

Fourth Sunday of Lent

Dear Sisters and Brothers

We passed the middle of Lent, today it is the 4th Sunday and on the 6th Sunday it will be Palm Sunday and Holy Week. With the winter and spring weather mingling together, we are reminded that, it is in God's hands that the change of seasons lies. So it is in God's grace, that the fruitfulness of Lent will be revealed in us, as much as we collaborate with it.



On Monday we could sense Jesus presence in the midst of our youth retreat for the Confirmation class, as Tony Bellizzi brought the Gospel message to our youth connecting with their world in very practical ways. Tony will be directing our Youth Ministry beginning from June 1st, and we hope to offer more opportunities for our youth to grow in their faith, before and after Confirmation.

Let's humbly discern, where we can grow in our faith and in our commitment to Christ and to the Church. It all goes together; faith and services, theory and practice.

Coming Saturday on the 17th of March we will have our day of prayer and reflection at the Seminary on the Eucharist and the service at the liturgy. Hopefully it will inspire all of us who assists with the liturgy, to be more prayerful and less distracting, so that everyone would perceive and receive more of Jesus. This week and the next we have the discussions on the book we all read - "Perfectly Yourself" - how it impacted each one of us. On Friday, March 16th, there is the All Night Adoration offered in our Chapel from 9pm to 5am, coordinated by Greg Florentino. Than next Sunday March 18th, it is the Healthy Sunday served to us by Buddhist Tzu Chi Foundation; with doctors, dentists, physical therapist, free haircut, and more. Stop by to share in what is offered to us. On that afternoon of the March 18th, Sunday, at 3:00 p.m., we will show a movie about St Philip Neri - a happy saint, with subtitles. So let us participate in any of the events, and let us draw inspiration and strength from what we receive and than, what we give in return in service. If in the Holy Week and Easter, Jesus gives himself to us, so in the Lent we should be finding new ways to give ourselves to Jesus.

As we read in the readings for this Sunday, God causes even pagans to fulfill his plans. So through pagans he purified his people in exile, and then released them back from slavery to rebuild the temple in Jerusalem. As St. Paul says: - *God is rich in mercy, and because his great love for us, he loved us even when we were sinners, He brought us back to life through Christ Jesus. By his grace we have been saved.* Let us than nourish ourselves at the table of Christ with the fruits of his love.

As Jesus said to Nicodemus: - *God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him, might have eternal life* - How powerful is that declaration made by Christ himself. How much have we experienced that love??? How much have we been touched by that love ??? Or, how untouched and indifferent we have been towards that love ??? Jesus keeps coming to us, asking us for a gesture of friendship and love, for an act of kindness and generosity, for an act of sacrifice and mercy. -God is rich in mercy - as Saint Paul experienced, and now he invites us into the range of it, to be saved by God's grace.

SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Baptism: For children under 5, please contact the Parish Office (273-8113) for an appointment to speak with a Priest or Deacon at least several weeks before the Baptism. For older children, contact the Office of Family Faith Formation (231-7344).

First Holy Communion: Children usually begin Religious Education studies in the First Grade and are prepared for Communion in the Second Grade. Call the Family Faith Formation Office (231-7344) to register your child the summer before the school year begins.

Confirmation: This Sacrament is currently celebrated in the Eighth Grade after 2 years of preparation. Please call the Religious Education Office (231-7344) for more information.

SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

Sacrament of the Sick: Call the Parish Office at any time to arrange for the Anointing of the Sick either at home or in the hospital.

Reconciliation: The Sacrament is celebrated every Saturday from 4:00 - 4:45 PM in the Church or by appointment.

SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

Marriage: Congratulations! Couples planning to marry should make an appointment with a Priest or Deacon at least eight (8) months in advance of the wedding to allow time for adequate preparation. **Holy Orders:** Is God calling you? Call a Priest or Deacon to discern a possible vocation to the Priesthood, Diaconate or the Religious life. DEVOTIONS





CUARTO DOMINGO DE CUARESMA

"Alégrate, Jerusalén (Laetare, Jerusalén) ...es el versículo de la introducción de la Misa (Is 66). La liturgia viene marcada por la Alegría ante la proximidad de la Pascua, la Iglesia usa el color Rosado (similar al tercero de Adviento). Este Domingo nos invita a ver más allá de la triste realidad del pecado y centrarnos en la Misericordia divina. Las posibilidades de las lecturas son variadas, las propias del ciclo B, o las alternativas del ciclo A para el RICA. Una breve reflexión de los Evangelios a continuación. En la primera opción, Jn 3, 14-21, sobresale el v. 16: "Porque

tanto amo Dios al mundo que le entrego a su Hijo único, para que todo el crea en el no perezca...", gozo inmenso que hay que celebrar siempre. La segunda opción es Jn 9, 1-41. Aquí resalta la figura de un ciego de nacimiento...ciegos lo hemos sido todos alguna vez, o pecadores somos siempre, pero tanto para los ciegos como para los pecadores existe la posibilidad de la curación, sanación que es más espiritual que física, la segunda en el Evangelio solo tuvo sentido para despertar la fe, nosotros que "ya tenemos la fe", necesitamos de la sanación interior que nos lleve a sobre llevar las dificultades de la vida y afrontar muchas veces las consecuencias de nuestros pecados. Un símil con la piscina del Evangelio, lo son los sacramentos del Bautismo y la Reconciliación, uno "hace cristianos", el otro "restituye a los cristianos", ambos motivos también de alegría a la cual hace referencia la Liturgia de hoy. Buen Domingo a todos.






