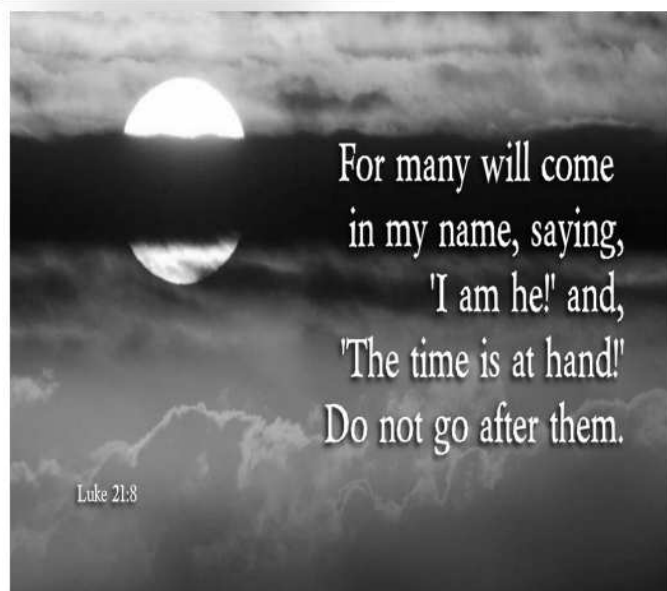

SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Baptism: For children under 5, please contact the Parish Office (273-8113) for an appointment to speak with a Priest or Deacon at least several weeks before the Baptism. For older children, contact the Office of Family Faith Formation (231-7344).

First Holy Communion: Children usually begin Religious Education studies in the First Grade and are prepared for Communion in the Second Grade. Call the Family Faith Formation Office (231-7344) to register your child the summer before the school year begins.

Confirmation: This Sacrament is currently celebrated in the Eighth Grade after 2 years of preparation. Please call the Religious Education Office (231-7344) for more information.

SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

Sacrament of the Sick: Call the Parish Office at any time to arrange for the Anointing of the Sick either at home or in the hospital.

Reconciliation: The Sacrament is celebrated every weekday at 5:00p.m. also Saturday from 4:00 - 4:45 PM in the Church and at 8:30a.m. and 10:30 a.m. on Sundays or by appointment by calling the business office 631-273-8113.

SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

Marriage: Congratulations! Couples planning to marry should make an appointment with a Priest or Deacon at least eight (8) months in advance of the wedding to allow time for adequate preparation.

Holy Orders: Is God calling you? Call a Priest or Deacon to discern a possible vocation to the Priesthood, Diaconate or the Religious life.

Message from our Pastor

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

With 33rd Sunday of Ordinary Time we are coming close to the end of the liturgical year. Next Sunday with the feast of Christ the King of the Universe we will celebrate not only the end of the liturgical year, but as well the end of times, when Christ will subject all things to himself by coming in glory. As Jerusalem was the city of God with its temple as the center of the Jewish worship, it was very courageous for Jesus to foretell the destruction of the temple. And it happened faster than one could think, in the year 70 after Christ. As the people were praising the beauty of it, boasting of human achievement, the Lord spoke of the reality that was surely to come. So it is with the rest of the Gospel of today, when Jesus speaks about the necessary things to happen before the end of time. It is very important to hear that part of the Gospel since it speaks to all of us about things to expect, things that we will experience in our life. Who of us would imagine to experience the things that Jesus described in this Gospel, and to see it as a normal thing when it will happen in our lifetime? This description of the end of times has something of nightmares in itself, something that we dread as we hear of it happening somewhere. And yet Jesus speaks of them inviting us to a great confidence and faith in him.



Is this confusion of our politics a part of that what Jesus is talking about? Probably yes. How many of mentioned disasters are happening in the world presently? Too many to ignore! Should we hope for peace and happiness and ignore what is happening?; or should we contemplate today's Gospel and start preparing ourselves for the worst scenario possible, as we hear it from Jesus' mouth today. The easiest thing to do would be to say, that it is said for people from other countries and other continents, and maybe for other times. But the prudent thing would be to see the reality, that many of those things are happening already even in our own country. The floods, the earthquakes, the hurricanes, the droughts. "Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom."

Lord what's are you saying? Should we be prepared for the worst? Or should we be refusing to think that it is possible in our life? One thing we can do, is we can keep our faith focused on Jesus, so that whatever happens we will be in the right spot with our hearts, confident that with him we can do all things. As he says "By your perseverance you will secure your lives." Which life are you talking about Lord? This one or the next? So many questions, so many uncertainties. Is Jesus real when he says what he says? Yes - he is true to what he says, he even gives his life for what he stands and says.

As we look on the world post election, let's not be naive that things will take care of themselves. We all be well, if we continue to strive to be good Christians and good Catholics, true to God and to our family and to our country, as it was intended by the founders of our country. Don't give your soul to any party, neither Republican or Democratic, but make sure that following a party, you get to heaven. That's the goal. Our soul belongs to ourselves and to God.

We have to be aware how dishonest were the media, projecting to the whole world different reality surrounding elections, in order to manipulate everyone into their way. Believe me, I lived in communist countries and I know how propaganda works. Each government should take care of the citizens first. America always helped others, but America can't promise everything to the whole world. Each government should work for their citizens. America was always good to immigrants and I'm sure it is going to be good under the new president. Remember his wife is an immigrant like many of us, and he understands what everyone is going through searching for a better life. The new President is not an angel, but one thing I'm sure, that he knows how to create jobs in America. After people have jobs, they can take care of all things they need. We need here more jobs, more business and than all things will be resolved by people themselves, without need for government to promise that, what can't be delivered. Remember, the communist governments were promising all things to all people, and than they were oppressing everyone because they could not keep false promises. Jesus' promises are true and eternal. 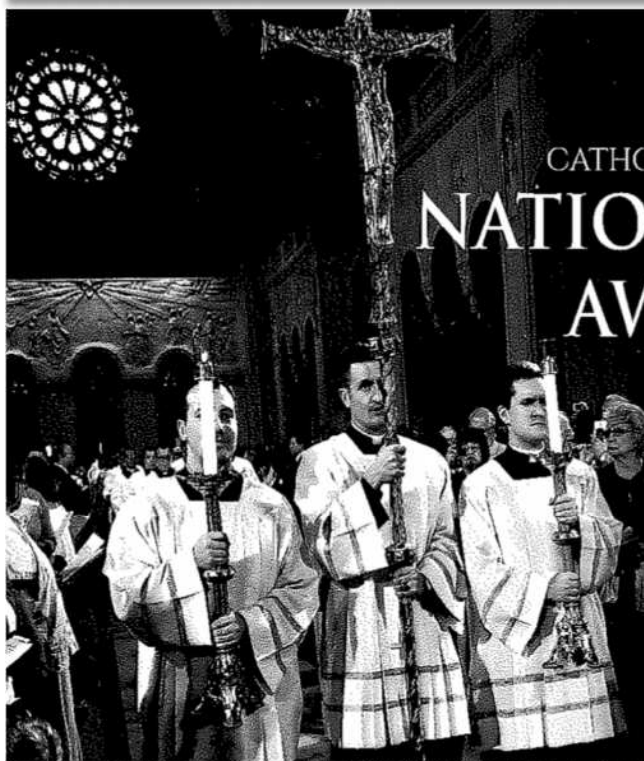
