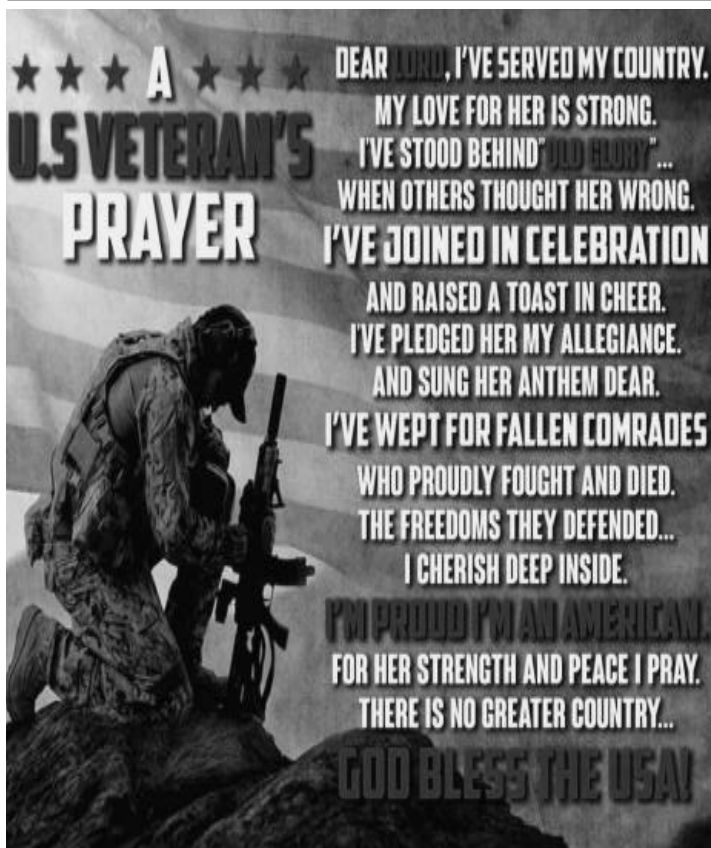

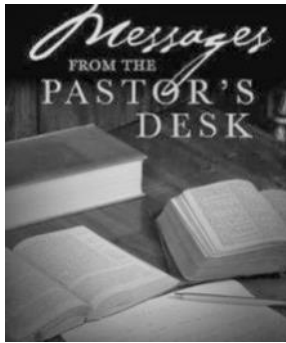

32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time



Dear Sisters and Brothers,

With the end of the Liturgical Year coming with the Feast of Christ the King on the last Sunday of November 24th, the Church proposes us reflection on the last things. The crystallization of the faith in regard to last things is revealed to us through the Old and New Testament. Jesus proclaims this teaching by words, deeds and by his own life, death and resurrection. "The last things are death,

judgment, heaven and hell.

Death is the separation of man's mortal body and immortal soul. It comes to all men as a result of original sin. It is a temporary state, for at the end of the world, all men shall rise again to be judged by Christ. Thus the whole man, body and soul, will be rewarded for the good or evil that he has done, body and soul, in this life.

At the moment of death, each human person is judged by God based on his conduct in this life, and goes immediately to his reward or punishment. Moreover, at the end of the world, Jesus Christ will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead. At that time, God's whole plan for the world shall be revealed, and his mercy and justice demonstrated.

Heaven is the eternal state of perfect happiness resulting from the face to face vision of God, which is the reward of those who have served Him in this life.

Hell is the eternal state of torment and despair which awaits those who, in this life, have freely rejected God and the happiness which He offers.

Before the end of the world, there will be an intermediate state called purgatory. There, those who are bound for heaven, but whose love for God is still marred by some imperfection, undergo a temporary period of purifying suffering. When this purification is complete, they are fit to enter God's presence and are admitted to the joys of heaven."

Then there will be the resurrection of the body; it is meant that at the end of the world the bodies of all men will rise from the earth and be united again to their souls, nevermore to be separated. No man knows when the world will end. The signs preceding the destruction of the world, as given in Scripture, are: wars, famine, pestilence, the coming of Antichrist, the darkening of the sun and moon, and the appearance of the cross in heaven.

Considering this teaching we realize that Jesus gave his life for it without hesitation. He surrendered his life for our sake and salvation to give us his example of how much he wants us to be with him in heaven. But we can see how difficult it was to teach and transmit that faith, to the point, that Jesus and many believers who followed him did offer their lives for it. Any martyr, starting with Jesus gave their life for the truth of the Gospel, that is for the truth of God's love and mercy and the truth of eternal life. In heaven we will be consumed or absorbed by personal relationship with God, being able to see God's glory in everything.

This is why specially in November the Church invites everyone to pray for all of our faithful departed, if necessary helping them to arrive in heaven. The best we can do for our departed is to offer a Mass for them, let the sacrifice of Jesus speed their purgatory if they were in need of God's mercy at the time of their death. The gift of flowers for the dead lasts for a few days, the gift of Mass is eternal. Then all other prayers and sacrifices are of real help in getting to the joy of heaven. May the souls of all the faithful departed through the mercy of God Rest In Peace!!! Amen !!!

Happy Veterans Day weekend to all !!! God bless all of our Veterans with good health and all blessings they need !!! We thank you for your service!!!

Queridas Hermanas y Hermanos.

Con el fin del Año Litúrgico con la Fiesta de Cristo Rey el ultimo Domingo de Noviembre 24, la Iglesia nos propone una reflexión sobre las ultimas cosas. La cristalización de la fe con respecto a las ultimas cosas se nos revela a traves del Antiguo y Nuevo Testamento. Jesús proclama esta enseñanza con palabras, hechos y con su propia vida, muerte y resurrección.

“Las ultimas cosas con muerte, juicio, cielo e infierno.”

La muerte es la separación del cuerpo mortal del hombre y el alma inmortal. Viene a todos los hombres como resultado del pecado original. Es un estado temporal, porque el fin del mundo, todos los hombres resucitaran para ser juzgados por Cristo. Así, todo el hombre, cuerpo y alma, será recompensado por el bien o el mal que ha hecho, cuerpo y alma, en vida.

En el momento de la muerte, cada persona humana es juzgada por Dios en función de sus conducta en esta vida, y va inmediatamente a su recompensa o castigo. Además, al fin del mundo, Jesucristo vendrá nuevamente en Gloria para vencer a los vivos y a los muertos. En ese momento, se revelara el plan de Dios para el mundo, y se demostrara su misericordia y justicia.

El cielo es el estado eterno de felicidad perfecta que resulta de la visión cara a cara del Dios, que es la recompensa de aquellos que le han servido en esta vida.

El infierno es el estado de tormento y desesperación que aguarda a quienes, en esta vida, han rechazado fielmente a Dios y la felicidad que El ofrece.

Ante del fin del mundo, Habrá un estado intermedio llamado purgatorio. Allí, aquellos que están destinados al cielo, pero que aman a Dios todavía se ven empañados por alguna imperfección, sufren un periodo temporal de sufrimiento purificador. Cuando se complete esta purificación, son aptos para confiar la presencia de Dios y son admitidos en las alegrías del cielo.

Entonces Habrá la resurrección del cuerpo; se quiere decir que al fin del mundo, los cuerpos de todos los hombres se levantarán de la tierra y se unirán nuevamente a sus almas, para nunca mas separarse. Nadie sabe cuando terminara el mundo. Los signos que presagian la destrucción del mundo, como se dan en la Escrituras, son: guerras, hambre, pestilencia, la vida del Anticristo, el oscurecimiento del sol y la luna, y la aparición de la cruz en el cielo. Esta es la razón por la cual, especialmente en Noviembre, la Iglesia invita a todos a orar por todos nuestros fieles difuntos, si es necesario, ayudándoles a llegar en el cielo. Lo mejor que podemos hacer por nuestros difuntos es ofrecerle una misa, dejar que el sacrificio de Jesús acelere su purgatorio si necesitaban la misericordia de Dios al momento de su muerte. El regalo de flores para los difuntos dura unos pocos días, el regalo de la misa es eterno. Entonces, todas las demás oraciones y sacrificios son de gran ayuda para llegar al gozo del cielo. ! Que las almas de todos los fieles partidos por la misericordia de Dios descansen en paz!!! Amen!!!

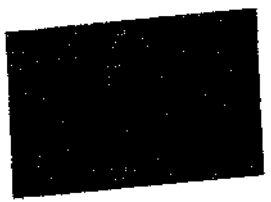

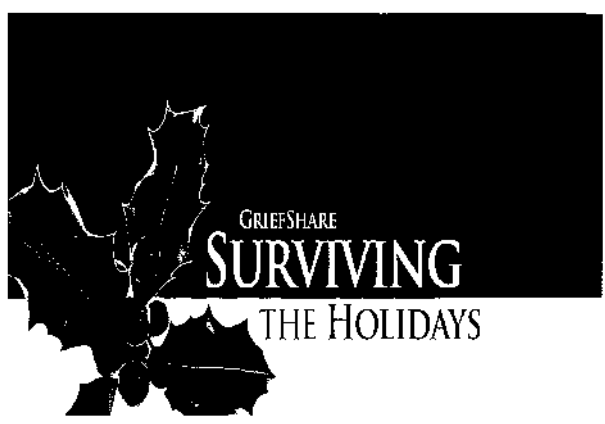

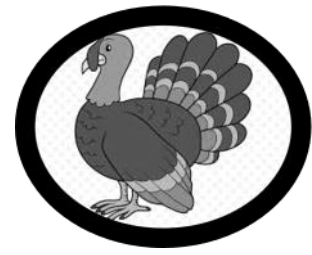

XXXII DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO
2 Mac 7;1-2,9-14 Sal 16 2Tes 2:16-3:5 Lc 20:27-38

Lo primero, este domingo, fijarnos que la 1L es de 2 Macabeos, este es uno de los siete libros que en la 'Biblia no-católica' está ausente. Dichos libros son: Libro de Tobías (Tobit), Libro de Judit, Libro de la Sabiduría, Eclesiastés (Sirácida), Libro de Baruc, 1 Macabeos y 2 Macabeos, privándose, por tanto, de una gran riqueza "sapiencial". El cuestionamiento viene al preguntarnos: ¿Qué hacer con una versión de la Biblia no-católica?, regálesela a alguien no-católico, y ya, o póngale un valor simbólico cuando haga venta de patio en el verano y dé lo colectado a la ofenda de los pobres en la parroquia.

Un elemento importante que resalta en 2 Mac 7 es el hecho de la resurrección de los muertos, aspecto mismo que los saduceos de Lc 20 no contemplan, dicho grupo era en el tiempo de Jesús la casta sacerdotal, entendamos que no se refiere al concepto de sacerdocio de nuestra Iglesia Católica. Los cuatro grupos religiosos eran: Escribas, Fariseos, Celotes y Saduceos.

Lc 20:27-38. Para afirmar la resurrección, Jesús va aclarar a los saduceos que el caso hipotético de una viuda está fuera de toda reflexión teológica, pues, una es la vida terrena y otra es la vida celeste, por lo cual, en el cielo nadie toma mujer o marido, el matrimonio es una realidad para este mundo. Sin embargo, tampoco es cierto el cristiano debe estar desvinculado de la realidad terrena, pues este mundo debería ser un reflejo de lo que encontraremos en el mas allá, por lo mismo, valores como el amor, la justicia, la misericordia...son prácticas de lo que luego se nos develará, la presencia de Dios, contemplar su semblante, enseñanza que nos da Sal 16. Estamos ya muy cerca del fin del año litúrgico. Feliz domingo.

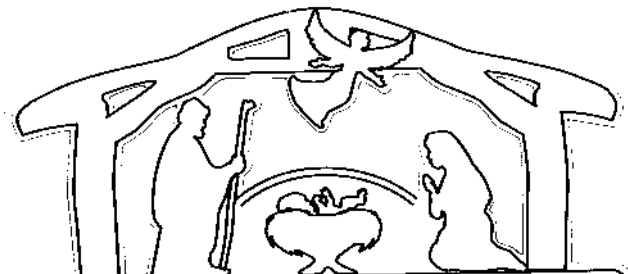
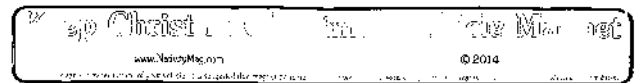
