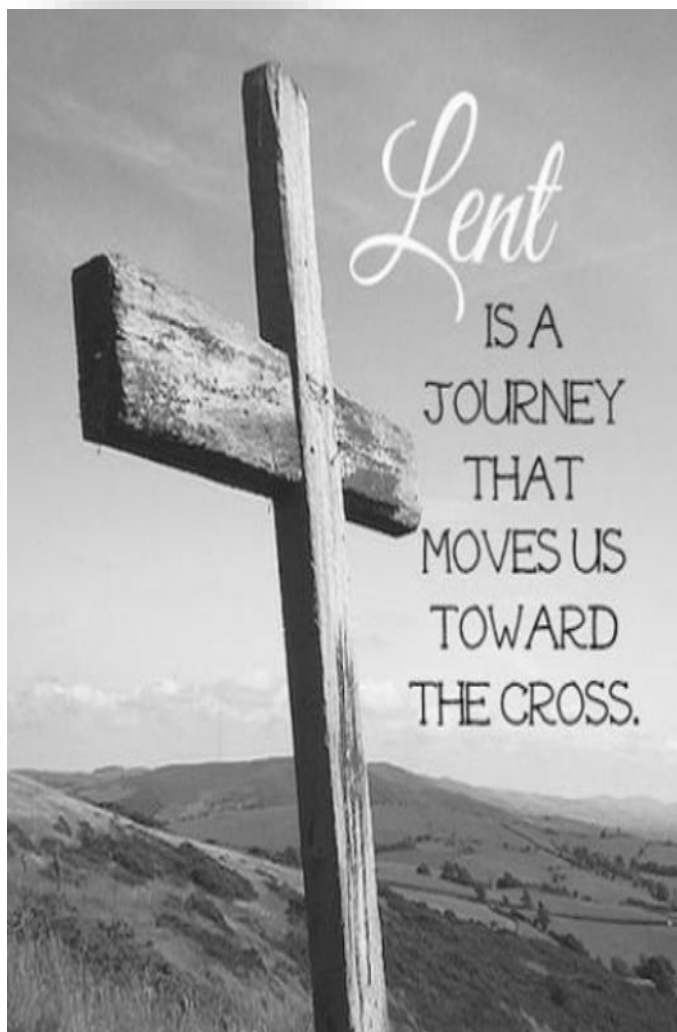

Fifth Sunday of Lent

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

The winter keeps coming back at us and we try to deal with it the best we can, trying to be safe. Some trees branches broke here and there, snow will remain around for some days, classes were canceled, some other problems of power shortages etc. it all shows our vulnerability and dependence on the Lord. We are not the drivers, we are just passengers on this journey of life. We try to make the best of it, the time is limited.

In the past two weeks I did anoint three persons, who within a few days passed away. It was so fast to see them move from here to there. Just matters of days, no matter how old they were, but it was so fast.

Our Lent it is our preparation time for Easter, and Easter it is our preparation time for Resurrection of Jesus, but as well for our own resurrection, and ultimately for the end of the world, and a Second Coming of Christ. Easter, is our new life with Christ, and it doesn't matter that we are still here on earth, or we be in heaven. Come Lord Jesus !!!

Much is happening this weekend; on Friday our Neocatechumenal Way went on weekend retreat and we will meet them on Saturday in the Seminary on our Day of Prayer for all those involved in our Liturgical Ministries.

On Sunday is our Healthy Sunday, and in the afternoon we will show the St. Philip Neri interesting and spiritual movie. Liturgically, this Saturday is St Patrick's Feast Day, and on Monday, the 19th of March is the Feast of St Joseph, the husband of Mary. These are big Saints that affected, and continue to build up the faith of the Church. As now we learned, that Archbishop Romero will be canonized in near future, so we see how our Saints are for us an examples of life, our guides and our friends, as they are very much alive before the Lord, and continue to intercede for us.

We live in times that need to be more open to the knowledge of our Saints, as media through its omni presence bombard us with all other information and marketing, that is appealing to our worldly matters and don't promote the vision of faith. We ourselves have to be aware of it, and consciously we need to make choices for our faith and for God in our lives.

Experiencing the power of God in our lives is the way to live our lives. It is very consoling to experience God's love through Christ. But to make that experience we need to follow the lead from the Gospel today. - Some Greeks asked Philip - Sir, we would like to see Jesus - , then Philip went and told Andrew; then Andrew and Philip went and told Jesus. - Jesus answered them with a parable, referring to his upcoming suffering and death calling it - the hour of his glory. Jesus could have said to them: - sure , invite them for a dinner, we talk, we exchange ideas, let them hang out with us, let them have fun, and Jesus did plenty of those human things with people, but Jesus did not draw attention to himself. Instead, he continued to point up to heaven, to the reality of eternal life, to his relationship with God the Father, to the need to serve, to be involved and bring the fruits, to be ready to lose oneself for the sake of the Lord.

This short passage of the Gospel, is so rich with the essence of what Jesus has to teach all of us about heaven and earth, then he says something about himself that is ultimately highest point of his, human - divine love for humanity: *-And when I am lifted up from the earth, I will draw everyone to myself-* How humble Jesus is in bringing God The Father to our attention? , and how humbly Jesus talks about the Crucifixion admitting his fear of it? , and only then, *-He will draw all to himself.* What is Jesus really trying to say to those Greeks ???

It was a quick catechetical class, about discipleship, about leadership, about heaven and earth coming together and meeting on the Cross. This is what Jesus let's the Greeks see. Will they believe ??? Will they ask for the sign, the miracles ??? , and then walk away ???, or will they risk everything to win even more ??? Are you with the Greeks ??? or are you with Christ all the way???

God bless everyone !!!

SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Baptism: For children under 5, please contact the Parish Office (273-8113) for an appointment to speak with a Priest or Deacon at least several weeks before the Baptism. For older children, contact the Office of Family Faith Formation (231-7344).

First Holy Communion: Children usually begin Religious Education studies in the First Grade and are prepared for Communion in the Second Grade. Call the Family Faith Formation Office (231-7344) to register your child the summer before the school year begins.

Confirmation: This Sacrament is currently celebrated in the Eighth Grade after 2 years of preparation. Please call the Religious Education Office (231-7344) for more information.

SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

Sacrament of the Sick: Call the Parish Office at any time to arrange for the Anointing of the Sick either at home or in the hospital.

Reconciliation: The Sacrament is celebrated every Saturday from 4:00 - 4:45 PM in the Church or by appointment.

SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

Marriage: Congratulations! Couples planning to marry should make an appointment with a Priest or Deacon at least eight (8) months in advance of the wedding to allow time for adequate preparation.

Holy Orders: Is God calling you? Call a Priest or Deacon to discern a possible vocation to the Priesthood, Diaconate or the Religious life.

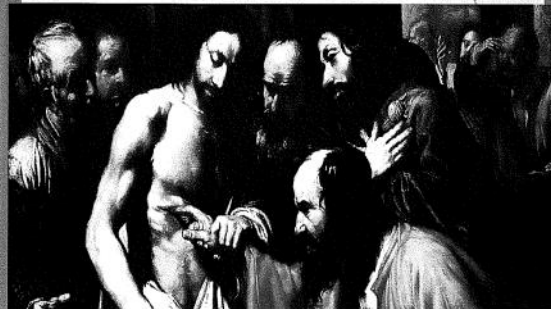

week.

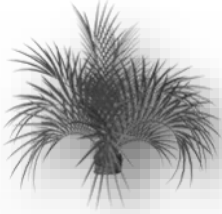

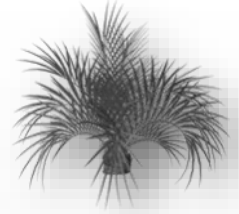

2. Entregar toda la Documentación solicitada eclesial y civil al menos 6 meses antes.
3. Recibir el Curso pre-matrimonial.



La resurrección de Lázaro (JN 11, 1-45). El Evangelio de este Domingo está lleno de simbolismo: por el Hecho, los Personajes y el Lugar. Unas “vagas ideas de estos”:

El Hecho. Se nos presenta uno de los más prodigiosos hechos de Jesús que recuerda el pasaje que dice: “así como el Padre da vida., así también el Hijo” tiene ese poder (Jn 5,21).

Los Personajes. El pasaje hace resaltar al “amigo” sobre sus hermanas (Marta y María), el nombre (Lázaro) significa “Dios socorrió”, Jesús se conmovió en su interior y hasta lloro (v. 35), esas lagrimas hace que los presentes digan: “Cuanto le amaba!!”, y no son emociones sin más están significadas por las mismas expresiones de dolor y compasión de los cristianos pues Lázaro es representación de Cristo y quizá Lázaro que ya llevaba cuatro días enterrado de los pecadores.

El Lugar. Entre otros significados, Betania puede ser: “casa de dolor”, “casa de ruego”, yendo más allá, es lugar físico donde se apersona Jesús “para manifestar la gloria de Dios” (vv.14-15). Es sitio privilegiado que recuerda otro lugar y acción de Jesús: Cana de Galilea, también entona con una constante de su vida: “la hora de Jesús”...y esa hora se acerca, el próximo Domingo comenzamos la Semana Mayor.

Et nul ne peut désormais se dire solitaire ou abandonné dans sa peine: Jésus est près de lui le compagnon de sa douleur qui lui apporte secours et miséricorde; il est aussi le fils qui lui apprend la valeur rédemptrice d'une souffrance offerte pour sauver le monde.
