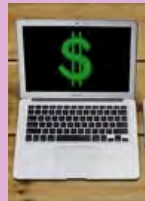

Dear Sisters and Brothers! A Blessed and Joyful Christmas to You All!!!

On behalf of our parish priests and staff, I extend to you and your loved ones heartfelt Christmas wishes. May this holy season fill your homes with peace, your hearts with hope, and your lives with the quiet joy that comes from knowing God is with us. Merry Christmas!



Today, we celebrate the great mystery at the heart of our faith: the Word became flesh and dwelt among us. Christmas proclaims that God is not distant or removed from our human experience. He enters it fully. He comes as a child—fragile, dependent, and entrusted to human love. The manger reveals who God is and how God works. He does not force His way into the world. He waits to be welcomed. He is born into simplicity, surrounded not by privilege, but by faith. In Jesus, God embraces our joys and struggles, our hopes and our wounds. Christmas speaks directly to our lives today. Many hearts rejoice; others ache. Some gather with family; others feel absence or loss. The good news of Christmas is that God enters all of it. No darkness is too deep, no situation too broken, no heart too weary for His light.

The Gospel of Christmas Day does not begin at the manger, but in eternity: “In the beginning was the Word.” Saint John reminds us that the child lying in the crib is the eternal God through whom all things were made. Yet this same God chooses humility over power, closeness over control, love over fear. As we celebrate this sacred day, we are invited to receive Christ anew—not only in this church, but in our daily lives. To welcome Him in kindness offered, forgiveness shared, generosity practiced, and love renewed.

We have just knelt at the manger, gazing upon the wonder of God made flesh—so small, so vulnerable, so close. He came not as a powerful ruler, but as a child born into a family. On Holy Family Sunday, we reflect on the family in which Jesus was raised—Mary, Joseph, and Jesus—and discover what Christmas looks like when it is lived day by day. The Gospel presents us with the Flight into Egypt. This is not a peaceful Christmas scene, but a moment of fear and urgency. Joseph rises in the night, trusting God’s warning and leading his family to safety. Mary follows with quiet courage. Jesus, still a child, becomes a refugee. From the very beginning, the light of Christmas shines in the darkness of a broken world.

The Holy Family reminds us that holiness does not mean a life free from hardship. Their love is tested by uncertainty, danger, and sacrifice—yet God is present in every step. Joseph teaches us attentive obedience and steady responsibility. Mary shows us love that trusts even when answers are unclear. And Jesus sanctifies ordinary family life simply by growing within it. This feast speaks powerfully to our own families. Many homes carry struggles, imperfections, or wounds. The Holy Family assures us that God does not wait for perfect families. He chooses to dwell in homes where love is tried, faith is lived quietly, and trust is renewed each day. As we continue to celebrate Christmas, may the Holy Family help us welcome Christ not only into our churches, but into our homes—where holiness begins, one faithful act of love at a time. God bless everyone always!!!

¡Queridos hermanos y hermanas! ¡Una Navidad bendecida y llena de alegría para todos!!! En nombre de nuestros sacerdotes y del personal parroquial, les extiendo a ustedes y a sus seres queridos mis más sinceros deseos de Navidad. Que esta santa temporada llene sus hogares de paz, sus corazones de esperanza y sus vidas de la serena alegría que nace de saber que Dios está con nosotros. ¡Feliz Navidad!



Hoy celebramos el gran misterio que está en el corazón de nuestra fe: el Verbo se hizo carne y habitó entre nosotros. La Navidad proclama que Dios no es distante ni ajeno a nuestra experiencia humana. Él entra plenamente en ella. Viene como un niño—frágil, dependiente y confiado al amor humano. El pesebre nos revela quién es Dios y cómo actúa. No se impone al mundo. Espera ser acogido. Nace en la sencillez, rodeado no de privilegios, sino de fe. En Jesús, Dios abraza nuestras alegrías y luchas, nuestras esperanzas y nuestras heridas. La Navidad habla directamente a nuestras vidas hoy. Muchos corazones se alegran; otros sufren. Algunos se reúnen con su familia; otros sienten la ausencia o la pérdida. La buena noticia de la Navidad es que Dios entra en todo ello. Ninguna oscuridad es demasiado profunda, ninguna situación demasiado rota, ningún corazón demasiado cansado por su luz.

El Evangelio del Día de Navidad no comienza en el pesebre, sino en la eternidad: “En el principio existía el Verbo”. San Juan nos recuerda que el niño acostado en el pesebre es el Dios eterno por quien todo fue creado. Y, sin embargo, este mismo Dios elige la humildad antes que el poder, la cercanía antes que el control, el amor antes que el miedo. Al celebrar este día sagrado, somos invitados a recibir a Cristo de nuevo—no solo en esta iglesia, sino en nuestra vida diaria: acogiéndolo en la bondad ofrecida, en el perdón compartido, en la generosidad practicada y en el amor renovado.

Acabamos de arrodillarnos ante el pesebre, contemplando el misterio de Dios hecho carne—tan pequeño, tan vulnerable, tan cercano. No vino como un gobernante poderoso, sino como un niño nacido en una familia. En el Domingo de la Sagrada Familia reflexionamos sobre la familia en la que Jesús creció—María, José y Jesús—y descubrimos cómo es la Navidad cuando se vive día a día. El Evangelio nos presenta la Huida a Egipto. No es una escena navideña tranquila, sino un momento de miedo y urgencia. José se levanta en la noche, confiando en la advertencia de Dios y conduciendo a su familia a un lugar seguro. María lo sigue con silencioso valor. Jesús, aún niño, se convierte en refugiado. Desde el principio, la luz de la Navidad brilla en la oscuridad de un mundo herido.

La Sagrada Familia nos recuerda que la santidad no significa una vida sin dificultades. Su amor es puesto a prueba por la incertidumbre, el peligro y el sacrificio—y, sin embargo, Dios está presente en cada paso. José nos enseña la obediencia atenta y la responsabilidad constante. María nos muestra un amor que confía incluso cuando las respuestas no son claras. Y Jesús santifica la vida familiar ordinaria simplemente al crecer en ella. Esta fiesta habla con fuerza a nuestras propias familias. Muchos hogares cargan luchas, imperfecciones o heridas. La Sagrada Familia nos asegura que Dios no espera familias perfectas. Él elige habitar en hogares donde el amor es probado, la fe se vive en silencio y la confianza se renueva cada día. Mientras continuamos celebrando la Navidad, que la Sagrada Familia nos ayude a acoger a Cristo no solo en nuestras iglesias, sino también en nuestros hogares—donde la santidad comienza, con cada acto fiel de amor.

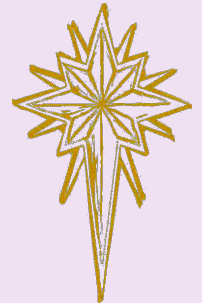
