

A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR – FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

This week we celebrate two great saints: Saint Patrick and Saint Joseph. It is amazing how the Saints inscribe themselves into the history of the Church, by showing us the ever-shining example of their faith and life reflecting it. The centuries go by, but the example of the saints stands ever more evident and stronger as the passing times affirms their faith. Hope and love are a much-appreciated monument of the time and life passed, yet their example is always alive in the hearts of the believers producing new fruits in their lives. The Saints become the next stone in the edifice of the Church, standing on the foundations of the Apostles. This is how Jesus manifests himself in the lives of his believers, by making them a sign on the way to himself and ultimately to God.

As I mentioned last week with our pilgrimage to Rome, we have seen the relics and tombs of many Saints. Fr. Louis took us for the tour of the underground of St. Peter's Basilica to see the tomb of St. Peter. We celebrated Mass twice at his tomb. We drove to the tomb of St. Padre Pio in San Giovanni Rotondo and we had a Mass there. Then we went to Pietralcina, his birthplace and the church where he was baptized and served as a priest for few years. We visited the sixth century tomb of St. Benedict and his twin sister, Scholastica, in Monte Cassino, with the cemetery that holds the tombs of 1051 graves of Polish soldiers from WWII who died liberating the place from Nazis. The example of their lives still edifies the faith of pilgrims, as the example of Jesus, continues to transform our lives in our Lenten journey.

The path of Lent is very indicative, starting with Ash Wednesday awareness, that we came from earth's ashes and to them we will turn. Then, we have seen Jesus tempted in the desert. On the 2nd Sunday of Lent, the Gospel spoke of Transfiguration of Jesus. On the 3rd Sunday of Lent, Jesus engages in dialogue with the Samaritan Woman and community, revealing himself to them. This Sunday Jesus reaches out to the blind man, and we hear how much confusion was created by those who commented on the cure. The blind man comes to faith in Jesus as the Messiah, but the spiritual blindness of many comes to evidence in their resentment directed towards Jesus or the man that was cured and his family. This kind of resentment and negative commentaries, exists even today in the hearts of those who resent christian or catholic values, as the western culture becomes more and more pagan again.

In the world and culture that negates the need for God and for faith, the existence of holy things is very threatening; but for us who have the faith, it only proves our dependence and need for God. As Jesus showed us, he always cares for the sick and the vulnerable, blind and lepers. Jesus very much cares for everyone, to the point of taking on, all those difficult steps: of desert, challenge by unbelievers, and of submission to haters who ultimately killed him. Jesus never abandons us, but walks with us even to the point of death and resurrection, in order to bring us the transfiguration of heaven. This is the purpose of Lent, to prepare us for heaven.

So let us engage with Jesus in this journey of faith, starting with prayer, penance, fasting and alms giving. Let us invite Jesus to take away our blindness, our brokenness, our sinfulness. Come to Jesus, come to receive any sacrament to be touched by Jesus. Realize we have confessions daily at 4:30pm. If you are without sin, you are a Saint. If you are a sinner, come and leave your sins behind and be free and happy believer ready for Easter.

MENSAJE DE NUESTROS PASTOR – CUARTO DOMINGO DE CUARESMA.

Queridas Hermanas y Hermanos,

Esta semana celebramos a dos grandes santos: San Patricio y San José. Es asombroso como los Santos se inscriben en la historia de la Iglesia, mostrándonos el ejemplo siempre brillante de su fe y de su vida reflejándolo, pasan los siglos, pero el ejemplo de los santos se hace cada vez más evidente y más fuerte, pues el paso de los tiempos afirma su fe, esperanza y amor para ser monumento muy apreciado del tiempo y de la vida pasada, pero su ejemplo siempre está vivo en los corazones de los creyentes produciendo nuevos frutos en sus vidas. Los Santos se convierten en la próxima piedra en el edificio de la Iglesia, que se levanta sobre los cimientos de los Apóstoles. Así es como Jesús se manifiesta en la vida de sus creyentes, haciéndolos un signo en el camino hacia sí mismo y, en última instancia hacia Dios.

Como mencione la semana pasada con nuestra peregrinación a Roma, hemos visto las reliquias y las tumbas de muchos santos. Padre Louis nos llevó a recorrer el subterráneo de la Basílica de San Pedro para ver la tumba de San Pedro. Nosotros celebramos Misa dos veces en su tumba. Condujimos hasta los santos Padre Pio en San Giovanni Rotondo y tuvimos una misa allí. Luego fuimos a Pietralcina, su lugar de nacimiento y la iglesia donde fue bautizado y sirvió como sacerdote durante algunos años. Visitamos la tumba del siglo VI de San Benito y su hermana preadolescente Scholasstica en Monte Cassino, con el cementerio que alberga las tumbas de 1051 tumbas de soldados polacos de la Segunda Guerra Mundial que murieron liberando el lugar de los Nazis. El ejemplo de sus vidas aun edifica la fe de los pelegrinos, como el ejemplo de Jesús continúa transformando nuestras vidas en nuestro camino de cuaresma.

El camino de la Cuaresma es muy indicativo, comenzando con la conciencia del Miércoles de Ceniza, que venimos de las cenizas de la tierra y a ellas nos volveremos. Entonces hemos visto a Jesús tentado en el desierto. El segundo Domingo de Cuaresma, el Evangelio habla de la Transfiguración de Jesús. El tercer Domingo de Cuaresma, Jesús dialoga con la Samaritana y la comunidad, revelándose a ellos. Este Domingo Jesús se acerca al ciego y escuchamos cuanta confusión crearon los que comentaban la cura. El ciego llega a la fe en Jesús como Mesías, pero la ceguera espiritual de muchos se manifiesta en su resentimiento hacia Jesús o hacia el hombre que fue curado y su familia. Este tipo de resentimiento y comentarios negativos, existe aún hoy en día en los corazones de aquellos que resienten los valores cristianos o católicos, ya que la cultura occidental se vuelve cada vez más pagana.

En el mundo y la cultura que niega la necesidad de Dios y de la fe, la existencia de las cosas santas es muy amenazante, pero para nosotros que tenemos la fe, solo prueba nuestra dependencia y necesidad de Dios. Como Jesús nos mostró, siempre se preocupa por los enfermos y los vulnerables, los ciegos y los leprosos. Jesús se preocupa mucho por todos, hasta el punto de asumir todos esos pasos difíciles: del desierto, del desafío de los incrédulos y de la sumisión a los enemigos que finalmente lo mataron. Jesús nunca nos abandona, sino que camina con nosotros hasta la muerte y la resurrección, para traernos la transfiguración del cielo. Este es el propósito de la Cuaresma, prepararnos para el cielo.

Así que comprometámonos con Jesús en este camino de fe, comenzando con la oración, la penitencia, el ayuno y la limosna. Invitemos a Jesús a quitar nuestra ceguera, nuestro quebrantamiento, nuestra pecaminosidad. Venid a Jesús, venid a recibir cualquier sacramento para ser tocados por Jesús. Tenga en cuenta que tenemos confesiones todos los días a la 4:30 pm. Si no tienes pecado, eres un Santo. Si eres pecador. Ven y deja atrás tus pecados y se un creyente libre y feliz listo para la Pascua.

CUARTA SEMANA DE CUARESMA

Los fariseos preguntan: "¿Quieres decir que nosotros también somos ciegos?" Si fueran realmente ciegos les dice Jesús, "no tendrían pecado; pero porque dicen: 'Podemos ver', son culpables".

Los fariseos se niegan a creer en Jesús. Los que pecan, los que se niegan a escuchar, los que son soberbios, son los verdaderos ciegos. Los fariseos, que pensaban que podían ver, eran los verdaderos pecadores. Y el hombre ciego de nacimiento que acepta a Jesús realmente puede ver.

Son muy oportunas las palabras de Pablo en la segunda lectura: "Ustedes en otro tiempo eran tinieblas, pero ahora son luz en el Señor; sean como hijos de la luz, porque los efectos de la luz se manifiestan en la bondad plena y en la recta vivencia y en la verdad. "

Por un lado, Pablo nos está diciendo que, como el hombre del Evangelio que nos representa a todos, también nosotros estábamos ciegos y tropezábamos en la oscuridad. Pero ahora vivimos a la luz del Evangelio y del Nuevo Testamento. Y esa luz se ve en la forma en que nos comportamos, en la forma en que nos relacionamos con otras personas en "plena bondad y recta vida e integridad".

4eme Dimanche de carême A

"Il y a une chose que je sais: j'étais aveugle et maintenant je vois"

À travers de nombreuses images et symboles, saint Jean nous révèle l'identité de Jésus. Il est le vin nouveau des noces de Cana; le bon pasteur qui guide ses brebis; l'eau fraîche du puits de Sikar; le pain partagé avec la foule au désert; le nouveau temple de Dieu; la lumière du monde; le chemin, la vérité, la résurrection et la vie. On retrouve dans tous ces textes la proclamation pascale de la divinité de Jésus.

Le texte d'aujourd'hui raconte donc beaucoup plus qu'un miracle. La rencontre de Jésus et de l'aveugle de naissance survient peu de temps après que le Seigneur eut dit : «Je suis la lumière du monde. Celui qui vient à ma suite ne marche pas dans la noirceur, et il a la lumière de la vie». (Jean 8, 12) Le Christ a permis à l'aveugle de voir avec ses yeux mais surtout, il lui a donné une nouvelle vision de la vie et du monde.

L'aveugle incapable de distinguer la lumière et les couleurs est l'image de tout être humain désorienté, qui cherche à voir et à comprendre.

Saint-Exupéry dans son livre «Le petit prince» disait : «On ne voit bien qu'avec le cœur». Nos rencontres du dimanche nous permettent de voir avec le cœur, de voir le monde à travers les yeux de Dieu. Jésus nous invite à améliorer notre façon de voir les choses. Il nous propose une nouvelle vision de la vie de famille, de notre relation avec les autres, de notre capacité de pardonner, de notre fragilité humaine, de la maladie et la mort. Il nous invite à voir tout cela avec les yeux de Dieu!

Cette nouvelle vision peut nous apporter la joie, la sérénité et la paix. Dieu est avec nous, il nous accompagne et nous offre une solution d'amour aux problèmes quotidiens. Saint Paul ajoute : «jadis vous étiez ténèbres mais à présent vous êtes lumière dans le Seigneur; conduisons-vous en enfants de lumière; car le fruit de la lumière consiste en toute bonté, justice et vérité.» (Éphésiens 5, 8-9)

La foi ne se réduit pas à une série de croyances théoriques, de traditions et de coutumes. Elle est une nouvelle façon de voir le monde et de bien vivre sa vie. La réalité éclairée par Seigneur prend alors une toute autre coloration




