Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Last weekend some of you were surprised by the news about Wayne Goldmann's passing away. We were all surprised about what and how fast it happened, so I am going to put it for you in a time frame.

On Friday, the 19th of April, Wayne went to the hospital for gold bladder stones removal. He returned home after the 4-hour procedure. When the painkillers wore off, he was in pain throughout the night. Saturday morning he called ambulance because of the pain. He was admitted to the South Side Hospital and we all thought he will be taken care of.

On Sunday the 21st I went to visit him at 11:30 and I gave him the anointing of the sick. We talked normally but with all the medicines that he was getting he was still in pain and tired.

On Sunday evening at 11:00pm Alexandra, Wayne's daughter received call that he needed to be intubated because he had difficulties breathing. He was put on dialysis because they realized that his kidneys were not working. He was sedated for the procedures.

When I went to see Wayne at 11:30am on Monday the 22nd, there was no normal communication with Wayne because of the sedation. His first dialysis machine was not working properly so they were setting up the second machine for it. His heart rate was high around 130 and his blood pressure was low- around 65/35. His other numbers were not improving at all.

At that situation I gave him another anointing of the sick with the Apostolic Blessings that we could call "last rights" as it was becoming obvious, that Wayne is not going to recover. As nothing was improving, but only going downhill. Wayne passed away around 8:15pm that Monday, April 22nd, due to unexpected medical complications. He was surrounded by family and friends. His passing was very peaceful, almost unnoticeable.

We buried Wayne on Friday, April 26th. After Mass in St. Anne's he was interred at The Resurrection Cemetery on Wellwood Avenue in Farmingdale.

We all are in debt to Wayne for his service to the Parish, who in many ways served in different capacities: as the morning custodian by opening the church every day, blowing the entrance leaves, flowers or snow, checking on general operations of things around; as the sacristan he was preparing things for different Masses, Baptisms or Adoration. As the teacher and believer, Wayne was preparing other adults for the Sacraments; as a parish driver he was picking up the food for our parish outreach or pizza that is donated to us daily on the end of the day. He would get for us the bread we were donating at the door of the church or those drinks that we distributed at the entrance. Wayne would supervise any repair works on the parish grounds if I could not be around, and any other things that would come up to be done. As a lector he would read at Mass and as a Eucharistic Minister he would help to give away the Holy Communion, he would go to the nursing home to bring Communion or Ashes. He supervised our annual procession between our parishes in Brentwood and Islip. He would help with any other job that came along. He would take care of our parish pick-up to be served and running. He would go shopping for what was needed. He is irreplaceable by a single person.

We thank you Wayne for being who you were to us: a brother, a friend, a companion, a believer and witness of Jesus. We pray for you to receive your reward of heaven for your generosity with us, and we ask you to intercede for us before God, that we continue to do what the Lord is asking of us to do.

Rest In Peace Wayne!

I want to thank all of you for the respect and affection that you have shown to the family of the late Wayne Goldmann, by being present at the Funeral Home, where Deacon Andres did wonderful prayer; at the Funeral Mass where Deacon John shared with us great homily and experience of Wayne's friendship; and at the Cemetery where we witnessed the lowering of the casket into the ground.

Wayne's only daughter Alexandra is getting married here at St. Anne's this Saturday May 4th at 3:00pm. She extended her invitation to the wedding Mass for anyone who wishes to be there for Wayne. It was announced last Sunday.

God bless You Wayne! See you through God's mercy before the Lord in heaven.

The readings for this Sunday prepare us for the coming feast of Pentecost. They invite us to take on the challenge of being perfected by God's love; seeing what Christ did for us, seeing that Christ loved us to the end by surrendering himself for our sake as he loved us first before even we were born. Jesus wants to perfect the love that is in us. He wants us to experience the fullness of it by sharing it with others, so that being born to eternal life ourselves, we may help others to be reborn. Will we be willing to accept that invitation, or will we selfishly choose to circle around ourselves never experiencing the fullness of life and of love that Christ brings to us? The invitation is open to everyone: "love one another as I love you" (John 13:34b). Let us remember that every act of kindness in God's name, it is an act of God's love for others.

Queridas Hermanas y Hermanos,

El fin de semana pasado algunos de ustedes se sorprendieron con la noticia sobre el fallecimiento de Wayne Goldmann. Todos estamos sorprendidos por lo que sucedió y con qué rapidez, así que lo voy a poner en un marco de tiempo.

El viernes 19 de Abril, Wayne fue al hospital para que le extrajeran cálculos o piedra en la vejiga. Regreso a casa después del procedimiento de cuatros horas. Cuando los analgésicos desaparecieron, sintió dolor durante toda la noche. El sábado por la mañana llamo a una ambulancia a causa del dolor. Fue ingresado en el Hospital South Side y todos pensamos que lo cuidarían.

El Domingo 21 fui a visitarlo a la 11:30 y le di la unción de los enfermos. Hablamos normalmente, pero con todos los medicamentos que estaba tomando todavía tenía dolor y estaba cansado.

El Domingo por la noche a las 11:00pm, Alexandra, la hija de Wayne, recibió una llamada informándole que necesitaba ser intubado porque tenía dificultades para respirar. Lo pusieron en diálisis porque se dieron cuenta de que sus riñones no funcionaban. Fue sedado para los procedimientos.

Cuando fui a ver a Wayne a las 11:30 am del lunes 22, no hubo comunicación normal con Wayne debido a la sedación. Su primera máquina de diálisis no funcionaba correctamente, por lo que estaban configurando la segunda máquina. Su frecuencia cardiaca era alta, alrededor de 130 y su presión arterial baja, alrededor de 65/35. Sus otros números no mejoraban en absoluto. Ante esa situación le di otra unción de los enfermos con la Bendiciones Apostólicas que podríamos llamar "últimos derechos" ya que estaba haciendo evidente que Wayne no se iba a recuperar. Como nada mejoraba; pero solo yendo cuesta abajo. Wayne falleció alrededor de la 8:15 pm de ese lunes 22 de abril debido a complicaciones medicas inesperadas. Estuvo rodeado de familiares y amigos. Su fallecimiento fue muy pacifico, casi imperceptible.

Enterramos a Wayne el Viernes 26 de abril. Después de la Misa en St. Anne's fue enterrado en el cementerio de la Resurreccion en Wellwood Avenue en Farmingdale.

Todos estamos en deuda con Wayne por su servicio a la parroquia, quien de muchas maneras sirvió en diferentes capacidades: como custodio matutino abriendo la Iglesia todos los días, soplando las hojas, flores o nieve de la entrada, verificando las operaciones generales de las cosas alrededor; como sacristán estaba preparando las cosas para diferentes Misas, Bautismos o Adoración. Como maestro y creyente, Wayne estaba preparando a otros adultos para los Sacramentos; como conductor parroquial, estaba recogiendo la comida para nuestra oficina de extensión parroquial o la pizza que nos donan diariamente al final del día. Nos conseguía el pan que donábamos en la puerta de la iglesia o esas bebidas que repartíamos en la entrada. Wayne supervisaba cualquier trabajo de reparación en los terrenos de la parroquia si yo no pudiera estar presente, y cualquier otra cosa que surgiera por hacer. Como lector leía en Misa y como Ministro Eucarístico ayudaba a repartir la Sagrada Comunión, iba al asilo de ancianos a llevar la Comunión o las Cenizas. Superviso nuestra procesión anual entre nuestras parroquias en Brentwood y Islip. Ayudaría con cualquier otro trabajo que surgiera. Él se encargaría de que nuestra parroquia estuviera atendida y en funcionamiento. Iría a comprar lo que hiciera falta. Es insustituible por una sola persona.

Te damos gracias Wayne por ser quien fuiste para nosotros: un hermano, un amigo, un compañero, un creyente y testigo de Jesus. Oramos para que recibas tu recompensa eterna del cielo por tu generosidad con nosotros, y te pedimos que intercedas por nosotros ante Dios, para que sigamos haciendo lo que el Señor nos pide que hagamos.

¡Descansa en Paz Wayne!

Quiero agradecerles a todos por el respeto y afecto que han mostrado a la familia del fallecido Wayne Goldmann, al estar presentes en la funeraria, donde el Diacono Andres hizo una maravillosa oración; en la Misa del Funeral donde el Diacono John compartió con nosotros una gran homilía y la experiencia de la amistad de Wayne; y en el Cementerio donde presenciamos el descenso del ataúd al suelo.

La única hija de Wayne, Alexandra, se casará aquí en St. Anne's este sábado 4 de mayo a las 3:00pm Extendió su invitación a la misa de boda a cualquiera que desee estar presente para Wayne. Fue anunciado el pasado Domingo. ¡Dios te bendiga Wayne! Nos vemos a través de la misericordia de Dios ante el Señor en el cielo.

Las lecturas de este Domingo nos preparan para la próxima fiesta de Pentecostés. No invitan a asumir el desafío de ser perfeccionados por el amor de Dios; viendo lo que Cristo hizo por nosotros, viendo que Cristo nos amó hasta el fin, entregándose a sí mismo por nosotros, como nos amó primero, incluso antes de que nacióramos. Jesus quiere perfeccionar el amor que hay en nosotros. Él quiere que experimentemos su plenitud compartiéndola con los demás, para que, habiendo nacido nosotros mismos para la vida eterna, podamos ayudar a otros a renacer. ¿Estando dispuestos a aceptar esa invitación, o elegiremos egoístamente dar vueltas alrededor de nosotros mismos sin experimentar nunca la plenitud de vida y de amor que Cristo nos trae? La invitación está abierta a todos: "amaos unos a otros como yo os amo". Recordemos que cada acto de bondad en nombre de Dios, es un acto de amor de Dios hacia los demás.

Jesús nos recuerda algo extremadamente importante. Es decir, que siempre estaremos en deuda con él. A veces nos resulta fácil pensar que Dios debería estar agradecido por el amor y la atención que le brindamos en comparación con la gran cantidad de personas que lo ignoran por completo.

Fácilmente puede haber en nosotros un poco de aquel fariseo que oraba en el templo y se jactaba de lo mucho que hacía por Dios y de que no era como los demás pecadores. "No fueron ustedes los que me eligieron, sino, yo los elegí", nos recuerda hoy Jesús.

Todo lo que hacemos por Dios y por Jesús es sólo una respuesta al amor y al llamado que primero vino de él. De acuerdo a las palabras del Evangelio, "somos servidores inútiles" simplemente cumpliendo con nuestro deber.

En la Segunda Lectura expresa esto de manera sorprendente. El amor de Dios, no el nuestro, es lo primero. "El amor de Dios por nosotros se reveló cuando Dios envió al mundo a su único Hijo para que tuviéramos vida por medio de él". Y continúa: "Este es el amor al que me refiero: no nuestro amor por Dios, sino el amor de Dios por nosotros cuando envió a su Hijo para ser el cordero sacrificado que quita nuestros pecados".

Hemos sido elegidos y bendecidos con este amor "Les he encargado que vayan y den fruto; fruto que perdure." No nos limitamos a recostarnos y disfrutar del conocimiento que nosotros, según los designios inescrutables de Dios, hemos sido elegidos por él. Hemos sido elegidos con un propósito. El amor de Dios que se derrama en nuestros corazones también debe fluir a través de nosotros y ser experimentado por las personas con las que entramos en contacto. De lo contrario, somos, como nos decía el Evangelio del domingo pasado, ramas inútiles, que sólo sirven para ser cortadas y arrojadas al fuego.

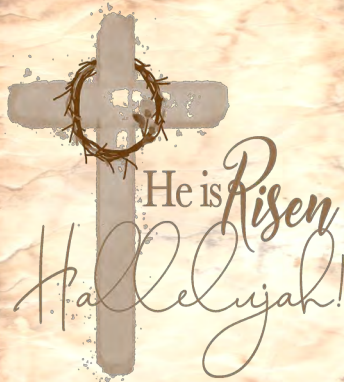
Notre vie chrétienne peut se développer dans la mesure où nous permettons à cette amitié avec Dieu de grandir et de s'épanouir.

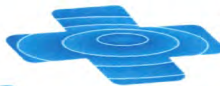

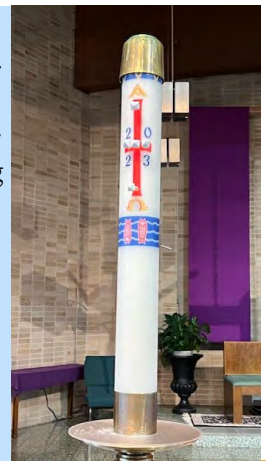
