

**Message from
Our Pastor**

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Last Sunday Jesus was teaching us how to pray, and this Sunday he goes further by helping us to set priorities in our life. It is in those priorities that the structure of our life is based. They are like the foundations of the building that hold all walls together. The prayer itself comes out of our heart and mind depending as well on those priorities of our belief and of our faith. It is only when we give the right place to the Lord, then to ourselves, then to others, then to all other things, that our prayer and actions will become more coherent and conformed to the reality of life.

It is interesting to see how Jesus declines to be a judge and arbitrator between the brothers. One would think that as God, Christ could tell everybody what to do. But Jesus responds only with a general counsel to the crowd asking them not to be greedy, because there are more important things in life than possessions. Here, Jesus has in mind those priorities. What is it the most important thing in my life? What is it that consumes my mind and heart? This judgment and determination can be done only by each one of us for ourselves. No one, even Jesus, refuses to decide it for us. This is why God gave us a conscience, so we can decide our own choices and assume responsibility for ourselves and for others. To underline what is important, Jesus gives us the parable of the farmer who gathered riches for his time ahead, but who was to be asked this very night for his life. In the face of it, what is it that is so important, as to be in our mind and heart? As Jesus says: "store the treasures in heaven" not on earth.

In the first reading the writer of the book of Wisdom tells us that most of the things in this life are vanity, because they are passing into nothingness with the passing of the time. What is forever, is the friendship with God, and this is what we want to be busy with; all the rest of things of this world are just temporary and non-important.

Saint Paul tells us to seek the things that are from above. What is important is Christ, who is to be the only possession that lasts forever, and He is all that we can carry to eternal life. Is Christ your priority? Or, who or what is your priority? Christ is the same; yesterday, today and forever. Let He be our treasure, our priority. Jesus is all and the only thing that we need for eternal life.

Queridas Hermanas y Hermanos,

El Domingo pasado Jesús nos estaba enseñando a orar, y este Domingo va más allá ayudándonos a establecer prioridades en nuestra vida. Es en esas prioridades que se basa la estructura de nuestra vida. Son como los cimientos del edificio que mantienen unidas todas las paredes. La oración misma sale de nuestro corazón y de nuestra mente dependiendo también de aquellas prioridades de nuestra creencia y de nuestra fe. Solo cuando le damos el lugar correcto al Señor, luego a nosotros mismos, luego a los demás, luego a todas las demás cosas, que nuestra oración y nuestras acciones se volverán más coherentes y conformes a la realidad de la vida.

Pero Jesús responde solo con un consejo general a la multitud pidiéndoles que no sean codiciosos, porque hay cosas más importantes en la vida que posesiones. Aquí Jesús tiene en mente esas prioridades. ¿Qué es lo más importante en mi vida? ¿Qué es lo que consume mi mente y mi corazón? Este juicio y determinación solo puede ser hecho por cada uno de nosotros por sí mismo. Nadie, incluso Jesús, se niega a decidirlo por nosotros. Por eso Dios nos dio una conciencia, para que podamos decidir nuestra elección y asumir la responsabilidad por nosotros mismos y por los demás. Para subrayar lo que es importante, Jesús nos da la parábola del labrador que recogió riquezas para el tiempo que le esperaba, pero a quien se le iba a pedir esta misma noche por su vida. Frente a ello, ¿Qué es tan importante como estar en nuestra mente y corazón? Como dice Jesús: “almacena los tesoros en el cielo” no en la tierra.

En la primera lectura el autor del libro de la sabiduría nos dice que la mayoría de las cosas de esta vida son vanidad, porque con el paso del tiempo se van desvaneciendo. Lo que es para siempre, es la amistad con Dios, y en esto queremos ocuparnos; todo el resto de las cosas de este mundo son solo temporales y sin importancia.

San Pablo nos dice que busquemos las cosas que son de arriba. Lo importante es Cristo, quien debe ser la única posesión que dure para siempre, y Él es todo lo que podemos llevar a la vida eterna. ¿Cristo tu prioridad? O, ¿Quién o cuál es tu prioridad? Cristo es este mismo; ayer, hoy y siempre. Que Él sea nuestro tesoro, nuestra prioridad. Jesús es todo y lo único que necesitamos para nuestra vida eterna.

Joaquim y Anna formaban una familia corriente, tan corriente como cualquiera de las nuestras: lo que significa, por supuesto, que, como el resto de nosotros, su familia era cálida y amorosa... pero no era perfecta. Sobre ellos estaba el dolor de no tener hijos. En su cultura y en ese lugar y tiempo, este problema era más que un dolor de cabeza; era un estigma social, visto por algunos como un signo de desaprobarción divina.

Cuando vemos a la familia de Joaquim y Ana, vemos personas como nosotros, como todos los demás. Vemos personas que anhelan un sentido de la presencia de Dios, un sentido del propósito de Dios en sus vidas. Y así como ambos estaban en profunda desesperación, Dios envió a su ángel para hablarles de su misericordia y amor, y que después de esperar con fe y esperanza, sus oraciones serían bendecidas: tendrían un hijo.

Y sucedió algo maravilloso para ellos, algo maravilloso para toda la humanidad. Nació una niña. Le dieron un nombre de la historia de la misericordia de Dios para con su pueblo, el nombre de la hermana de Moisés: Miriam. Hoy, cuando la llamamos bienaventurada, nos dirigimos a ella como María. Y la llamamos bienaventurada, porque ella dio a luz al Salvador, a Jesucristo, al Dios encarnado.

La madre de nuestro Dios tuvo padres que fueron modelos a seguir de amor y abnegación, de perseverancia y oración.

Así que este día, sobre todos los días, nos dice cuán importante es para nosotros el ejemplo fuerte y fiel de nuestros padres, nuestros primeros modelos de fe, para que podamos ver más allá de las distracciones de esta época y lleguemos a conocer el amor, la misericordia y la gracia de Dios.

Chers sœurs et frères,

Dimanche dernier, Jésus nous apprenait à prier, et ce dimanche il va plus loin en nous aidant à établir des priorités dans notre vie. C'est dans ces priorités que se fonde la structure de notre vie. Ils sont comme les fondations du bâtiment qui maintiennent tous les murs ensemble. La prière elle-même sort de notre cœur et de notre esprit en fonction aussi des priorités de notre croyance et de notre foi. Ici, Jésus a à l'esprit ces priorités. Quelle est la chose la plus importante dans ma vie ? Qu'est-ce qui consume mon esprit et mon cœur ? Ce jugement et cette détermination ne peuvent être faits que par chacun de nous pour nous-mêmes. Personne, même Jésus, ne refuse de le décider pour nous. C'est pourquoi Dieu nous a donné une conscience, afin que nous puissions décider de nos propres choix et assumer la responsabilité de nous-mêmes et des autres. Pour souligner ce qui est important, Jésus nous donne la parabole du fermier qui a amassé des richesses pour son temps à venir, mais qui devait être demandé cette nuit même pour sa vie. Face à cela, qu'est-ce qui est si important, pour être dans notre esprit et notre cœur ? Comme le dit Jésus : « gardez les trésors dans les cieux » et non sur la terre.

Dans la première lecture, l'auteur du livre de la Sagesse nous dit que la plupart des choses de cette vie sont vanité, parce qu'elles passent au néant avec le temps. Ce qui est pour toujours, c'est l'amitié avec Dieu, et c'est de cela que nous voulons nous occuper ; toutes les autres choses de ce monde ne sont que temporaires et sans importance.

Saint Paul nous dit de chercher les choses d'en haut. Ce qui est important, c'est Christ, qui doit être la seule possession qui dure pour toujours, et Il est tout ce que nous pouvons porter à la vie éternelle. Christ est-il votre priorité ? 
SCHOOL IS FINISHED FOR THE YEAR AND OUR OUTREACH IS NOW REQUESTING SCHOOL SUPPLIES

The supply list is always very extensive: composition notebooks (no spiral notebooks), Ticonderoga #2 pencils, pens, colored pencils, Crayola crayons, glue, glue sticks, Fiskar scissors, highlighters, dry erase markers, thin washable markers, rulers, ruled index cards, pencil cases with zippers, 1" and 2" binders, dividers with tabs (for binders), loose leaf paper, 2-pocket folders (laminated or plastic), lunch bags and backpacks. Any donated school supply item will be greatly appreciated.
