32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

This weekend we remember all Veterans, these are the men and women who served in the military of this great country. Their service was not only to our country but as well to the whole world. With both World Wars in the last century, the role of USA came to be a global peace keeping one. It was very evident in the breaking of the German - Italian - Japanese alliance to conquer the world during WW II. Since then the USA military role remains dominant in the peacekeeping effort for the world. The political struggles are real. Many governments are not people friendly, persecuting their own fellow citizens for the sake of self appointed superiority or manipulated elections. We have numerous oppressive governments all around the world on all continents. That safety and peace exists because someone is risking their life to protect it. Many service members paid the highest price and never became Veterans because they lost their lives in the service. We owe our gratitude to all servicemen and women in all capacities in all safety roles. We pray that they never have to pay the highest price with their lives. We pray for all Veterans, their health and their families and we thank them for their generosity. God bless all our Veterans!!! May God bless all those who have died as we continue to remember all of our faithful departed in the Novena of Masses and in special remembrance of prayer in the month of November.

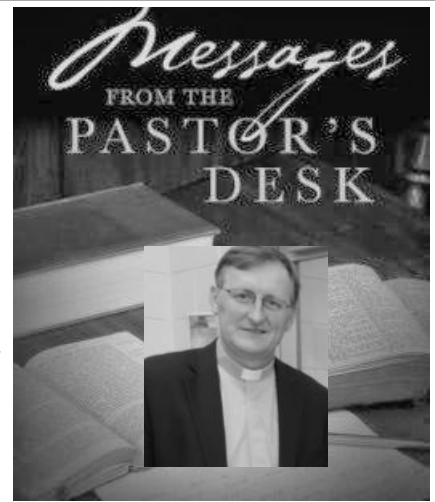

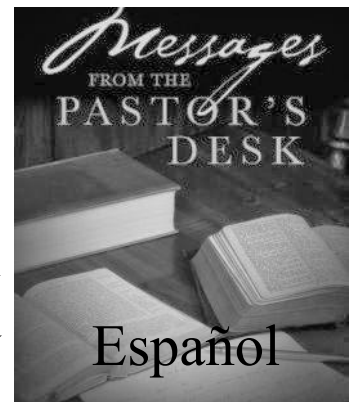

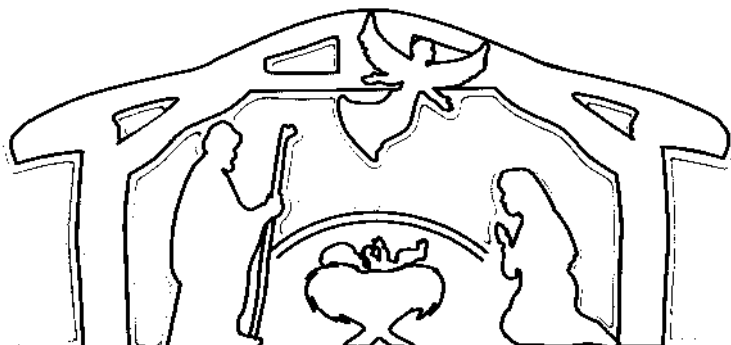

### XXXII-B DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO

1 Reyes 17:10-16 El texto nos presenta al prototipo del profetismo en Israel: Elías, el mismo sugiere una característica que rige el ser y actuar de un profeta: la obediencia a Dios, no solo del “enviado” sino también a “quienes es enviado”: una viuda y su hijo puestos al límite. El desenlace de la primera lectura es muy llamativo, la obediencia a Dios tiene como consecuencia la Providencia divina. Muchas veces, hemos estado o estaremos al límite, sin embargo, si escuchamos a los profetas que se nos son enviados, “ni el agua ni la harina se acabaran” y todos quedaremos saciados si comemos “el pan de la voluntad de Dios”.

Hebreos 9:24-28 La victima propiciatoria que es Cristo se entrego una vez para siempre. En los últimos tiempos este vendrá para consumir la salvación ya obrará por su obediencia al Padre. Desde el Altar cristiano, Cristo sigue ofreciéndose “incruentamente”, actualizando aquel único sacrificio. Jesús es: victima, sacerdote y altar... y un día vendrá en gloria para consumir su obra redentora en su Iglesia.

Marcos 12:38-44 El Evangelio es este domingo tiene una doble narrativa. Por un lado, Jesús critica el actuar de los fariseos, pone el dedo en la practica religiosa meramente ritual en la cual está ausente “el espíritu de las normas” que nunca pueden estar por encima de la dignidad humana. Exalta el actuar de una pobre viuda que ofrece, no lo que le sobra, mas bien: “todo que tenía para subsistir”. En las dos “moneditas” están simbolizados la Ley y los Profetas que Jesús vino a cumplir.

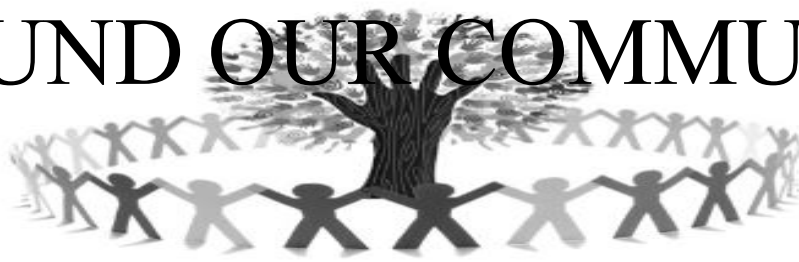

## Jésus, les scribes et l'obole de la veuve (Mc12 :38-44)

Ce récit est divisé en deux parties. La première traite de la rencontre de Jésus avec les scribes, et dans la deuxième partie Jésus loue l'attitude de la veuve dans le Temple.

Ici Jésus dénonce, une dernière fois, ses adversaires : les scribes et les pharisiens. Il demande la méfiance envers ces guides spirituels présomptueux. Le Maître stigmatise la vaine ostentation de ces notables à la recherche de l'adulation populaire. Ces meneurs du peuple n'hésitent pas à exploiter les pauvres sans défense. La condamnation que Jésus finit par prononcer peut nous paraître trop dure.

L'Obole de la veuve est le dernier épisode de Jésus au Temple. Cette cène située dans l'enceinte du Temple, près de la salle du trésor. Des riches, assez nombreux, y mettent de 'grosses sommes'. Mais le regard de Jésus se porte sur un fait qui mérite l'attention. Une pauvre veuve e s'avança et déposa deux piécettes. Ce qu'elle dépose dans le tronc est sans valeur : deux piécettes de monnaie juive. Une somme dérisoire. Cependant Jésus prend l'occasion de cet humble geste pur adresser une leçon d'importance a ses disciples (v.43-44). Le contraste porte bien sur le fait que les riches ont donné de leur 'superflu', alors que cette femme indigente a donné de son nécessaire. Demandons au Seigneur la grâce du don de soi.
