#### 19TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Dear Sisters and Brothers.

We are in the middle of summer with its family time, as children and youth are enjoying their vacation time. In that time of rest and enjoyment, our hearts naturally turn to God with a song of thanksgiving and praise. How wonderful it is when we can enjoy our family and friends. It was great to spend that time together at the pig roast, and now we approach the middle of August with the feast of Assumption of the Blessed Mother to Heaven, then we will be visited by the Cardinal Gregorio Rosa Chavez from El Salvador who is coming Saturday at 7:30 pm Mass.

Sorry for the inconvenience of the air-conditioning last weekend, but I am in Poland until 18 of August, so I could not fix it remotely, as a couple of rubber belts broke and caused the breakers to go out and so on. With it continuously operating, it needs constant monitoring and still it causes trouble at the most inconvenient moment, but that it is to help us to appreciate the fact, that we normally do not suffer extremal weather, but we have it always moderated to livable levels of heat or cold depending on season. The system itself is always running, with the blowers moving the air, heating or cooling it for our convenience. Maybe it is not perfect, but how blessed we are to have it.

This week we have the Assumption of the Blessed Mother. It is a big feast celebration in Poland, and not far from my home there is a double procession with around 100,000 plus people: first dedicated to the - falling asleep - of the Blessed Mother, and second: to Her Body and Soul being taken to heaven. If it be possible next year I would like to invite those who can for the pilgrimage to Lithuania and Poland in the footsteps of Saint Faustina and John Paul II, to visit Gdansk, where Solidarity and challenge to the Communism came from, with near by locality of Wester Platte, a place where WW II started, Auschwitz the big German concentration camp, and to attend the Assumption processions, to get the sense of Polish faith and its expression that is very much alive, even in those materialistic times.

When we talk about the dogma of the Assumption we want to remember that it was promulgated by Pope Pius XII in 1950. It states: "It is a dogma revealed by God that the Immaculate Mother of God, Mary ever Virgin, when the course of her earthly life was finished, was taken up body and soul into the glory of heaven ". That belief was in the Church for centuries, as we see no place that would claim to be the burial place of Blessed Mother. The context of that proclamation was made by the years of WW II and the general disregard for the human life for the sake of Communism, Fascism, Nazism, the ideologies that consumed millions of human lives. The dogma of the Assumption, pointed up to the dignity of the Blessed Mother, but as well to the dignity of every human being by its call to the glory of heaven, and the infinity of the gift of life that can't be limited by the shortness of it here on earth. The Blessed Mother is already in heaven with her body and soul, the reality that we will experience after the resurrection on the last day, that it will be at the beginning of new times after the last judgment.

In the readings of this Sunday we perceive the fascination with the presence of God in the powers of nature, that seem to be close expressions of that presence, yet we have to discover that God is much more present in faith and love than in any particular force of nature. God is above creation and nature, God is a gentle dispenser of life, patient observer of human choices, most manifested in Love and Mercy.

No doubt that the one that commands: winds, earthquakes, fire, and water is in charge of all creation and above it; and Peter liked to experience it for the sake of fun, but believing in God's power one would stand above the power of nature and even of life and death. If we would contemplate the powers of nature of the world and of the universe, it will lead us to God's glory, as we will see that God ordered it effortlessly, just with his creative power of his Word. No wonder children are fascinated with super powers, too bad that as adults we have lost that capacity to wonder and see the powers of nature and of God himself.

Let's contemplate the greatness of God in the beauty of the earth and its creation, and let him speak to us in the gentle breeze.

God bless everyone !!! See you next weekend at Mass.

The generosity of the parishioners of St. Anne Parish allows us to reach out to people in our Brentwood/Bay Shore neighborhood who struggle every day to make ends meet. Our pantry shelves are *very sparsely filled*. If each parishioner brought in one non-perishable food item, it would help us to feed the hungry in our community.

Thank you to all who donate to our food pantry. During July 2017, we were happy to assist 142 families, 28 seniors, 201 adults and 160 children. We also helped 11 new families.

Here are some items our pantry needs this month: soup, Goya beans, cereal, jelly, juices, pasta, sauce, rice, toilet paper, tissues, paper towels, shampoo, conditioner, body wash, soap, deodorant, toothpaste, shaving cream, disposable razors, diapers (size 4 & 5), baby wipes, feminine hygiene products, pet food and laundry detergent.

We are requesting school supplies for the school year 2017-2018. The supply list is always very extensive: composition notebooks, #2 Ticonderoga pencils, pencil sharpeners, pens, crayons, glue, glue sticks, Fiscar scissors, highlighters, dry erase markers, thin washable markers, rulers, 3x5 ruled index cards, pencil cases, 1"and 2" binders, loose leaf paper, 2-pocket folders (laminated or plastic), lunch bags and backpacks.

There are boxes in our church near the statue of St. Anne for you to drop off your donated items.







#### ASSOMPTION DE MARIE

Les Saintes Ecritures ne disent rien a propos de l'Assomption de Marie. Cependant, le chapitre 12 du livre de l'Apocalypse parle d'une femme prise dans une bataille entre le bien et le mal. Plusieurs voit en cette femme, le Peuple de Dieu, le nouvel Israël ou Marie, la mère de Jésus. Dans ce cas, Marie assurerait le passage entre le peuple élu et l'Eglise de son Fils. Le récit de la Visitation l'illustre a sa manière. Tel est le secret de l'Assomption: sa foi et son humilité lui valent d'être proclamer bienheureuse par toute les générations.

Quelle est l'origine de cette fête? L' Assomption de Marie a été célébrée au Sixième siècle a Jérusalem ou se trouvait une église de la Dormition. Elle était célébrée en Egypte le 18 Janvier. C'est l'Empereur de Constantinople, Maurice (585-603), qui a impose la date du 15 Aout pour la fête de la Dormition. La fête est arrivée a Rome au septième siècle. Grégoire de Tours, vers 594, a donne la première formulation théologique de l'Assomption. La doctrine de l'Assomption a été confirmée par les grands théologiens du treizième siècle Thomas d'Aquin, Saint Bonaventure et autres.
