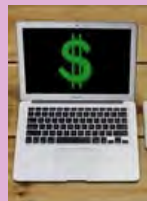

May this holy season help us cultivate watchfulness, deepen our longing for Christ, and renew our commitment to walk in the light of the Lord. Let us begin the journey of Advent with alert hearts and joyful expectation. As we see the giving tree alight, let us consider lighting a smile on the face of those who are in need, by offering a gift for them from the generosity of our hearts.

Queridos Hermanos y Hermanas:

Espero que hayan tenido una hermosa celebración de Acción de Gracias con sus familias y amigos, y que hayan encontrado muchos motivos para dar gracias al Señor. Hoy entramos en un nuevo año litúrgico con el Primer Domingo de Adviento, un tiempo lleno de promesa, anhelo y renovación silenciosa. “Manténganse despiertos”

El Adviento abre un nuevo año litúrgico y, con él, una nueva oportunidad para renovar nuestro corazón. Este primer domingo, el Evangelio de Mateo nos presenta una invitación clara y urgente de Jesús: “Estén prevenidos... estén preparados.”

Jesús compara su venida con los días de Noé: la gente vivía ocupada, distraída, cada uno en lo suyo, sin darse cuenta de que Dios estaba tratando de hablarles. No hacían nada “malo”, simplemente estaban desatentos. Ese es el verdadero peligro del alma: no tanto el pecado grave, sino la distracción constante que nos adormece espiritualmente.

Adviento es precisamente lo contrario:

Es tiempo de despertar. De abrir los ojos. De volver a enfocarnos en lo esencial.

No se trata de miedo, sino de esperanza activa, de vivir con un corazón dispuesto.

Este tiempo es una invitación a preguntarnos:

- ¿Cómo está mi corazón ante Dios?
- ¿Qué cosas me distraen o me apagan espiritualmente?
- ¿Cómo puedo preparar mi familia, mis días y mis decisiones para recibir mejor al Señor?

Que este tiempo sea para todos, un despertar del alma y una preparación serena para acoger al Emmanuel, Dios-con-nosotros.

Que Santa Ana interceda por nuestra comunidad en este camino de preparación y esperanza.

1er Dimanche de l'Avent (A)

Is 2,1-5 ; Mt 24,37-44

Frères et sœurs,

Nous entrons aujourd'hui dans l'Avent, un temps où l'Église nous invite à veiller, à désirer et à préparer la venue du Seigneur. Ce n'est pas seulement une préparation pour Noël, mais aussi un appel à accueillir le Christ dans notre vie aujourd'hui, et à attendre son retour dans la paix et la confiance.

1. « Venez, montons à la montagne du Seigneur » (Is 2,3)

La prophétie d'Isaïe nous trace un chemin d'espérance. Le prophète voit un monde où les peuples montent vers Dieu pour recevoir sa lumière. C'est un appel à sortir de la routine et à mettre Dieu au centre.

Monte à la montagne du Seigneur signifie : prends du temps pour Lui, laisse Sa Parole éclairer tes décisions, laisse Sa paix transformer ton cœur.

Isaïe nous rappelle aussi que Dieu peut changer nos armes en outils de vie :

« De leurs épées, ils forgeront des socs de charrue. »

Nous aussi sommes invités à laisser Dieu transformer nos colères, nos peurs, nos rancunes... en instruments de paix.

2. « Veillez, car vous ne savez pas quel jour votre Seigneur vient » (Mt 24,42)

Dans l'Évangile, Jésus ne veut pas nous faire peur, mais nous réveiller.

Le danger aujourd'hui n'est pas tant un événement dramatique... mais la distraction, l'indifférence, le cœur endormi.

Comme au temps de Noé, on peut vivre, manger, travailler — mais oublier l'essentiel.

Veiller, c'est vivre présents à Dieu, présents aux autres, présents à soi-même.

Veiller, c'est garder un cœur disponible, capable d'aimer, de pardonner, de commencer à nouveau.

3. L'Avent : un temps pour se laisser rejoindre

Ce temps liturgique nous invite à :

ralentir, pour écouter la voix de Dieu ;

accueillir la lumière, au milieu de nos obscurités ;

ouvrir la porte à Celui qui vient, humblement, dans la simplicité d'une crèche.

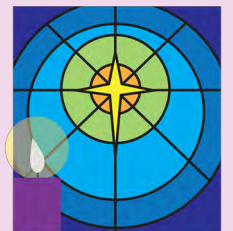
Frères et sœurs,
