Dear Sisters and Brothers,



Last Sunday we were invited by the Scriptures to: "be holy, for I, the Lord, your God, am holy." Lev 19;2. Than by Jesus in the Gospel: "be perfect, just as your heavenly Father is perfect "Mt 5;48.

It is a high call that never expires for every human being. God remains totally committed to sharing with us all that he has; all the blessings of creation, all of his love and mercy. As St Paul tells us in letter to Hebrews 13;8 "Jesus Christ is this same yesterday, today and forever". So if the intensity of God's love and mercy is always great and constant in outpour for us, so no wander, that the Church continues to celebrate it and present it to us in continual way, for us to perceive it and to be transformed by it. Did we arrive yet at the holiness or at the perfection of God??? Until we do arrive at it, we need to ponder it with the aspiration to: acquire it, to be transformed by it, and to resemble it to the rest of the world. This process seems to be natural for the saints and hopefully it is natural for us, that we would allow Jesus' love to work its sanctification in us, that we would become more like him every day. Is that happening in your life ??? Are you becoming "like Jesus "; are you becoming "other Christ " for those around you ???

That is the call: to be holy, to be perfect as Jesus is the perfect image of God, so you and I should become the perfect image of Christ. Is that possible??? Is that realistic???

Jesus said: "love one another as I have loved you" Jn 13;34, he not only says that we should try to be nice, to be good to each other, to tolerate each other, to work together, to respect each other, not to hurt each other. Jesus clearly challenges us to love everyone, even our enemies. Are we there yet???

This is why we come to celebrate Ash Wednesday and Lent, in order to reawaken ourselves to the need of becoming like Jesus: holy and perfect as our heavenly Father is perfect and holy.

To get where Jesus got, we need to take the steps that Jesus took. With the first Sunday of Lent we look at the beginning of the ministry of Jesus. As the Gospel says: "Jesus was lead by the Spirit into the desert to be tempted by the devil". Wow, what a powerful statement! Who of us should think, that this would be the beginning of his public ministry, the beginning of his mission, the beginning of the path to glory of the resurrection???

I think we tend to forget how complex it was for Christ, to make all of those experiences that he made, to make the whole of his mission: to reveal who he is, and who God is, in regard to every human being.

We tend to choose what we like about Christ and his experiences, and we identify with those pleasant and glorious moments, putting aside the difficult moments as if they didn't exist. The reality is, that Jesus shows the strength of his character and the depth of his love, and his commitment to each one of us precisely in undergoing those difficult and terrible experiences, to the point of sacrificing his own life for the salvation of us all.

How much are we ready to sacrifice for our own salvation, and then for the salvation of others ??? Are we ready to sacrifice anything for the salvation of others ?, family ?, strangers ?, enemies ?, sinners ?

Are we ready to take on any: discomfort ?, pain ?, suffering ?, penance ? sacrifice ? Are we ready for the desert ??? Are we ready for fasting ??? 40 days ??? Every year ??? Just mentioning it all together seems too much. Imagine if we should incorporate it seriously into our life as a routine thing to do ???

We don't get tired of the thought of feasting with Jesus. We can do it every Sunday and we almost believe, that we should feast always, we should be happy always, and that only wonderful things should happen to us. We kind of give ourselves the right to be happy eternally starting at our birth. We just so easily forget how we were saved by Jesus, and Lent is supposed to help us to stand on the ground and realize, that we are not yet in heaven, and that Jesus is asking us for help in saving the world.

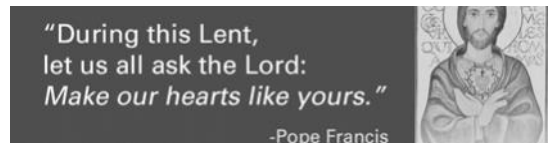
Lent is to awaken us to this reality. Will you collaborate with Jesus for the salvation of the world ??? Will you fast, do penance, pray, make sacrifices, suffer for Christ and for others ??? Big question. Make your big or small answer.

Queridas Hermanas y Hermanos,



El Domingo pasado fuimos invitados por la Escrituras a : "Se Santo, porque Yo, el Señor, Dios, soy santo". Lev. 19;2. Que por Jesus en el Evangelio "se perfecto, asi como tu Padre celestial es perfecto Mt 5;48. Es un llamado alto que nunca expira para cada ser humano. Dios sigue totalmente comprometido a compartir con nosotros todo lo que tiene; todas la bendiciones de la creación , todo su amor y misericordia. Como nos dice San Pablo en una carta a los Hebreos 13;8: "Jesucristo es el mismo ayer, hoy y siempre."

Entonces, si la intensidad del amor y la misericordia de Dios siempre es grande y constante para nosotros, entonces no es de extrañar que la Iglesia continúe celebrándolo y presentándonoslo continuamente, para que lo percibamos y seamos transformados por el.

¿Ya llegamos a la santidad o a la perfección de Dios?

Hasta que lleguemos a el, debemos meditarlo con la aspiración de: adquirirlo, ser transformado por el y parecerse al resto del mundo. Este proceso parece ser natural para los santos y esperamos que sea natural para nosotros, que permitamos que el amor de Jesus trabaje en su santificación en nosotros, que volvamos mas como el todos los días.

¿Eso esta sucediendo en tu vida? ¿Te esta volviendo "como Jesus"; ¿te estas convirtiendo en "otro Cristo" para los que te rodean?

Ese es el llamado: ser santo, ser perfecto, ya que Jesus es la imagen perfecta de Dios, para que tu y yo debamos convertirnos en la imagen perfecta de Cristo. ¿Es eso posible? ¿Eso es realista?

Jesus dijo: "amense los unos a los otros como yo los he amado" Jn 13,34, no solo dice que debemos tratar de ser amables para ser buenos los unos con los otros, para tolerarnos, trabajar juntos, respetarnos, para no lastimarse, Jesus claramente nos reta a amar a todos, incluso a nuestros enemigos. ¿Ya llegamos? Es por eso que venimos a celebrar el Miercoles de Ceniza y la Cuaresma, para despertarnos a la necesidad de llegar a ser como Jesus: santo y perfecto como nuestro Padre Celestial es perfecto y santo.

Para llegar a donde llego Jesus, debemos seguir los pasos que Jesus dio. Con el primer Domingo de Cuaresma miramos el comienzo del ministerio de Jesus. Como dice el Evangelio: "Jesus fue llevado por el Espiritu al desierto para ser tentado por el diablo" ¡Vaya, que declaración tan poderosa! ¿Quién de nosotros debería pensar que este seria el comienzo de su ministerio publico, el comienzo de su misión, el comienzo del camino hacia la gloria de la resurrección?

Creo que tendemos a olvidar lo complejo que fue para Cristo, hacer todas esas experiencias que hizo, cumplir toda su misión : revelar quien es el y quien es Dios, con respecto a cada ser humano. Tendemos a elegir lo que nos gusta de Cristo y sus experiencias, y nos identificamos con esos momentos agradables y gloriosos, dejando de lado los momentos difíciles como si no existieran. La realidad es que Jesus muestra la fuerza de sus personajes y la profundidad de su amor, y su compromiso con cada uno de nosotros precisamente para experimentar esas experiencias difíciles y terribles, hasta el punto de sacrificar su propia vida por la salvación de todos nosotros.

¿Cuánto estamos dispuestos a sacrificar por nuestra propia salvación, y luego por la salvación de otros?, ¿extraños? Enemigos?, pecadores?, ¿Estamos listos para enfrentarnos a alguna molestia?, ¿dolor?, ¿sufrimientos?, ¿penitencia?, ¿sacrificio?, estamos listos para el desierto? ¿Estamos listos para el ayuno? ¿40 días? ¿Todos los años???

Solo mencionarlo todo junto parece demasiado. ¿Imagina si lo incorporamos seriamente a nuestra vida como algo rutinario?

No nos cansamos de festejar con Jesus. Podemos hacerlo todos los Domingos y casi creemos que debemos que debemos darnos un festin siempre, debemos ser felices siempre y que solo nos pueden pasar cosas maravillosas. Nos damos el derecho de ser felices eternamente desde nuestro nacimiento. Tan fácilmente olvidamos como fuimos salvos por Jesus, y se supone que la Cuaresma nos ayudara a permanecer en el suelo y darnos cuenta de que todavía no estamos en el cielo, y que Jesus nos esta pidiendo ayuda para salvar el mundo.

La Cuaresma es para despertarnos a esta realidad. ¿Colaboraras con Jesus para la salvación del mundo?

¿Ayunaras, haras la oración, rezaras, haras sacrificios, sufrirás por Cristo y por los demás? Gran pregunta. Haga su gran o pequeña respuesta.

El tiempo de Cuaresma

La Cuaresma es preparar la Pascua. O mejor todavía: la Cuaresma es la primera parte del tiempo de Pascua, u tiempo que tiene su centro en los días santos de la muerte y la resurrección de Jesús, y que tiene su segunda parte en la Cincuentena, los cincuenta días de fiesta en honor del Señor resucitado que acaban con el día de Pentecostés.

Una buena manera de mirar este tiempo es verlo como la primera parte del ciclo pascual. El Miércoles de Ceniza comenzamos un camino que nos llevara a vivir y celebrar con gozo, largamente, la vida nueva de Jesús, que es nuestra propia vida.

De ahí, la pregunta que hay que hacerse a la hora de pensar en la Cuaresma es: ¿cómo procuraré yo, y como procuraremos en mi comunidad, que la celebración de la Pascua de este año sea verdadera? Seguro que, si la pregunta nos la hacemos así, el resultado será muy serio.

Nos daremos cuenta de que vivir la Pascua de manera verdadera comporta cambios en la propia vida, y cambios en la propia vida y cambios en la vida de la comunidad. Pero cambios que vayan a las raíces; cambios que, en definitiva, hagan que nuestra vida se acerque más a la vida de Jesús. Con conciencia de que el camino es un camino que siempre vuelve a comenzar, porque somos débiles y pecadores, pero con conciencia de que lo hacemos por Jesús y acompañados de Jesús: el objetivo no es un empeño ascético de mejora personal, ni es "quedar bien" con Dios a base de sacrificios; el objetivo es unirnos a Jesucristo renovando nuestra adhesión a el con la fe reafirmada, con una renovada participación en sus sacramentos, y con una vida de amor que intente parecerse a la suya.

Qu'est-ce que le Carême ?

Mercredi dernier, communément appelé, Mercredi des Cendres, nous débutons officiellement le Temps du Carême. Pendant ces 40 jours qui mènent à la fête de Pâques, nous allons fixer nos réflexions et prières sur le mystère de la Mort et de la Résurrection du Christ.

Le mot « carême » vient du latin « quadragesima » (quadragesime) qui veut dire quarantième. Il désigne la période de quarante jours pendant laquelle l'Eglise se prépare à Pâques par une vie chrétienne plus intense et par diverses pratiques de pénitence. Un voyage spirituel de quarante jours.

La durée du Carême – quarante jours sans compter les dimanches – fait en particulier référence aux quarante années passées au désert par le peuple d'Israël entre sa sortie d'Egypte et son entrée en terre promise. Elle renvoie aussi aux quarante jours passés par le Christ au désert entre son baptême et le début de sa vie publique. Ce chiffre de quarante symbolise les temps de préparation à de nouveaux commencements.

On peut ajouter que les quarante jours du Carême nous rappellent et vont nous permettre de revivre avec le Christ au désert les quarante années de la marche (de voyage) des Hébreux vers la Terre promise. Au long de ces années, le peuple que guidait Moïse eut souvent faim et soif. Parfois, il se découragea, mais il fit surtout l'expérience unique de la tendresse de Dieu envers lui.

C'est la même expérience d'intimité avec Dieu que souhaite revivre toute la communauté des croyants, baptisés ou candidats au baptême, alors qu'elle se met en route vers la Pâque, pour y trouver « la joie d'un cœur unifié » dans la communion au Christ mort et ressuscité. CHURCH IN NEED COLLECTION

The Church in Africa - although the Church in Africa is growing, many still lack access to basic resources and pastoral care. Many suffer due to high rates of poverty and unemployment, illiteracy, and poor education. The Solidarity Fund supports pastoral projects that foster lasting peace and reconciliation in a continent often marked by division and tension.

El Fondo de Solidaridad financia proyectos pastorales que fomentan la paz y la reconciliación duraderas en un continente que a menudo está marcado por división y tensión.

FAST & ABSTINENCE

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics.

In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59.

When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

Reflection on Lenten Fasting

If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily his Resurrection.

Q: What is a day of Fast and Abstinence?

Under current canon law in the Western Rite of the Church, a **day of fast** is one on which Catholics who are eighteen to sixty years old are required to keep a limited fast. In this country, one may eat a single, normal meal and have two snacks, so long as these snacks do not add up to a second meal. Children are not required to fast, but their parents must ensure they are properly educated in the spiritual practice of fasting. Those with medical conditions requiring a greater or more regular food intake can easily be dispensed from the requirement of fasting by their pastor. A **day of abstinence** is a day on which Catholics fourteen years or older are required to **abstain from eating meat**. Again, persons with special dietary needs can easily be dispensed by their pastor.

Each decennial census results determine how many seats your state gets in Congress. State and local officials use census counts to draw boundaries for districts like congressional districts, state legislative districts and municipal districts.

ANY ADDITIONAL PEOPLE LIVING OR STAYING

Our goal is to count people once, only once and in the right place according to where they live on Census Day. Keeping this goal in mind, we ask this question to ensure that everyone living at an address is counted.

OWNER/RENTER

We ask about whether a home is owned or rented to create statistics about

homeownership and renters. Homeownership rates serve as an indicator of the nation's economy and help in administering housing programs and informing planning decisions.

PHONE NUMBER

We ask for a phone number in case we need to contact you. We will never share your number and will only contact you if needed for official Census Bureau business.

Why We Ask

The 2020 Census is easy. The questions are simple.

NAME

We ask for names to ensure everyone in the house is counted. Listing the name of each person in the household helps respondents include all members, particularly in large households where a respondent may forget who was counted and who was not.

SEX

We ask about the sex of each person to create statistics about males and females. Census data about sex are used in planning and funding government programs, and in evaluating other government programs and policies to ensure they fairly and equitably serve the needs of males and females. These statistics are also used to enforce laws, regulations and policies against discrimination in government programs and in society.

AGE AND DATE OF BIRTH

We ask about age and date of birth to understand the size and characteristics of different age groups and to present other data by age. Local, state, tribal and federal agencies use age data to plan and fund government programs that provide assistance or services for specific age groups, such as children, working-age adults, women of childbearing age, or the older population. These statistics also help enforce laws, regulations and policies against age discrimination in government programs and in society.

HISPANIC, LATINO OR SPANISH ORIGIN

We ask about whether a person's of Hispanic, Latino or Spanish origin to create statistics

about this ethnic group. The data collected in this question are needed by federal agencies to monitor compliance with antidiscrimination provisions, such as under the Voting Rights Act and the Civil Rights Act.

RACE

We ask about a person's race to create statistics about race and to present other statistics by race groups. The data collected in this question are needed by federal agencies to monitor compliance with anti-discrimination provisions, such as under the Voting Rights Act and the Civil Rights Act. State governments use the data to determine congressional, state and local voting districts.

WHETHER A PERSON LIVES OR STAYS SOMEWHERE ELSE

Our goal is to count people once, only once and in the right place according to where they live on Census Day. Keeping this goal in mind, we ask this question to ensure individuals are not included at multiple addresses.

RELATIONSHIP

We ask about the relationship of each person in a household to one central person to create estimates about families, households and other groups. Relationship data are used in planning and funding government programs that provide funds or services for families, people living or raising children alone, grandparents living with grandchildren, or other households that qualify for additional assistance.

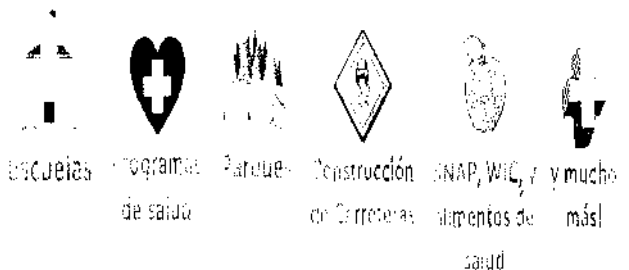
