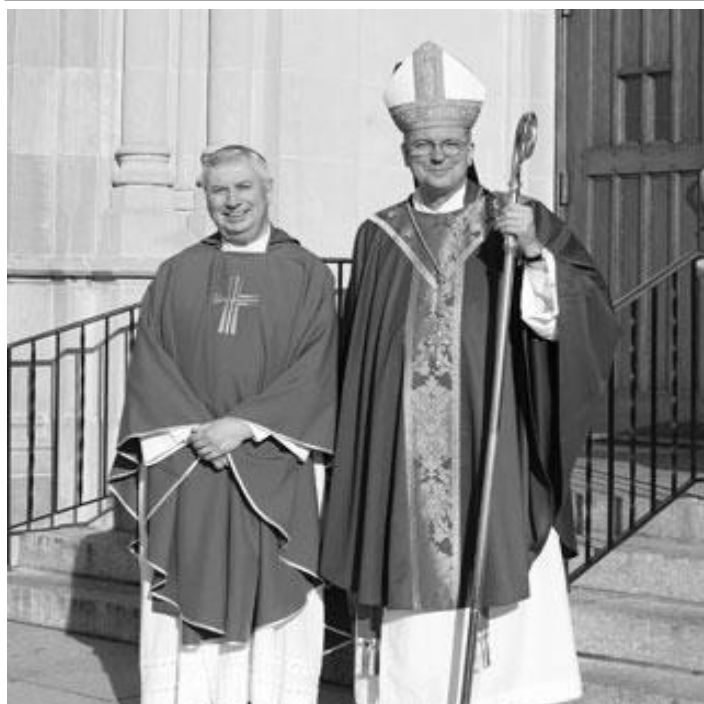

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Lent it is a great season of Jesus revelation of who he is as God and man, who he is for every person, and how far would he go for you and me to be saved. This is why right from the beginning of Lent, Jesus tells us how through: prayer, fasting and almsgiving we maintain open communication with God, ready to receive his love, and give God space in our hearts and our lives. Those three things show our positive disposition and readiness to receive God.

Right after that first request for our open hearts on Ash Wednesday, Jesus shows us his way of getting ready to give himself to all of us, by talking upon himself the temptation and evil of the world, by his own fast and prayer for 40 days in the desert. Showing his commitment and perseverance against the evil, Jesus encourages us to persevere in our Lenten commitment to sacrifice something that we promised to him and to ourselves.

Did you choose your Lenten sacrifice yet ??? Choose it and keep it !!! Don't loose or waist the time. If it was good for Jesus, it will be good for you and me to do something, smaller or bigger as your heart tells you. If we want God to take us seriously, so let's take our commitment to God seriously as well. Only than we can expect something big to happen. God doesn't want to give himself just as little as possible to us, but he wants to give himself totally to us, the question is only: are we ready to receive him ??? Are we ready to handle his greatness and power with which he comes ??? Are we ready to handle the desert experience??? Are we humble enough to resist the temptation of the devil as Jesus did ???

If we will pass the test of the desert, then we will be better prepared to handle the glory of God, being invited by Christ to claim the mountain of Transfiguration. God's glory is overwhelming, fulfilling, transforming ones life and faith. It opens new horizons of faith and life. It shows the humans the perspective of God. Don't we all want to see the things that God sees and knows ??? Than, let us cross the desert of temptation to the god's mountain of revelation, of Transfiguration.

Don't we all have desire to know the mysteries of God and to see the glory of heaven ??? If yes, than let's claim that mountain of sacrifice, self negation and penance, and Christ will share with us his glory. Often we want to see the glory, but we don't want the effort of claiming the mountain. God's glory is reachable for those who are persevering in obtaining it.

It is only in year 1953, that the highest mountain of the earth, the Mont Everest was claimed for the first time. Imagine how long humanity waited for the capacity to make it happen physically. It was only after many failed attempts. First time in the existence of the earth. Isn't it incredible how long it took whole humanity to figure it out how to make it ??? No wonder why, there is a mystery and mysticism about the mountains, if they are so hard to reach ? No wander that it is so fascinating, that many people risked their lives and even lost it, trying to reach that knowledge and experience. How much more valuable is the knowledge of heavenly mountain, to which Jesus invites us in Lent and Easter???

To claim the highest mountain of the earth, would be the most incredible thing to experience, and than to see for oneself the perspective that only God and very few people can see- isn't it fascinating ???

How much more fascinating is to see what the glory of the resurrection has to show us, if only we could get to heaven and see what God sees, and what Christ wants us to see - how fascinating that must be ???

This is the Lenten path, this is why it is worth making, it is worth trying, it is worth risking to get there earlier, than to wait passively for the end of our lives journey. Simply it is incredible. As St Paul says: "Eye has not seen, nor ear heard, Nor have entered into the heart of man The things which God has prepared for those who love Him." 1 Corinthians 2:9.

We know St. Paul was blinded, only to be enlightened by Christ, and was given the revelation of that knowledge of God's glory. That experience transformed his life and set his heart on the things of heaven, considering the knowledge of God the supreme undeserved gift from Christ.

The sacrifice of Lent is meant to bring us to the experience of heaven. Have a fruitful Lent and be brought to the vision of heaven.

If we merit it, we will get there after our death, but if we follow the Lenten observance we may experience the glory of God even this Easter.

Queridas Hermanas y Hermanos,



La Cuaresma es una gran temporada de la revelación de Jesús de quien es el como Dios y hombre, quien es para cada persona, y hasta donde llegaría para que usted y yo seamos salvos. Es por eso que desde el comienzo de la Cuaresma, Jesús nos dice como: a través de la oración, el ayuno y la limosna, mantenemos una comunicación abierta con Dios, listos para recibir su amor y darle espacio a Dios en nuestros corazones y nuestras vidas. Esas tres cosas muestran nuestra disposición positiva y disposición para recibir a Dios.

Justo después de esta primera solicitud de nuestros corazones abiertos el Miércoles de Ceniza, Jesús nos muestra su manera de prepararse para entregarse a todos nosotros, hablando sobre si mismo la tentación y el mal del mundo, por su propio ayuno y oración durante 40 días, en el desierto. Elegiste tu sacrificio cuaresmal ya? !Elígelo y guárdalo! No pierdas ni pierdas el tiempo. Si fue Bueno para Jesús, será bueno para ti y para mi hacer algo, mas pequeño o mas grande como tu Corazón te lo diga. Si queremos que Dios nos tome en serio, entonces tomemos nuestro compromiso con Dios en serio también. Solo de lo que podemos esperar que suceda algo grande. Dios nos quiere entregarse lo menos posible a nosotros, pero quiere entregarse totalmente a nosotros, la pregunta es solo: Estamos listos para recibirlos? Estamos listos para manejar su grandeza y poder con el que viene? Estamos listos para manejar la experiencia del desierto? Somos lo suficientemente humildes para resistir la tentación del diablo como lo hizo Jesús?

Si pasamos la prueba del desierto, entonces estaremos mejor preparados para manejar la Gloria de Dios, siendo invitados por Cristo a reclamar la montaña de la Transfiguración. La Gloria de Dios es abrumadora, satisfactoria, que transforma la vida y la fe. Abre nuevos horizontes de fe y vida. Muestra a los humanos la perspectiva de Dios. No todos queremos ver las cosas que Dios ve y sabe? Entonces, crucemos el desierto de la tentación hacia la montaña de la revelación del Dios, de la Transfiguración.

No todos deseamos conocer los ministerios de Dios y ver la Gloria del cielo? Si es asi, entonces reclamemos la montaña de sacrificio, auto negación y penitencia, y Cristo compartirá con nosotros su Gloria. A menudo queremos ver la Gloria, pero no queremos el esfuerzo de reclamar la montaña. La Gloria de Dios es accesible para aquellos que perseveran en obtenerla.

Fue solo en el año 1953, que la montaña mas alta de la tierra, el Monte Everest, fue reclamada por primera vez. Imagine cuanto tiempo la humanidad espero la capacidad de hacer que suceda físicamente. Fue solo después de muchos intentos fallidos. Primero en la existencia de la tierra. No es increíble cuanto tiempo le llevo a toda la humanidad descubrir como hacerlo? No es de extrañar porque, hay un misterio y misticismo acerca de la montaña, si son tan difíciles de alcanzar. No es de extrañar que sea tan fascinante, que muchas personas arriesgaron sus vidas e incluso la perdieron, tratando de alcanzar es conocimiento y experiencia. Cuanto mas valioso es el conocimiento de la montaña celestial, a la que Jesús nos invita en Cuaresma y Pascua?

Para reclamar la montaña mas alta de la tierra, seria lo mas increíble de experimentar, y que ver por si mismo la perspectiva que solo Dios y muy pocas personas pueden ver, No es fascinante? Que tanto mas fascinante que ver lo que la Gloria de la resurrección tiene para mostrarnos, si tan solo pudiéramos llegar al cielo y ver lo que Dios ve y lo que Cristo quiere que veamos, que tan fascinante debe ser? Este es el camino de la Cuaresma, es por eso que vale la pena hacerlo, vale la pena intentarlo, vale la pena arriesgarse a llegar antes que esperar pasivamente el final del viaje de nuestras vidas. Simplemente es increíble. Como dice San Pablo: "El ojo no ha visto, ni el oído ha oído, ni ha entrado en el Corazón del hombre las cosas que Dios ha preparado para los que aman" 1 Corintios 2:9.

Sabemos que San Pablo fue cegado, solo para ser iluminado por Cristo, y se le dio la revelación de ese conocimiento de la Gloria de Dios. Esa experiencia transformo su vida y puso su Corazón en las cosas del cielo, considerando el conocimiento de Dios como el regalo inmerecido supremo de Cristo.

El sacrificio de la Cuaresma tiene la intención de llevarnos a la experiencia del cielo. Tener una Cuaresma fructífera y ser llevado a la visión del cielo.

El tiempo de Cuaresma (II)

El tiempo de Cuaresma nació marcado por dos hechos sacramentales: era el tiempo en que los que querían bautizarse culminaban su preparación para celebrar el Bautismo en la Vigilia Pascual (¡el día de la resurrección de Jesucristo es el mejor día para incorporarse a su vida nueva!); y era el tiempo en el que los pecadores (los que habían roto gravemente la comunión eclesial con su comportamiento) hacían penitencia para ser reconciliados el Jueves Santo y volver así a la comunidad.

El eco de estos dos sacramentos marca también nuestra Cuaresma: es tiempo para reconciliarnos con Dios (y hace bien celebrar la penitencia comunitariamente al final del tiempo) y es tiempo de renovar nuestro bautismo en la Vigilia Pascual.

Y este camino culminará con un tercer sacramento, el sacramento de la presencia constante de Jesús resucitado en medio de nosotros: la Eucaristía. Porque la Eucaristía de la noche de Pascua es, efectivamente, el momento culminante de todo nuestro camino cristiano.

La Cuaresma comienza, como una preparación, el Miércoles de Ceniza, y más solemnemente el primer domingo de Cuaresma. Y acaba el Jueves Santo al mediodía: en la tarde del Jueves Santo, con la misa de la Cena del Señor nos introducimos en el Triduo Pascual, los días de la muerte, la sepultura y la resurrección del Señor. La Cuaresma dura cuarenta días, que evocan los cuarenta días de Jesús en el desierto antes de comenzar su misión, y los cuarenta años del pueblo de Israel, también en el desierto, de camino hacia la tierra prometida.

Quel comportement le fidèle catholique doit-il avoir pendant ce temps de carême ?

L'Eglise invite les chrétiens à se donner davantage à la prière, à combattre nos vices et en étant attentif au prochain.

Pendant ce temps de carême, il convient de prendre le temps de nous recueillir, même dans une vie agitée et remplie de beaucoup d'activités. Prier à l'image de Jésus lui-même qui, dans une vie très active, savait prendre du temps, loin de la foule, pour prier. Prendre du temps pour lire la Parole de Dieu, la méditer. Cela voudra dire que l'on éteint la télévision, on coupe la radio, et l'on évite d'être trop dépendant de son téléphone. Se décider à prendre chaque jour du temps pour la prière, il s'agit de voir son emploi du temps et se décider à sortir de la superficialité de certains emplois de temps pour donner la priorité à l'essentiel.


Prendre le temps de la Lectio Divina (une lecture priante de la parole de Dieu). COME MEET PAUL MONTENERO SPEAKING ON:
**Who is Being Called in Caravaggio's,
"The Calling of Saint Matthew"**



Michelangelo Merisi da Caravaggio (known simply as Caravaggio), was one of the main artists who pioneered the new style in Italian art known as Baroque. In Rome, in the Contarelli Chapel of the Church of St. Louis of the French, you will see what many consider his finest painting: "The Calling of Saint Matthew." The scene brings the moment where Jesus called Matthew to follow him to a sudden standstill. In this frozen scene, Caravaggio illuminates numerous messages about being called and the one calling us. Many who have discerned a call to serve God, pray in front of an image of this masterpiece (including our presenter). Like the chiaroscuro style he mastered so well, Caravaggio's life was a struggle between his immoral deeds and the deeply spiritual works he created.

PAUL MONTENERO'S BIO

Paul Montenero has produced and delivered many different Catholic-themed art presentations to several parishes and organizations. He has used art to bring many closer to God by deepening the experience of prayer in topics such as: the Stations of the Cross, the theology of the Crucifixion, and the history and mystery of the image of Our Lady of Guadalupe. The art of Caravaggio has been a favorite of Paul's, and he has studied this particular piece extensively. Paul is nearing the completion of his MA in Theology at the Immaculate Conception Seminary, where he has incorporated art into many of his term papers and essays. Paul is the editor of *The Missioner* newsletter for his Knights of Columbus Council, which has won the top award for Suffolk County multiple times, and he is a regular contributor to his parish bulletin. As a computer consultant and teacher, he is an expert on the use of programs such as PowerPoint, which he employs to enliven his art presentations.

Hope and Healings through the Missionary Image

The Missionary Images of Our Lady of Guadalupe are the only four images in the world commissioned by the Basilica Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico City to journey as Missionary Images on a Mission in the New Evangelization to bring conversions and a Culture of Life and Civilization of Love, for which St. John Paul II prayed. He also named Our Lady of Guadalupe as the Star of The New Evangelization.

There are many images of Our Lady of Guadalupe, but the Missionary Images are the only ones in the world with this special title, mission and certification. In 1999, the miraculous image of Our Lady of Guadalupe was removed from the Basilica in Mexico in order to create a new true and exact digital copy. The resulting digital file is the first and only digital rendition of the sacred image in existence created directly from the miraculous image and completed with the full control and approval of the Church. The digital images are exact-size and color replicas of the original miraculous image. On January 25, 1999, Pope John Paul II blessed the digital file of these replica images.

Because of Our Lady of Guadalupe's special mission, they have traveled the world bringing many signs, wonders, conversions, healings and graces. The images have manifested signs such as detections of a heartbeat of an unborn baby in her womb, confirmed by doctors and nurses with stethoscopes, and the shedding of tears of oil and holy glitter. God manifests these signs at his pleasure and delights to give them to help us strengthen our faith and our confidence in the intercession of Our Lady of Guadalupe. However, these are not just images. They represent the spiritual presence of Our Lady of Guadalupe. The Missionary Images may also be considered as icons because they are authentic copies of the original miraculous image, and were painted by God and not by human hands.

Our Lady of Guadalupe told St. Juan Diego, "I am the merciful Mother of all mankind. Am I not your hope?" This is why Blessed Pope John Paul II named her the "Mother of Hope". He said, "It is my heartfelt hope that she, whose intercession was responsible for strengthening the faith of the first disciples (see Jn. 2:11) will, by her maternal intercession guide the Church in America, obtaining the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, as she once did for the early Church (see Acts 1:14), so that the New Evangelization may yield a splendid flowering of Christian life." Our Lady of Guadalupe brings us this hope through her Missionary image.

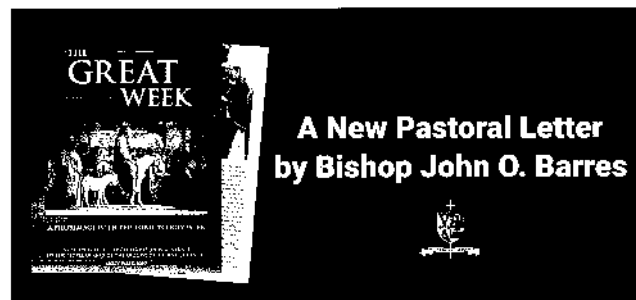

Why We Ask

The 2020 Census is easy. The questions are simple.

NAME

We ask for names to ensure everyone in the house is counted. Listing the name of each person in the household helps respondents include all members, particularly in large households where a respondent may forget who was counted and who was not.

SEX

We ask about the sex of each person to create statistics about males and females. Census data about sex are used in planning and funding government programs, and in evaluating other government programs and policies to ensure they fairly and equitably serve the needs of males and females. These statistics are also used to enforce laws, regulations and policies against discrimination in government programs and in society.

AGE AND DATE OF BIRTH

We ask about age and date of birth to understand the size and characteristics of different age groups and to present other data by age. Local, state, tribal and federal agencies use age data to plan and fund government programs that provide assistance or services for specific age groups, such as children, working-age adults, women of childbearing age, or the older population. These statistics also help enforce laws, regulations and policies against age discrimination in government programs and in society.

HISPANIC, LATINO OR SPANISH ORIGIN

We ask about whether a person is of Hispanic, Latino or Spanish origin to create statistics

about this ethnic group. The data collected in this question are needed by federal agencies to monitor compliance with anti-discrimination provisions, such as under the Voting Rights Act and the Civil Rights Act.

RACE

We ask about a person's race to create statistics about race and to present other statistics by race groups. The data collected in this question are needed by federal agencies to monitor compliance with anti-discrimination provisions, such as under the Voting Rights Act and the Civil Rights Act. State governments use the data to determine congressional, state and local voting districts.

WHETHER A PERSON LIVES OR STAYS SOMEWHERE ELSE

Our goal is to count people once, only once and in the right place according to where they live on Census Day. Keeping this goal in mind, we ask this question to ensure individuals are not included at multiple addresses.

RELATIONSHIP

We ask about the relationship of each person in a household to one central person to create estimates about families, households and other groups. Relationship data are used in planning and funding government programs that provide funds or services for families, people living or raising children alone, grandparents living with grandchildren, or other households that qualify for additional assistance.
