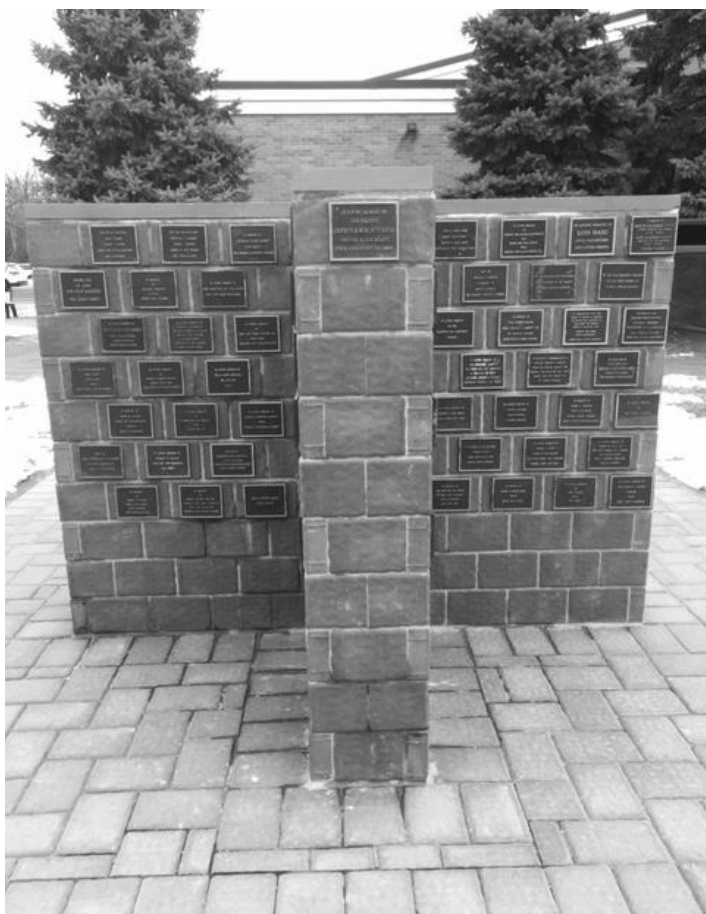

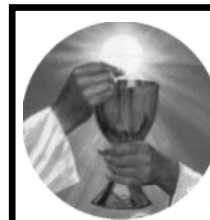

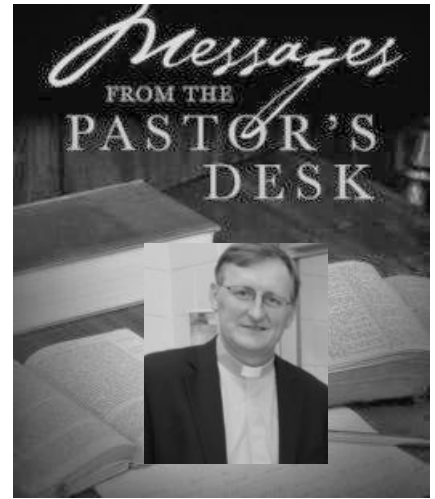

*Dear Sisters and Brothers,*

*As February is approaching the end, the winter has been easy for us so far. We have been blessed with moderate climate and we are thankful to the Lord for it. Let us remember, that a lot of people suffer from too much cold or too much heat, from droughts or floods, from earthquakes or tsunamis, from hurricanes or tornadoes, and we are blessed with none of those. Lord we are blessed and we thank You, keep us safe.*

*As a part of remembrance how blessed we are, we want to remember those who brought us to the place where we are here in Saint Anne's. Grateful to our parishioners those who built this community and our church, I want to point to the fact that we have finished our Memorial Garden - Jerusalem Cross Memorial Wall. As you can see we have placed the memorial plaques on the wall, as the warmer weather permitted us to glue them to the bricks. I believe it is very respectful and better and more visible way to acknowledge those who contributed to the building of the church and maintenance of our property and to our parish programs. It is all part of Evangelization and sharing of the Gospel.*

We still can use a couple of benches next to the Memorial Cross, they too can be memorialized, so if you feel inspired to do so please contact Marge in the parish office. You may find it interesting to look through those dedications and inscriptions made for different occasions and anniversaries, for happy and sad memories. God bless everyone who is on those plaques, who dedicated them and to whom dedications were made. There is more spaces to put your memorial plaque. If you are passing by look how nice it is. Say a prayer for those who are memorialized.*

*As we go to the readings of this Sunday, in beautiful way they bring us the teaching about the truly spiritual person inspired by the Gospel, loving others as Jesus did. It is interesting how already in the Book of Samuel, we have the image of two different postures taken by King Saul, and by anointed future King David. Saul trying to kill David, and David well wishing his King. Two postures that remind us of brothers: Cain and Abel and the dynamic between them.*

*In letter to Corinthians, St Paul speaks to us of the first and last Adam, the natural and spiritual one. The first man was from the earth, earthly; the second man was from heaven, heavenly. St Paul tells us that, as we carry in us the image of the earthly man, so we should carry the image of the heavenly one also.*

*In the Gospel of today, Jesus explains to us what it means to be the heavenly man, the spiritual man, the new man. What it means to love as God loves, to love as Christ loves, to love as spiritual person does, to love as the new person loves.*

*Love your enemies - do good to those who hate you. Stop judging ....., stop condemning ....., forgive and you will be forgiven. Stop perpetuating the evil by responding with evil. Turn the other cheek, take on some hurt, offer it up. The first one to do that was Jesus, David started good but didn't persevere, Abel paid with his life. Saint Paul became the new man and gave his life for others like Jesus did.*

*After was Mahatma Gandhi, then Martin Luther King. Non violence in face of evil and violence. The good defends itself eventually, it wins in the end, but there's the need for the sacrifice of the other cheek and still non violence. Even more, doing good to those that mistreat you. How difficult is that. How difficult is to be calm and quiet when things don't go our way. How difficult is it, not to speak and not to fight back. How difficult it is to swallow our pride and judgement. How difficult it is to be humble and holy. How difficult it is to be the new man, to be the spiritual person, to be like Jesus, like Gandhi, like M. L. King, like Abel, like Saint Paul. Jesus teach us to become more like you. Please bless everyone.*

A medida que vamos a las lecturas de este Domingo, de una manera hermosa nos traen la enseñanza sobre la persona verdaderamente espiritual inspirada por el Evangelio, amando a los demás como lo hizo Jesús. 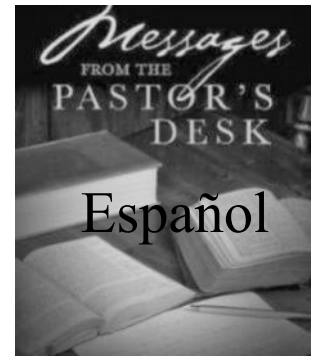

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

*“Before I formed you in the womb I knew you...”* (Jeremiah 1:5)

At the very heart of our beliefs about who we are and why we exist, is a message of love. God creates us out of love. Out of love, He redeems us by the sacrifice of his Son, Jesus. He calls us to an eternal destiny with Him because He loves each sacred human life, created in His image.

That we are created in God’s image is reaffirmed in our nation’s Declaration of Independence, reminding us that we “are endowed by [our] Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are **Life**, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness.” The **right to life** is the foundation and starting point for every other God-given human right. When that right is attacked or denied, all other rights and liberties begin to crumble.

You are probably aware that on January 22, 2019, the 46<sup>th</sup> anniversary of *Roe v. Wade* (the Supreme Court decision that declared an absolute constitutional right to abortion), Governor Andrew Cuomo of New York signed into law the “Reproductive Health Act”, which he himself called “the most aggressive” abortion law in the country. It was then “celebrated” by his lighting up One World Trade Center and the Alfred E. Smith Building in Albany.

It is our obligation as citizens and as Catholics, to be well informed and to make our voices heard in the public square when evil and injustice threaten the sacred gift of life at any stage.

On a human level, this gruesome law should be appalling to people of every faith, or no faith. The Reproductive Health Act allows for abortion on demand with no restrictions throughout all of pregnancy. *This means that as a choice, an abortion could be performed on a full-term infant as the mother is going into labor.*

This law might also open the door to taking away conscience protections from medical personnel, and could be used to force doctors, nurses and other medical staff to perform or to assist in abortions. Governor Cuomo claims that he is protecting women’s rights, when in fact, this law endangers the lives of women by allowing non-physicians to perform abortions, and it removes any objective standard of care due to the patient.

*The Act has also removed criminal penalties when an unborn child is deliberately targeted for death in a crime.* Two and a half weeks after the bill became law, the Queens District Attorney said he could not prosecute a man for the stabbing death of his unborn child in the womb of his girlfriend, because of the passage of the Reproductive Health Act.

*Unimaginably, the law also repeals protections for infants who are accidentally born alive during the course of a failed abortion.* This amounts to infanticide, the killing either by direct

means or by neglect of an infant who is alive outside the womb. The law is silent on reducing the pain and suffering of infants, especially those being aborted late term.

Brothers and sisters, this law is an abomination that cries out to Heaven for justice. We cannot be silent in the face of such a blatant attack on the most vulnerable among us. I invite you to do several things:

1. **Stay informed and educated** regarding these issues and the battles ahead of us, such as assisted suicide and legalized surrogacy. Two outstanding resources available to you are:

2. **Get involved.** Both web pages listed above offer easy links to contacting your elected representatives. Let the Governor and our other elected officials know that this Act violates the dignity of the human person and that you do not support it.

Get involved in the efforts already underway at your parish, such as Respect Life Committees. In addition, our Diocesan Respect Life Office can direct you to ways that you can support and promote the sanctity of life locally, on Long Island.


3. **Pray.** Pray the Holy Rosary. Ask the intercession of Our Blessed Mother Mary, Protector of Mothers, Defender of Life and the Family, to strengthen us so that we may be compassionate, courageous witnesses to the truth. Ask also for the intercession of Saint Thomas More, patron of statesmen, politicians, lawyers and judges, who lost his life for refusing to renounce his conscience and give in to the tides of political power and privilege.

Pray for our elected officials and for all people and pray that our politicians come to understand their profound obligation to defend the most defenseless among us. Any Catholic who actively supports an attack on the sacredness of life, chooses to place him or herself in grave moral danger and outside of the Communion of the Church. We pray for their souls, for a spirit of repentance, for a return to the truth of the love of God. It is God's love that formed each one of us in our Mother's womb.

A civilization that not only will not protect, but actually celebrates an attack on its most vulnerable members is morally bankrupt and stands on the verge of collapse. We pray for the courage of the martyrs, that an awakened spirit of evangelization and voices raised together will move hearts and minds, and call us back to our God-given senses, to the God who made us, who loves us, and who offers us our eternal destiny in love.

Our Lady of Lourdes, pray for us!

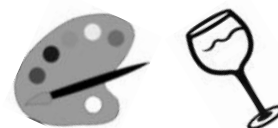

1 26:2,7-9ss Sal 102:1-4ss 1Cor 15:45-49 Lucas 6:27-38

Hoy se nos presenta la “regla de oro evangélica”: Traten a los demás como quieren que los traten a ustedes, porque si aman solo a los que les hacen el bien, ¿qué han de extraordinario? A primera vista, esto no necesitaría mayor explicación, pero hay que dársela, en el encabezado de la misma, Jesús ha dicho algo que cuando lo escuchamos nos desconcierta: Amen a sus enemigos, hagan el bien a los que los aborrecen, bendigan a quienes los maldicen y oren por quienes los difamen. La respuesta no es sencilla, pero la tiene, Jesús habla aquí de persecución por el Reino, por los valores del mismo, lo más sencillo para todo cristiano debería ser el desprendimiento respecto a los bienes materiales, y quizá después se esté en disposición para “realizar en nuestra vida esta Regla”....pues cumplida ya nos la entrego Jesús cuando en el Calvario dio la vida por nosotros †, pero él no se quedó en la muerte, Resucito y envió el E.S., no vamos a profundizar, viene la Cuaresma y tendremos tiempo para ello. Viene un tiempo maravilloso para reflexionar en el Misterio de nuestra salvación. Volvamos al principio de esta ‘nota’ pero en clave eclesiológica. San O. Romero hablaba que la esencia de la Iglesia es ser Una, Católica y Apostólica... y en esto estamos todos de acuerdo; dijo también que, a estas tres características de nuestra Iglesia, deberíamos agregar ‘una más’: la persecución, “pues, cuando la Iglesia es perseguida es señal de que está cumpliendo su misión” (Hom. 11/25/77), y es cierto que se acusa a la misma por sus pecados (¡!), pero también es verdadero que se la increpa por estar a favor de la vida (no al aborto), de la dignidad del ser humano (no a la eutanasia) y a defender la familia (matrimonio heterosexual), y sabemos que cada día, esto será mas complicado, ¡bienvenidos al club de Jesús y de Romero! Buen domingo.

### Tribute to Venerable Haitian Pierre Toussaint

From slavery to Sainthood, describes the onset of the article from the Associated Press. Seeing as February is the month in the US in which the works and contributions of African Americans, both past and present are highlighted, I thought it is important to bring light to the first black Saint to be of the Catholic Church. The referenced article gives detail to the tribute paid to the Venerable Haitian Pierre Toussaint by a Vincentian-born public school teacher, Dr Ann Sutherland, from Brooklyn, NY who details Toussaint's life and works.

Dr. Sutherland writes that the life of Toussaint "transcended from slavery to entrepreneur," adding that "throughout all, he performed great acts of charity, helping to enhance the lives of those who were in need."

Toussaint was born a slave in 1766 in the French colony of Saint Domingue, which is now modern-day Haiti. Pierre Toussaint himself worked as a house slave inside a plantation owned by Jean Berard. He was educated by the family's tutors, which was very unusual for the time. In 1787, during times of political unrest on the island of Saint Domingue, he was sent to New York for safekeeping by his master. Upon his arrival to New York, Toussaint was allowed to train as a hairdresser.

Freed in 1807 after the death of his mistress, Pierre took the surname of "Toussaint" in honor of the hero of the Haitian Revolution, which established the nation of Haiti (formerly Saint Domingue). Toussaint's works included opening his and his wife's home as an orphanage, employment bureau, taking in and nursing those suffering from yellow fever and a refuge for travelers. He also contributed funds and helped raise money to build the famous Saint Patrick's Cathedral on Mulberry Street in Manhattan, NY.

Evidence has shown Toussaint was a devout member of the Catholic Church. He was also one of the benefactors of the multi-national Catholic school in New York City called St. Vincent de Paul.

Toussaint died June 30, 1853 at 87. Following his passing various groups and individuals started to advocate for consideration for sainthood for Toussaint. In 1991, Cardinal John O'Connor sent the necessary documents to the Vatican. The cardinal also ordered his body exhumed, examined and reinterred in the present location of St. Patrick's Cathedral on Fifth Avenue, giving him the honor of being the first layman to be buried in the crypt below the main altar. Due to his devout and exemplary life, the Roman Catholic Church has been investigating his life for possible canonization and in 1996 he was declared "Venerable" by Pope John Paul II, the second step in the process of Sainthood.
