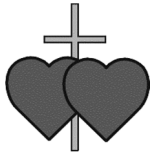

SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Baptism: For children under 5, please contact the Parish Office (273-8113) for an appointment to speak with a Priest or Deacon at least several weeks before the Baptism. For older children, contact the Office of Family Faith Formation (231-7344).

First Holy Communion: Children usually begin Religious Education studies in the First Grade and are prepared for Communion in the Second Grade. Call the Family Faith Formation Office (231-7344) to register your child the summer before the school year begins.

Confirmation: This Sacrament is currently celebrated in the Eighth Grade after 2 years of preparation. Please call the Religious Education Office (231-7344) for more information.

SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

Sacrament of the Sick: Call the Parish Office at any time to arrange for the Anointing of the Sick either at home or in the hospital.

Reconciliation: The Sacrament is celebrated every week-day at 5:00p.m. also Saturday from 4:00 - 4:45 PM in the Church and at 8:30a.m. and 10:30 a.m. on Sundays or by appointment by calling the business office 631-273-8113.

SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

Marriage: Congratulations! Couples planning to marry should make an appointment with a Priest or Deacon at least eight (8) months in advance of the wedding to allow time for adequate preparation.

Holy Orders: Is God calling you? Call a Priest or Deacon to discern a possible vocation to the Priesthood, Diaconate or the Religious life.

My Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ Jesus !

What a significant day we are going to live and celebrate with sadness again on this 9/11 , what a memorial to lost lives, to families broken and hurting forever, to the world that lost its liberties and freedom of believing in the goodness of another human being.

Since that day we all became suspected potential terrorists when we travel by airplane. I'm writing these words over 30,000 feet high in the sky, on my flight back from Rome from Mother Teresa's Canonization. Why must we all have to be treated as potential evil persons ? There is evil, and sin in us all, but not to that degree, or at least this is what we would like to believe of ourselves.

In today's Gospel we have the reminder of that reality of human brokenness, and of God's merciful love that goes much beyond what we humans imagine, much beyond what we allow our minds to elaborate when it comes to forgiveness and mercy.

The two sons, the younger and the older, the bad and the "good one", they both misunderstood their Father's love, as we all misunderstand God's love often, or when we fail to see it in the events of everyday life. Are you the older son or older daughter that " always did the right thing," by obeying and listening ? Or are you the bad young son or daughter, that does not care about your parents feelings, but you ask them for your share of the inheritance even before they die, as if almost wishing that they were dead already.

Lord, help us not to be like the younger son squandering the blessings and graces that you keep offering us, and not to be like the older son accusing you of not being good enough for fulfilling our fantasy about what the life supposed to be according to our perception and vision.

Lord, give us the capacity to see our life and the life of the world; in the way that You see it, in the way as You love it, in the way as You bless it, in the way as You show us your mercy. Give us that trusting and believing heart, that would know and understand your love, and would give it back as Saint Mother Teresa, satisfying your **THIRST FOR LOVE OF SOULS**, as she would often say it. That is our goal in life: to learn to love as God does love, to love as Christ loves by giving his life for the life of the world and for the life of each one of us. Christ gives his life that you and I can live in happiness of heaven forever after passing the test of love and kindness here on earth.

As I mentioned to you last week, I was invited to Rome by the President of Ave Maria Catholic University in Florida, Mr. James Towey, it was this gentleman that proclaimed the first reading during the Canonization Mass. He was and is a co-worker and volunteer of Mother Teresa for decades. As a lawyer he provided Mother, and provides The Missionaries of Charity with his help and advise that would include caring for AIDS patients, driving, getting visas for people and for Mother herself when she was alive etc, etc.....

With the Ave Maria University Staff, we met with Sister Prema; the present Mother General of The Missionaries of Charity Sisters. As we met she asked me to bless her, but if she should be the next Saint, she will bless me I guess. At the Mass I was sitting with my Panamanian friend Fr. Rolando whom I knew from my seven years with the Missionaries of Charity Fathers in Bronx, Tijuana - Mexico, and Rome. As it was hot and sunny at Mass, I was using on and off my Yankee baseball hat acknowledging my being a New Yorker. I had chosen that hat for its clear New York design. I met some other priests and nuns friends, and even an Albanian lady, who recognized me and reminded me that I did baptize her child back in my years in Albania, Mother Teresa's country where I was ordained and spent my first seven years of priesthood. As you could see at Mass, we priests were close to the altar, and Pope Francis got on the vehicle right by us. After Mass I did walked into Basilica of Saint Peter where I walked through Holy Doors, and at the main door I encountered our Bishop Murphy as he was heading out after the Mass. He invited me to give him a call when I get home - I guess he wants to invite me for a glass of Italian wine as we didn't share it in Rome, given the busy schedules we both had.

As I walked through the Basilica, I met Panamas' delegation, so I asked them for picture as we will be preparing for the next World Youth Day in Panama. I got a picture with the First Lady of Panama and the Ambassador. They were very distinguished and polite promising to do great work for the next WYD in 2019. As the Basilica was being prepared for receiving the public, I did go to the tomb of Saint John Paul II, to the bronze statue of Saint Peter and the Main Altar. It was wonderful to have that time in a almost empty Basilica. That afternoon we visited another two Basilicas of Saint John on Lateran, and Mary Major walking through Holy Doors again. One can't describe the impressions those places make on you, even though I knew those places since I did study 3 years in Rome in 1994 to 97 and visited it other times after. You can't get tired of visiting Rome.

On Tuesday, I went to spend a day with my Roman friends who dropped me later at the airport, where I boarded my plane home, and began my writing this article in my flight home on Tuesday. I did not see them since John Paul II funeral. The matriarch of the family and I met in 1994 when I got to Rome for study, and in Rome we met at the house of Missionary of Charity Sisters in Vatican, taking apart the meat from chicken bones, as the meat was going to be used for the minestrone soup being prepared for the people in the soup kitchens. This morning I visited The Missionaries of Charity Fathers at their home, meeting my old priests friends that I knew since 1988, when I first arrived to join them. It was an amazing pilgrimage to this holy place. Thanks for all your prayers.

On this 9/11 day, let us all pray for the victims of this tragedy and all their families. Let's us pray for all victims of tragedies and disasters, both; natural and man made throughout our country and the world. God bless You All !!!

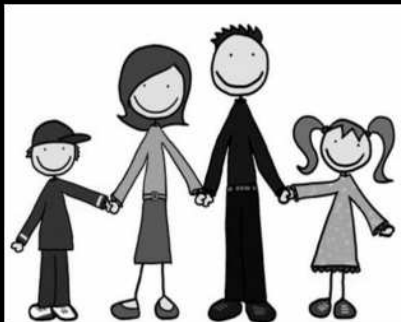

Remembering and Caring for our Senior Priests

Do you ever think about a favorite Pastor or Parish Priest and wonder how they are and where they may be living?

Well, for 14 of our Senior Priests who are living at St. Pius X Enriched Living Facility in Amityville, life is good and sometimes very busy.

As an example, Father Martin Hall had spent many years in Notre Dame in New Hyde Park before he was assigned as Associate Pastor at St. Bernard's in Levittown, where he was an important part of that Parish community. Father Hall, however, is also fondly remembered for being instrumental to the establishment of the Apostolate for the Deaf. Born to parents who were deaf, Father Hall learned how to sign at a very early age and intimately understood how important it was for Catholics with hearing impairments to be able to practice and be connected to their faith and their church.

Although retired, Father Hall continues to be involved with that ministry and frequently joins Monsignor Tom Costa, Vicar of Senior Priests, when he says Mass for people with hearing impairments, either at St. Ignatius Loyola, on the 1st Sunday of every month, or at St. Frances de Chantal on the 3rd Sunday of every month. Father Hall is always met with great fondness and affection.

Many members of the St. Pius Community also continue their ministry much closer to home. Father Marty Klein and a number of other retired priests joyfully celebrate Mass on the 2nd and 4th Fridays of every month for all of the lay residents of Dominican Village and they also lead Holy Hour prayers every Friday evening and offer Reconciliation during the Advent and Lenten seasons.

While these important services for the Lay residents of Dominican Village help bring Christ's message of love and service to many people who may not be able to attend Mass outside, they also allow our Senior Priests to work directly with the people that they have devoted their entire lives to serving.

"Still on duty" St. Pius X provides the opportunity for our senior priests residing there to remain fully engaged members of our Diocesan community, serving as our teachers, counselors, and spiritual leaders.

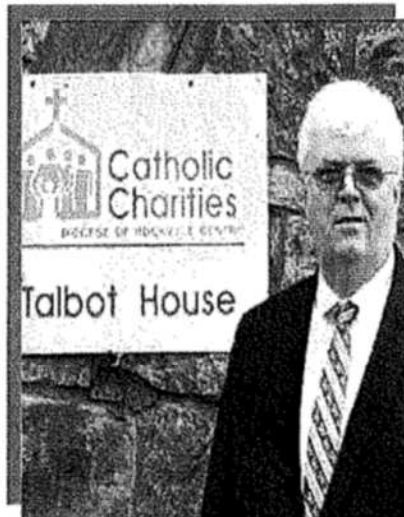

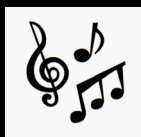
