucho más que alimento. La alimentación es muy importante para nuestro cuerpo para funcionar correctamente, pero la comida se convierte en sólo una excusa para las personas utilizan para reunirse en la mesa. La comida es compartir; una persona trabaja por ella; y ahora esa persona comparte de ella.

Ese compartir se convierte en otra forma de alimento espiritual: de nuestras relaciones, de nuestras amistades, se convierte en un acto de donación, un acto de amor. La distribución de alimentos se convierte en un compartir de vida. Y por eso es tan importante, como en sentido bíblico, como en nuestra vida diaria. Aquellos que no saben: Cómo compartir la comida, no saben cómo compartir la vida, no saben cómo amar.

Por eso es que, compartir la comida en nuestra casa, en casa de los amigos, en la iglesia, se convierte en fuente de esta misma comunión de vida y de amor. Es un factor de construcción de la familia, la amistad y de la iglesia; como se convierte en fuente de comunión y comunidad con Dios mismo. Jesús eleva esa comida a la categoría de la fiesta en el cielo, donde sus invitados festejaran por la eternidad con Dios mismo. No seamos sorprendidos al oír hablar de comida y comer y beber en la iglesia y en la Misa, ya que es más humana de todas las funciones humanas, y es así como tiene comunión de vida y de amor con los amigos. Como dicen: "Dime quienes son tus amigos y te diré quién eres".

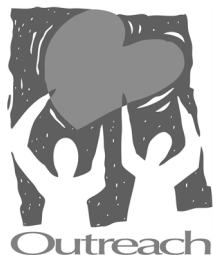

Everyone recognizes the truth of good proverbs, and so they endure from generation to generation. The Russians have a surprisingly bold one that fits this Sunday's Gospel: "Bread is the beginning of everything."
 Judging from the first reading, Elijah might have felt that it was too late for bread- too late for life itself. This great prophet was at the end of his rope and endurance. Then, not one, but two angels visit him. One offers food and drink. The other gives startling directions. For Elijah, this food from the angels is bread for his journey. On the strength of the heaven-sent gift of food, he walks to the mountain of God.

In today's Gospel, Jesus offers himself, not just as bread for the journey, but as bread for life itself. He gives his flesh as life for the world.
 "I am the bread of life" (John 6:48). He is the beginning of everything.

L'ASSUMPTION DE LA VIERGE

Le mot "**dame**" vient du Latin "**Domina**", maitresse. Comme le mot "**madame**", il était à l'origine réservé aux femmes de noble origine. L'expression "**Notre-Dame**" est par elle-même très significative de ce culte imprégné de respect, de confiance, d'affection. Le "**Notre**" souligne que la Vierge est protectrice de tout le peuple chrétien. "Nous affirmons, nous déclarons, et nous définissons comme un dogme divinement révélé que l'Immaculée Mère de Dieu, Marie toujours vierge, après avoir achevé le cours de sa vie terrestre, a été enlevé en corps et âme à la Gloire céleste." C'est par ces mots que, le 1er Novembre 1950, le pape Pie XII affirmait la foi en l'Assomption de la Vierge Marie. Le premier théoricien de cette foi de l'Eglise est Saint Grégoire de Tours VIe Siècle. Mais ce furent saint Albert Le Grand, Saint Thomas d'Equin et Saint Bonaventure qui, au XIIe Siècle, lui donnèrent ses lettres de noblesse. La fête célébrée en Occident le 15 Aout sous le Nom d' Assomption de la Vierge Marie a son origine dans celle constamment célébrée en Orient, depuis le VIe Siècle, sous le Nom de Dormition de la Vierge Marie.

Nous croyons enfin que, dans la gloire où Vous réglez, parée du soleil et couronnée d'étoiles, Vous êtes, après Jésus, la joie et l'allégresse de tous les anges et de tout les saints ; et nous, de cette terre où nous passons en pèlerins, réconfortés par la foi en la résurrection future, nous regardons vers Vous, notre vie, notre douceur, notre espérance ; attirez-nous par la suavité de votre voix, pour nous montrer un jour après notre exil, Jésus, le fruit béni de votre sein, ô clémente, ô bonne, ô douce Vierge Marie !»
