Third Sunday of Easter

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

With the Easter celebrations, I hope that we all get closer to the Lord. Remember, that the Easter Season extends to Pentecost, and it is precisely to give us time to process the magnitude of events that happen during Holy Week.

Participating in the celebrations, we need to give as well some personal time, to let what we have celebrated sink into our life's experiences. I am very grateful to all the participants of liturgies, the decorators, to those who helped to clean and put things in order. I thank everyone without exception for all the collaboration and service given. If we all put our little talent into good use for others, it becomes a mosaic of a masterpiece as it happened at Christmas, and now for Easter. After seeing all the material signs of celebration, each one of us needs to make it his own, by contemplating the meaning of it all.



Why Jesus did what he did ??? And now, why we do what we do ??? And, what do I need to do to be in harmony with my faith ??? Jesus did what he did, how does that affect me today ??? SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Baptism: For children under 5, please contact the Parish Office (273-8113) for an appointment to speak with a Priest or Deacon at least several weeks before the Baptism. For older children, contact the Office of Family Faith Formation (231-7344).

First Holy Communion: Children usually begin Religious Education studies in the First Grade and are prepared for Communion in the Second Grade. Call the Family Faith Formation Office (231-7344) to register your child the summer before the school year begins.

Confirmation: This Sacrament is currently celebrated in the Eighth Grade after 2 years of preparation. Please call the Religious Education Office (231-7344) for more information.

SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

Sacrament of the Sick: Call the Parish Office at any time to arrange for the Anointing of the Sick either at home or in the hospital.

Reconciliation: The Sacrament is celebrated every Saturday from 4:00 - 4:45 PM in the Church or by appointment.

SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

Marriage: Congratulations! Couples planning to marry should make an appointment with a Priest or Deacon at least eight (8) months in advance of the wedding to allow time for adequate preparation.

Holy Orders: Is God calling you? Call a Priest or Deacon to discern a possible vocation to the Priesthood, Diaconate or the Religious life.

ITINERARY

Day 1 Depart JFK for Venice

Day 2 This afternoon we arrive in Venice and transfer to our hotel by late-afternoon. You will have a short period of free time before our welcome dinner.

Day 3 We make a pilgrimage to St. Anthony's burial site and Basilica in the morning, where we will also have Mass. Afterwards, we will visit the medieval Scrovegni Chapel, adorned with priceless masterpieces by Giotto. Late afternoon shopping before we return to the hotel for dinner.

Day 4 Today we explore Venice, with the highlights being St. Mark's Basilica, St. Mark's Square, the Rialto Bridge and walks along the magnificent canals. There will be time for shopping in the mid-afternoon along with an optional excursion to the island of Murano to view and purchase world-famous Murano glass.

Day 5 We leave for Milan, where upon arrival we will stop at the Milan Cathedral and the monastery of Santa Maria Delle Grazie, where we will view Da Vinci's world-famous painting of the "Last Supper" (ONLY THE FIRST 20 PEOPLE TO SIGN UP CAN BE GUARANTEED A TICKET). Late afternoon shopping among the exclusive shops around the Cathedral.

Day 6 Departing Milan for Athens, we will have a panoramic tour including Hadrian's Gate, the Ancient Agora and the Roman Catholic Cathedral of Athens before checking into our hotel.

Day 7 Today is devoted to exploring Athens, including the Acropolis and it's ancient Parthenon. After a tour of the affiliated museum, we continue to Mars Hill, where St. Paul preached of the "Unknown God" the ancient Greeks had been taught to recognize and Syntagma Square, the heart of the capital city. We will have some time late in the afternoon for shopping at the outdoor market.

Day 8 We visit the Corinth Canal and the ancient city of Corinth to view the Temple of Apollo, the Agora (market) and Bema Seat before taking in the areas where Paul preached the "Good News" to the Corinthians.

Day 9 Setting sail for a one day cruise, we will choose from a variety of options depending upon the ultimate size of the group and availability. Among the possibilities are a stop in Hydra to see its cobblestone alleys unique architecture and donkeys that still provide public transportation and Aegina to see its pistachio groves and the majestic Temple of Aphaea and the Byzantine monastery of Agios Nektarios.

Day 10 Depart Athens for JFK.

TERCER DOMINGO DE PASCUA B (Tomado de Catholic.Net)

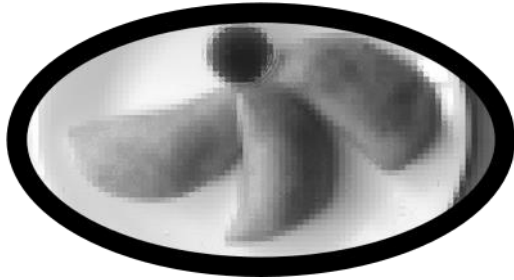
El núcleo del mensaje de este tercer domingo pascual lo encontramos en el evangelio. Las profecías debían cumplirse. Es decir, todo aquello que había sido escrito en la ley y Moisés acerca del Mesías, acerca de sus sufrimientos y de su muerte, debía tener cabal cumplimiento en Cristo (Ev). En la primera lectura Pedro muestra la continuidad entre el Dios de Abraham, el Dios de Issac, el Dios de Jacob y el Dios que ha glorificado a Jesús. Ninguna ruptura entre las promesas hechas por Dios y la realidad actual; por el contrario: un cumplimiento cabal y perfecto del plan de Dios, de su pacto de amor con los hombres llevado hasta el amor extremo (1L). Gracias a la muerte de Jesús y a su resurrección tenemos el perdón de los pecados. Él es propiciación por nuestros pecados nos dice san Juan en la segunda lectura (1L). Allí donde se anuncie el misterio de Cristo, el misterio de su muerte y su resurrección, debe anunciarse el perdón de los pecados y la necesidad de la conversión. Así, pues, nos encontramos ante un mensaje con una doble valencia: por una parte el gozo de saber que todas las profecías se han cumplido en Cristo Jesús, en su muerte y su resurrección; por otra parte, la necesidad de arrepentimiento y conversión por nuestros pecados

Témoins de la Parole

Frères et sœurs, le dernier mot de l'évangile que nous venons d'entendre est celui de « témoins ». C'est un thème sur lequel saint Luc revient souvent, en recourant à deux termes différents : le premier, employé une seule fois, consiste à simplement rendre compte, c'est le témoignage visuel ; et le deuxième, très fréquent, qui évoque un engagement personnel allant jusqu'au don de la vie, c'est le martyre. C'est le terme employé ici, et tout au long des Actes des Apôtres, sans doute parce que c'est le service que Jésus attend de ses disciples au lendemain de la résurrection. Quel est alors ce témoignage que Jésus attend aujourd'hui de chacun de nous, et qui soit donc à notre portée ? Il repose sur l'Écriture. Ce qui établit le témoignage pascal des disciples sur des bases solides, c'est la une double expérience: celle de la Parole et celle du repas. En s'ajoutant à sa manifestation visible, la parole du Ressuscité ouvre aux disciples le sens des Écritures. Un va-et-vient s'instaure ainsi entre l'écoute de la Parole et l'action des croyants, entre célébration et la pratique quotidienne. Dans l'épître, Saint Jean formule ainsi cette polarité: " En celui qui garde fidèlement sa parole, l'amour de Dieu atteint la perfection."

Frères et sœurs, je voudrais vous poser une question. Je suis sûr que vous ouvrez plusieurs fois par jour votre courrier électronique ? Pour prendre des nouvelles des uns et des autres. Faites-vous de même avec votre bible ?

Pas sûr ! Alors je vous propose un engagement, celui d'ouvrir votre bible au moins une fois chaque jour dès lors que vous ouvrez votre courrier électronique : parce que Dieu et Jésus sont vos amis, qu'ils voudraient eux aussi de vos nouvelles et que vous sachiez ce qu'ils deviennent. Et vous verrez que vous finirez par leur rendre témoignage.
