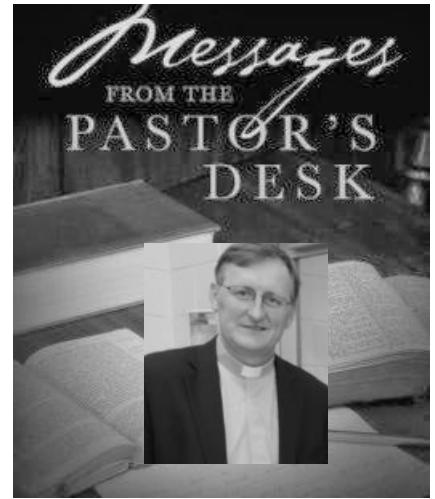

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

I hope you all had a great Thanksgiving with your family and friends. It is a special time in the life of every family with special memories and history to it, especially when we want to remember what we are grateful for. Family is always the first place where we need to be grateful. To our parents we owe a gratitude for the gift of life that comes from heaven, a gift which with God's help is infinite in value and eternal in extension, so should be the thanksgiving. That eternal meaning of things has to be perceived by us, since it corresponds to our greatest need for answers and consolation at a time of loss of someone we love, or at a time of loss of what is very dear to us; as our health, strength, friendship, work, and ultimately our life.

Enjoying his friendship we enjoy each other and what we are and what we have. Let's be ready to carry one another's burdens, as often as the Lord shares his cross more generously with some. It is a sign of true faith and love when we do that.

Let us remember to forgive everyone, so that the Lord would not hold anything against us if we should be called to see his face today.

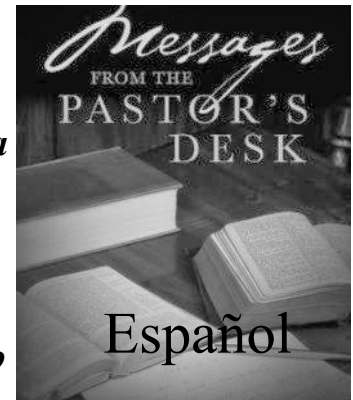

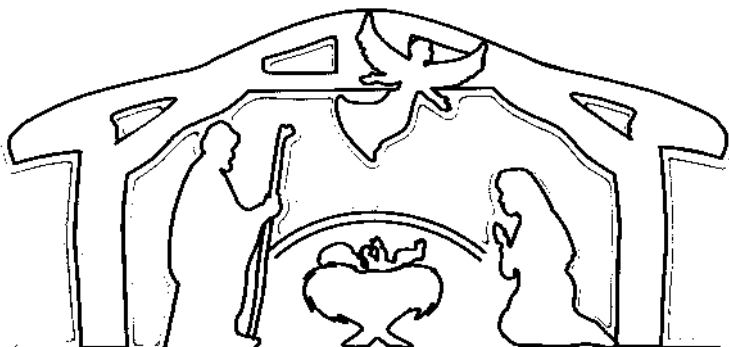

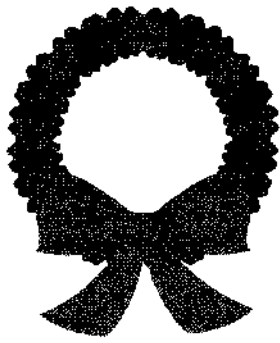

Jésus et Pilate : Royauté de Jésus (Jn 18 :33-38a)

Provoqué par Pilate à se reconnaître comme roi, Jésus prend ses distances, comme s'il voulait montrer ses réserves par rapport à l'image de la royauté terrestre, sans pour autant refuser le titre lui-même. Ce titre 'roi des juifs' étant celui des rois asmonéens, les derniers rois d'Israël avant l'occupation romaine, on comprend la méfiance de Jésus devant les connotations politiques attachées à l'expression 'roi des juifs' au Ier siècle.

Mais la contestation de Jésus est plus large : sa royauté n'est ni celle qu'attendent les Juifs, ni celle qu'imagine Pilate, ni à l'image de la royauté des hommes qui se juge à la force des armées et à l'étendue des conquêtes. Sa royauté s'établit non par la force, mais par la proposition d'une parole de révélation. Ceux qui l'accueillent deviennent sujets de ce royaume, non seulement à la fin des temps, mais des maintenant. Ces sujets sont 'ceux qui appartiennent à la vérité', c'est-à-dire ceux qui se mettent à l'écoute de la Parole de révélation.
