Message from the Our Pastor – Third Sunday of Lent

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

The readings for the Third Sunday of Lent, Year A, draw us into the powerful biblical image of thirst—physical thirst, spiritual thirst, and the deep human longing for God. In the first reading from the book Exodus 17:3–7), the Israelites grumble in the desert. Having been freed from slavery, they now fear death by thirst. “Why did you ever make us leave Egypt?” they cry. Their thirst becomes accusation. Their hardship becomes doubt. They question not only Moses—but God Himself.

How familiar this sounds. When life feels dry—when prayers seem unanswered, when burdens increase, when faith does not bring immediate comfort—we too may ask: “Is the Lord in our midst or not?” Yet God responds not with anger but with abundance. Water flows from the rock. Grace flows where complaint had reigned.

The Gospel from John (4:5–42) brings us to another scene of thirst—this time at Jacob’s well. There, Jesus Christ encounters a Samaritan woman. It is noon, the hottest part of the day. She comes alone—perhaps isolated, perhaps ashamed. She comes for ordinary water. She leaves transformed. “Give me a drink,” Jesus says. In this simple request, He overturns barriers: Jew and Samaritan, man and woman, righteous teacher and morally complicated sinner. He begins with physical thirst but moves quickly to something deeper: “Whoever drinks the water I shall give will never thirst.”

The woman misunderstands at first—like Nicodemus before her. But slowly, through honest conversation, her heart opens. Jesus reveals her truth—not to condemn her, but to free her. The One who knows her completely does not reject her. Instead, He offers “living water.” This living water is the life of the Spirit. It is grace that wells up from within. It is relationship, not ritual alone. Worship “in Spirit and truth.” And here is the miracle: the woman who came alone leaves as a missionary. She runs back to the town she once avoided and proclaims, “Come see a man who told me everything I have done.” Her shame becomes testimony. Her thirst becomes mission.

The second reading from Romans (5:1–2, 5–8) reminds us that “the love of God has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit.” Notice the language—poured. Not sprinkled. Not rationed. Poured.

Lent confronts us with our thirst. We thirst for meaning, for love, for forgiveness, for hope. We attempt to satisfy that thirst in many wells: success, comfort, distraction, control. Yet again and again we return empty. The Samaritan woman had drawn water from Jacob’s well her entire life. It sustained her body, but not her soul. We, too, can draw daily from wells that never truly satisfy. Christ does not shame us for our thirst. He meets us there. The Israelites struck the rock and water flowed. The Samaritan woman encountered Christ and faith flowed. Paul tells us that through suffering, hope flows. The desert and the well teach the same lesson: God is not absent in our thirst. Often, thirst is the very place of encounter.

This Third Sunday of Lent invites us to ask: Where am I spiritually thirsty? Where have I been grumbling instead of trusting? What wells am I drawing from that cannot satisfy? Am I willing to let Christ reveal my truth so He can heal it? Lent is not about proving our strength to God. It is about discovering our need for Him. At every Mass, we come again to the well. We hear His Word. We receive living water. And like the Samaritan woman, we are sent back into our towns—our families, workplaces, and communities—to say: “Come and see.” May this Sunday move us from complaint to trust, from isolation to witness, from thirst to living water.

Queridos hermanos y hermanas:

Las lecturas del Tercer Domingo de Cuaresma, nos introducen en la poderosa imagen bíblica de la sed: la sed física, la sed espiritual y el profundo anhelo humano de Dios. En la primera lectura del libro del Éxodo (17,3-7), los israelitas murmuran en el desierto. Después de haber sido liberados de la esclavitud, ahora temen morir de sed. «¿Por qué nos hiciste salir de Egipto?», claman. Su sed se convierte en acusación. Su sufrimiento se transforma en duda. Cuestionan no solo a Moisés, sino a Dios mismo. Qué familiar nos resulta esto. Cuando la vida se siente árida —cuando las oraciones parecen no tener respuesta, cuando las cargas aumentan, cuando la fe no trae consuelo inmediato— también nosotros podemos preguntarnos: «¿Está el Señor en medio de nosotros o no?» Sin embargo, Dios responde no con enojo, sino con abundancia. Del peñasco brota agua. La gracia fluye donde antes reinaba la queja.

El Evangelio según san Juan (4,5-42) nos lleva a otra escena de sed, esta vez en el pozo de Jacob. Allí, Jesucristo se encuentra con una mujer samaritana. Es el mediodía, la hora más calurosa del día. Ella viene sola —quizá aislada, quizá avergonzada—. Viene por agua común. Se va transformada. «Dame de beber», le dice Jesús. En esta sencilla petición, derriba barreras: judío y samaritana, hombre y mujer, maestro justo y pecadora con una vida complicada. Comienza con la sed física, pero pronto pasa a algo más profundo: «El que beba del agua que yo le daré no tendrá sed jamás».

Al principio, la mujer no entiende —como tampoco entendió Nicodemo antes que ella—. Pero poco a poco, a través de un diálogo sincero, su corazón se abre. Jesús le revela su verdad, no para condenarla, sino para liberarla. Aquel que la conoce completamente no la rechaza. Al contrario, le ofrece «agua viva». Esta agua viva es la vida del Espíritu. Es la gracia que brota desde lo más profundo del corazón. Es relación, no solo rito. Adorar «en espíritu y en verdad». Y aquí está el milagro: la mujer que llegó sola se va como misionera. Corre de regreso al pueblo que antes evitaba y proclama: «Vengan a ver a un hombre que me ha dicho todo lo que he hecho». Su vergüenza se convierte en testimonio. Su sed se convierte en misión.

La segunda lectura de la carta a los Romanos (5,1-25-8) nos recuerda que «el amor de Dios ha sido derramado en nuestros corazones por el Espíritu Santo». Fijémonos en el lenguaje: derramado. No rociado. No racionado. Derramado. La Cuaresma nos enfrenta con nuestra sed. Tenemos sed de sentido, de amor, de perdón, de esperanza. Intentamos saciar esa sed en muchos pozos: éxito, comodidad, distracción, control. Y sin embargo, una y otra vez regresamos vacíos.

La mujer samaritana había sacado agua del pozo de Jacob toda su vida. Sostenía su cuerpo, pero no su alma. Nosotros también podemos sacar cada día agua de pozos que nunca satisfacen verdaderamente. Cristo no nos avergüenza por nuestra sed. Él nos encuentra precisamente allí. Los israelitas golpearon la roca y el agua brotó. La mujer samaritana se encontró con Cristo y la fe brotó. Pablo nos dice que a través del sufrimiento brota la esperanza.

El desierto y el pozo enseñan la misma lección: Dios no está ausente en nuestra sed. Muchas veces, la sed es precisamente el lugar del encuentro. Este Tercer Domingo de Cuaresma nos invita a preguntarnos: ¿Dónde tengo sed espiritual? ¿Dónde he estado murmurando en lugar de confiar? ¿De qué pozos estoy sacando agua que no puede saciarme? ¿Estoy dispuesto a dejar que Cristo revele mi verdad para poder sanarla?

La Cuaresma no consiste en demostrarle a Dios nuestra fortaleza. Consiste en descubrir cuánto lo necesitamos. En cada Misa volvemos al pozo. Escuchamos su Palabra. Recibimos el agua viva. Y, como la mujer samaritana, somos enviados de regreso a nuestros pueblos —a nuestras familias, trabajos y comunidades— para decir: «Vengan y vean». Que este domingo nos mueva de la queja a la confianza, del aislamiento al testimonio, de la sed al agua viva.

¡Que Dios bendiga siempre a todos!

Exodus 17:3-7 9

Romans 5:1-2, 5-8

John 4:5-42

Chers frères et sœurs,

En ce Troisième Dimanche de Carême, la Parole de Dieu nous parle de la soif — une soif physique, mais surtout une soif spirituelle.

Dans le livre de l'Exode, le peuple d'Israël, libéré d'Égypte, traverse le désert. Il a soif et il murmure contre Dieu. À Massa et Mériba, il doute : « Le Seigneur est-il au milieu de nous, oui ou non ? » Pourtant, Dieu fait jaillir l'eau du rocher. Même dans l'infidélité, Dieu reste fidèle.

Dans l'Évangile selon saint Jean, Jésus rencontre la Samaritaine au puits. Fatigué du chemin, il lui demande à boire. Mais très vite, il révèle qu'il peut donner une autre eau : une eau vive qui devient source jaillissante pour la vie éternelle. Cette femme venait puiser de l'eau ordinaire ; elle découvre en Jésus-Christ celui qui peut combler la soif la plus profonde de son cœur. Comme la Samaritaine, nous avons soif : soif d'amour, de vérité, de paix, de sens. Trop souvent, nous cherchons à éteindre cette soif dans des puits qui ne rassasient pas. Mais le Christ nous attend au bord de notre puits quotidien — nos habitudes, nos blessures, nos recherches — pour nous offrir l'eau vive de sa grâce.

Le Carême est justement ce temps où nous reconnaissons notre soif et où nous revenons à la vraie source. Demandons au Seigneur de creuser en nous le désir de cette eau vive, afin que notre foi ne soit pas seulement une tradition, mais une rencontre personnelle avec le Christ.

Et comme la Samaritaine, après avoir rencontré Jésus, devenons témoins : elle laisse sa cruche et court annoncer la Bonne Nouvelle. Puisse notre rencontre avec le Seigneur transformer notre vie et faire de nous des porteurs d'espérance.




