

Third Sunday of Lent

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

It is third week of Lent, we are entering into month of March, and right on the end of it we will celebrate the Holy Week and Easter. Both of those seasons are so close to each other and they are inseparable: Lent / Easter, Easter / Lent. Those seasons keep mixing up in the daily life. We live moments of happiness as if the Easter already now could be eternal, and than we get hit by events of Holy Week - the Passion and death again. As I write this article, just before starting it, I glazed at the news and I saw two articles, one about the negligence of the Police Department and FBI in regard to the Florida school shooting, talking about the families terribly hurt and destroyed in this explosive evil, that build up over time as the shooter was growing in his destructiveness unchecked. The other article was much closer to us, as it talked about the three killers of Kayla Cuevas and Nisa



When does the Resurrection come after death ??? How long it takes to cross the line of loss and pain to arrive at the Resurrection and Easter- joy and happiness again ???

For those families who lost their loved ones so tragically and senselessly, it will be a life long experience. Can one ever accept what happened as normal ??? To bad, that in real life it can't be faster as it is in yearly calendar, when Easter comes regularly, and it seems so fast. But as we observed, there are too many Good Fridays happening in the course of one year, too many tragedies and senseless acts of evil affecting many people, affecting our lives. What would be life without Easter ??? What would be life without Resurrection ??? What is it like for those families affected directly by those tragedies to be grieving daily??? and for how long ??? When will the Easter come for them ???

As I looked on the readings of this Sunday, it is striking the beauty and wisdom of them all. Jesus is the Incarcerated Wisdom, talking in parables about the temple of his body to be ready to be raised on the third day. Jesus being preoccupied with the temple and true worship of God shows anger and irritation towards the system and culture created around the place of worship. He shows the connection between the worship and the sanctity of the temple of our body. True worship is necessary to be able to preserve the truth of the faith, that is God's revelation, the wisdom of faith. This is why the temple of Christ's Body sanctifies the temples of our bodies and the temples of our churches and tabernacles.

The wisdom of our revealed faith is given to us in the 10 Commandments given to Moses. This is the bill of human rights, that Jesus summed up in saying - love the Lord your God, and your neighbor as yourself - this is the most just thing to do in life. Is it not very simple ??? Yet the practice shows how far away we get sometimes from this truth.

The best description of it we find in Saint Paul in Second Reading today as he says:

- "Jews demand signs and Greeks look for wisdom, but we proclaim Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to Gentiles, but to those who are called, Jews and Greeks alike, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. For the foolishness of God is wiser than human wisdom, and the weakness of God is stronger than human strength." -

Who, but Saint Paul could make such an explanation of that parable of the temple of the body and of the wisdom of life. Lord continue to teach us about the temples of our bodies and about the wisdom of our faith, and help us to embody into our lives what we learn from you.

Please look into this months calendar for the opportunities to experience the Lord and his wisdom: in worship, prayers, presentations, cultural events, it all builds up the temples of our bodies as the Spirit of God dwells in them.

SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Baptism: For children under 5, please contact the Parish Office (273-8113) for an appointment to speak with a Priest or Deacon at least several weeks before the Baptism. For older children, contact the Office of Family Faith Formation (231-7344).

First Holy Communion: Children usually begin Religious Education studies in the First Grade and are prepared for Communion in the Second Grade. Call the Family Faith Formation Office (231-7344) to register your child the summer before the school year begins.

Confirmation: This Sacrament is currently celebrated in the Eighth Grade after 2 years of preparation. Please call the Religious Education Office (231-7344) for more information.

SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

Sacrament of the Sick: Call the Parish Office at any time to arrange for the Anointing of the Sick either at home or in the hospital.

Reconciliation: The Sacrament is celebrated every Saturday from 4:00 - 4:45 PM in the Church or by appointment.

SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

Marriage: Congratulations! Couples planning to marry should make an appointment with a Priest or Deacon at least eight (8) months in advance of the wedding to allow time for adequate preparation.

Holy Orders: Is God calling you? Call a Priest or Deacon to discern a possible vocation to the Priesthood, Diaconate or the Religious life.

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament: Each Thursday from 12:30 PM until 5:15 PM. First Friday from 5:30 PM until 7:00 PM. Rosary after the 12:00 daily Mass.

FROM THE DESK OF P.VICTOR

TERCER DOMINGO DE CUARESMA

"Señor, tu tienes palabras de vida eterna" es la respuesta al Salmo (18) este domingo; el Decálogo (Ex 20, Dt 5) pretende ser eso para nosotros, también es una "luz en nuestro itinerario cuaresmal". Sin embargo, Jesús nos da una nueva norma de vida fundamentada en un unico Mandamiento: "Amaras a Dios y tu Prójimo como a ti mismo" (Mt 22), y S. Agustín nos provee una clave: "Ama y haz lo que quieras", si se ama aun el rechazo y corrección estarán bien si se hacen por amor. Mas aun, Cristo crucificado es "locura y necedad", igual es que en algún momento nos toque llevar las cruces de otros o quizá las consecuencias de sus mismos pecados. Estamos dispuestos a ello esta Cuaresma???

El tiempo apremia, la Cuaresmal avanza, atenta debe ser nuestra actitud, la Iglesia seguirá proveyéndonos insumos para que se de en nosotros la Conversión. El objetivo debe ser llegar a la Pascua con el corazón renovado y con nuevos brillos. Que estamos haciendo individual o colectivamente con este propósito???
