SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Baptism: For children under 5, please contact the Parish Office (273-8113) for an appointment to speak with a Priest or Deacon at least several weeks before the Baptism. For older children, contact the Office of Family Faith Formation (231-7344).

First Holy Communion: Children usually begin Religious Education studies in the First Grade and are prepared for Communion in the Second Grade. Call the Family Faith Formation Office (231-7344) to register your child the summer before the school year begins.

Confirmation: This Sacrament is currently celebrated in the Eighth Grade after 2 years of preparation. Please call the Religious Education Office (231-7344) for more information.

SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

Sacrament of the Sick: Call the Parish Office at any time to arrange for the Anointing of the Sick either at home or in the hospital.

Reconciliation: The Sacrament is celebrated every week-day at 5:00p.m. also Saturday from 4:00 - 4:45 PM in the Church and at 8:30a.m. and 10:30 a.m. on Sundays or by appointment by calling the business office 631-273-8113.

SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

Marriage: Congratulations! Couples planning to marry should make an appointment with a Priest or Deacon at least eight (8) months in advance of the wedding to allow time for adequate preparation.

Holy Orders: Is God calling you? Call a Priest or Deacon to discern a possible vocation to the Priesthood, Diaconate or the Religious life.

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament: Each Thursday from 12:30 PM until 5:15 PM. First Friday from 5:30 PM until 7:00 PM. Rosary after the 12:00 daily Mass.

We had some beautiful, warm days with sunshine and blue sky. It was easy to enjoy it and want more, but we know that fall is coming and it may change to less favorable conditions. It's part of life and it's constant regeneration, so the best is to expect all the best and be prepared to deal with whatever is given to us.

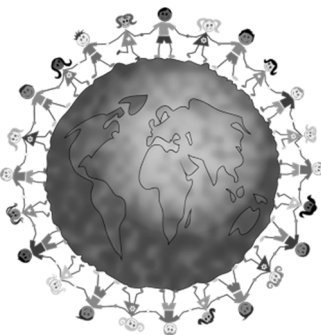


I want to thank you all for your generosity with the second collection for the human relief to Haiti as we gathered: \$ 4000. Our prayers go with it, and if someone still wants to participate in financial support we encourage it, as we all know how much it takes to rebuild homes and lives. As your pastor I want to thank you for all your support and help in making things work in our own parish. There is always something to do, to repair, to fix as our facilities are in constant use. Last weekend we had blocked pipes in the bathrooms, and I want to personally thank Jose Nunez for calling his friend to come and to snake the pipes and cleanup after on Sunday afternoon. It was a good deal of work. This week I bought extra trash containers for all bathrooms, and we will keep them in visible places in the restrooms so that any trash is thrown into them, and not to the toilets, so we avoid the inconvenience of blocked restrooms again. Let's keep our facilities clean as it helps us to pray and to enjoy our participation in all our activities. If you can help with something to make our parish a better place, please don't hesitate to talk to me. Then we can enjoy better our time with the Lord as we will not be distracted by disorder of things around.

In the Gospel of today Jesus gives us the parable of two men praying in the temple. The first man as Jesus said, was saying the prayer not to God but to himself. The man was talking about himself as if he was the center of the universe, praising himself to himself, but God did not need to hear those false statements, since God knows how dependent on him each man is and those self praises made by the first man didn't reflect the reality and the truth; and so his thinking was just as a talking to himself. He had no need for God, he seemed to have all things as his own accomplishment.

Instead the tax collector stood at the distance, perceiving his unworthiness and his total dependence on God: **"O God, be merciful to me a sinner."** Simple prayer showing the reality of relationship and of total need for God. The second man is justified, because he knows he is counting on help from God and not depending on his own capacities since it is God who is the source of all good. We need to be confident in our prayer, but it is confidence in God and not in ourselves. In prayer we want to place all our confidence in God, because all things are in god's hands, instead in action, we need to do all that is in our power, in order to do what we believe is right and what we believe is god's will. But let us remember, in prayer we need to remember how much God has done for us, not how much we have done for God and for others. The fact of remembering what God has done for us will fill our hearts with love, gratitude and with happiness. If we don't feel that love and happiness, then probably the focus of our prayer is not on God but too much on ourselves. Let us examine our prayer; what or who is the focus of my prayer? Is it again about poor me, whom no one understands or no one loves ? Or is it truly about being with the Lord, in whom I trust with all my life? Lord teach us how to pray, how to trust you totally with our lives. Lord have mercy on us poor sinners and give us perception of your presence and love. **Take, Lord, and receive all my liberty, my memory, my understanding and my entire will, All I have and call my own. you have given all to me. To you, Lord, I return it. Everything is yours; do with it what you will. Give me only your love and your grace. That is enough for me.**

The most needed items for our pantry this month are: **cereal, soup, rice, jelly and juices.**

We are always in need of items that our clients cannot purchase with their food stamps. Toilet paper, paper towels, toothpaste, soap, laundry detergent, shampoo, conditioner, deodorant, disposable razors, body wash, disposable diapers (size 3, 4 & 5), travel size toiletries and baby wipes are among those non-food items. Grocery store and Target gift cards (any amount)

are always appreciated. Now that the weather is getting cooler, we are also requesting clean, gently used jackets for adults and children. Thank you for caring for the poor in your parish community.

La prière du pauvre traverse les nuées

La première lecture a été choisie pour nous préparer à comprendre correctement la parabole du pharisien et du publicain. Deux hommes priaient: l'un pour demander à Dieu de reconnaître ses mérites, l'autre pour obtenir son pardon. Ben Sirach dénonce l'illusion de ceux qui se croient agréables à Dieu parce qu'ils lui offrent tous les sacrifices prescrits par la Loi. Mais c'est la prière du pauvre et de l'opprimé qui traverse les nuées. Le "Pauvre", dans l'évangile, c'est paradoxalement le collecteur d'impôts, qui se frappe la poitrine en disant: "Mon Dieu, prends pitié du pécheur que je suis." Le contraste est total avec le pharisien, qui fait étalage devant Dieu de sa vertu et de sa bonne conscience. Mais son narcissisme impénitent l'empêche d'adopter l'attitude de contrition qui pourrait le sauver. C'est le publicain qui était devenu juste aux yeux de Dieu.
