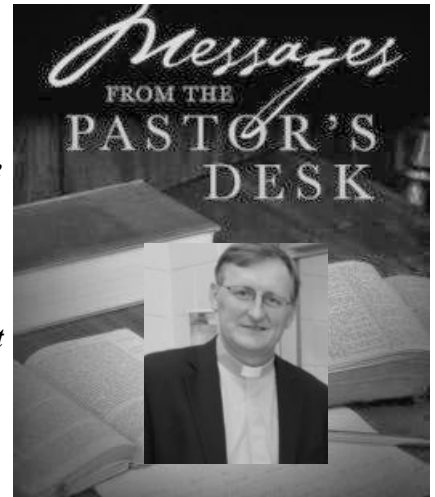

4th Sunday of Advent

Dear Sisters and Brothers.

This 4th Sunday of Advent is already at the door of Christmas. The Gospel tells us that Mary went to serve her cousin Elisabeth. Helping with the baby John the Baptist, prepared herself for her own motherhood. Her desire to serve others never stopped manifesting itself in her attentiveness to others. So it continues in the Church until today. Mary always sees what is good for others, and calls on her Son to respond to people's needs. Or She herself brings Christ with her, as She did in the Gospel today. Jesus in Mary's womb affects John the Baptist in St Elizabeth's womb. How profound is that encounter. Yet how much more will Christ bring when he grows up? How much He and His Mother can do together? Only in Heaven we will see the magnitude of that cooperation. How dependent we are on all, that Blessed Mother and Jesus did for us, and how John the Baptist affected the world by offering his life as a witness to Jesus.



Today, as we are two days from Christmas, we could say that Mary and Joseph are already on the way to Bethlehem, the town of David. Riding on a donkey, they are ever closer to their destination, to the grotto of Bethlehem, where in manger, dry hay is waiting to accommodate the Savior of the world, Christ the Lord. Here I want to share with you the poem written about Christ, called: "One Solitary Life"

"Here is a man who was born in an obscure village, the child of a peasant woman. He grew up in another village. He worked in a carpenter shop until He was thirty. Then for three years He was an itinerant preacher. He never owned a home. He never wrote a book. He never held an office. He never had a family. He never went to college. He never put His foot inside a big city. He never traveled two hundred miles from the place He was born. He never did one of the things that usually accompany greatness. He had no credentials but Himself... While still a young man, the tide of popular opinion turned against him. His friends ran away. One of them denied Him. He was turned over to His enemies. He went through the mockery of a trial. He was nailed upon a cross between two thieves. While He was dying His executioners gambled for the only piece of property He had on earth – His coat. When He was dead, He was laid in a borrowed grave through the pity of a friend. Nineteen long centuries have come and gone, and today He is a centerpiece of the human race and leader of the column of progress. I am far within the mark when I say that all the armies that ever marched, all the navies that were ever built; all the parliaments that ever sat and all the kings that ever reigned, put together, have not affected the life of man upon this earth as powerfully as has that one solitary life."

We could add many things that Jesus didn't do, to the list we read, but they only increase His greatness as we come to the conclusion that He accomplished our salvation without any of our comforts and helps. He never went by bus to the school, never spoke English nor Spanish. He never went to Mc Donald, never ate at Burger King. He never owned a bicycle, He never finished a high school. He never had a driving license, or drove a car. He never owned a cellphone nor laptop. He never went to movies nor watched the TV. He never seen a highway, nor traveled by airplane, he never had a watch.

Yet, He was always on time, always did the good thing, always did the will of his Father, and ultimately saved every person in the universe. Let us wonder with the Shepherds what was said about this Child.

Luego, durante tres años, fue un predicador Itinerante. Nunca fue dueño de una casa. Nunca escribió un libro. Nunca tuvo una oficina. Nunca tuvo una familia. Nunca fue a la universidad. Nunca puso su pie dentro de una gran ciudad. Nunca viajo docenitas millas Desde el lugar donde nació. Nunca hizo una de las cosas que suelen Acompañar a la grandeza. No tenia credenciales, pero a si mismo... Mientras aun era un hombre joven, la opinión popular se volvio contra el. Sus amigos se escaparon. Uno de ellos lo negó. Fue entregado a sus Enemigos. Paso por la burla de un juicio. Fue clavado en una cruz entre Dos ladrones. Mientras moría, sus verdugos apostaron por la única propiedad

Que tenia en la tierra: su abrigo. Cuando murió, fue puesto en una Tumba prestada por la compasión de un amigo. Diecinueve largos Siglos han llegado y se han ido, y hoy El es una pieza central de la raza Humana y líder de la columna del progreso.

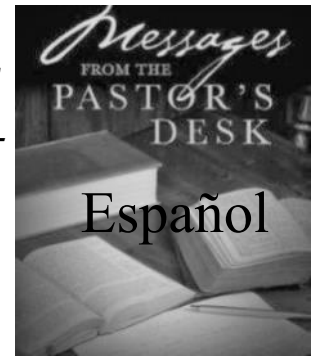

El nunca tuvo una licencia de conducir, o condujo un coche. Nunca tuvo un teléfono celular ni una computadora portátil. Nunca fue al cine ni miro la televisión. Nunca vio una carretera, ni viajo en avión, nunca tuvo un reloj. Sin embargo, El siempre estuvo a tiempo, siempre hizo las cosas buenas, siempre hizo la voluntad de su Padre y, en ultima instancia, salvo a cada persona en el universo. 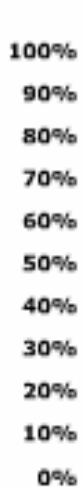

Lucas 1:39-45

CAMINO DEL ADVIENTO

Pero este hermoso Himno se quedaría corto si no hacemos trascender nuestras palabras a los hechos...” María se quedó con ella (Isabel) tres meses y después se volvió a casa”, buenos deseos acompañado de buenas acciones.
