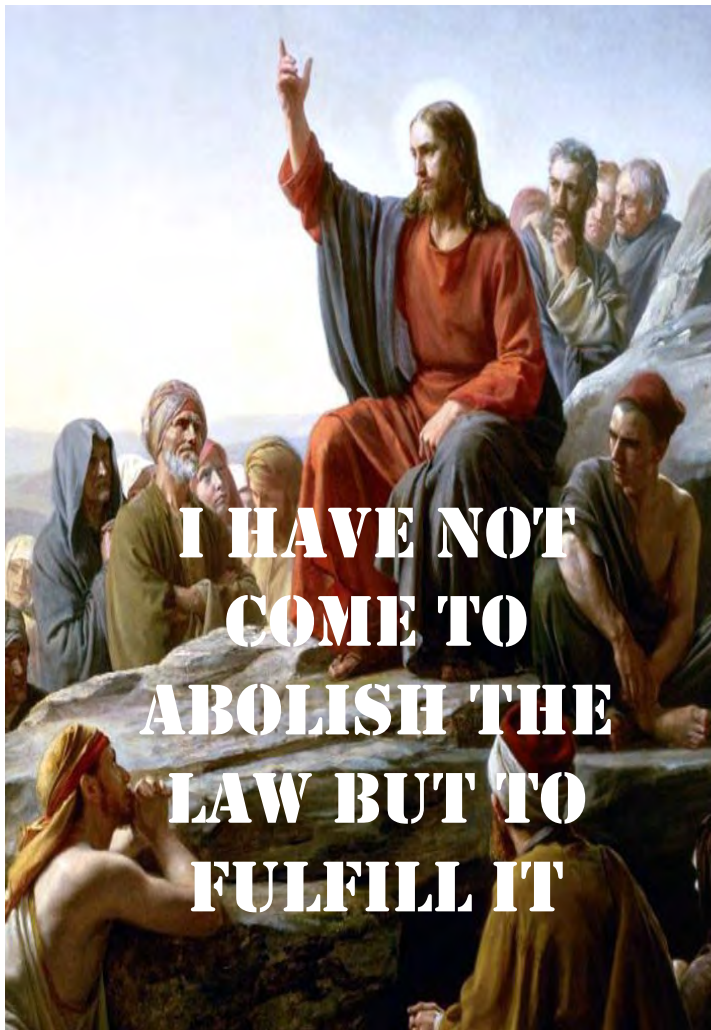

Message From Our Pastor

SIXTH SUNDAY ORDINARY TIME

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Every day Jesus keeps revealing himself to us for our salvation, and so that we can reveal him to others. In the opening statement of the Gospel this Sunday, Jesus speaks of his commitment to fulfilling all that is written in the Sacred Scriptures about him and all commands of God to the smallest letter of it. We have seen as well from the parents of Jesus in their commitment to honoring Jewish traditions and prescriptions of the Law. It is Jesus' way, to show respect and appreciation of our humanity, of our culture, of our traditions, that stay within the boundaries of God's Commandments.

Jesus invites us to be concerned with the heart of all things, with all that we have in our mind, with our thoughts, with our words. Why? Because it all accounts for who we are, and because it all affects our relationships with others and with God. So, to be in good relationship with God we have to be in good relationship with our family, friends and our coworkers. "Therefore, if you bring your gift to the altar, and there recall that your brother has anything against you, leave your gift there at the altar, go first and be reconciled with your brother, and then come and offer your gift" (Matthew 5:23-24).

Sometimes it may be a real workout to maintain good relationships with others, even our own family members. What Jesus is asking of us, is to remain humble and caring about people because of Him, because we have to wish that all people get to heaven. Jesus doesn't want our pride be more important to us than our soul, or the soul of any other person.

To be always so humble and restrained, is not easy when something is wrong in the relationships. Often, we wish we could reform other persons, we could tell them how to be normal, how to act normal, how to behave normal, how to think normal, how to feel normal, that is according to the Gospel. But it is only through humble dialogue, that we can arrive at consensus and understanding with other people. We want to learn to live in harmony with people who may have totally different point of view, different beliefs, different way of life; and yet we are called to find a way to relate to them in a Christian way. What Jesus is asking for is not so simple and not always easy. It is challenging to put God first above all things. Jesus, teach us to love you, teach us to love your commands, to love your truth, teach us to love heaven, teach us to love others, teach us to love ourselves.

Happy St. Valentine's Day! Happy friendship day! Let us be friends with God first.

It is the Lord who saves us.

God bless everyone always!!!!

Mensaje de Nuestro Pastor

SEXTO DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO

Queridas Hermanas y Hermanos,

Cada día Jesús sigue revelándose a nosotros para nuestra salvación, y para que podamos revelarlo a los demás. En las declaraciones de apertura del Evangelio de este Domingo, Jesús habla de su compromiso de cumplir todo lo que está escrito en la Sagrada Escritura sobre él y todos los mandamientos de Dios hasta la letra más pequeña de la misma. Hemos visto también a los padres de Jesús en su compromiso de honrar las tradiciones judías y las prescripciones de la Ley. Es el camino de Jesús, mostrar respeto y aprecio por nuestra humanidad, por nuestra cultura, por nuestras tradiciones, que se mantienen dentro de los límites de los Mandamientos de Dios.

Jesús nos invita a preocuparnos por el corazón de todas las cosas, por todo lo que tenemos en nuestra mente, con nuestros pensamientos, con nuestras palabras. ¿Por qué? Porque todo explica quiénes somos, y porque todo afecta nuestras relaciones con los demás y con Dios. Entonces, para tener una buena relación con Dios, tenemos que tener una buena relación con nuestra familia, amigos y compañeros de trabajo. “Por tanto, si traes tu ofrenda al altar, y allí recuerdas que tu hermano tiene algo contra ti, deja allí tu ofrenda en el altar, ve primero y reconcílate con tu hermano, y luego ven y presenta tu ofrenda”.

A veces puede ser un verdadero ejercicio mantener una buena relación con los demás, incluso con los miembros de nuestra propia familia. Lo que Jesús nos está pidiendo es que permanezcamos humildes y preocupados por las personas debido a Él, porque tenemos el deseo de que estas las personas lleguen al cielo. Jesús no quiere que nuestro orgullo sea más importante para nosotros que nuestra alma, o el alma de cualquier otra persona.

Ser siempre tan humilde y comedido, no es fácil cuando algo anda mal en las relaciones. Muchas veces deseamos poder reformar a otras personas, decirles como ser normales, como actuar normal, como comportarse normal, como pensar normal, como sentirse normal, eso es según el Evangelio. Pero es solo a través del diálogo humilde, que podemos llegar a un consenso y entendimiento con otras personas. Queremos aprender a vivir en armonía con personas que pueden tener puntos de vista totalmente diferente, creencias diferentes, formas de vida diferentes y, sin embargo, estamos llamados a encontrar una manera de relacionarnos con ellos de una manera cristiana. Lo que Jesús pide, no es tan simple y no siempre fácil. Es un desafío poner a Dios primero por encima de todas las cosas. Jesús, enséñanos a amarte, enséñanos a amar tus mandamientos, a amar tu verdad, enséñanos amar el cielo, enséñanos a amar a los demás, enséñanos a amarnos a nosotros mismos.

La Ley y Jesús

En el Evangelio de hoy, San Mateo enfatiza la relación entre la Ley judía y la enseñanza de Jesús. San Mateo asegura a sus lectores que Jesús no ha venido a abolir la Ley y los profetas, sino a completarlos. Entonces, en cierto sentido, la Ley todavía tiene vigencia. “Hasta que pasen el cielo y la tierra, ni una letra, ni una tilde de la ley pasará, hasta que todo se haya cumplido”.

Por otro lado, hay mucho en la enseñanza de Jesús que es completamente nuevo. No abolió la Ley, pero introdujo una forma de pensar completamente nueva. No abolió ni cambió la Ley, sino que fue mucho más allá de sus requisitos. Para Jesús, sólo cumplir la Ley externamente no es suficiente. Para ser un discípulo de Cristo, el fundamento de nuestra vida debe ser más profundo: el amor mutuo. Guardar la Ley sin amor es como tener un cuerpo sin alma.

Literalmente guardar la Ley de Dios y de la Iglesia no es lo mismo que ser un buen discípulo de Jesús. “Si vuestra virtud no es más profunda que la de los escribas y los fariseos [que eran perfectos observadores de la letra de la Ley], entonces nunca entraréis en el Reino de Dios”, nos dice Jesús hoy.

Si votre justice ne surpasse pas celle des Pharisiens...

Nous lisons aujourd'hui les quatre premières, précédées d'une sorte de prologue qui en donne l'orientation générale. «Ne pensez pas que je sois venu abolir la Loi ou les Prophètes: je ne suis pas venu abolir, mais accomplir.» Jésus n'est ni un révolutionnaire qui veut tout changer, pour repartir à zéro, ni un conservateur qui ne veut rien changer, comme si le passé était parfait en tout.

Il ne faut pas oublier que l'évangile de Matthieu s'adressait à des communautés chrétiennes venues du Judaïsme où la question de l'évolution et des changements était très présente.

Que fallait-il conserver des anciennes coutumes et des lois de Moïse.

qu'il est. Dans une sorte d'accomplissement, d'achèvement, il faut lui donner une vie nouvelle, afin d'aller toujours un peu plus loin. Ce n'est pas parce qu'une tradition est ancienne qu'elle est encore valable aujourd'hui. Ce n'est pas parce qu'une idée est nouvelle qu'elle est meilleure que celle du passé.

Du texte d'aujourd'hui, il faut retenir deux passages importants :

Le premier indique le désir de Jésus «d'accomplir» les promesses de l'Ancien Testament : «Ne croyez pas que je sois venu abolir la loi et les prophètes. Non, je suis venu pour les accomplir». Jésus veut améliorer, compléter, parfaire

Le second nous invite à surpasser la justice des scribes et des pharisiens. Chacune des antithèses nous pousse à aller plus loin, comme par exemple celle de l'offrande à l'autel : «Lorsque tu apportes ton offrande à l'autel et que tu te souviens que ton frère ou ta soeur a quelque chose contre toi, laisse-là ton offrande, va d'abord te réconcilier avec ton frère ou ta soeur et reviens présenter ton offrande.»

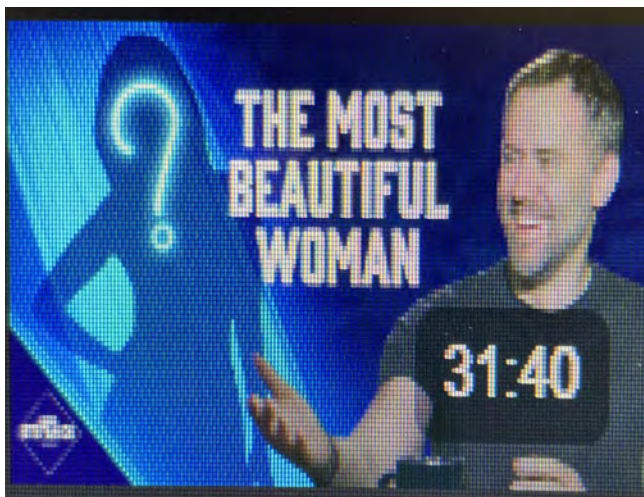
