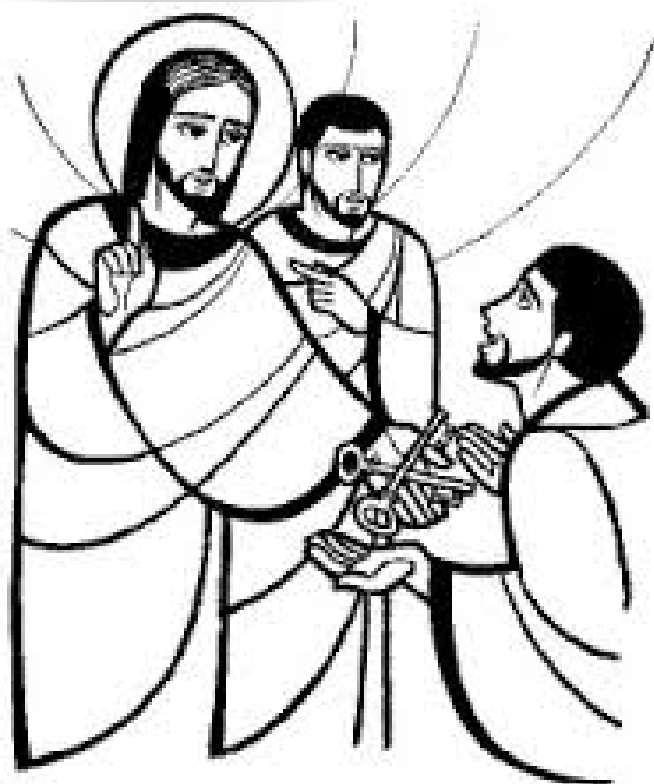

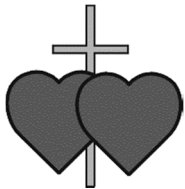

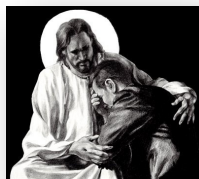

SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Baptism: For children under 5, please contact the Parish Office (273-8113) for an appointment to speak with a Priest or Deacon at least several weeks before the Baptism. For older children, contact the Office of Family Faith Formation (231-7344).

First Holy Communion: Children usually begin Religious Education studies in the First Grade and are prepared for Communion in the Second Grade. Call the Family Faith Formation Office (231-7344) to register your child the summer before the school year begins.

Confirmation: This Sacrament is currently celebrated in the Eighth Grade after 2 years of preparation. Please call the Religious Education Office (231-7344) for more information.

SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

Sacrament of the Sick: Call the Parish Office at any time to arrange for the Anointing of the Sick either at home or in the hospital.

Reconciliation: The Sacrament is celebrated every week-day at 5:00p.m. also Saturday from 4:00 - 4:45 PM in the Church and at 8:30a.m. and 10:30 a.m. on Sundays or by appointment by calling the business office 631-273-8113.

SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

Marriage: Congratulations! Couples planning to marry should make an appointment with a Priest or Deacon at least eight (8) months in advance of the wedding to allow time for adequate preparation.

Holy Orders: Is God calling you? Call a Priest or Deacon to discern a possible vocation to the Priesthood, Diaconate or the Religious life.

DEVOTIONS

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament: Each Thursday from 12:30 PM until 5:15 PM. First Friday from 5:30 PM until 7:00 PM. Rosary after the 12:00 daily Mass.

Miraculous Medal Novena: Monday after the 12:00 Mass and First Saturday from 8:15 - 9:00 AM.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ!

Our World Youth Day 2016 Experience!

Day One & Two: Sunday, July 24th- Monday, July 25th

– Departure from NY and Arrival in Poland

BRITNEY:

Prior to this pilgrimage, I had little knowledge of what to expect from it. I was told by Ms. Clodine, as well as some of our former youth group members who had gone to previous WYD's (Toronto, Canada/Cologne, Germany and Sydney Australia) about their experiences and from all the information, I thought that this would be something like a religious boot camp. Little did I know, it was going to be less of a boot camp, and more of a very meaningful experience.

Clodine:

I was 15 years old when I went to my First World Youth Day back in 2002. That WYD took place in Toronto, Canada and would be the WYD that Pope John Paul II (now St. John Paul II) would celebrate. I remember all the wonderful experiences with joy, but didn't know when I would ever be attending such an event again. God had other plans and decided it would be this year, and with some help from my dad, I was able to save enough money to go and participate in another WYD.

We left from JFK airport that morning and flew with Lufthansa Airlines. The flights were pretty smooth and we tried to take naps when we could, but between crying babies and the overall excitement of the moment, that was pretty hard to do. Our motto for the pilgrimage (taught to us by Bishop William Murphy) was that "This is a pilgrimage, not a vacation! And when you are on a pilgrimage, you do not complain about anything! Because this is a

pilgrimage and not a vacation!", and we had quite some laughs reciting it.

CINDY:

We finally arrived in Krakow, Poland after two plane rides and almost ten hours of flying! I had done some research on the country, but I still wasn't too sure what to expect. Though suffering from a serious lack of sleep, I kept reminding myself that this was the start of my pilgrimage, NOT a vacation.

BRITNEY:

We were so exhausted that we would crack up over the simplest of things. When we officially arrived in Poland, we were offered to try some cheese at the airport. I didn't know what it was (still to this day, I don't), but it tasted like mozzarella and I enjoyed my tasty preview of Polish culture.

CLODINE:

We waited a few moments, stopped by the airport currency exchange (finding out the US Dollar goes a very long way in Poland)...

CINDY:

And then we were off to Wawel Cathedral with our group and initial tour guide, Monika. Little did we know, this would be only the beginning of our Polish excursion!

BRITNEY:

We received a little tour of Kraków to start off the trip, and right off the bat, I was captured by the city's historic and authentic architecture. The main site we saw that day was the Wawel Cathedral. It was a beautiful place that contained a few of Poland's famous rulers and subjects.

CINDY:

After seeing the resting grounds of many beloved Polish royalty including the first female king, Jadwiga of Poland, and the newest chapel dedicated to St. John Paul II, we were driven to Krakow's Market Square.

CLODINE:

The Market square was truly a beautiful place, and since most of the pilgrims from around the world had not arrived yet, we could really take time to look around and take in the scenery. It looked as though we had walked into a postcard of Krakow.

BRITNEY:

Many little restaurants and shops were located in the market square and pilgrims it would become the meet up location during their free time. When we got there, the diocesan leader, Marianne Sheridan allowed us to split up into little groups for a little while to explore. Within a few minutes of walking with Tamara, Ms. Clodine, and Ms. Cindy, I was stopped by a Polish native to take a picture.

I really spent my time observing the people in the Square. There really weren't many pilgrims here yet, but from the few groups and natives I saw, I've noticed a lot. The main observation was that Europeans appreciate leisure time and their surroundings. It was nice to see families and young people spend time with one another and enjoy the beauty of their country.

CINDY:

Throughout the week, the Market Square would also be where we would spend many hours hunting for locations that accepted our WYD food vouchers, exchange high fives, hellos...

CLODINE:

In several different languages haha!

CINDY:

Yes! And trading buttons/pins with fellow pilgrims from around the world. The sounds would be similar to that of a football game in Europe. Drums would be pounding, people would be chanting, all while marching proudly behind the waving flags of their countries.

After our time in the Market square, we got back on our bus to travel a little further into the city to retrieve our official WYD 2016 Pilgrim backpacks.

By this time most of us were completely exhausted from our long day of travel and very little rest. You could almost hear a pin drop on the bus, because everyone was too tired to be chatter boxes by then, so most of us were asleep.

BRITNEY:

Yeah, the rest of the day was sort of a blur, but we finally made it to the hotel. Being up 24 hours straight, my body was aching to lay down. After settling down and eating a few slices of pizza, Tamara & I called it a night. I went to bed, fresh and mentally prepared myself for what was to come.

Couples are given the opportunity to explore many aspects of their relationship through a series of presentations, writings and dialog. During the month of July, we were able to assist 100 families. Within those 100 families, there were 27 seniors, 133 adults and 116 children. We had 16 new families. Thanks to your donations we were able to give our clients food and the extra toiletries they need.



We are concentrating our efforts on supplying our outreach children with the basic school necessities to get a fresh start in September. The school supply list for the Brentwood schools is quite extensive and expensive. Here are some of the items: 2-pocket folders (laminated or plastic), 1" & 2" binders, loose leaf paper, construction paper, pens, #2 Ticonderoga pencils, pencil cases, highlighters, scissors, dry erase markers and erasers, thin washable markers, 24 count Crayola crayons, rulers, post-its, glue sticks, ruled index cards, black & white composition notebooks and 3 subject & 5 subject spiral notebooks. Please consider a small donation to help us give a child those needed school supplies. These school supplies will be distributed at the end of August to the children of our outreach clients.



The following items are always needed: soup, jelly (small jars), cereal, toilet paper, tissues, paper towels, shampoo, conditioner, bar soap, body wash, deodorant, toothpaste, tooth brushes, disposable razors, shaving cream, disposable diapers sizes 3, 4 and 5, baby wipes, dish detergent, laundry detergent, pet food and travel-size toiletries.

When items are available at our outreach, we are able to give our clients gently used clothing, towels and bedding. Our clients are very grateful for these extra items. All of your donations are truly appreciated by those who cannot afford to purchase them on their own.

Un esclave, Onésime, s'est enfui de chez son maître pour se réfugier auprès de Paul, qui l'a gagné à l'Evangile. Paul le renvoie à son maître avec une courte lettre qui révèle la délicatesse de son cœur et l'esprit nouveau qu'apporte le christianisme: cet homme est désormais un frère bien-aimé dans la foi; fais-en réellement un frère en lui rendant sa liberté! On a beaucoup discuté pour savoir si la suppression de l'esclavage, cette plaie du monde antique, est due à l'esprit nouveau qu'apportait le Christianisme ou à des découvertes techniques qui rendaient superflue une nombreuse main-d'œuvre.
