Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time



Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Last week we had beautiful readings about the love of God for each one of us. Love that starts even before we are conceived, as God knows it will happen. Already before Jeremiah was born, God has chosen him to be his prophet.

Today's first reading speaks about Isaiah's experience of heaven and the call God makes to Isaiah, to be his messenger. Then, we have St. Paul telling us about his revelation and experience of God and the call he received from the Lord Jesus himself. In the Gospel we read about the miraculous catch of the fish and the call that Jesus makes to the apostles to be the fishers of men. It is most incredible how wonderfully God approaches those whom he calls. God gives us the experience of himself so that we can witness it to others, to be fishers of men.

Why don't we all seek an experience of God? We all do seek that experience of the love of God, because this is why we are here. We want more experience of God; we want more experience of his love. But what is it that we seek in our lives? What is it that we want to do with our lives?

We seek happiness. There is no doubt, that our human happiness comes from our enjoyment and satisfaction of our life's experiences. It is experience of God's love or human love or both. That happy realization of ourselves we accomplish by doing what is good for ourselves and for others. But as they say, there is more happiness in giving than in receiving. Why is that? What is wrong with receiving? Happiness comes from knowledge that we are blessed, but if we would just collect the blessings for ourselves, we would discover that we are selfish, self-serving, empty collectors of blessings that would be wasted, if not shared with others.

For ourselves, we need a minimum of blessings, to be able to perceive that we are loved by God and by others. After we realize that, we are moved to share that experience with others, the experience of being blessed, of being loved. There is a multiplication of joy in sharing what we have and who we are. Love, is in mutual sharing, and not in selfish self-satisfaction. Love is more in giving, in caring about the other. But we cannot give what we don't have.

This is why we need to receive love; we need to be loved. This is why we need others to love us, so that we can love them in return. Given that our human life has some great limits, barriers and pains, we need to know and perceive the love of God, which is the source of all that is good, the source of all love. Knowing God's love is even greater than knowing human love. Even if all human love should fail us, we still are loved by God, and that love is enough for us to be happy. In fact, God's love is necessary for us to be happy in the face of adversity from life itself and from others. Human mutual love ends with death, God's love never ends, God's love is forever, it lasts for eternity.

This is why in the Gospel, Jesus wants to awaken us to the love of God for us, so that we could love God in return. By doing that, we become the best person that we can be, because God is the source of all good, the source of life and of love, and so, we gain access to infinity of love. The love of God brings to perfection in our human love. The love of God never ends.

Jesus challenges all of us to be selfless; by being totally selfless himself. He leads us by example. This kind of love we can learn only from God, we can learn only from Jesus. There is no greater love than this; when one lays down his own life for his friends. This is why Jesus does what he does, and He invites us to do the same. So, in the today's Gospel he asked the disciples to trust him and to put the nets into deep water, to reach the abundance of fish. Trusting Jesus is the only way we can access the love of God and the depths of love within us. This is a vocation for everyone.

Quinto Domingo de Tiempo Ordinario

Queridas Hermanas y Hermanos,

La semana pasada tuvimos estas hermosas lecturas sobre el amor de Dios por cada uno de nosotros. Amor que comienza incluso antes de que seamos concebidos, como Dios sabe que sucederá. Ya antes de que naciera Jeremías, Dios lo había elegido como profeta.

La primera lectura de hoy habla de la experiencia del cielo de Isaías y del llamado que Dios le hace a Isaías, para que sea su mensajero. Luego, San Pablo nos habla de su revelación y experiencia de Dios y del llamado que recibió del mismo Señor Jesús. En el Evangelio leemos sobre la captura milagrosa del pez y el llamado que Jesús hace a los apóstoles para que sean pescadores de hombre. Es increíble cuán maravillosamente Dios se acerca a aquellos a quienes llama. Dios nos da la experiencia de sí mismo para que podamos testimoniarla a los demás, para ser pescadores de hombres.

¿Por qué no buscamos todos una experiencia de Dios? Todos buscamos esa experiencia del amor de Dios, porque para eso estamos aquí. Queremos más experiencia de Dios, queremos más experiencia de su amor. Pero, ¿Qué es lo que buscamos en nuestras vidas? ¿Qué es lo que queremos hacer con nuestra vida?

Buscamos la felicidad. No hay duda de que nuestra felicidad humana proviene de nuestro disfrute y satisfacción de las experiencias de nuestra vida. Es la experiencia del amor de Dios o del amor humano o de ambos. Esa realización feliz de nosotros mismo la logramos haciendo lo que es bueno para nosotros y para los demás. Pero como dicen, hay más felicidad en dar que en recibir. ¿Por qué es eso? ¿Qué hay de malo en recibir? La felicidad proviene del conocimiento de que somos bendecidos, pero si recolectáramos las bendiciones para nosotros mismos, descubriríamos que somos egoístas, egoístas, recolectores vacíos de bendiciones que se desperdiciarían si no se compartiesen con los demás.

Para nosotros mismos necesitamos un mínimo de bendiciones, para poder percibir que somos amados por Dios y por los demás. Después de darnos cuenta de eso, nos sentimos impulsados a compartir esa experiencia con otros, la experiencia de ser bendecidos, de ser amados. Hay una multiplicación de alegría al compartir lo que tenemos y lo que somos. El amor está en el compartir mutuo, y no en la autosatisfacción egoísta. El amor está más en dar, en preocuparse por el otro. Pero no podemos dar lo que no tenemos.

Por eso necesitamos recibir amor, necesitamos ser amados. Es por eso que necesitamos que otros nos amen, para que podamos amar a cambio. Dado que nuestra vida humana tiene grandes límites, barreras y dolores, necesitamos conocer y percibir al amor de Dios, que es la fuente de todo bien, la fuente de todo amor. Conocer el amor de Dios es aún mayor que conocer el amor humano. Aunque todo el amor humano nos falte, seguimos siendo amados por Dios, y ese amor es suficiente para que seamos felices. De hecho, el amor de Dios es necesario para que seamos felices frente a las adversidades de la vida misma y de los demás. El amor mutuo humano termina con la muerte, el amor de Dios nunca termina, el amor de Dios es para siempre, dura para toda la eternidad.

Es por eso que en el Evangelio, Jesús quiere despertarnos al amor de Dios por nosotros, para que podamos amar a Dios a cambio. Al hacerlo, nos convertimos en la mejor persona que podemos ser, porque Dios es la fuente de todo bien, la fuente de la vida y del amor, y así accedemos a la infinitud del amor. El amor de Dios lleva a la perfección nuestro amor humano, el amor de Dios nunca termina.

Jesús nos desafía a todos a ser desinteresados, siendo el mismo totalmente desinteresado. Él nos guía con el ejemplo. Este tipo de amor solo podemos aprender de Dios, solo lo podemos aprender de Jesús. No hay amor que este; cuando uno da su propia vida por sus amigos. Por eso Jesús hace lo que hace, y nos invita a lo mismo. Por eso, en el Evangelio de hoy, pide a los discípulos que confíen en él y que echen las redes en aguas profundas, para alcanzar la abundancia de peces. Confiar en Jesús es la única forma en que podemos acceder al amor de Dios y las profundidades del amor dentro de nosotros. Esta es una vocación de todos.

Quinto Domingo Tiempo Ordinario



Una de las fiestas más celebradas por los hondureños es el aniversario de la Virgen de Suyapa, la Patrona de Honduras, quien fue encontrada por Alejandro Colindres, un campesino que descubrió la figura de la morenita hace 274 años.

La historia de su hallazgo en 1747 relata que Colindres, junto a otro niño, fue enviado por su madre a limpiar unos campos en El Piliguín, y a su regreso a casa por la noche, el cansancio les hizo buscar un lugar para descansar y continuar su caminata al día siguiente.

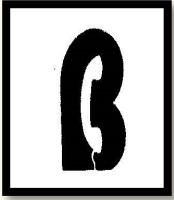
Sin embargo, para Alejandro Colindres la noche no fue tan tranquila, pues había un pequeño objeto que no le dejaba conciliar el sueño y cada vez que intentaba deshacerse de él lanzándolo lejos, el objeto volvía al mismo lugar.

Colindres decidió guardarlo y ver que era al día siguiente, y cuando lo vio que se parecía a una virgen se la llevo a su mamá, y desde entonces los fieles católicos veneran y celebran cada año el hallazgo de la Virgen de Suyapa.

En 1925 que fue declarada por el papa Pio XI como la Patrona de Honduras.

Su nombre (Suyapa) es criollo, proveniente de vocablo “Coyapa”, que significa agua de las palmeras. La Virgen de Suyapa mide 6.5 centímetros y está hecha de madera de cedro. Su tonalidad un tanto oscura se asemeja al color de piel que tiene la mujer hondureña, así como las facciones de su rostro y su cabello, la posición de sus manos indican fe y oración, algo muy significativo para quienes la visitan cada año desde tierra adentro de Honduras.
