

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Last Saturday we had celebrated our Confirmation for our youth and we were very blessed with the presence of Archbishop Bernardito Auza, who is serving as a Permanent Observer of the Holy See to United Nations. He reminded our young people who were being confirmed, that they are all invited to take more responsibility in the service of the church as: Lectors, Altar Servers, as Readers and Ushers, they can help to teach younger kids and much more.



I want to invite all of our confirmed youth to participation in our Youth Group. Our Youth Group meets on Friday evenings from 7:00p.m. till 9:00p.m. It will be very vital for their faith to continue their formation in our Youth Group. It would be the right thing to do for all of our confirmation classes and I hope they will follow my advice. As a parish we want them to continue to grow in faith and to find a way to serve the Lord by serving in the community of the church. Our happiness in life comes from our capacity to share our life with others.

I want to thank Bertha, our Deacons and all of our teachers in our Religious Education Office and program for all of their dedication and service. Now in June we have already started registration for upcoming the year for all classes in Faith Formation programs. We all need to grow in faith during our whole lifetime, because life is always challenging at every stage of our life, and without faith it would be very difficult to face life itself.

In the Gospel we find Jesus always challenged and put to the test. Could our life be different from his? In today's Gospel we see Jesus life affected by the opinion of other people and it is not only Jesus, but his whole family that was affected by it. As the Gospel mentions: his cousins and his mother came looking for him because people were saying that he went out of his mind.

When Jesus is made aware of their presence, He makes this most beautiful statement, about doing God's will, by saying: - who is my mother? who are my brothers? but the one who does the will of my Heavenly Father. Apparently he ignores them, but actually he exults them. Jesus did not complain about why people would say such things about him, or he refuses calling attention just to human goodness of his family, but he points out to the essence of why they are there - that is: their love for Jesus and for God, as they were fully focused on doing God's will in their lives.

That totally focused attention given to God's will, was the fruits of their total humility before God and before men. Jesus pointed out to why his family was so kind and loving so that they would look out for him. Because it is God's will, that those who are family of Jesus should be concerned about the well-being of Jesus. So as Jesus points out - all those who care about him are his family, - and here is the place where everyone is invited. Are you a family of Jesus? Do you care about Jesus? Is He as close to you as your family members? Here each one of us needs to answer this question in the depths of our heart - is Jesus my family to me? Is He a member of my household? Isn't that a special question? Isn't that a must answer question??? Because it is all about: - US - Jesus and me - for each one of us. Let that family connection be our main concern of our lives. Am I God's Family???

Again I want to thank everyone for being concerned about the family of our parish, by being involved in our parish missionary activity of 5th encounter, as well as all those that are concerned about in any other activities of our Parish Family. I thank as well all who support material responsibility for the buildings and property of our parish. It all comes to serving and honoring God in our lives. SACRAMENTAL INFORMATION ST. ANNE'S PARISH

SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Baptism: For children under 5, please contact the Parish Office (273-8113) for an appointment to speak with a Priest or Deacon at least several weeks before the Baptism. For older children, contact the Office of Family Faith Formation (231-7344).

First Holy Communion: Children usually begin Religious Education studies in the First Grade and are prepared for Communion in the Second Grade. Call the Family Faith Formation Office (231-7344) to register your child the summer before the school year begins.

Confirmation: This Sacrament is currently celebrated in the Eighth Grade after 2 years of preparation. Please call the Religious Education Office (231-7344) for more information.

SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

Sacrament of the Sick: Call the Parish Office at any time to arrange for the Anointing of the Sick either at home or in the hospital.

Reconciliation: The Sacrament is celebrated every Saturday from 4:00 - 4:45 PM in the Church or by appointment.

SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

Marriage: Congratulations! Couples planning to marry should make an appointment with a Priest or Deacon at least eight (8) months in advance of the wedding to allow time for adequate preparation.

Holy Orders: Is God calling you? Call a Priest or Deacon to discern a possible vocation to the Priesthood, Diaconate or the Religious life. DEVOTIONS

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament: Each Thursday from 12:30 PM until 5:15 PM. First Friday from 5:30 PM until 7:00 PM. Rosary after the 12:00 daily Mass.

Miraculous Medal Novena: Monday after the 12:00 Mass and First Saturday from 8:15 - 9:00 AM.



June 8, 2018 Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus

Dear Brother Priests:

On this Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, I would like to thank you for living your priesthood with authentic Christ-centered holiness.

Holiness, Pope Francis reminds us in his Apostolic Exhortation *Guadete et Exsultate*, is the most attractive face of the Church. Furthermore, it is holiness which has and always will form the bedrock of *dramatic missionary growth*.

When speaking of holiness as it appears in the parish family, Pope Francis reminds us of gospel stories, images and parables that focus us on a contemplative and evangelizing attention to the details of charity and mercy. He states:

Let us not forget that Jesus asked his disciples to pay attention to details.

The little detail that wine was running out at a party.

The little detail that one sheep was missing.

The little detail of noticing the widow who offered her two small coins.

The little detail of having spare oil for the lamps, should the bridegroom delay.

The little detail of asking the disciples how many loaves of bread they had.

The little detail of having a fire burning and a fish cooking as he waited for the disciples at daybreak.

Pope Francis encourages us and our parishioners to bring this contemplative and evangelizing attention to detail directly into parish life and directly into the parish evangelization mission that occurs outside our parish churches and campuses but is stoked there.

A community that cherishes the little details of love, whose members care for one another and create an open and evangelizing environment, is a place where the risen Lord is present, sanctifying it in accordance with the Father's plan. There are times when, by a gift of the Lord's love, we are granted, amid these little details, consoling experiences of God.

I want to thank you for caring for those little details. So often focus is placed on the public and pronounced gestures of the priesthood, while the attention you pay to the little details goes unseen.

Thank you for noticing the little details of your parish communities:

The detail of knowing the heat needs fixing.

The detail of making sure the snow gets shoveled.

The detail of calling a brother priest when he is in need.

The detail of thanking a married couple for the witness of their marriage and family as they celebrate a marriage anniversary.

The detail of gently encouraging a vocation to the priesthood.

The detail of attending games, plays, and parish functions.

The detail of realizing a parishioner has been missing from daily Mass.

The detail of being faithful to spiritual direction and frequent confession so that we can be ever wiser spiritual guides and compassionate confessors.

The detail of following up with a family that has experienced a tragedy.

The detail of praying silently before the Blessed Sacrament early in the morning and at night.

By paying attention to these little details, we not only grow in holiness, but we reflect the face of Christ. Thank you for reminding people through your priesthood that they are loved and cherished by God and that no detail of their lives is unimportant to Him.

On June 23rd, Deacon Leo Song will be ordained to the Priesthood of Jesus Christ. Please keep Deacon Leo Song and his family in your prayers.

Please continue to pray that more men will respond to the call to be priests. Pray also that more women would answer God's call to be holy religious sisters. Just as devotion to our Blessed Mother always brings us closer to Jesus Christ, I know so many of us were brought closer to the priesthood through the inspiration of religious sisters.

May the Immaculate Heart of Mary always keep you close to the sanctifying and sacred heart of her Son. In His heart, we will always find healing, transformation, holiness, and the foundation for *dramatic missionary growth*.

SAGRADO CORAZON DE JESUS

Algo de historia. La devoción al Sagrado Corazón tiene su origen el las apariciones del mismo a Sta. Margarita María de Alacoque el 27 de diciembre de 1673 en Paray-le-Monial (Francia) hasta 1690, año de su muerte. En los Padres de la Iglesia (S. Ambrosio, S. Juan Crisóstomo...S. Agustín) encontramos innumerables textos que refieren al corazón abierto de Cristo como aquel del cual "recibimos los Sacramentos de la Iglesia", recientemente esto lo recoge "la más actualizada" devoción a Jesús que llamamos "Divina Misericordia".

A cerca de las "devociones". Con estas pasa como con la Trinidad, se adora a Dios como Padre, Hijo o E.S., único Dios, cuando se invoca a una de las Personas; igual suceda con la Virgen María, cuando se le llama "de Fátima" o "de Lourdes"...por lo mismo, no hay devoción mejor, no se le ama más por títulos dados a Dios, a María o a Jesús (Sagrado Corazón vs. Divina Misericordia), más bien, el culto que Dios quiere es uno "en Espíritu y en Verdad" (Jn 4, 19ss). También podemos aplicar el ejemplo a la Fe, siguiendo a Santiago que contrapone que una fe sin obras, es una fe vacía (Sntgo. 2:14ss).

Aprovechando este espacio. Saludar al P. Eden que recientemente estuvo de "manteles largos" y también al P. Charlince que se incorporara prontamente a nuestra Parroquia, a ambos abundantes bendiciones en su labor pastoral. 










