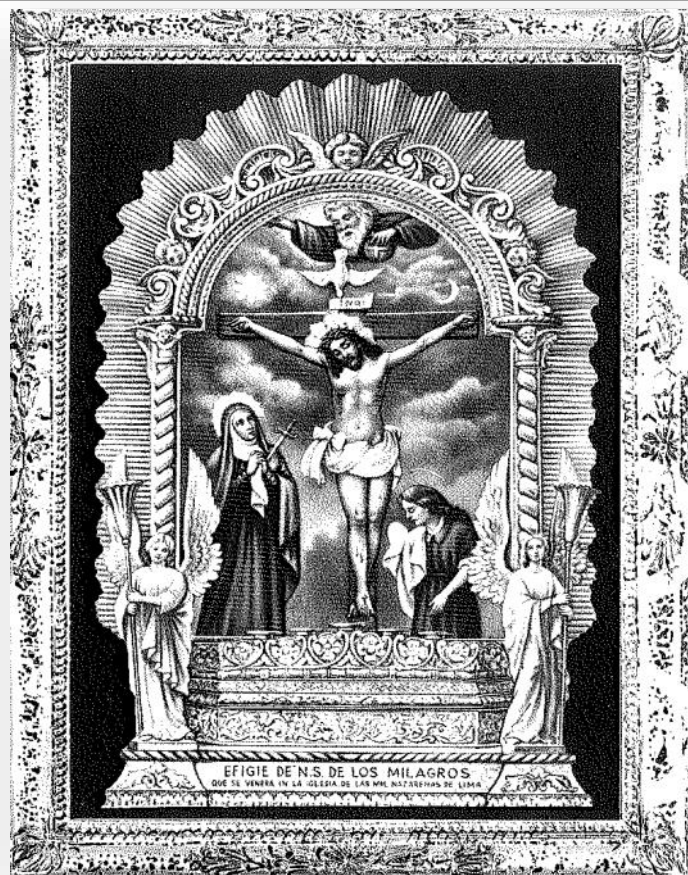

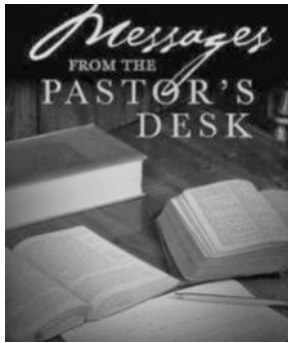

28th Sunday in Ordinary Time



Dear Sisters and Brothers,

The Gospel of this Sunday brings to us again the topic of prayer, that is our ongoing dialogue with God. As we come to God in worship and praise, adoration, admiration, gratitude, and thanksgiving, the biggest part of our prayers probably is taken by prayer of petition. It is us saying the most basic prayer and most fundamental, based in our own need for God and our daily needs, that are marked by our human limitations and our vulnerability.

It is when we can say most primitive and basic type of prayer seeking our own benefit, but when done in sincerity of heart, it proclaims the basic truth of one's dependence on God. We ask from God anything and everything that we perceive as our need, be it for ourselves or for others. After that basic level of prayer we may grow into the more sublime levels of prayer that I did mention above.

Jesus, when teaching us about prayer he never criticized this basic prayer of petition. In the prayer: Our Father - he pointed out to us recognition of God's holiness, plan and will; and then he goes right into the prayer of petition for our daily basic needs followed by need for God's mercy and defense from evil. The prayer "Our Father" is the basic and fundamental prayer including all other types of prayer and covering our essential needs before God. This prayer is said with understanding and love makes our prayer complete, mature and holy.

In the readings of this Sunday we see the need for faith and belief that will turn into actions of collaboration with the plan of God. Our loving and confident attachment to God in our needs shows our faith and its depth, and it is pleasing to God. As Jesus points in the Gospel that the evil judge hears the plea of a widow not because of his love, but because of his discomfort of having her disturbing his peace; so how much more good and loving God will give to the one that is asking in love and with perseverance?

In our first reading we see the faith of Moses brings, the blessing of God upon the battle field as fast as his raising of his hands in prayer to God. God's answer is immediate and dramatic, saving lives of many assuring the victory in war. Isn't it what the Blessed Mother told the children of Fatima about the prayer of the rosary stopping the war ??? And if so - bringing anything we need from God into our lives. But the basis is the faith, as Jesus states about his Second Coming: "will he find faith on earth?" at his return ???

Will you keep the faith ??? Will you share the faith ??? Will you live the faith ??? As Saint Paul tells us in the Second Reading encouraging us to hold on to the Word of God, that is wisdom of life, and salvation of our souls, useful to nourish us at every situation in life. Let's take this encouragement of Jesus and of St. Paul to heart, and surely it will make our hearts and lives more like theirs.

I want to thank everyone for last weeks events of Latino Heritage celebration and Worship Concert, both events manifesting God's power and love in sharing the blessings of God's love. This Saturday night we will celebrate Peruvian feast of The Lord of the Miracles, that is Christ Crucified. Let us enjoy the best of different spiritualities and cultures.

Queridas Hermanas y Hermanos.

El Evangelio de este Domingo nos trae nuevamente el tema de la oración, que es nuestro dialogo continuo con Dios. Como llegamos a Dios en la adoración y alabanza, adoración, admiración, gratitud y acción de gracias, la mayor parte de nuestra oración probablemente es tomada por la oración de petición. Podríamos decir la oración mas básica y mas fundamental, basada en nuestra propia necesidad de Dios y nuestras necesidades diarias, que están marcadas por nuestras limitaciones humanas y nuestra vulnerabilidad.

Podemos decir que el tipo mas primitivo y básico busca nuestro propio beneficio, pero cuando se hace con sinceridad de Corazón, proclama la verdad básica de la dependencia de Dios. Le pedimos a Dios cualquier cosa y todo lo que percibimos como nuestra necesidad, ya sea para nosotros o para los demás .

Después de ese nivel básico de oración, podemos llegar a los niveles mas sublimes de oración que mencione anteriormente.

Jesús, cuando nos enseñó sobre la oración, nunca critico esta oración básica de petición. En la oración: Padre Nuestro, señalo el reconocimiento de la santidad, el plan y la voluntad de Dios; y después va directamente a la oración de petición por nuestras necesidades básicas diarias, seguido por la necesidad de la misericordia de Dios y la defensa del mal. La oración "Padre Nuestro" es la oración básica y fundamental que incluye todos los otros tipos de oración y cubre nuestras necesidades esenciales ante Dios. Esta oración dicha con comprensión y amor hace que nuestra oración sea completa, madura y santa.

En las lecturas de este Domingo vemos la necesidad de fe y creencia que se convertirá en acciones de colaboración con el plan de Dios. Nuestro apego amoroso y confiado a Dios en nuestras necesidades muestra nuestra fe y su profundidad, y es agradable a Dios. Como Jesús señala en el Evangelio que el juez malvado escucha las suplicas de una viuda no por amor, sino por el disgusto que ella le causo al perturbar sus paz; cuanto, mas Dios Bueno y amoroso le dará al que le pide con amor y perseverancia?

En la primera lectura vemos la fe de Moisés que trae la bendición de Dios al campo de batalla tan rápido como levantar sus manos en oración a Dios. La respuesta de Dios es inmediata y dramática, salvando vidas de muchos asegurando la Victoria en la Guerra. No es lo que la Santísima Madre les dijo a los hijos de Fátima sobre la oración del Rosario que detiene la Guerra? Y si es así, traer todo lo que necesitamos de Dios a nuestras vidas. Pero la base es la fe, como dice Jesús acerca de su segunda venida: "encontrara fe en la tierra?" a su regreso? Mantendrá la fe? Compartirás la fe? Vivirá la fe?

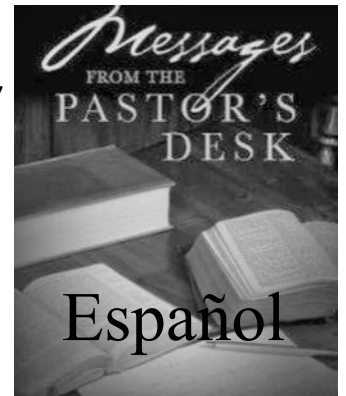

Kevin's presentations address the effects of abortion on men, couples and families and effective post abortion ministry for Clergy and Counselors.

The Rachel's Vineyard™ support group and retreat models are now offered in 49 states. The international outreach of Rachel's Vineyard is now in over 70 countries. The Retreat manual has been translated into 22 languages with other translations in progress. We offer over 1000 retreats annually worldwide.

Kevin is the author of *Tears of the Fisherman: Recovery for Men Wounded by Abortion* and *Sharing the Heart of Christ: Safe and Effective Post Abortion Ministry for Clergy and Counselors* co-authored with Theresa Burke and Fr. Frank Pavone.

He has contributed and authored articles on the trauma and recovery after abortion. Kevin has been a guest on EWTN's "At Home with Jim and Joy" and the "Gospel of Life" on Sky Angel Network. He is a regular guest on national radio shows.

Kevin formerly served as the administrator of Mother's Home, a crisis pregnancy residence that provides housing, computer job training and programs for women and their children. Kevin also worked as a clinical social work supervisor for Catholic Social Services in Philadelphia.

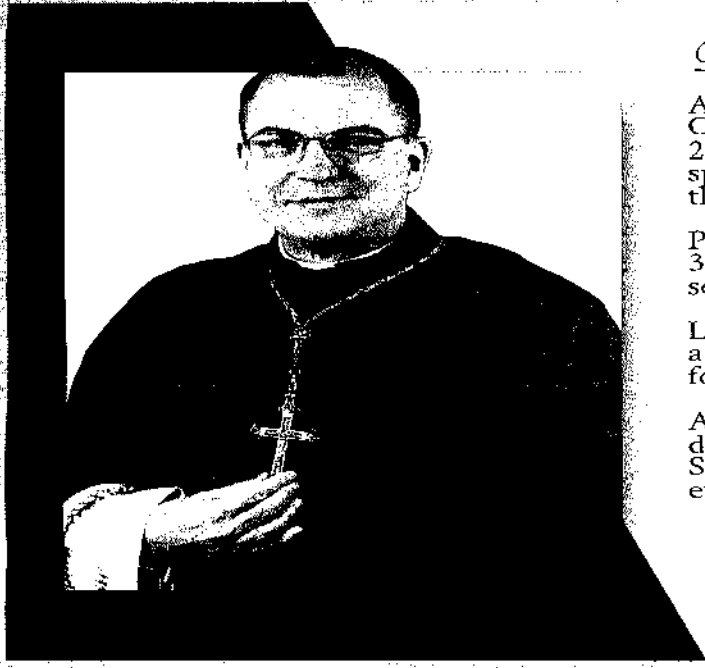

How the Diocese of Rockville Centre Has Been Addressing Child Protection and the Clergy Abuse Scandal



The sexual abuse of minors is a horrifying sin and a crisis in our society at large. Ever since the instance of the abuse of a child by a member of the clergy is far too many. However, it is a myth that the abuse crisis only exists in the Catholic Church. It is also a myth that the Church has done nothing to address this problem.

This does not diminish the shame of what occurred in the Church in the past. But, if we fail to see and deal with the reality of the sexual abuse of minors across all levels of society: in schools, hospitals, institutions, all religious and secular organizations, and especially in families, then we will fail in our duty to truly protect all children.

What does the Diocese do to protect children?

- All accusations of abuse (whether credible or not) made against any member of the clergy, employee or volunteer, are promptly reported to the district attorney's office, regardless of when the abuse may have occurred. This policy has been in place since 2003 in the Diocese of Rockville Centre.
- The diocese has released the names of all clergy, employees and volunteers that we are aware of having ever been accused of the sexual abuse of a minor (whether credible or not), to the proper law enforcement authorities.
- All priests, deacons, diocesan and parish employees, and volunteers are background screened.
- All priests, deacons, diocesan and parish employees and volunteers are required to attend the *VIRTUS* course: *Protecting God's Children*. Offered in multiple languages, these classes are designed to educate everyone in the Church on the prevention of child sexual abuse, making participants aware of the signs of abuse, the methods used by offenders to commit abuse and steps used to prevent such abuse.
- Children attending parish faith formation programs are taught safety awareness through the program: *Think First & Stay Safe: Child Safety Prevention*. Youth enrolled in diocesan elementary and high schools receive safety awareness training beginning with nursery school and continuing throughout high school.
- Rigorous psychological screening is done for all men discerning vocations to the priesthood, and this continues throughout the five-year period of seminary formation. In addition, all seminarians receive training in diocesan child protection policies.
- Codes of Conduct have been published and mandated for all clergy, employees, volunteers and youth, to clearly define what is and what is not acceptable when interacting with children and young adults.
- In 2003, the Diocese of Rockville Centre established an Office for the Protection of Children and Young People. This Office works collaboratively with other Diocesan offices to ensure the safety and well-being of children, youth and vulnerable adults.
- A longstanding Diocesan Review Board (DRB), comprised mostly of lay men and women with expertise in the fields of psychiatry, law enforcement, jurisprudence, psychology and expertise in sexual abuse of minors/child protection, functions as a consultative body advising the Bishop. The DRB helps in the assessment of reports of sexual abuse of minors and advises the Bishop in the determination of the cleric's suitability for ministry.
- Since the inception of audit reviews in 2003, the Diocese has participated in 14 audits and found to be in compliance with standards as outlined in the Charter for the Protection of Children & Young People for each audit period.

What does the Diocese do for victim survivors of child sexual abuse?

- The Office for the Protection of Children and Young People has a three-fold mission:
 - To promote healing and reconciliation with the victims/survivors of sexual abuse of minors
 - To ensure the protection of the faithful for the future
 - To ensure the accountability of our procedures
- We have a dedicated phone line for reporting abuse (516)594-9063. All allegations are responded to within 24 hours of the report. Outreach to the victim survivor is initiated, counseling assistance is offered to survivors and, when appropriate, to family members, and a determination is made regarding the necessity of additional support services.
- The Diocesan Victims Assistance Coordinator is available for the immediate pastoral care of persons who report having been sexually abused as a minor by a "yone working for the Church".
- In 2017 the Diocese of Rockville Centre initiated the Independent Reconciliation and Compensation Program (IRCP) to offer an opportunity for some measure of healing and justice to those who were abused by diocesan clergy. The IRCP program allows survivors of clergy sexual abuse to file confidential claims and receive financial compensation. It continues to offer survivors a confidential option for reconciliation. To date, 370 people have filed claims with our IRCP. The vast majority of claimants - 277 to be exact - have accepted compensation totaling just over \$53 million, with 75 - 80 claims still being processed. This program is currently ongoing.

Facts:

Independent analysis by John Jay College of Criminal Justice and the Center for Applied Research in the Apostolate (CARA) at Georgetown University confirm that the vast majority of reported offenses took place between the 1960's and 1980's, then declined sharply. The allegations that we have received in the Diocese of Rockville Centre follow that same pattern.

Since the year 2015, nationwide there have been only 17 reported cases of current clerical sexual abuse in the Catholic Church as reported by CARA. In the Diocese of Rockville Centre during that same time there have been zero reports of a current incident of clergy sexual abuse. This shows that the efforts of the Catholic Church for many years now throughout the country, and in the Diocese of Rockville Centre, have been working.

The Work that Must Continue

The work of the Church - of administering the Sacraments, of preaching the Gospel, teaching, healing, advocating, serving, and ministering to the poor and vulnerable - can and must continue, despite the sins of the past.

The months and years ahead of us will require perseverance and prayer if we are to emerge as a Church even more dedicated to Christ's saving mission. We are reminded to look to Mary our Mother and draw courage from the one who did not look away from her suffering Son. She waited patiently, suffered with him, and shared in his victory over sin and death.

This is the same Mary who, as Mother of the Church, gathered with the Apostles in the locked room, waiting for the power of the Holy Spirit to descend at Pentecost. As we enter a time of Paschal Mystery suffering, may Mary guide us, so that together we may continue to carry out the mission of her Son: the building up of the Kingdom of God throughout Long Island and the world.
