

30th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

In today's Gospel we have a description of an encounter of Jesus with Bartimaeus, who as a blind man is calling for help: "Jesus, Son of David, have pity on me." We can only imagine what is it like to be blind. How incredible limitation it is? What level of dependency on other persons it creates, for the person who is blind? How humbling is the experience to have such need for assistance in daily life? We can only imagine because we have not experienced such limitations. Try to keep your eyes blinded, as people do sometimes for sleep during the day or on airplane. How long could you stay blind? It's a horrible limitation, it is a difficult disability. Imagine what it takes to survive in life with it? When Bartimaeus called on Jesus, he called from that dark place within his mind and heart. He opened his heart to Christ, to let the light of Christ enlighten his mind, making him a free and independent man, ready to follow Jesus.



Bartimaeus got a new life, totally new perspective, new dimension, something that normally we take for granted, he got it as a miraculous.

Isn't our whole life miraculous ??? Isn't every sense that we have miraculous ??? Isn't life itself miraculous ??? Isn't our life magical ???, beautiful ???, divine ??? as the people in Ecuador would say ??? In reality our whole life is divine, if only we decide to see it. It is not our possession, it is a gift given for our temporary use; - something divine - life is Divine. Only God can give life; we only can share it, but we don't own it. It all depends on what meaning we want to give it, in what perspective we want to live it - Divine or human- in meaning material, or spiritual- Jesus dimension, or blind man's dimension??? How much time do we need in order to discover the Divine perspective of life ??? How much in life do we have to experience our limitations before we discover the Divine perspective of life ??? It is the Jesus' perspective!!! It's the most of life that we can make, to make it Divine. This is what the Saints discovered about life, and made the effort to implement it. They practiced Divine life. Did you discovered it yet ??? Is your life Divine yet ??? How big or how small is your perspective of life ??? What does it take for a person to discover what Bartimaeus discovered ??? What experience in life made you discover that life is Divine and that ultimately it all belongs to Him ???

God and Jesus wait for us our whole life to share it with us - the eternity of Divine life. It's the only thing that remains forever. God has the infinite patience with us, waiting for us to recognize Him for what He is - the God of love. Love never fails, it never ends - all other things will pass away. At the end of our life nothing will matter except if there is eternal life- the Divine life, that life is a true possession. This is Jesus' message. Did you get it ??? If not yet, call in prayer as Bartimaeus did: "Jesus, son of David, have pity on me", and than when Jesus asks you what do you want?, you tell Him: Master, I want to see.

I want to thank everyone for the Peruan feast of Our Lord of the Miracles. For prayers, novena, for decorating the church and basement, for party and for entertainment. It was a good time of prayer and culture, sharing and fun. I thank all for serving and helping, for cooking and cleaning. I thank you all for your donations from the party of free food donation of around \$600.00 and other personal donations. For this celebration, I did buy 50 more chairs in Walmart for the basement in black color as we always are short of seating places for the meal. I bought as well four folding tables eliminating the round, heavy and consumed tables. This past Sunday we met as well with the people wanting to be a part of Our Lady of Guadalupe Feast committee. This week on Thursday I hope to meet with our Spanish Ushers, than in two weeks with our Spanish Eucharistic Ministers and than with our Spanish Lectors.

We ended our lease of the space above our business office building (Pastoral Center) to the Seafield rehabilitation program. Now we will look into a rehabilitation of the building for the purpose of meeting space and retreats as the upstairs of the building is composed of 20 rooms that we plan to equip with bunk-beds. You remember it was the residence at one time of the Cenacle Sisters (Nuns) for a three years past. We started to fix the pavement in the entrance of the building as it was degenerated. There is a need for internal restoration that we are looking into with the Emaus Men's Group. We already received some beds and tables and chairs for the rooms. I will keep you posted on the progress. Don't forget All Saints Feast Day, November 1st and All Souls Day, November 2nd! *God bless everyone*!!! *God bless you always*!!!



San Oscar Romero, Obispo-Mártir y San Pablo VI, Papa.

El domingo 14 de octubre junto a estos también se canonizo a cuatro más, el espacio no da para hacer una reseña, pero pueden consultar sobre los mismos en los medios digitales católicos. Es claro que el gesto del Papa Francisco detrás de "estos dos" tiene sus motivos por la coincidencia de sus vidas. El Papa Pablo VI fue el primer aplicador del Concilio Vaticano II y Oscar Romero (quizá mas en su segunda etapa como Arzobispo de San Salvador) es un fruto de este 'aire renovador en la Iglesia". Además, discípulo y maestro tuvieron una resonada sensibilidad respecto a los más desprotegidos, aspecto que la asamblea de obispos latinoamericanos en Medellín (Colombia), definió como "opción preferencial por los pobres". A este ultimo "meeting" de obispo, hay que agregar el siguiente en Puebla (México) en el cual Romero estuvo presente y que perfilaron su actuar como Obispo que bien podríamos definir en su lema episcopal: "Sentir con la Iglesia".

En cierto aspecto, igual que Papa Francisco, los santos en cuestión, lo son "de periferias", dejan de ser "de sacristía" y vienen a serlo de "compromiso social" (algo que en el caso de Romero asustaba aun a sus propios colegas obispos y parte del conglomerado salvadoreño...), lo que corresponde ahora es inmiscuirse en la herencia de S. Pablo VI y redescubrir o conocer a S. Oscar Romero (de América).

Casi un centenar de miembros de DRVC asistimos a este magno evento, a una convocatoria de la Iglesia que es difícil traducir en palabras. Algunos de los hechos que vivimos fueron: El 'antipasto' una vigilia de oración presidida por el Card. Rosa Chávez (Ob. Aux. S.S.). El 'plato fuerte', la mañana de 14 de octubre en la emblemática Plaza de S. Pedro. El 'postre' la audiencia con el Santo Padre en la Sala Pablo VI.

Nuestra peregrinación termino en Assisi, lugar también de regocijo y que alberga la memoria de San Francisco de Asís que perfila el pontificado del actual Papa.



L'Aveugle de Jéricho (Mc 10: 46-52)

Cette scène est située avec précision. Quand on vient de Transjordanie, Jéricho est la localité par laquelle on pénètre en Israël (v.46). C'est surtout pour Jésus une étape décisive dans sa marche vers Jérusalem avec d'autres personnes que ses disciples « une foule nombreuse ». Son aventure a frappe Marc au point qu'il est le seul des évangélistes à avoir retenu son nom (cf. Mt20 :29-34 et Lc 18 :35-41). : « Bartimée » est un nom araméen veut dire en grec « le fils de Timée ». Il est bien campé dans campe dans son extrême marginalité : assis et « a cote » du chemin.

Son cri est l'expression d'une grande détresse, mais surtout d'une incroyable confiance. Le paradoxe vient du fait que cet aveugle 'voit' avec exactitude qui est Jésus de Nazareth. Il l'appelle : « Fils de David ; c'est, dans la tradition biblique, l'appellation du Messie par le peuple élu. Bartimée fait donc un acte de foi remarquable.

L'aveugle crie : Jésus, Fils de David, aie pitié de moi ! » (V.48). Cette prière insistante, répétée, touche son but : Jésus, s'arrête et dit : 'Appelez-le' (v.49). Et lui demande : Que peux-tu que je fasse pour toi ? Lui de répondre. Que je voie ! Ainsi Jésus délivre l'homme de ce le paralysait.

Chers amis lecteurs, Jésus est celui qui restaure. Grace a la foi, Bartimée a pu recouvrir la vue. Jésus a soif que nous ayons soif de lui. Avec lui il n'y a pas de cas désespérés A l'instar de Bartimée, confions-lui nos situations sans issues et rappelons-nous toujours que la foi peut tout faire.
