SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Baptism: For children under 5, please contact the Parish Office (273-8113) for an appointment to speak with a Priest or Deacon at least several weeks before the Baptism. For older children, contact the Office of Family Faith Formation (231-7344).

First Holy Communion: Children usually begin Religious Education studies in the First Grade and are prepared for Communion in the Second Grade. Call the Family Faith Formation Office (231-7344) to register your child the summer before the school year begins.

Confirmation: This Sacrament is currently celebrated in the Eighth Grade after 2 years of preparation. Please call the Religious Education Office (231-7344) for more information.

SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

Sacrament of the Sick: Call the Parish Office at any time to arrange for the Anointing of the Sick either at home or in the hospital.

Reconciliation: The Sacrament is celebrated every weekday at 5:00p.m. also Saturday from 4:00 - 4:45 PM in the Church and at 8:30a.m. and 10:30 a.m. on Sundays or by appointment by calling the business office 631-273-8113.

SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Jesus is the King of the Jews, and King of the Universe! He is the King of Kings. A President of all Presidents. His kingdom is embracing all nations of all times, his power is infinite, his kingdom has no end. He is the most gentle and most loving man that ever existed, his kindness and mercy knows no end. The praises of Christ made by Saint

Paul in the letter to Colossians brings a whole range of implications and meaning that we should contemplate upon; drawing from the richness of it for the benefit of our souls. It is to Him that we owe our lives for He gave his life for us all. This is the mystery that we keep discovering for ourselves throughout our lives, and depending on how much we have discovered, that much of our lives are richer in meaning and happiness. What Christ is and what he has, is all to benefit those who believe in him. The Good Thief is the best example of it; he gains it all by a single act of faith in Christ. When we learn earlier who Christ is for us, we automatically participate in the riches of grace that Christ brings with him. Our knowledge of Christ enriches us already in life and we don't need to wait to be dead to know the fullness of grace and love of God. We receive it in the moment we open ourselves to it in faith. Like the Good Thief, he was assured of being graced at the moment he made the act of faith in Christ. "Today you will be with me in Paradise ", Jesus assured him. That is the answer that God gives to all our prayers when they are in conformity with his will, because "God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not die but have eternal life."



As we see in the Gospel, everyone has their own opinion about who Jesus is. Pilate himself had an intuition in his mind when he stated ordering the inscription on the cross; "What I have written stays written." Pilate had an intuition that Jesus was innocent, but didn't have faith to motivate him to act accordingly, but he gave in for the reason of his political and military career. The rulers of the people "sneered at Jesus ", they knew of the good deeds of Christ, but they were blinded by their own agenda and interests, and so they don't allow their faith in Jesus to surface "He saved others, let him save himself if he is the chosen one ". For the soldiers in their arrogance it seemed funny, as they jeered at him "If you are King of the Jews, save yourself." Even full of himself one of the criminals hanging there reviled Jesus "Are you not the Christ? Save yourself and us." The only sane person in the whole seen was the Good Thief as he said: "have you no fear of God? " Imagine, he was the only person in the seen that acted with a proper perspective, giving God proper place. Even if before he didn't act in accordance with god's law, yet he never pretended to occupy god's place. Everyone else was impeded by their own motives and misinterpreted Christ for their own condemnation, as someone less important than their own ego.

How important it is to have the fear of God, that would help us to occupy the right place and to give God proper place in our lives? What does it mean to have the fear of God? What are my words to Crucified Christ ? What does my prayer looks like? Is God in god's place in my prayer and in my life?

The best stand for Christ we could find in the life of Saint Mother Teresa. When as a girl she told her mother that she wanted to be a nun, her brother didn't want her to waste her life. He was proud of himself as a soldier and he believed himself to be on the top of the world. Than she told him: "you serve the Albanian King of 3 million people and I will serve the King of Kings ", than her brother had nothing more to say. After the military service he escaped Albania to live in Italy. Mother Teresa once left to become a nun was never able to see her mother and sister again as the Albanian communist government considered her the enemy of the state that was officially atheistic. Only years after her mother and sister died, after the fall of Berlin Wall was Mother Teresa able to visit Albania again. And yes she served the King of Kings.

"Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom ." Yes, it was the best prayer ever said, with the answer that surpassed all expectations, not of the Good Thief who knew that God is Good and can and will give us all the best he has, even his own Son.

As you gather this coming Thursday, Thanksgiving Day with family and friends, remember to thank the King of Kings for all the blessing on your table and around your table. May we forever stand, true to our God and true to our native land.

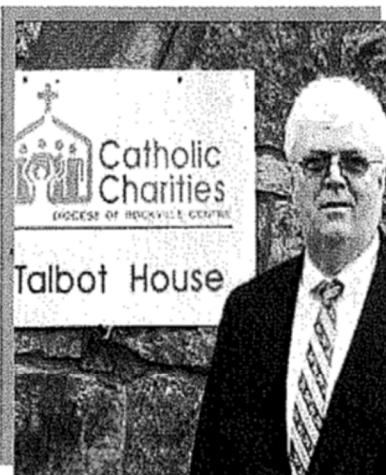

Tout en s'inscrivant dans la tradition du messianisme davidique, rappelée par la première lecture, Jésus la fait voler en éclats. Messie et Roi, il l'est, mais pas au sens des attentes populaires. L'univers des choses et des hommes trouve en lui son aboutissement pour être consacré à Dieu dans un monde nouveau réconcilié. Qui reconnaît pour roi cet homme crucifié? Celui qui a éprouvé jusqu'à quelle profondeur va la solidarité de Jésus avec les pécheurs, jusqu'à s'offrir pour assurer leur pardon, afin d'obtenir, par son amour la royauté sur le cœur des hommes.
