A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR – FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Lent seems to be long for forty days, but it passes very fast when we stay busy with daily preparation for Jesus Resurrection. Next week we will celebrate Palm Sunday, and the following weekend is Easter. Our Lenten preparations and efforts to be transformed by practice of extra prayer, fasting and alms giving, hopefully brought us closer to the Lord.

Today we have the Gospel of Lazarus being allowed to die, and then being raised from the dead back to life. And interestingly enough, Jesus calls Lazarus dying: "being asleep", and Jesus promises to awaken him. Is Jesus mocking the death? Is he comparing the death to a sleep? Is it a parable?

Jesus often explains things by making comparisons and references. If Jesus compares death to being asleep it must be comparable. Do you believe this? It would be nice for us if we all would have the possibility of waking up in heaven as Jesus suggests it. He makes it sound very easy and simple.

Already, the prophet Ezekiel in the first reading foretells the rising from the graves and putting back the human spirit into the bones bringing them back to life. It would be nice if Jesus could do it more often - for example, if he could rise up those young people killed in Brentwood by gangs, and give them back to their families - to be able to have a "normal " life and a "normal" ending to it one day.

The Scriptures make this process of rising seem to be so simple and obvious, so natural. Jesus says to the dead friend: "Lazarus come out!!! " Even Lazarus sister Martha says- "it is already four days after death and its already going to be stench," (John 11:39) but Jesus responded to her: " Did I not tell you that if you believe you will see the glory of God? "

As Lazarus comes out of the grave, Jesus tells others to untie him so he can walk freely. So last Sunday, we had Jesus making us see the glory of God, by returning the sight to a man blind from birth, and today we see the glory of God by seeing Jesus put back the spirit into the dead body of his friend Lazarus.

Would Jesus do it for everyone or just to his friends?

Saint Paul says to us in the second reading: "If the Spirit of God dwells in you, the One who raised Christ from the dead will give life to your mortal bodies also" (Romans 8:11). What a certainty, what a sequence of things said about dying and rising? In the coming Sunday, we will read the Passion of Christ and take a walk with the Palm in our hands, to follow Christ as he is to take his cross and walk from life to death and back to life again on the Easter Sunday. It is a display of the power and the glory of God, that is promised to those who believe and turn their hearts and lives to Christ. That is the purpose and goal of Lent and of Christian life. This is the Easter we are preparing for all our lives. Risen Christ is waiting for us on the end of our lives. Come Lord Jesus!!!

QUINTO DOMINGO DE CUARESMA.

Queridas Hermanas y Hermanos.

La Cuaresma parece larga por cuarenta días, pero pasa muy rápido cuando nos mantenemos ocupados con la preparación diaria para la Resurrección de Jesús. La semana que viene celebraremos el Domingo de Ramos, y el siguiente fin de semana es Semana Santa. Nuestras preparaciones para la Cuaresma y los esfuerzos para ser transformados mediante la práctica de oración extra, ayuno y limosnas, esperamos que nos hayan acercado más al Señor.

Hoy tenemos el Evangelio de que a Lázaro se le permitió morir y luego resucitar de entre los muertos a la vida. Y curiosamente, Jesús llama a Lázaro moribundo: “estar dormido”, y Jesús promete despertarlo. ¿Jesús se está burlando de la muerte? ¿Está comparando la muerte con un sueño? ¿Es una parábola?

Jesús a menudo explica las cosas haciendo ese tipo de comparaciones y referencias. Si Jesús compara la muerte con estar dormido, debe ser comparable. ¿Cree usted esto? Sería bueno para nosotros que todos tuviéramos la posibilidad de despertar en los cielos como sugiere Jesús. Él hace que suene muy fácil y simple.

Ya el profeta Ezequiel en la primera lectura predice la resurrección de los sepulcros y la restitución del espíritu humano en los huesos para devolverles la vida. Sería bueno si Jesús pudiera hacerlo más a menudo – por ejemplo, si pudiera levantar a esos jóvenes asesinados en Brentwood por las pandillas y devolvérselos a sus familias – para poder tener una vida “normal”, Terminándolo un día.

Las Escrituras hacen que este proceso de levantarse parezca tan simple y obvio, tan natural. Jesús le dice al amigo muerto: “¡¡¡Lázaro, sal fuera!!!” Incluso la hermana de Lázaro, Marta, dice: “ya son cuatro días después de la muerte y ya va a ser hedor”, pero Jesús le respondió “No te dije que si crees veras la gloria de Dios?”

Cuando Lázaro sale de la tumba, Jesús les dice a los demás que lo desaten para que pueda caminar libremente. Así que el Domingo pasado tuvimos a Jesús haciéndonos ver la gloria de Dios, al devolverle la vista a un ciego de nacimiento, y hoy vemos la gloria de Dios al ver a Jesús devolver el espíritu al cuerpo muerto de su amigo Lázaro.
¿Jesús lo haría por todos o solo por sus amigos?

San Pablo nos dice en la segunda lectura: “Si el Espíritu de Dios mora en vosotros, Aquel que resucitó a Cristo de entre los muertos vivificará también vuestros cuerpos mortales”. ¿Y subiendo?

El próximo Domingo leeremos la Pasión de Cristo y daremos un paseo con la Palma en la mano, para seguir a Cristo tal como es para tomar su cruz y caminar de la vida a la muerte y de vuelta a la vida el Domingo de Resurrección. Es una muestra del poder y la gloria de Dios, que se promete a los que creen y vuelven su corazón y su vida a Cristo. Ese es el propósito y la meta de la Cuaresma y de la vida cristiana. Esta es la Pascua que estamos preparando para toda nuestra vida. Cristo Resucitados nos espera al final de nuestra vida. Ven Señor Jesús!!!

¡¡¡Dios les bendiga a todos siempre!!!

QUINTO DOMINGO DE CUARESMA

La resurrección de Lázaro no es solo la resurrección de un hombre muerto, sino que es un poderoso signo de la nueva vida que todos podemos experimentar cuando aceptamos y seguimos a Jesús como Señor y Salvador. Podemos levantarnos de la muerte del pecado a una vida bañada en el amor de Dios. Lázaro saliendo de la tumba recuerda mucho a Pablo describiendo el bautismo de los primeros cristianos. Se pararon junto a la piscina bautismal, se despojaron de toda su ropa, bajaron al agua, simbolizando la muerte de su vida pasada de pecado. Se sumergieron por completo, un símbolo de Jesús bajando a su propia muerte y trayendo nuestros pecados con él. Luego salieron por el otro lado cuando Jesús salió de la tumba y se vistieron con una vestidura blanca nueva para simbolizar su nueva vida en Cristo.

Podemos entender cuán significativo es todo esto en el contexto del Misterio Pascual donde celebramos el amor de Dios declarado por nosotros a través del sufrimiento, muerte y resurrección de Jesús. Cuán significativo es en el contexto de aquellos catecúmenos que se preparan para recibir el Bautismo en la Vigilia Pascual y cuán significativo es para nuestras propias vidas mientras nos preparamos para comenzar de nuevo a vivir nuestro propio Bautismo.

5th Sunday of Carême A

"Je suis la résurrection et la vie. Qui croit en moi, même s'il meurt, vivra."

La liturgie de ce dimanche continue à nous préparer au renouvellement des promesses de notre baptême pendant la liturgie de la vigile pascale. Dans l'épisode de la Samaritaine, Jésus nous a révélé qu'il était une source d'eau vive; lors de sa rencontre avec l'aveugle de naissance, il se présente comme la lumière du monde; et aujourd'hui, à travers la résurrection de Lazare, il dit à Marthe qu'il est la résurrection et la vie.

La résurrection de Lazare, dans l'évangile de S. Jean, est le dernier miracle de Jésus, le dernier «signe» offert dans cet éternel procès entre la lumière et les ténèbres. Peu après commence le drame de la Passion. En retournant en Judée pour sauver son ami, Jésus risque sa vie et va au-devant de sa propre mort.

Le point culminant du texte d'aujourd'hui est le dialogue entre Marthe et Jésus. Marthe proclame sa foi au Christ : «Tu es le Messie... le Fils de Dieu». C'est là la profession de foi que les autres évangélistes mettent sur les lèvres de Pierre.

Le Christ dit alors à Marthe : «Moi je suis la résurrection et la vie. Celui qui croit en moi, même s'il meurt, vivra; et toute personne qui vit et qui croit en moi ne mourra jamais.»

Le Christ nous dit que non seulement nous serons transformés et que nous continuerons à vivre après la mort, mais il nous invite à vivre pleinement dès maintenant. «Sortez de vos tombeaux, de vos vies sans espérance. Recommencez à respirer la vie à pleins poumons...» «Je suis venu pour que vous ayez la vie et que vous l'ayez en abondance» (Jean 10,10).

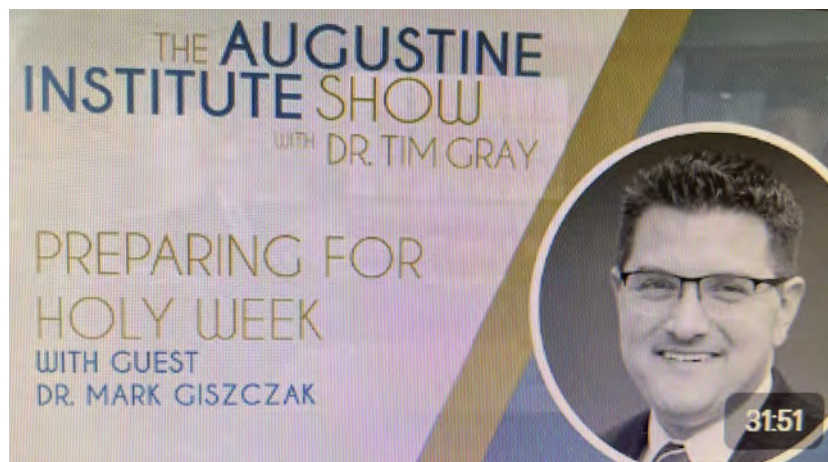

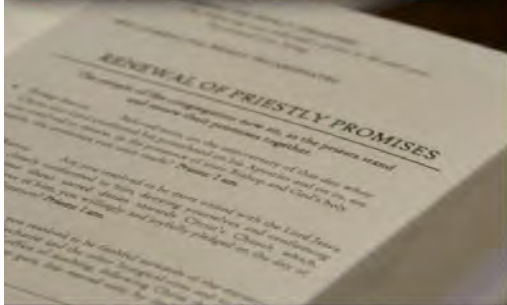
The Chrism Mass

During the Chrism Mass, Bishop John Barres will consecrate the Oil of Chrism and bless the Oil of Catechumens and the Oil of the Sick. These holy oils will be used throughout our Diocese during the coming year in celebration of the Sacraments. Priests of the Diocese will also renew their call to the Holy Priesthood of Jesus Christ.
