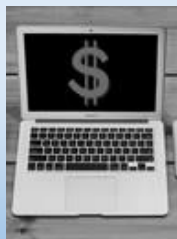

## 15th Sunday in Ordinary Time



*Dear Sisters and Brothers,*

*We are so blessed with the beautiful weather of the summer, and I am hopeful that you are enjoying every day of it, after being confined in movements, because of the virus. Hopefully you can use the barbecue to cook outside, the pools to cool down with the heat wave, or go to the beach or even enjoy the working air-conditioning at home. As we take this vacation mode, we continue to be careful about social distancing, as a way to protect ourselves and others from the virus. Let's continue to use masks in public, so we help to eliminate the virus.*



*Coming to church, we have at disposal the sanitizers for the purpose of keeping our hands clean, right at the entrances to the church and before Holy Communion. We continue to celebrate the extra Masses Sunday afternoon in Spanish at 3:00pm and at 6:00pm with the 5:00pm English Mass. It gives us opportunity to participate at Mass with plenty of space around for social distancing. I am so proud of all of you, that we were able to accomplish this spread of attendance to 4 Spanish, 4 English and Creole Masses, with all your collaboration. Our attendance last weekend was around 900 persons in all nine Masses, so you can see how much space we have. At 33% we could accommodate 400 persons in our church at Mass, so keep inviting your family and friends back to Mass on weekends.*

*Let's change the world by changing our hearts, by making them stronger in doing good, in taking care of our families and our community. Let's become more aware of God's Love in our lives, as it makes us happy persons. It is happiness to perceive love of God and love of others. This is the way to spend our lives: by loving ourselves in mercy and forgiveness, by allowing God and others to love us, and by loving them in return.*

*In this pandemic for example, it was the strangers that cared for the sick in the hospitals, the family members were not allowed. The sickness made people totally dependent with their whole lives, on people they never met before. We never thought that it would happen, we always thought that we can be there for our loved ones. How difficult it is for those who lost their loved ones in this time, without the possibility of carrying for them, or having a normal funeral after? We hope we never see it again, but we are aware how present the virus is, still around the world. This is why let's keep praying for the whole world to be free of virus, and ready to love God and neighbor.*

*The readings of this Sunday tell us of the fruitfulness of God's word, that accomplishes purpose by its power coming from its source. As every drop of water accomplishes God's will in multiple tasks on earth and returns to the heavens, so much more God's word. As St. Paul says: "the sufferings of the present time are as nothing compared with the glory to be revealed for us". Those blessings, God's power, God's glory is in our reach, and all of us are invited to share in it by entering into a friendship with Christ. How blessed are we to have this invitation of Christ open to us? "Come all you who are burdened and I will give you rest!"*

*In the Gospel, Jesus gives us the parable of the sower, and challenges us to reflect on what kind of soil is my heart??? What kind of soil is my life??? Is there a place in my heart and life for the word of God, to take roots and bring fruits and harvest ??? What fruits did my life bring to God ??? What did I offer to God after expecting everything from Him ??? If I would be called to go to God today, what would I present to him as a fruit of my life ???*

*Jesus puts this parable for us, to reflect on the beauty of the fruitfulness that God brings to those who accept his Word. Each one of us needs to answer the previous questions, if one is looking to harvest the power of God's love.*

Queridas Hermanas y Hermanos,

Estamos muy bendecidos con el hermoso clima del verano, y espero que disfruten todos los días, después de estar confinados en sus casas todos los días, debido al virus. Esperemos que pueda utilizar la barbacoa para cocinar al aire libre, la piscina para refrescarse con la ola de calor, o ir a la playa o incluso disfrutar del aire acondicionado en casa. A medida tomamos este modo de vacaciones, seguimos teniendo cuidados con el distanciamiento social, como una forma de protegernos a nosotros mismos y a otros del virus. Sigamos usando mascararas en publico, por lo que ayudamos a eliminar el virus.



Al llegar a la Iglesia, tenemos a disposición los desinfectantes con el propósito de mantener nuestras manos limpias, justo en la entrada de la Iglesia y antes de la Sagrada Comunión. Continuamos celebrando Misas adicionales el Domingo por la tardes en Español a las 3:00 pm y a las 6:15 pm con las Misa en Ingles a la 5:00pm. Nos da la oportunidad de participar en la Misa con mucho espacio para el distanciamiento social. Estoy tan orgulloso de todos ustedes, que pudimos lograr esta distribución de asistencia a 4 Misas en Español, 4 en Ingles y Creole, con todas sus colaboración Nuestra asistencia el fin de semana pasado fue de alrededor 900 personas en las nueve Misas, por lo que pueden ver cuanto espacio tenemos. Con un 33% podríamos acomodar a 400 personas en nuestra iglesia en la Misa, así que sigan invitando a su familia y amigos a la Misa los fines de semana.

Cambiamos el mundo cambiando nuestros corazones, haciéndolos mas fuertes para hacer el bien, para cuidar de nuestras familias y nuestra comunidad. Seamos mas conscientes del Amor de Dios en nuestras comunidad. Seamos mas conscientes del Amor de Dios en nuestras vidas, ya que nos hace personas felices. Es felicidad percibir el amor a Dios y el amor a los demás. Esta es la manera de gastar nuestras vidas: amándonos a nosotros mismos en misericordia y perdón, permitiendo que Dios y los demás nos amen y amándonos a cambio.

En esta pandemia, por ejemplo, fueron las personas desconocidas los que cuidaron a los enfermos en los hospitales, a los miembros de la familia no se les permitió. La enfermedad hizo que las personas fueran totalmente dependientes de toda la vida, de personas que nunca habían conocido antes. Nunca pensamos que sucedería, siempre pensamos que podemos estar allí para nuestros seres queridos.

¿Qué tan difícil es para aquellos que perdieron a sus seres queridos en este momento, sin la posibilidad de llevarlos a tener un funeral normal después? Esperamos no volver a verlo nunca mas, pero somos conscientes de la presencia del virus en todo el mundo. Es por eso que sigamos orando para que todo el mundo sea libre del virus y este listo para amar a Dios y al prójimo.

Las lecturas de este Domingo nos hablan de la fecundidad de la palabra de Dios, que cumple su propósito con su poder proveniente de su fuente. Como cada gota de agua cumple la voluntad de Dios en múltiples tareas en la tierra y regresa a los cielos, mucha mas palabra de Dios. Como dice San Pablo: “los sufrimientos de la actualidad no son nada comparados con la gloria que se nos revelara”. Esas bendiciones, el poder de Dios, la gloria de Dios esta a nuestro alcance, y todos estamos invitados a compartirla entrando en amistad con Cristo. ¿Cuan bendecidos somos de tener esta invitación de Cristo abierta para nosotros? “¡Vengan todos ustedes que están agobiados y les daré su descanso!”

En el Evangelio, Jesús nos da la parábola del sembrador y nos desafía a reflexionar sobre que tipo de tierra es mi corazón . ¿Qué tipo de suelo es mi vida? ¿Hay lugar en mi corazón y vida para la palabra de Dios, para echar raíces y traer frutos y cosechar? ¿Qué frutos trajo mi vida a Dios? ¿Qué le ofrecí a Dios después de esperar todo de El? Si me llamaran para ir a Dios hoy, ¿Qué le presentaría como fruto de mi vida?

Jesús pone esta parábola para nosotros, para reflexionar sobre la belleza de la fecundidad que Dios causa a quienes aceptan su Palabra. Cada uno de nosotros necesita responder las preguntas anteriores, si esta buscando cosechar el poder del amor de Dios.

## La parabole du semeur (Mt 13, 1-23)

Cette parabole des terrains veut faire réfléchir sur la manière dont chacun écoute la Parole de Dieu et donne chance à cette semence de se développer jusqu'aux fruits du Royaume. En effet, Jésus offre à tous cette même et bonne semence : pourquoi ne produit-elle pas en tous de bons résultats ? Parce que chaque auditeur est un terrain particulier. Et pourtant chacun peut devenir cette terre généreuse dans laquelle la semence pourra fructifier.

La semence, pour Matthieu, est la parole du Royaume. La parole de Jésus qui, à la fois, annonce et instaure le Royaume. L'absence de racine est le manque de confiance dans les situations difficiles. L'être humain tend à tout laisser quand cela va mal. Les épines symbolisent les passions et les soucis (v.22) que dénonçait le Sermon sur la montagne (cf. 6, 19-34), tout ce qui accapare l'homme tourné vers le profit et l'empêche d'être 'rentable' dans son engagement à la suite du Christ. L'idéal de la 'bonne terre' pour Matthieu, c'est d'entendre, de comprendre la parole, de s'ouvrir et de se soumettre à ce qu'elle demande de faire, et de porter du fruit chacun à la mesure de ses capacités, comme le mentionnera la parabole des talents (Mt 25, 14-30)

**DOMINGO XV DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO**

**Mt 13:1-9**

Entonces Jesús les habló de muchas cosas en parábolas y les dijo: Una vez, salió un sembrador, y al ir arrojando la semilla, unos granos cayeron a lo largo del camino; vinieron los pájaros y se los comieron. Otros granos cayeron en terreno pedregoso, que tenía poca tierra; ahí germinaron pronto, porque la tierra no era gruesa; pero cuando subió el sol, los brotes se marchitaron, y como no tenían raíces, se secaron. Otros cayeron entre espinos, y cuando los espinos crecieron, sofocaron las plantitas. Otros granos cayeron en tierra buena y dieron fruto: unos, ciento por uno; otros, sesenta; y otros treinta. El que tenga oídos, que oiga”.

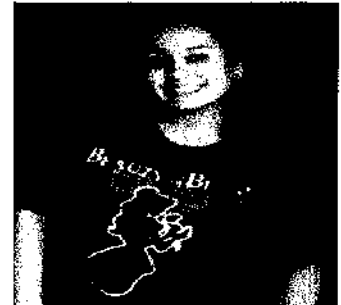
Se ha transcrito la segunda parte del Evangelio dominical con una intención, determinar de que “manera nos podemos aproximar a la Palabra de Dios”. Uno de los recursos más valiosos que se tienen son las “imágenes” o recursos “estéticos”, sean estos: literarios (cuentos y parábolas), la pintura, la escultura y muchos otros, de todos ellos ha echado mano la Iglesia a través del tiempo. Concretamente, Jesús “enseñaba en parábolas”, en el lenguaje que la gente sencilla podía entender, usaba ejemplos de la vida cotidiana, en este caso del ambiente rural de los oyentes.

**Aplicación.** ¿Cómo hablar de forma “estética” de la higiene en el Templo? de la necesidad de “saturarse” las manos (al entrar y antes de recibir la comunión), de mantener puesta la “mascarilla” todo el tiempo y de mantener la “distancia física” recomendada, ¿Cómo explicárselo al que no lo entiende? Les queda de tarea.
