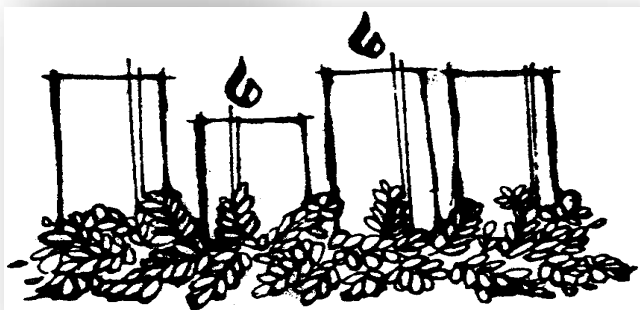

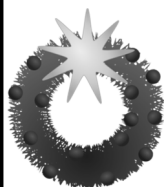

SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Baptism: For children under 5, please contact the Parish Office (273-8113) for an appointment to speak with a Priest or Deacon at least several weeks before the Baptism. For older children, contact the Office of Family Faith Formation (231-7344).

First Holy Communion: Children usually begin Religious Education studies in the First Grade and are prepared for Communion in the Second Grade. Call the Family Faith Formation Office (231-7344) to register your child the summer before the school year begins.

Confirmation: This Sacrament is currently celebrated in the Eighth Grade after 2 years of preparation. Please call the Religious Education Office (231-7344) for more information.

SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

Sacrament of the Sick: Call the Parish Office at any time to arrange for the Anointing of the Sick either at home or in the hospital.

Reconciliation: The Sacrament is celebrated every weekday at 5:00p.m. also Saturday from 4:00 - 4:45 PM in the Church and at 8:30a.m. and 10:30 a.m. on Sundays or by appointment by calling the business office 631-273-8113.

SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

Marriage: Congratulations! Couples planning to marry should make an appointment with a Priest or Deacon at least eight (8) months in advance of the wedding to allow time for adequate preparation.

Holy Orders: Is God calling you? Call a Priest or Deacon to discern a possible vocation to the Priesthood, Diaconate or the Religious life.

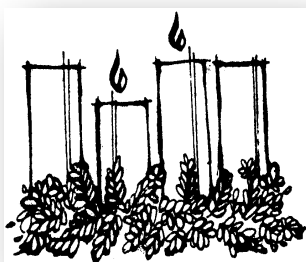

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

We are in Advent already with the first week of December, preparing for celebration of Christmas. Christ's birth is a historical event and we celebrate it yearly, giving ourselves time to be enriched and transformed by his coming, and ultimately to be saved by his: life, suffering, death and resurrection. Do we allow Christ to save us, depends on each one of us individually, since friendship and love of God is a relationship built on freedom to give ourselves to one who loved us first.



Last Sunday Deacon Andre made a great point in describing three types of people in the world in approach to life and faith; they are the : "tourists, residents and pilgrims ". What kind of life and faith consumers are we ? The TOURIST is a person that goes around the world to see, to experience, to consume new things, but is unaffected by it and quickly forgets about them and needs to go to see, to experience, to consume more. It is a typical self centered person, for whom all is about "ME". The "RESIDENT" is a person who already lives in a beautiful place all around, with many blessings easily accessible, but is used to them being there always and doesn't appreciate and doesn't see them anymore, and takes them for granted. This is a person that is always unhappy, but is too lazy to do something about it. The "PILGRIM" is the third type of person that see the places, the beauty and the blessings of the world, experiences them and is transformed by them and shares it with others. This is mature, responsible and happy person, that collaborates with God in saving the world. What kind of person are you???

Who Christ is for the world we have a description in the first reading this Sunday, that surpasses all of our expectations and imagination. Read it again ISAIAH 11;1-10 and be surprised and enriched by it. Let that reading open our eyes, mind and heart to the reality of the person of Christ. Let's invite him to come to our world with all his potential and grace and power. Please read that reading, and see how many new expressions about Christ you notice, that were escaping your memory or attention, but are powerfully describing the Savior, the Anointed One???

As we go into the Gospel, we see John the Baptist awaiting the Christ, preparing to encounter him, preparing for the salvation of the world. Nothing escaped John's attention, he describes the power of Christ, he describes the power of God. He is ready for God's mercy and blessings. It's a total priority for him, making it his aim, his mission, his destiny in life; to wait and watch and to receive Christ into his life, and to make him known to the world. What a blessed call, mission, and what a consequence in pursuing that goal in his life, that John the Baptist had seen with the eyes of the faith itself. It was his faith driven life that proved to be of such a close intuition about who Christ was as a Messiah and Savior, and when he was going to come. His way of life kept his faith and senses alert to the manifestation of Christ. He also foretold what was to come. He not only knew it when it happened, but he knew it ahead and prepared others for that what was to come.

We all are curious about the future, we all want to meet God, we all want to be saved, but do we want to take the trouble or to pay the price for reaching that goal ? Don't we look at John the Baptist as a strange man who does strange things ? For John the Baptist it would be strange to see us not to be too concerned with the project of our own salvation and salvation of the world, since for him it was his life. Is it not our life's goal as well ?

Penance and mortification does strange things to human sensitivity and to the experience of faith. When we don't try it we don't know it. Self control is fundamental for one who wants to reach the goal, even more so in spiritual sense. Our capacity to love is measured by our capacity to sacrifice of ourselves for whom we love. And that is the way of the PILGRIM who: sees, experiences, and is transformed by the experience of life, of faith, of God and of Christ. The PILGRIMS get the best experience of both worlds, and make the most of it for themselves and for others. The PILGRIM enjoys his life on earth and has the happiness of the life to come, but that doesn't mean his life is easy, it may be strange as the life of Saint John the Baptist. Even today there are people who live lives of PILGRIMS , happy to be blessed, happy to love and to serve, they are transformed and they transform the lives of others. " A voice of one crying out in the desert, Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths. "

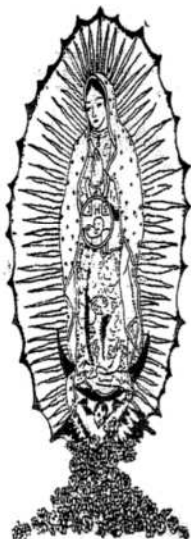

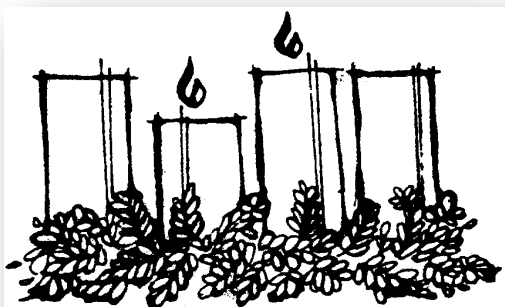
