Message from the Our Pastor – Seventh Sunday of Easter

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

After Christ has ascended to the Father the disciples gather in prayer, anticipating the coming of the Holy Spirit. The First Reading from Acts (Acts 1:12–14) presents the apostles gathered in the upper room after the Ascension. They are not scattered in fear as they once were during the Passion. Instead, they are united in prayer with Mary, the Mother of Jesus. This image of the early Church is deeply significant. Before the Church can preach, evangelize, or perform miracles, it must first become a community rooted in prayer. The disciples do not yet fully understand what lies ahead, but they trust in the promise of Christ. Their unity becomes the foundation for the mission they will soon receive at Pentecost. In a world increasingly marked by division, conflict, and isolation, this reading reminds Christians that authentic discipleship begins in communion with God and with one another. Prayer unites hearts, strengthens faith, and prepares believers to receive the gifts of the Spirit.

The Second Reading from the First Letter of Peter (1 Peter 4:13–16) addresses Christians who are suffering for their faith. Peter encourages them not to be ashamed of suffering as followers of Christ, but rather to rejoice because they share in Christ's sufferings. These words may seem difficult in a culture that often seeks comfort, success, and acceptance above all else. Yet Peter reveals a profound truth: discipleship carries a cost. Christ never promised His followers an easy path. To live according to the Gospel often means standing against selfishness, injustice, and sin. Christians may face misunderstanding, ridicule, or rejection because of their beliefs and values. However, Peter reminds the faithful that suffering united with Christ is never meaningless. It becomes a participation in His glory and a witness to the world. This message remains relevant today. Many believers experience pressure to remain silent about their faith or to compromise Christian principles. The reading challenges us to remain courageous and faithful, trusting that God's grace sustains those who persevere.

The Gospel reading from John (John 17:1–11a) is part of what is often called Jesus' "High Priestly Prayer." On the night before His Passion, Jesus lifts His eyes to heaven and prays to the Father. This prayer is intimate, powerful, and deeply moving because it reveals the heart of Christ. Jesus prays first for His disciples, asking the Father to protect them and keep them united. His words, "that they may be one," echo throughout Christian history. Unity is not merely organizational or social; it is spiritual. Jesus desires that His followers share the same communion of love that exists between the Father and the Son.

This prayer is especially meaningful in today's divided world. Families, communities, nations, and even Christians themselves often struggle with division and conflict. The prayer of Jesus calls believers to reject hatred, pride, and rivalry. True Christian unity is built on truth, love, humility, and forgiveness. At the same time, Jesus acknowledges that His disciples remain "in the world." Christians are not called to escape the world but to transform it through holiness and witness. The challenge of the Gospel is to live faithfully amid a culture that may not always reflect God's values. Christ prays for His followers because He knows the difficulties they will face, yet He also knows the strength they will receive through God's grace.

The apostles are waiting for Pentecost, but their waiting is active rather than passive. They pray, remain united, and trust in God's promise. Modern life often teaches impatience. People seek immediate results, instant answers, and quick solutions. Yet spiritual growth requires waiting upon the Lord. Waiting can become sacred when it is filled with faith. In moments of uncertainty, suffering, or transition, we are invited to imitate the apostles in the upper room: remaining faithful, prayerful, and hopeful. God often works most deeply in hearts that learn to trust Him in silence and expectation.

This Sunday also invites our reflection on the role of Mary in the life of the Church. She is present among the disciples as they await the Holy Spirit. Mary becomes a model of faithful prayer and trust. Just as she once awaited the birth of Christ, she now waits with the Church for the birth of its mission at Pentecost. Her presence reminds us that discipleship involves openness to God's will and perseverance in faith.

Today, we are invited to ask ourselves important questions: Do I remain faithful in prayer while waiting for God's guidance? Do I contribute to unity within my family, parish, and community? Am I willing to stand courageously for my faith, even when it is difficult? Do I trust that God is preparing me for a greater mission through the power of the Holy Spirit? Christ has ascended, but He has not abandoned His people. He continues to pray for His Church, guide His disciples, and prepare our hearts for the transforming gift of the Holy Spirit. Like the apostles in the upper room, we are called to wait with expectation, pray with confidence, and live with unwavering faith. God bless everyone always!!!

Queridos Hermanos y Hermanas:

Después de que Cristo asciende al Padre, los discípulos se reúnen en oración, esperando la venida del Espíritu Santo. La Primera Lectura de los Hechos de los Apóstoles (Hechos 1:12–14) presenta a los apóstoles reunidos en el aposento alto después de la Ascensión. Ya no están dispersos por miedo, como lo estuvieron durante la Pasión. Más bien, están unidos en oración junto con María, la Madre de Jesús. Esta imagen de la Iglesia primitiva es profundamente significativa. Antes de que la Iglesia pueda predicar, evangelizar o realizar milagros, primero debe convertirse en una comunidad arraigada en la oración. Los discípulos todavía no comprenden plenamente lo que les espera, pero confían en la promesa de Cristo. Su unidad se convierte en el fundamento de la misión que pronto recibirán en Pentecostés. En un mundo cada vez más marcado por la división, el conflicto y el aislamiento, esta lectura recuerda a los cristianos que el auténtico discipulado comienza en comunión con Dios y con los demás. La oración une los corazones, fortalece la fe y prepara a los creyentes para recibir los dones del Espíritu.

La Segunda Lectura de la Primera Carta de San Pedro (1 Pedro 4:13–16) se dirige a los cristianos que sufren por su fe. Pedro los anima a no avergonzarse de sufrir como seguidores de Cristo, sino más bien a alegrarse porque participan en los sufrimientos de Cristo. Estas palabras pueden parecer difíciles en una cultura que a menudo busca, por encima de todo, la comodidad, el éxito y la aceptación. Sin embargo, Pedro revela una verdad profunda: el discipulado tiene un costo. Cristo nunca prometió a sus seguidores un camino fácil. Vivir de acuerdo con el Evangelio significa muchas veces enfrentarse al egoísmo, la injusticia y el pecado. Los cristianos pueden experimentar incompreensión, burla o rechazo a causa de sus creencias y valores. Sin embargo, Pedro recuerda a los fieles que el sufrimiento unido a Cristo nunca carece de sentido. Se convierte en una participación en Su gloria y en un testimonio para el mundo. Este mensaje sigue siendo relevante hoy en día. Muchos creyentes sienten presión para permanecer en silencio acerca de su fe o para comprometer los principios cristianos. La lectura nos desafía a permanecer valientes y fieles, confiando en que la gracia de Dios sostiene a quienes perseveran.

La lectura del Evangelio según San Juan (Juan 17:1–11a) forma parte de lo que a menudo se llama la “Oración Sacerdotal” de Jesús. En la noche antes de Su Pasión, Jesús levanta los ojos al cielo y ora al Padre. Esta oración es íntima, poderosa y profundamente conmovedora porque revela el corazón de Cristo. Jesús ora primero por Sus discípulos, pidiendo al Padre que los proteja y los mantenga unidos. Sus palabras, “que todos sean uno”, resuenan a lo largo de la historia cristiana. La unidad no es simplemente organizativa o social; es espiritual. Jesús desea que Sus seguidores compartan la misma comunión de amor que existe entre el Padre y el Hijo.

Esta oración es especialmente significativa en el mundo dividido de hoy. Las familias, las comunidades, las naciones e incluso los mismos cristianos a menudo luchan con divisiones y conflictos. La oración de Jesús llama a los creyentes a rechazar el odio, el orgullo y la rivalidad. La verdadera unidad cristiana se construye sobre la verdad, el amor, la humildad y el perdón. Al mismo tiempo, Jesús reconoce que Sus discípulos permanecen “en el mundo”. Los cristianos no están llamados a escapar del mundo, sino a transformarlo mediante la santidad y el testimonio. El desafío del Evangelio es vivir fielmente en medio de una cultura que no siempre refleja los valores de Dios. Cristo ora por Sus seguidores porque conoce las dificultades que enfrentarán, pero también conoce la fuerza que recibirán por medio de la gracia de Dios.

Los apóstoles están esperando Pentecostés, pero su espera es activa y no pasiva. Ellos oran, permanecen unidos y confían en la promesa de Dios. La vida moderna muchas veces enseña la impaciencia. Las personas buscan resultados inmediatos, respuestas instantáneas y soluciones rápidas. Sin embargo, el crecimiento espiritual requiere esperar en el Señor. La espera puede volverse sagrada cuando está llena de fe. En momentos de incertidumbre, sufrimiento o transición, estamos invitados a imitar a los apóstoles en el aposento alto: permaneciendo fieles, orantes y llenos de esperanza. Dios obra muchas veces de manera más profunda en los corazones que aprenden a confiar en Él en el silencio y en la expectativa.

Este domingo también nos invita a reflexionar sobre el papel de María en la vida de la Iglesia. Ella está presente entre los discípulos mientras esperan al Espíritu Santo. María se convierte en modelo de oración fiel y de confianza. Así como una vez esperó el nacimiento de Cristo, ahora espera con la Iglesia el nacimiento de su misión en Pentecostés. Su presencia nos recuerda que el discipulado implica apertura a la voluntad de Dios y perseverancia en la fe.

Hoy se nos invita a hacernos preguntas importantes: ¿Permanezco fiel en la oración mientras espero la guía de Dios? ¿Contribuyo a la unidad dentro de mi familia, parroquia y comunidad? ¿Estoy dispuesto a defender con valentía mi fe, incluso cuando es difícil? ¿Confío en que Dios me está preparando para una misión mayor mediante el poder del Espíritu Santo? Cristo ha ascendido, pero no ha abandonado a Su pueblo. Él continúa orando por Su Iglesia, guiando a Sus discípulos y preparando nuestros corazones para el don transformador del Espíritu Santo. Como los apóstoles en el aposento alto, estamos llamados a esperar con esperanza, orar con confianza y vivir con una fe inquebrantable. ¡Que Dios bendiga siempre a todos!!!

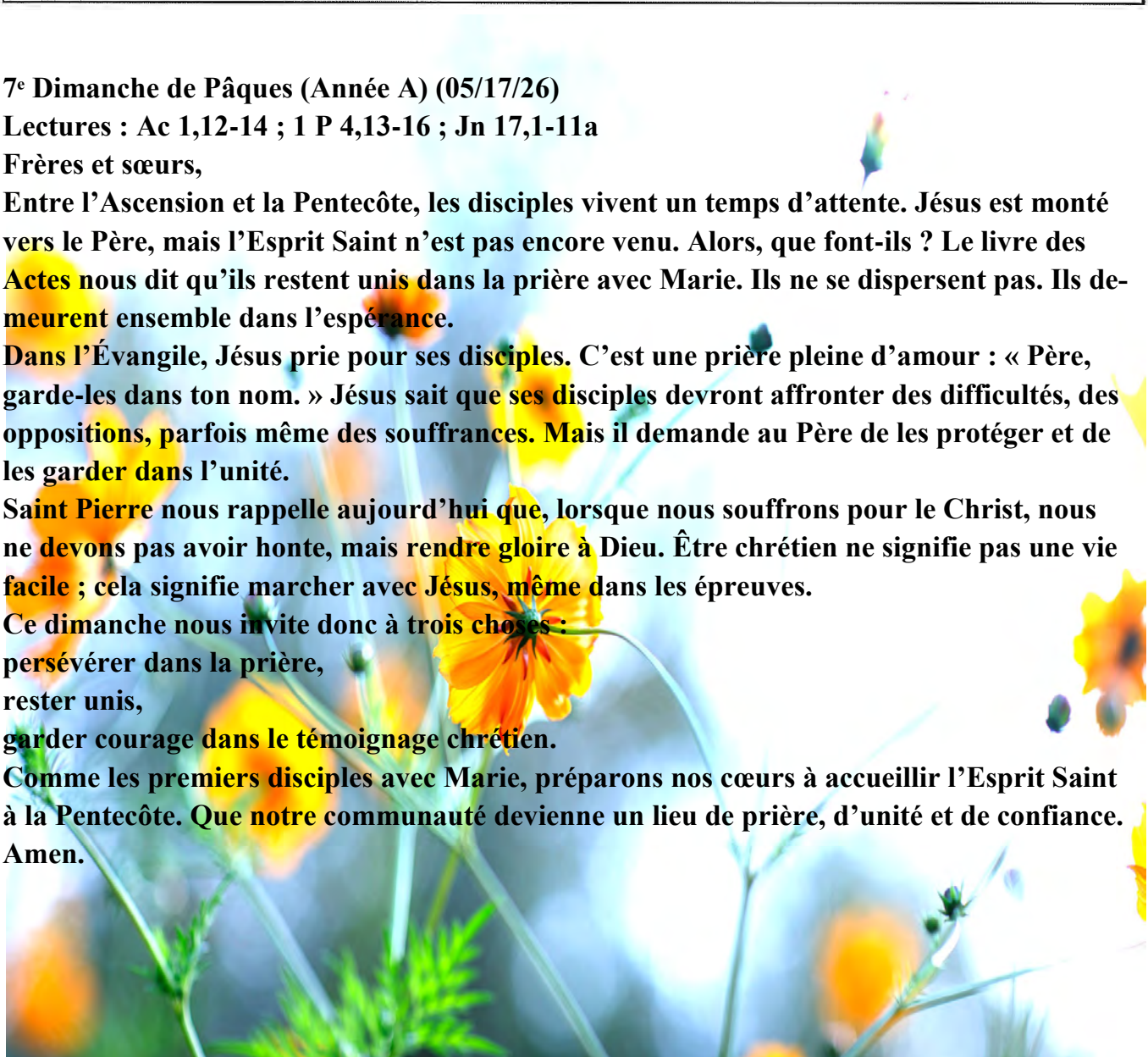



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**PILGRIMAGE TO FATIMA,
LOURDES AND SPAIN
SEPT. 28TH – OCT. 9TH 2026
WITH FR. STAN**



Day 3 Wed. Sept. 30th Lisbon-Santarem-Fatima

In the morning, we will departure towards Fatima. On the way we will stop in the old city of Santarem. In Santarem we will visit and attend Mass at the Church of St. Stephen, which holds the oldest (13th century) recorded Eucharistic Miracle in Portugal. The Miracle occurred when a woman yearned to change the ways of her unfaithful husband and consulted a sorceress. The sorceress agreed that she would cure the husband's infidelity in exchange for a consecrated Host. The woman committed the sacrilege, but when she exited the church, the Host began to bleed. It bled so much that her fellow parishioners thought she had cut her hand. The woman ran home and hid the bleeding Host in a trunk. When her husband arrived home, the wife told him what she had done, and later that night there was a light emanating from the trunk. She and her husband began to kneel before the trunk. The following morning, the husband and wife brought the Host to the parish priest. It was then moved to the Church of St. Stephen where another miracle occurred; the miraculous Host was originally put in a wax container, however, when a priest opened the tabernacle to view the Host, the container was found broken, and the Host was found enclosed in a crystal pyx. Continuation of the journey to Fatima. In the afternoon we will start the visit of the most important places related to the apparitions located in the surroundings of Fatima: Parish Church of Fatima, the Cemetery of Fatima (Where we will find the tomb where Saint Francesc and Saint Jacinta were buried after they passed away) and Aljustrel (The hamlet of the three children). In Aljustrel we will visit the houses where the three children lived and also the well where the Angel of Peace appeared in Summer 1916 (second apparition of the Angel). Dinner in the hotel. After dinner we will be able to gather with the rest of the pilgrims in Fatima at the Chapel of the Apparitions, where Our Blessed Mother appeared, to pray the Rosary and to participate in the candlelight procession. Overnight in Fatima.
