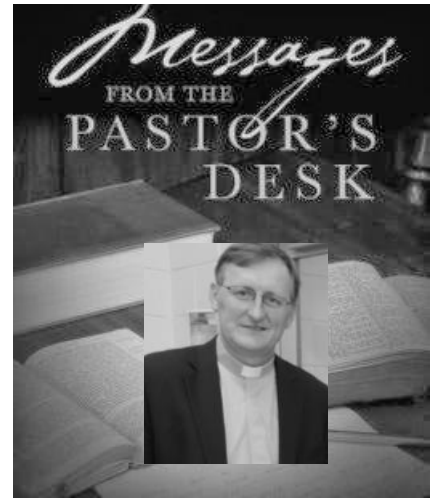

33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

We just passed the middle of November and are preparing for Thanksgiving. It goes so fast specially in our parish life, as we keep looking on the calendar through the prism of rolling celebrations. This Saturday we celebrate the Salvadorian Blessed Mother with the title of **OUR LADY OF PEACE**. Peace needed in the heart of every person, peace needed in every home, in every community, in the whole world. The peace we associate with the things being normal, regular, respectful, kind of expected, foreseen and good. It has a lot to do with people getting along well with each other. But before we get along with each other we need to find peace individually in our hearts. This comes from our relationship with The Lord, when we are convinced of doing God's will, being coherent with what we believe. This experience of peace comes from our individual experience of self worth, self confidence, self esteem. To be at peace with ourselves, we need to know who we are, and be able to accept it, to like it, to love ourselves. That acceptance of self comes from our experience of being loved, that empowers us to love in return. This is why Jesus says: "love your neighbor as yourself". We can't love others if we don't love ourselves. We can't give what we don't have. This is why it's so fundamental to perceive love from someone. It can be from other persons, from God, from the world of creation, but definitely the first place is our parents, our family, our home, our friends.



The peace is acquired by loving others, by stepping towards the needs of others, by giving back what we have received in love and goodness from God or from others. This is why to be at peace we need to relate well to others, we can't be selfish, we have to be ready to share good things of life with others, than we will be at peace. Selfish person is maybe self satisfied but is not in peace, because it sees others as a threat to what they selfishly want. To be at peace, one needs to be free of exaggerated attachments, to be ready to see other persons value and wellbeing as important as ones own. This is why to keep peace, we need to work for justice, because we can't be at peace with injustice around us. Simply, to be at peace we need to work at it.

This is why we need a capacity to dialogue, to listen, to forgive in order to preserve our peace, because when conflicts arise we need to find ways to work it out with the other persons, but it has to be civil, respectful, reasonable. The peace has to be based on truth and true good of all involved.

Considering all of these different aspects, we realize how much we need the Blessed Mother to intercede for us to be able to celebrate life and peace in our hearts, in our families, in our communities, and ultimately in the world.

*Blessed Mother, Queen of Peace pray for us !!!*

This Thursday we celebrate **THANKSGIVING DAY !!!** To be thankful we need to recognize that we are blessed. As the saying goes: "count your blessings ". To be able to count them we need to see them, and then gratitude arises in our hearts. That gratitude becomes a source of happiness for the one that is able to see the blessings. It is a kind of a happy circle. You can't be happy if you don't see the blessings. To be loved provokes us to love, provokes us to be happy. You want to be happy ???, than you have to be grateful.

There was a happy person that everyday was asking himself that question: **WHAT ARE THE THREE THINGS THAT I WANT TO BE GRATEFUL FOR TODAY?** He tried to answer himself that question every day, and it helped him to reach happiness of life that was contagious. A happiness, that people could see in him and want to be around him. He was a happy person that taught people how to become happy, in this competitive and selfish world. He died in a car accident at the age of 32, and is greatly missed by his friends and family and those who knew him for his ever shining smile. He can't be remembered with sadness, because he was a happy person. His name was Andres, and he is happy even now with the Lord who is the source of all happiness.

*Bendita Madre Reina de la Paz ruega por nosotros!!!*

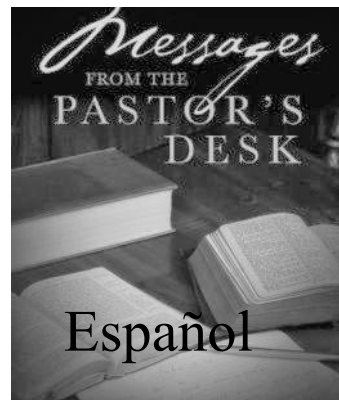

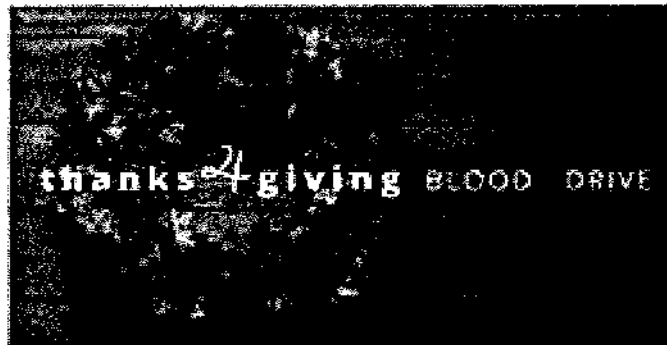

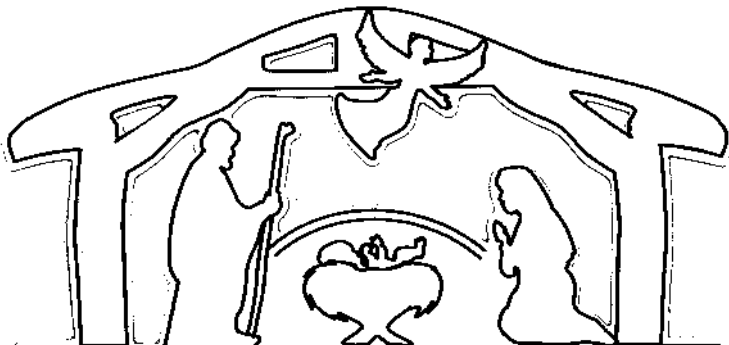

*Salmo 15: R. Protégeme, Dios mío, que me refugio en ti.*

(2L) **Hebreos 10:11-14,18** Continuamos reflexionando sobre el sacerdocio de Cristo. Hoy se hace una comparación entre los sacrificios de la antigua alianza, con el sacrificio *único y singular* de la Nueva Alianza. Este último otorga algo que el anterior no podía, la Redención y el perdón de los pecados, y ya no está basado en sangre de animales, sino en la entrega generosa del mismo Hijo de Dios.

**Marcos 13:24-32** En el centro del discurso de hoy está la Venida del Hijo del Hombre... qué diferencia hay entre Hijo de Dios e Hijo de Hombre?? La repuesta es simple, ninguna, solo hay que decir que Hijo de Hombre refería en AT a un ser misterioso que Jesús asume para si en el Evangelio, de un ser que vendría a terminar con cualquier culto distorsionado a Dios, y presentar a la Comunidad de creyentes el culto verdadero, uno que invita a acompañar al Hijo del Hombre en el sufrimiento por causa de la fe. En conclusión, al igual que la (1L), el texto no enfatiza el fin de los tiempos, pero si la posibilidad que esos tiempos últimos están cerca, en *el ya pero todavía no de la escatología cristiana*.

### La venue du Fils de l'Homme (Mc 13 : 24-32)

La formule 'en ces temps-là' veut designer les derniers jours : le temps de la fin. Il ne faut pas s'étonner que ce temps semble commencer par une série de catastrophes (v.24b-25). Il s'agit d'un bouleversement cosmique colossal. Le soleil et la lune s'éteignent. Les étoiles abandonnent leur place et leur fonction. A cette époque, dans les apocalypses, un tel chambardement de la nature n'a rien d'extraordinaire. C'est un langage traditionnel pour annoncer l'intervention de Dieu, sa victoire sur les forces du Mal (cf. Is : 13,10 ; 34,4).

Parler de l'éclipse du soleil et de la lune, de la chute des étoiles, c'est donc attester le triomphe du Dieu Unique sur l'idolâtrie païenne. Il faut que le vieux monde disparaisse pour laisser place au monde nouveau. La Bonne Nouvelle qui retentit est la venue du « fils de l'Homme' en gloire, sur fond de désagrégation de l'univers pécheur. Au tournant de notre ère, la figure du Fils de l'Homme' désigne communément le Messie que Dieu investit pour établir son Règne sur la terre. On a vu Jésus s'attribuer ce titre, de préférence a tout autre (2, 10.28 ; 8,31). Ici il annonce donc sa venue triomphale comme Juge et Sauveur universel de la fin des temps.
