Pentecost Sunday

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Today is a Pentecost Sunday, it is 50 days since the Resurrection Sunday. For the disciples it was a time of reconciliation with the events of Good Friday and Holy Saturday and Easter Sunday. It was a time of processing of what just happened to Jesus and to them on this incredible end of the week of Passover.



Those 50 days became a time of expectation, as Jesus encourage his disciples to wait and to pray and to expect the Counselor to be given to them, the Spirit of truth which was going to lead them from now on. Jesus would come or appear to the disciples in different moments of their daily lives, be it when they were fishing or when they were praying, and he would give them proof of his real presence among them, by sharing with them food, and allowing himself to be touched and to be seen how real he was.

Since the time of Easter we too have experienced how real Jesus is, and how present he is in our lives. We met him at the Divine Mercy celebration. Some met Jesus at the retreat, in sharing the Word, the meals and lives. We experience his presence at every Eucharist, at the breaking of the bread.

We see God's presence and love in the beauty of the spring, with flowers and birds proclaiming it to us. We experienced Christ's presence in the beauty of the First Communion celebrations; in the beauty and happiness of the faces of the first communion children. We experienced Christ's presence and love in the celebration of Mother's Day. It is the love of a mother that resembles the love of Christ. It is a love that knows no limits, it is infinite love.

I want to thank everyone for those beautiful days. I want to thank all teachers and catechists, especially Bertha the Director of our Family Faith Formation Office. I want to thank all who contributed to making it a beautiful celebration of Mother's Day. Our youth group Renacer, who have prepared the party: a theater show and a nice meal for our mothers on Saturday evening. I want to thank the Christian Mothers Group, who prepared yearly sale of jewelry and gifts for our mothers. I want to recognize as well a great job that was done by our Charismatic group, who prepared and sold live flowers at the entrance of the church. The whole day turn out to be a great success even if the weather was not too cooperative. In the end the Mother's Day is about the love of our mothers, and how we can recognize it and appreciate it, and keep returning it.

Today's celebration of Pentecost is a crowning of all those celebrations. Pentecost is a outpouring of the Holy Spirit, Spirit of faith and love of God and of people. The Holy Spirit makes us mature in our expression of faith and of love. From the passive disciples of Christ it makes us into Apostles of Christ, ready to carry the Good News of salvation to the ends of the world. This is the birthday of the Church, the day when the disciples were empowered to take charge of the Church entrusted to them by Christ himself.

Now it is our turn to ask for the Holy Spirit, so that we may be able to carry out the mission of taking care of Christ's Church. Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created and you shall renew their face of the earth.

O God, who instructed the hearts of the faithful by the light of the Holy Spirit, grant us in the same Spirit to relish what is right and always rejoice in your consolation. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Baptism: For children under 5, please contact the Parish Office (273-8113) for an appointment to speak with a Priest or Deacon at least several weeks before the Baptism. For older children, contact the Office of Family Faith Formation (231-7344).

First Holy Communion: Children usually begin Religious Education studies in the First Grade and are prepared for Communion in the Second Grade. Call the Family Faith Formation Office (231-7344) to register your child the summer before the school year begins.

Confirmation: This Sacrament is currently celebrated in the Eighth Grade after 2 years of preparation. Please call the Religious Education Office (231-7344) for more information.

SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

Sacrament of the Sick: Call the Parish Office at any time to arrange for the Anointing of the Sick either at home or in the hospital.

Reconciliation: The Sacrament is celebrated every Saturday from 4:00 - 4:45 PM in the Church or by appointment.

SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

Marriage: Congratulations! Couples planning to marry should make an appointment with a Priest or Deacon at least eight (8) months in advance of the wedding to allow time for adequate preparation.

Holy Orders: Is God calling you? Call a Priest or Deacon to discern a possible vocation to the Priesthood, Diaconate or the Religious life.

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament: Each Thursday from 12:30 PM until 5:15 PM. First Friday from 5:30 PM until 7:00 PM. Rosary after the 12:00 daily Mass.

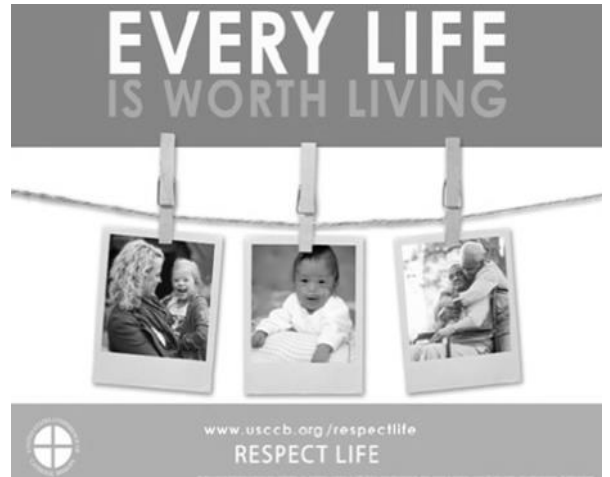

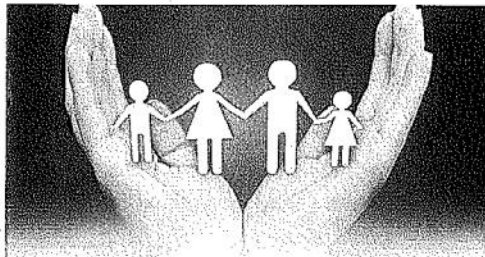
Our Family Support Specialists will work with you to personalize the program, help you overcome obstacles, and meet your specific goals.

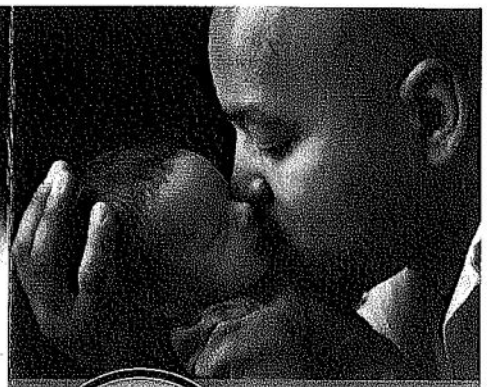

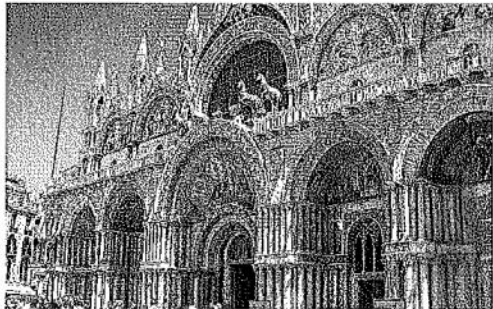

El tiempo pascual termina con "el envío del Espíritu Santo"(Jn. 20,19-23), aspecto de la Liturgia que conmemoramos hoy, está de más decirlo, "cincuenta días después de la Resurrección". Y como oportunamente apuntamos, a parte de la Secuencia propiamente de la Pascua, también hay una que corresponde a Pentecostés... *Ven, Dios Espíritu Santo, envíanos desde el cielo tu luz, para iluminarnos...* la misma es "como una oración" o mas bien "un hermoso himno" que enarbola el sentimiento mas profundo de la Iglesia que ve cumplida la promesa hecha por Jesús... *Es necesario que me vaya, para que les envíe al Paráclito (Jn. 16,7)*. Y los dones que Dios comunico ese día, y comunica hoy también, son múltiples, aunque la Palabra centra su atención en Siete: *Sabiduría, Inteligencia, Consejo, Fortaleza, Ciencia, Piedad y Temor de Dios* (1 Cor. 12), precisamente porque este numero tiene un gran simbolismo que quiere expresar plenitud y perfección. Con los "dones" pasa igual que con los "talentos" (Mt. 25, Lc. 19)... *Todos hemos recibido "algo", indistintamente, "dones o talentos"...* digamos que "los dones" nos ayudan a poner en movimiento "los talentos". Excepcionalmente, a los Apóstoles les fue dado el Espíritu para *...que en nombre de Cristo pudieran perdonar los pecados...* como leemos en el Evangelio de hoy.

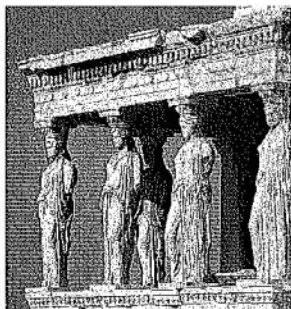

ITINERARY

Day 1 Depart JFK for Venice

Day 2 This afternoon we arrive in Venice and transfer to our hotel by late-afternoon. You will have a short period of free time before our welcome dinner.

Day 8 We visit the Corinth Canal and the ancient city of Corinth to view the Temple of Apollo, the Agora (market) and Bema Seat before taking in the areas where Paul preached the "Good News" to the Corinthians.

Day 9 Setting sail for a one day cruise, we will choose from a variety of options depending upon the ultimate size of the group and availability. Among the possibilities are a stop in Hydra to see its cobblestone alleys unique architecture and donkeys that still provide public transportation and Aegina to see its pistachio groves and the majestic Temple of Aphaea and the Byzantine monastery of Agios Nektarios.

Marie dans les religions--2

Marie, pour les Chrétiens (Catholiques, Orthodoxes, mais aussi protestants), Myriam pour les Juifs et les Musulmans: la Mère de Dieu peut se révéler un trait d'union entre les croyants. Dans l'Eglise Catholique, Lumen Gentium en son dernier chapitre, met en lumière la place et le rôle de Marie dans la vie de l'Eglise.

Honorée comme Mère de Dieu (Theotokos) et du Rédempteur, Marie occupe une place unique dans l'Eglise Catholique. Pour les Protestants, Marie est un témoin admirable par "son oui" à Dieu. Luther a su insister sur la naissance originale du Christ et sur Marie, Mère du Seigneur. Il a même publié un commentaire sur le Magnificat en 1521, qui est considéré comme un des plus beaux textes écrits sur Marie. Pour les Orthodoxes, la Vierge est étroitement associée au Christ. C'est elle, en tant que figure de l'Eglise, qui présente à son Fils la prière des pécheurs. Dans l'Islam, Marie occupe une place de choix. Elle n'est pas une femme comme les autres. Selon le Coran, elle est un exemple de prière, de soumission à Dieu, et de sainteté. A la suite du Coran, la tradition musulmane s'est intéressée à la vie de Marie. Certains sanctuaires Mariiaux, comme Notre Dame d'Afrique à Alger, sont d'ailleurs fréquentes par les Musulmans. Faut-il en

conclure que les Protestants et les Catholiques ne peuvent que se déchirer, en leurs églises et en leurs cœurs, au sujet de Marie? Non! LE GROUPE DES DOMBES pouvait affirmer avoir donné à Marie "toute sa place", mais "rien que sa place", Et Marie existe hors des frontières du Christianisme. Le Cardinal Francis Arinze en est convaincu et écrit en 2001 en conclusion d'un colloque sur "Marie et les relations œcuméniques et inter religieuses" : "Marie a brillé par les grandes qualités que l'on désire voir chez un partenaire du dialogue, attention à Dieu, obéissance à sa parole, aptitude au silence, à l'écoute et à la réflexion, prière de louange et d'action de grâce adressée à Dieu, préoccupation pleine d'amour pour le prochain, pratique du don de Dieu avec les autres,"
