## Message from the Our Pastor – Fifth Sunday of Easter

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Today the readings invite us into a deeper understanding of what it means to belong to God—not as distant followers, but as a people in whom God actively dwells. They speak of structure and mission, of identity and relationship, and ultimately of Christ as the foundation that holds everything together.

In the first reading from Acts of the Apostles (Acts 6:1–7), we encounter a moment of tension in the early Church. A practical problem arises: the Greek-speaking widows are being overlooked in the daily distribution. Rather than ignoring the issue or allowing division to grow, the apostles respond with wisdom. They appoint seven men of good reputation, filled with the Spirit and wisdom, to ensure justice and care within the community. This moment is more than administrative—it reveals something essential about the Church. The mission of proclaiming the Word and the mission of serving the vulnerable are not in competition; they are complementary. The Body of Christ is healthiest when each member lives out their calling. The result? “The word of God continued to spread.” When the Church orders itself rightly, grounded in charity and truth, it becomes a credible witness to the world.

The second reading from First Epistle of Peter (1 Peter 2:4–9) shifts the focus to identity. St. Peter describes Christ as the “living stone,” rejected by men but chosen by God. And we, he says, are “living stones” as well, being built into a spiritual house. This is a striking image: the Church is not merely an institution or gathering—it is a living structure, with Christ as its cornerstone. To be a “living stone” means we are not passive participants. Each believer is shaped, placed, and called to support the whole. Peter goes further, naming the Church “a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation.” These are not titles of privilege for their own sake, but for mission: “that you may proclaim the mighty acts of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light.” Our identity is inseparable from our purpose.

The Gospel from Gospel of John (John 14:1–12) brings us into an intimate moment between Jesus and His disciples. As He prepares them for His departure, He offers both comfort and challenge: “Do not let your hearts be troubled.” He speaks of preparing a place for them, assuring them that their future is secure in Him. Then comes one of the most profound declarations in all of Scripture: “I am the way and the truth and the life.” Jesus does not merely point the way—He is the way. He does not simply teach truth—He embodies it. He does not just give life—He is its source.

When Thomas asks how they can know the way, Jesus responds not with directions, but with Himself. And when Philip asks to see the Father, Jesus reveals the depth of their relationship: “Whoever has seen me has seen the Father.” This is the heart of Christian faith—not just belief in God, but encounter with God in Christ. Taken together, these readings form a coherent vision. The Church is built on Christ, sustained by diverse gifts, and sent into the world with a clear identity and mission. We are not isolated believers, but living stones in a divine structure. We are not wandering seekers, but people who know the Way. Yet this vision also raises questions for us. Are we actively contributing to the life of the Church, or standing on the margins? Do we see our gifts as part of a larger mission? Do we truly trust that Christ is the way—even when the path is unclear?

The promise of this Sunday is not that life will be easy, but that it will be grounded. Christ prepares a place for us, not only in eternity, but even now—within His Body, the Church. And as we take our place within it, we become what we are called to be: a people who make God’s presence visible in the world. In a time when many feel unsettled or uncertain, the words of Jesus remain steady: “Do not let your hearts be troubled.” The foundation is secure. The dwelling place is prepared. And the way forward is not hidden—it is a person, alive and present among us. God bless everyone always!!!

Queridos Hermanos y Hermanas,

Hoy, las lecturas nos invitan a una comprensión más profunda de lo que significa pertenecer a Dios—no como seguidores distantes, sino como un pueblo en el que Dios habita activamente. Nos hablan de estructura y misión, de identidad y relación, y, en última instancia, de Cristo como el fundamento que mantiene todo unido.

En la primera lectura de los Hechos de los Apóstoles (Hch 6,1–7), encontramos un momento de tensión en la Iglesia primitiva. Surge un problema práctico: las viudas de habla griega están siendo desatendidas en la distribución diaria. En lugar de ignorar el problema o permitir que crezca la división, los apóstoles responden con sabiduría. Designan a siete hombres de buena reputación, llenos del Espíritu y de sabiduría, para garantizar la justicia y el cuidado dentro de la comunidad. Este momento es más que administrativo: revela algo esencial sobre la Iglesia. La misión de anunciar la Palabra y la misión de servir a los más vulnerables no están en competencia; son complementarias. El Cuerpo de Cristo está más sano cuando cada miembro vive su vocación. ¿El resultado? “La palabra de Dios seguía extendiéndose.” Cuando la Iglesia se organiza correctamente, fundada en la caridad y la verdad, se convierte en un testimonio creíble para el mundo.

La segunda lectura de la Primera Carta de Pedro (1 Pe 2,4–9) cambia el enfoque hacia la identidad. San Pedro describe a Cristo como la “piedra viva”, rechazada por los hombres pero elegida por Dios. Y nosotros, dice, también somos “piedras vivas”, edificadas como una casa espiritual. Esta es una imagen impactante: la Iglesia no es simplemente una institución o una reunión—es una estructura viva, con Cristo como su piedra angular. Ser una “piedra viva” significa que no somos participantes pasivos. Cada creyente es formado, colocado y llamado a sostener el conjunto. Pedro va más allá, llamando a la Iglesia “linaje elegido, sacerdocio real, nación santa”. Estos no son títulos de privilegio por sí mismos, sino para una misión: “para que proclamen las maravillas de Aquel que los llamó de las tinieblas a su luz admirable.” Nuestra identidad es inseparable de nuestro propósito.

El Evangelio según San Juan (Jn 14,1–12) nos introduce en un momento íntimo entre Jesús y sus discípulos. Mientras se prepara para su partida, les ofrece tanto consuelo como desafío: “No se turbe su corazón.” Les habla de prepararles un lugar, asegurándoles que su futuro está seguro en Él. Luego viene una de las declaraciones más profundas de toda la Escritura: “Yo soy el camino, la verdad y la vida.” Jesús no solo señala el camino—Él es el camino. No solo enseña la verdad—Él la encarna. No solo da vida—Él es su fuente. Cuando Tomás pregunta cómo pueden conocer el camino, Jesús responde no con indicaciones, sino con Él mismo. Y cuando Felipe pide ver al Padre, Jesús revela la profundidad de su relación: “Quien me ha visto a mí, ha visto al Padre.” Este es el corazón de la fe cristiana—no solo creer en Dios, sino encontrarse con Dios en Cristo.

Tomadas en conjunto, estas lecturas forman una visión coherente. La Iglesia está edificada sobre Cristo, sostenida por diversos dones, y enviada al mundo con una identidad y misión claras. No somos creyentes aislados, sino piedras vivas en una estructura divina. No somos buscadores errantes, sino un pueblo que conoce el Camino. Sin embargo, esta visión también nos plantea preguntas. ¿Estamos contribuyendo activamente a la vida de la Iglesia, o permanecemos al margen? ¿Vemos nuestros dones como parte de una misión más grande? ¿Confiamos realmente en que Cristo es el camino—aun cuando la ruta no esté clara?

La promesa de este domingo no es que la vida será fácil, sino que estará bien fundamentada. Cristo nos prepara un lugar, no solo en la eternidad, sino incluso ahora—dentro de su Cuerpo, la Iglesia. Y al ocupar nuestro lugar en ella, nos convertimos en lo que estamos llamados a ser: un pueblo que hace visible la presencia de Dios en el mundo. En un tiempo en que muchos se sienten inquietos o inciertos, las palabras de Jesús permanecen firmes: “No se turbe su corazón.” El fundamento es seguro. La morada está preparada. Y el camino hacia adelante no está oculto—es una persona, viva y presente entre nosotros.

Actes 6, 1-7

Jean 14, 1-12 :

Frères et sœurs,

Dans l'Évangile d'aujourd'hui, Jésus nous dit : « Que votre cœur ne soit pas bouleversé...

Moi, je suis le Chemin, la Vérité et la Vie. » Ces paroles sont un appel à la confiance. Les disciples sont troublés, incertains de l'avenir. Et pourtant, Jésus ne leur donne pas un plan détaillé — il leur donne lui-même.

Il ne dit pas seulement qu'il connaît le chemin, mais qu'il est le chemin. Cela signifie que suivre le Christ n'est pas seulement adopter des règles ou des idées, mais entrer dans une relation vivante avec lui. C'est marcher avec lui, même quand nous ne comprenons pas tout.

Dans la première lecture, tirée des Actes des Apôtres, nous voyons une communauté confrontée à des tensions et des besoins concrets.

Les apôtres prennent une décision importante : ils confient le service des tables à d'autres, afin de rester fidèles à leur mission de prière et d'annonce de la Parole.

Ainsi naît un nouveau ministère dans l'Église. Cela nous montre que la foi se vit aussi dans l'organisation, le service et le partage des responsabilités.
