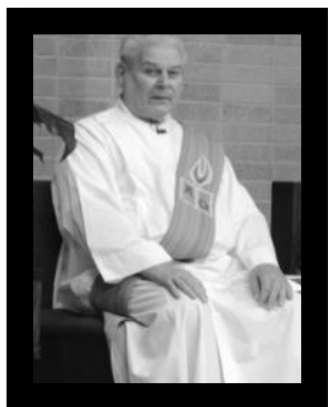

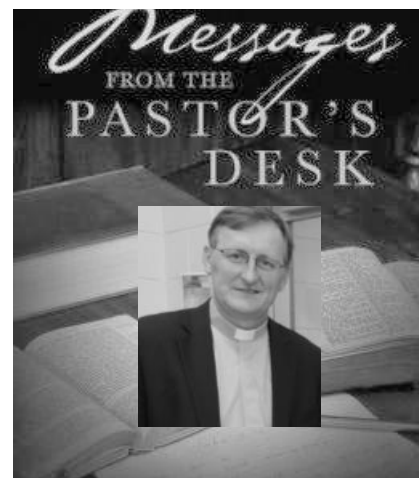

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Next Saturday at 7pm we will have with us our own Bishop John Barres, celebrating with us the Vigil of the Canonization of our modern martyr, Archbishop Oscar Romero. Killed in our lifetime on March 24 1980, remembered by older generations, it seems unreal that in so modern times we would have such violent reactions to criticism on political and social issues. He spoke out against poverty, social injustice, assassinations, and torture. He was killed during Mass.

Sadly enough we experienced violence in our own community in Brentwood. How much Evangelization is needed, in order for people to be respectful to one another and tolerant of the other. How much practice of good we have to engage in, in order to resist temptation for becoming selfish and disrespectful of other person's equal rights to live and to prosper. Where do we find the power to prosper??? Where do we find the source of goodness, and happiness???

The scriptures of this Sunday remind us of the basic truth about our happiness, that comes from marriage and family life. It is interesting how the subject of marriage is in the Bible from the very beginning, right from creation God made. God made it that way. It was the purpose of having this adequate company, that would bring the fullness of life and happiness for both: man and woman. Family is a source of life, and marriage is a contract, a statement, a promise mutually made by husband and wife who recognize each other as the partner for life, - to have and to hold, from this day forward, for better, for worse, for richer, for poorer, in sickness and in health, until death do us part. - It's a powerful statement, it's powerful promise, but without it there is no happiness for family, no happiness for individual parent, no happiness for children.

Family is the source of happiness and goodness in life. And even though it may be as well the source of pain and suffering. But the whole difference is made by the love that is found in the family. If there is no love, there is no happiness. If there is love, nothing can disturb the happiness. With love in the family, even the crosses are bearable. Without the love the crosses are disastrous. We receive so much from home, that we even don't realize. It is only when we see a broken person and broken life, then we ask what went wrong in this persons life.

The strength that we find in our life in a great measure comes from faith, faith in God, faith in others, faith in ourselves. All three of them are intertwined, but all three of them are received and perceived through the family experience. It's family that gives us the necessary assurance in all three of them. Family is our rock. Family is our foundation. Family is our strength. Family is our refuge. Family is our shelter. Family is our happiness. Family can be as well the source of suffering and deprivation if it is dysfunctional. But in order for it to be normal, it's necessary that there be Love, respect, self sacrifice, than it accomplishes it's purpose of channeling life and happiness.

This is why Jesus stands in defense of marriage and family. There is no better place to be happy and accomplished, to be in love and to love. This is why we expect people to make their choice and decision seriously, with awareness and consideration. With definitive commitment and wholeheartedly. With knowledge of self and the knowledge of the other. This is why Jesus on the end of today's Gospel tells us that we have to accept his teaching with simplicity of heart as children do, and than we will enter the Kingdom of God.

In this week we celebrated great Saints who were blessed with childlike hearts. On the October 1st we celebrated St. Therese of Lisieux, the Saint of the Little Way - getting to heaven doing small things with great love. On the 2nd we celebrated our Guardian Angels, the Angels that look at God's face for us. Then, on the 4th we celebrated St. Francis - the lover of God and of all creation. Then on October 5th St. Faustina - Secretary of Divine Mercy as called by Jesus himself. Than St. Bruno - a Saint founder of 1000 years old order of Carthusians we have one monastery in Vermont. 1000 year old spirituality of prayer and contemplation, of anticipation of heaven while walking on earth.

What an incredible display of holiness and spirituality, beyond imagination.

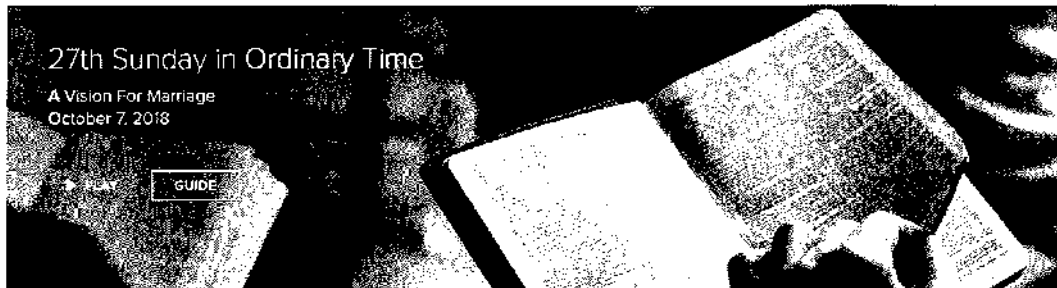

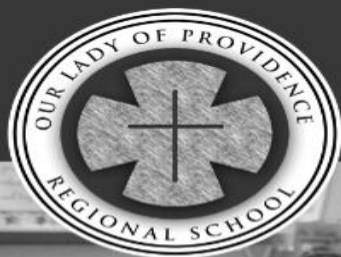

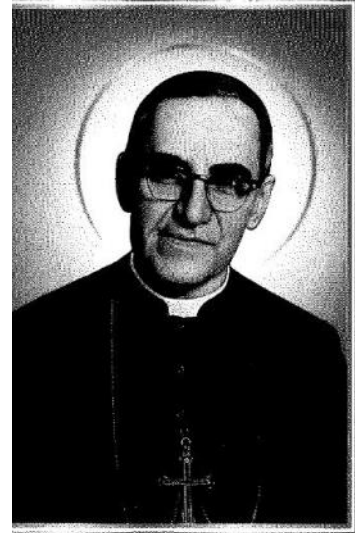

ARCHBISHOP SAINT OSCAR ROMERO:

A CATHOLIC MARTYR WHO MADE THE HOLY SACRIFICE OF HIS LIFE
WHILE CELEBRATING THE HOLY SACRIFICE OF THE MASS

A PASTORAL LETTER TO THE PEOPLE OF GOD OF THE DIOCESE OF ROCKVILLE CENTRE ON THE OCCASION OF THE OCTOBER 14, 2018 CANONIZATION OF ARCHBISHOP OSCAR ARNULFO ROMERO



On Monday, March 24, 1980 at 6:25pm, Archbishop Oscar Romero, the Archbishop of San Salvador in the Central American nation of El Salvador, was celebrating Mass at the chapel of the Divina Providencia Cancer Hospital.

During the homily, a gunman shot him in the heart and he died a Catholic martyr for human rights and human dignity and a martyr advocate of the poor and marginalized, for non-violence and beatitudinal peace.



In addition to a diocesan pilgrimage in Rome for the Canonization liturgy led by Deacon Francisco Cales, Father Daniel Rivera, our El Salvadoran seminarians and lay faithful, we will be celebrating the Canonization of Archbishop Romero, along with the Canonization of Blessed Pope Paul VI, at our parish Masses on Sunday, October 14, 2018.



As a Catholic martyr, Archbishop Romero made the holy sacrifice of his life in the context of the Holy Sacrifice of the Catholic Mass.

He teaches us so powerfully that our embrace of the Cross of Christ in our lives connects with the rhythm of the Pascal Mystery Sacrifice of the Mass streaming through every dimension of our lives and missionary spirit on Long Island and beyond.



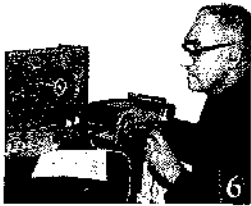
We prepare for the celebration of this historic moment in the Universal Church in a variety of ways:

We reflect on the heroic life and sanctity of Blessed Archbishop Oscar Romero. We can read some of his homilies and pastoral letters or a biography of the Archbishop. Chapter 13 of Robert Royal's *The Catholic Martyrs of the Twentieth Century: A Comprehensive World History* entitled, "Murder in the Cathedral: Archbishop Oscar Arnulfo Romero of El Salvador and Some Latin American Martyrs," is an especially helpful overview. Perhaps we watch the film *Romero* starring Raul Julia.

We call for a more intense commitment of the Catholic academic community to study the Archbishop's Spiritual Theology, Missiology and approach to Catholic Social Justice Teaching and the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy. Taking Romero scholarship to the next level will enrich our global Church immensely.

Our El Salvadoran priests and seminarians have told me that the Archbishop's episcopal motto, *Sentire cum Ecclesia* (Latin)/*Feel with the Church* (English)/*Sentir con la Iglesia* (Spanish) — a motto which means to experience, to live and to walk with the people, is particularly moving and inspirational to them.





II We have conversations with our beautiful El Salvadoran community on Long Island about the oral tradition passed on by their families and communities about the impact of Blessed Archbishop Romero on their Catholic faith, their parishes and their country. We seek their advice on how to live in a more intense way the spirit of the saint on Long Island.

III We engage in ecumenical and interfaith dialogue and prayer. The ecumenical and interfaith opportunities can be summarized by the fact that Archbishop Romero is one of the ten 20th Century martyrs depicted in statues above the Great West Door of Westminster Abbey in London. There are also many atheists and agnostics who admire the human rights legacy of Archbishop Romero — so we have a great and natural entrée into discussion.



IV We take yet another opportunity to connect the Canonization, in a spirit of pastoral charity, promotion of human rights and global justice, to a call for comprehensive immigration reform for our nation that is built on the principles of the dignity of the human person, social justice, the sanctity of human life and the family, and a Good Samaritan love for the poor.

V We promote a Culture of Life as a response to gang violence and its Culture of Death by continuing to comfort and support grieving families and by appealing for the conversion of the hearts, minds and souls of gang members.

VI We present the holiness of Archbishop Romero to the next generation of Catholics. We ask the Archbishop's

intercession for a rich and new harvest of vocations to the priesthood and religious life in our Hispanic community and throughout Long Island.

VII Archbishop Romero once said: "The most profound social revolution is the serious, supernatural, interior reform of a Christian."

Although Blessed Romero has been embraced as an ecumenical and interreligious figure of inspiration who is known for his courage, his humanity and his solidarity with the poor, what is often forgotten is that he was a deeply humble man and priest who was profoundly committed to the Sacrament of Penance in his personal life and who deeply promoted it among the people he served.

Blessed Romero understood both the power of conversion in the Sacrament of Penance and how that conversion could help provide for the social change El Salvador desperately needed.

Like Blessed Romero, when we embrace the personal conversions of the Sacrament of Penance, we see the global challenges of migration through the lens of the Kingdom of God and the prophetic mission of mercy of the Catholic Church on earth, rather than through our own limited vision. We begin to better understand our own role in welcoming strangers as we follow Jesus' call and build a genuine culture of life and civilization of love.



VIII Blessed Archbishop Romero was no stranger to anguish and pain in Church life. We ask his intercession for the healing of survivors of clergy sexual abuse and a new and powerful experience of Church reform grounded in holiness, mission and a commitment to *dramatic missionary growth*.



10 Archbishop Romero walks and listens to the needs of the people of God in El Salvador.

¹On August 6, 2018, we celebrated the 25th Anniversary of Pope St. John Paul II's encyclical *Veritatis Splendor/The Splendor of Truth*. In section 90-94 entitled "Martyrdom, the exaltation of the inviolable holiness of God's law", Pope St. John Paul II gives an extended reflection on the moral witness to Truth of martyrs in the history of the Church. It is very profitable to read, study and pray this section and realize how deeply Archbishop Romero's life is an expression of principles and insights that are expressed.

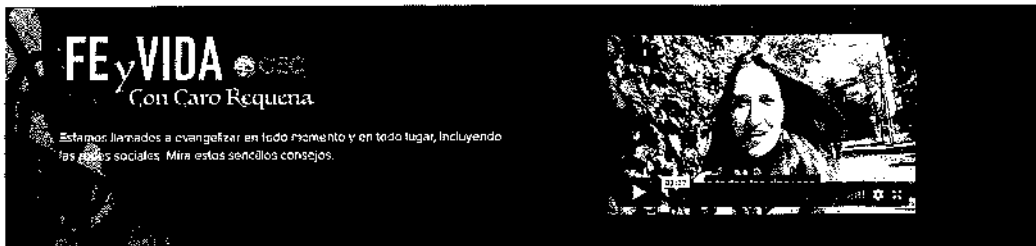
Marcos 10,2-16

El antecedente del Evangelio de hoy, efectivamente esta en la Primera lectura, Gen 2,18-24, y todo católico mínimamente instruido entiende que refiere a la “vida en pareja”, de esa relación que es presentada “querida por Dios” y que evoluciona al concepto y al Sacramento que en la Iglesia conocemos como Matrimonio (que a muchos asusta, pues, para decirlo en palabras llanas y en clave masculina: “*el Matrimonio es cosa de hombres*”, y también lo es de mujeres, pues *hombre y mujer* los creo, fuera de ese *consorcio* la Iglesia no reconoce otro tipo de unión humana que se le pueda equiparar, y es que un **Sacramento** deja de ser un consorcio, y viene a ser un *mandato divino*, en palabras de Jesús y mas cuando le argumentan los fariseos a cerca de la posibilidad del “*divorcio por cualquier motivo*”, y es que en tiempos de Moisés (AT), y también en el de Jesús (NT), algunos hacían unas consideraciones absurdas de *la mujer y los niños* que tenían menos valor que “un cántaro”, es decir el del nivel de *esclavos o ignorantes*. Cristo devuelve las cosas a su justo lugar, y dirá que “nunca será lícito separar lo que Dios quiso fuera una sola carne”, y es que el repudio o la separación puede inducir a la infidelidad. Entendemos pues, que solo la muerte puede dar paso a unas segundas nupcias a un hombre o a una mujer. Respecto de los niños dirá: “*dejen que los niños se acerquen a mi...de los que son como los niños es el Reino de los cielos*”, y *los abrazada y los bendecía* (esto no quiere decir que los niños puedan “dar vuelta y media” durante la celebración de la misa o en una reunión de la iglesia). Un último aspecto que hoy podemos considerar es el de la **Declaración de nulidad matrimonial**, traducido al castellano, si antes de casarse Ud. hubieron inconsistencias, quizá inmadurez, algo oculto, temor, etc., de una de las partes (o de ambas) la Iglesia evalúa esa irregularidad y determina que nunca existió un matrimonio; si Ud. esta es su situación, si una vez “se caso por la Iglesia” y ahora tiene una relación distinta (o matrimonio civil), consulte con algún Sacerdote o Diacono para hacer las indagaciones respectivas y ayudarle a iniciar ese proceso y pueda a mediano plazo recibir la bendición de Dios en el **Matrimonio**.

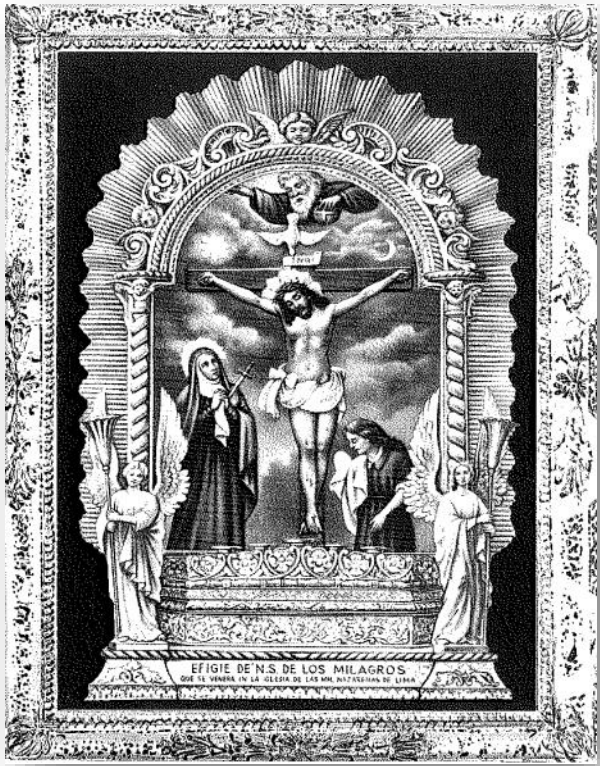

La question du divorce (Mc10, 1-12)

Des pharisiens abordent Jésus pour le mettre à l'épreuve en lui disant : « est il permis a un mari de renvoyer sa femme ? »

Le piège qu'on lui tend est clair : on va pouvoir le taxer de laxisme ou de rigorisme en la matière. On veut l'enfermer dans un campo ou dans l'autre. Le Maitre renvoie ses interlocuteurs à la source du débat : « Que vous a prescrit Moise ? » la réponse est facile (v.4). Cette référence des pharisiens a la Loi de Moise manifeste l'usage ancien et légal du divorce (Dt 24,1)

Par cette législation israélite qui remonte à Moise, l'homme pouvait répudier son épouse, même pour des raisons les plus futiles !

O

Conscient de ce type d'interprétation et d'autres, Jésus commence par resituer la Loi de Moise a son juste niveau : : « C'est en raison de votre endurcissement qu'il a formulé cette loi » (v. 5) Mais le Maitre entend motiver plus profondément sa pensée. Comme il l'a fait précédemment au sujet de cette autre loi de Moise : le sabbat (cf. 2,23-28), il en appelle par-delà la tradition juive, a l'intention originelle du Créateur (v.6). Jésus remonte le temps : bien avant le Deutéronome, le livre de la Genèse qu'il cite (Gn1,27) présente l'union de l'homme et de la femme comme une base solide sur laquelle l'humanité doit s'édifier, et non se détruire.
