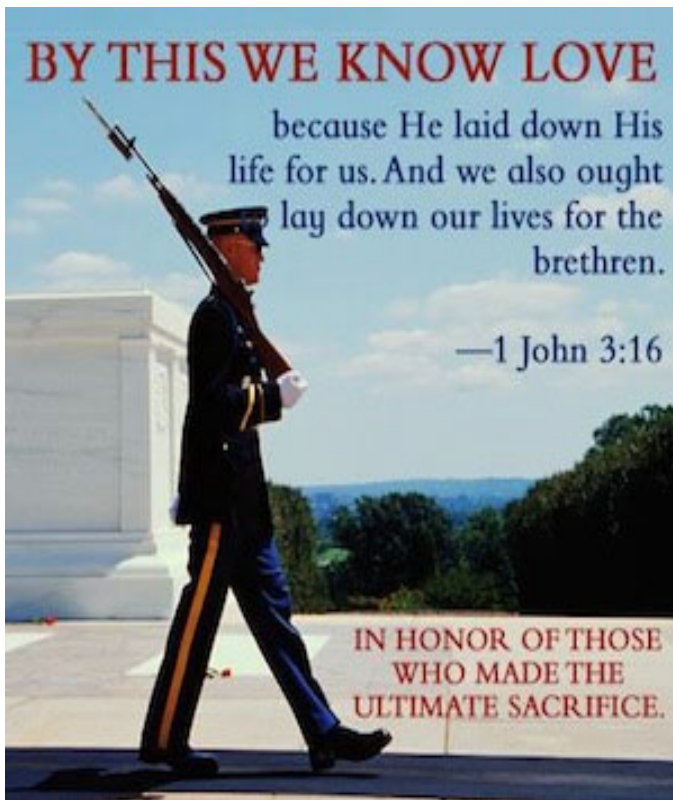

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

This week we remember all Veterans; the men and women, who served in the military of this great country. Their service was not only to our country, but as well to the whole world. With both World Wars in the last century, the role of USA came to be a global peace keeping one. It was very evident in the breaking of the German - Italian - Japanese alliance, that wanted to conquer the world during WW II. Since then, the USA military role remains dominant in the peacekeeping effort for the world.

Many governments around the world are not people friendly, persecuting their own fellow citizens for the sake of self-appointed superiority or manipulated elections. Their policies are harmful and oppressive to the citizens. We see the political struggle for power and for the interpretation of freedom, even in our own country. I hope you have voted in local elections this past week, taking responsibility for the local governance.

If it is not easy for us here, in our country, to deal with those political differences and interpretations, imagine the countries like Venezuela, Argentina, Haiti, Salvador, Afghanistan, China, etc. Even our own Puerto Rico, where I heard, you cannot drive safely after the sunset, because if you stop at the red light crossing, you may easily get assaulted.

Peace and safety are not a permanent feature of the human values landscape, and we have our own experience with the gangs. So, let's not take safety to be a free given thing, because it is not free. Our Veterans are the people, that risked their own lives to give peace and security to us all. This is why we have to appreciate their generosity and service. Let's not forget their role, because safety, security and peace, don't exist without those who dedicate their lives to provide it.

Many service members paid the highest price and never became Veterans, because they lost their lives in the service. We owe our gratitude to all servicemen and women in all capacities and all safety roles. We pray, that they never have to pay the highest price for it - with their lives. We pray for all Veterans, their health and their families. God bless all our Veterans! May God bless all those who have died in service. We remember all of our faithful departed in the Novena of Masses and in special prayer of remembrance in the month of November.

In the readings of this Sunday, we have some of the most touching moments of the Scriptures, when Jesus is talking about the faith of the widow. It is a profound experience, because the widows through their vulnerability in life, open us to greater compassion. Their faith is marked by great humility and hard realism of life. Only God knows what is in every human heart, and only Jesus knew, that this widow was the most generous of all people coming to the temple that day. God sees what is done in the secret of our hearts, and he will repay us according to our deeds. Jesus knows how much the widow sacrificed, and He knows how much she trusted God every day of her life.

Let us learn from the widow how to trust God, and how to depend on God for everything in life. The widow's coin, is the gift from the depths of one's heart and from the profound love for God.

Queridas Hermanas y Hermanos,

Esta semana recordamos a todos los Veteranos; los hombres y mujeres, que sirvieron en las fuerzas armadas de este gran país. Su servicio no fue solo para nuestro país, sino también para el mundo entero. Con las dos Guerras Mundiales del siglo pasado, el papel de los Estados Unidos, se convirtió en el de mantenimiento de la paz mundial. Fue muy evidente en la ruptura de la alianza entre Alemania, Italia y Japón, que querían conquistar el mundo durante la Segunda Guerra Mundial. Desde entonces, el papel militar de los Estados Unidos sigue dominante en el esfuerzo de mantenimiento de la paz en el mundo.

Muchos gobiernos de todo el mundo no son amistosos con las personas y persiguen a sus propios conciudadanos en aras de la superioridad autoproclamada o elecciones manipuladas. Sus políticas son dañinas y opresivas para los ciudadanos. Vemos la lucha política por el poder y por la interpretación de la libertad, incluso en nuestro propio país. Espero que haya votado en las elecciones locales la semana pasada, asumiendo la responsabilidad del gobierno local.

Si no es fácil para nosotros aquí, en nuestro país, lidiar con esas diferencias e interpretaciones políticas, imagínense en países como Venezuela, Argentina, Haití, El Salvador, Afganistán, La China, etc. Incluso nuestro propio Puerto Rico, donde escuche, no puede conducir de manera segura después de la puesta del sol, porque si se detiene en el cruce del semáforo cuando está en rojo, es posible que lo asalten fácilmente.

Entonces, la paz y la seguridad no son una característica permanente del panorama de los valores humanos, y tenemos nuestra propia experiencia con las pandillas. Así que no tomemos la seguridad como algo gratuito, porque no es gratis. Nuestros Veteranos son las personas que arriesgaron sus propias vidas para darnos paz y seguridad a todos. Por eso debemos agradecer su generosidad y servicio. No olvidemos su papel, porque el bienestar, la seguridad y la paz no existen sin quienes dedican su vida a brindarla.

Muchos miembros del servicio militar pagaron el precio más alto y nunca se convirtieron en Veteranos porque perdieron la vida en el servicio. Debemos nuestra gratitud a todos los hombres y mujeres en el servicio militar en todas las capacidades y todos los roles de seguridad. Oramos para que nunca tengan que pagar el precio más alto por ello con sus vidas. Oramos por todos los Veteranos, su salud y sus familias. Dios bendiga a todos nuestros Veteranos. Que Dios bendiga a todos los que han muerto en el servicio militar. Hay muchos ricos que echan tantas monedas, y una pobre mujer, viuda, que da apenas dos pequeñas monedas. Jesús observa atentamente a esa mujer e indica a los discípulos el fuerte contraste de la escena.

Los ricos han dado, con gran ostentación, lo que para ellos era superfluo, mientras que la viuda, con discreción y humildad, ha echado «todo lo que tenía para vivir»; por ello —dice Jesús— ella ha dado más que todos.

Debido a su extrema pobreza, hubiera podido ofrecer una sola moneda para el templo y quedarse con la otra. Pero ella no quiere ir a la mitad con Dios: se priva de todo. En su pobreza ha comprendido que, teniendo a Dios, lo tiene todo; se siente amada totalmente por Él y, a su vez, lo ama totalmente. ¡Qué bonito ejemplo de esa viejecita!

« Tous, ils ont pris sur leur superflu, mais elle, elle a pris sur son indigence »



Aujourd'hui, l'Evangile nous présente le Christ comme Maître, et Il nous parle du détachement avec lequel nous devons vivre. En premier lieu, un détachement par rapport à notre sens de l'honneur et de la reconnaissance propre que nous cherchons souvent : « Méfiez-vous (...) les salutations sur les places publiques, les premiers rangs dans les synagogues, et les places d'honneur dans les dîners » (cf. Mc 12,38-39). Sur ce point, Jésus nous met en garde du mauvais exemple donné par les scribes.

En deuxième lieu, le détachement, des choses matérielles. Jésus loue l'attitude de la veuve pauvre et déplore l'hypocrisie de certains : « Car tous, ils ont pris sur leur superflu, mais elle, elle a pris sur son indigence » (Mc 12,44). Celui qui n'a pas l'esprit du détachement par rapport aux biens temporels, vit rempli de sa propre personne et ne peut pas aimer. Dans un tel état l'âme n'a pas de place pour les autres : ni compassion, ni miséricorde, ni attention envers son prochain.

Les saints nous donnent l'exemple. Voici un récit de la vie de Saint Pie X quand il était encore évêque de Mantoue. Un commerçant écrit des mensonges à son propos. Beaucoup de ses amis lui conseillèrent d'attaquer en justice ce calomniateur, mais le futur Pape leur répondit : « Ce pauvre homme a plus besoin de prière que de châtement ». Alors, il ne l'a pas poursuivi mais il a beaucoup prié pour lui.

Mais l'histoire ne finit pas ainsi, après un certain temps, les affaires du commerçant n'allaient pas bien du tout et il se déclare en faillite. Tous ses créanciers se jetèrent sur ses biens et lui enlevèrent. La seule personne qui est venue à son secours était justement l'évêque de Mantoue, qui de manière anonyme fit envoyer de l'argent au commerçant en lui disant que cet argent venait de la Dame la plus miséricordieuse qui soit, c'est à dire : Notre Dame du Bon Secours.

Est-ce que je vis avec détachement par rapport aux réalités terrestres ? Est-ce que mon cœur est vide de choses ? Est-ce que mon cœur est capable de voir les besoins des autres ? « Le programme du chrétien —le programme du Christ— est un “cœur qui voit” » (Benoît XVI).

Si nous sommes consumés par l'honneur, le pouvoir, les réseaux sociaux, la beauté ou l'argent, ils nous mangeront vivants et finiront par nous laisser vides. Le vide nous dévore en promettant une vie qu'il ne peut pas donner. Jésus identifie la veuve comme ayant donné le plus : elle se donne. Réfléchissons à ce qui dévore nos communautés et notre société aujourd'hui. Nous avons parfois l'impression que les exigences qui nous sont imposées dépassent le temps, l'énergie et la vie que nous avons. Il est crucial de se rappeler que la maison de Dieu n'est pas un endroit pour dévorer les exclus.

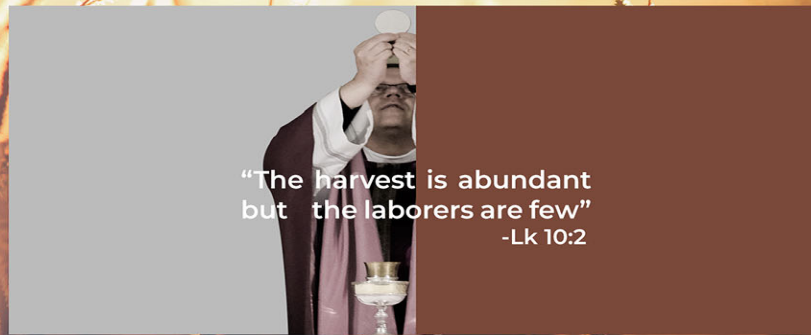

As you know, in response to the August 14th Earthquake affecting many departments in the South of Haiti, HAFALI in connection with the Elmont Cultural Center embarked on a relief drive for the affected areas. We are grateful to the office of Assembly Woman Michaele C. Solages, the office of Legislator Debra Mulé for their support in this endeavor.

We are happy to report to you that our special delegation made it safely to the Grandans Department during the Labor Day week in September. We are extremely grateful to Maxi & Youmie for sharing their time. We seized on that opportunity to buy food locally for distribution in addition to the suitcases of items we sent to Haiti. The delegation visited and distributed the donations in Preville, Mont Oge, Lattiboliere and LaBasti, rural areas near Jeremie.

Hearfelt thanks to George Siberon at the Hempstead Hispanic Civic Association, Gotham Ave Elmont Firehouse, Fr. Bob at OLM in Wyandanch, Fr. Stan & Fr. John at St. Anne in Brentwood for providing the much needed space to collect the donations.

We were happy to reconnect with Maryse Cadet, Founder of the Association of The Children of Regnier (ACR) to send 5 large boxes to Regnier. We worked in collaboration with the Union Fraternelle de Camp Perrin, to shipped 10 barrels to Camp-Perrin, 8 barrels to Ducis with the MKKD a Community based organization in Ducis; then an additional shipment of 5 barrels to ACR in Regnier. At this stage, we are sending 5 more barrels and continue to look for sponsors to send 12 additional barrels @ \$ 180.

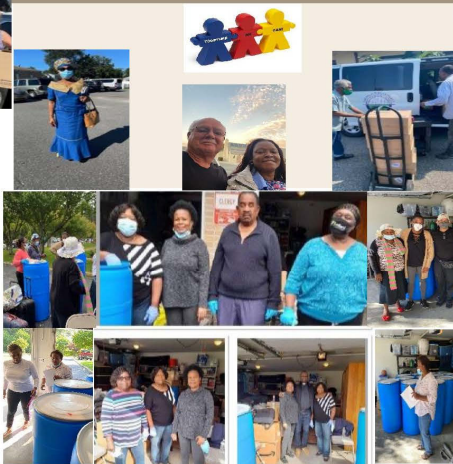
