Dear Sisters and Brothers ,

The summer is coming to its end for us, not so much by the changes of weather, as this seems to continue to be beautiful, but it is close to the end because the children and youth will begin their school year and whole new rhythm of life will govern everyone's life. Taking children to school, after school activities, religious education, and all other responsibilities will take over our lives. Last Sunday we had the family picnic in Sunken Meadow Park, that after the business of the Cardinal Gregorio's visit, gave us sense of relaxation and summer fun as we played some games, shared: company, prayer and food; we celebrated the blessings and beauty of nature.



As I am writing this article it is Tuesday, and since last weekend we are watching with sadness and unbelief the unfolding of this catastrophic hurricane that is flooding Texas and destroying and disrupting the lives of millions of people. It's hard to believe it's real, as we have such perfect weather at this same time. We know from Sandy how threatening it is, and how devastating it turns. Our prayers and our hearts are with the people of Texas, and we will have a 2nd collection on September 16/17 for solidarity with people affected by Hurricane Harvey. As I am writing this article, it's still raining and flooding will continue to be the issue for days affecting millions of people. We pray specially for their life safety, as we hear some sad stories of loss of life in those dramatic circumstances. The sad for us in all of that unfolding of events, is our incapacity to improve or better the situation of people trapped in the violence of that natural disaster of which extent we still don't know.

Lord, we ask you to spare the lives of all those affected by this hurricane, protect them and bring them to safety through the help of the responders and relief workers. Lord, be close to those who suffered terrible loss of their loved ones due to this disastrous weather. Lord, help the responders to bring their relief to those who need it and keep them safe from harm. Lord, bring those waters down and help the people to rebuild their lives. Please help us to assist those in need adequately to our possibilities, so that our solidarity would be a true gift of our hearts to the needy.

Today , as we look at the sequence of events in the Gospel of Saint Matthew, we see with unbelief that after that beautiful profession of faith of Peter, and after Jesus revelation of his plans for Peter and the Church, we come to such a scolding that Peter gets from Jesus for his human looking at the divine plan of salvation. As Jesus foretells what is going to happen to him, Peter refuses to accept it, and Jesus categorically condemns his way of thinking as merely human not divine. "Get behind me, Satan ! " are the harshest words of reprimand that Jesus did ever say in the Gospel to anyone. Than he continues: " You are an obstacle to me. You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings does."

How different is god's thinking from ours ??? Surely it is different. In divine plans, God gives meaning to human suffering and death, categories that humanly we would totally eliminate from our lives if we could. Jesus makes it evident for us, that there is no love without: suffering and sacrifice and even if necessary, death. In God's original plan, God prepared our happiness based on human share in God's life and in the goodness of creation, based on total trust and obedience. Instead, after the fall of Adam and Eve, the death entered the world as a consequence of their sin. Since than, one can access the happiness that God has prepared for us by dying to oneself and surrendering everything to God, and this is why now the death became a part of the plan to acquire our eternal happiness and salvation from God. This requires our new level of: faith, trust and total surrender, that surpasses the scandal of the suffering, cross and death. So after the great revelation of who Jesus is, made by Peter; Jesus reveals his way of saving us and our way of accepting his salvation by joining him, by taking our crosses daily and following him humbly.

This is what Peter was avoiding, he just wanted the glory, that he discovered in Jesus, but was not ready to pay the price. No surprise for us, as we too are afraid of suffering and death, but that can't stop us from believing. Some people get paralyzed in their faith by the fact of death, and refuse to reconcile with idea of death being necessary for entering into eternal happiness with God. " *Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me.* " These words of Jesus reveal to us the way in which God is thinking, but it is a statement that we keep at distance from us until we definitely have no choice, but to deal with it. Who of us is making a prayer asking God to reveal to us the crosses that he wants us to carry today or in the future. Do we ever pray like that ??? Don't we want to think as God does ??? - according to what Jesus says, or we really want to stay far from the cross ???

It is something that we want to consider and meditate upon ??? It may be very revealing to us about our motives, our faith and our love for Christ.

Where are we as the Church of Long Island?

Statement by Bishop Barres on the situation that occurred in Charlottesville:

Over the past few days, our nation has been forced to confront the evil effects of racism. The violence in Charlottesville did not develop in that moment or in one day. Rather the seeds of Saturday's tragedy had been planted long before, going back far in the history of our nation. We can look upon that Saturday's tragedy with a sense of great sadness and defeat. Or we can look at these events with the vision the Paschal Mystery brings us - a vision of healing, a vision of new life.

The measure of our commitment to the Gospel will shine forth in the days and weeks to come. The Catholic Church believes and teaches that every human life is sacred. It is my prayer that the tragedies in Charlottesville will inspire each one of us to an examination of conscience that will help us better recognize our role in bringing about and restoring that dignity and sanctity in our world, nation and local communities, particularly here in the Diocese of Rockville Centre.

We know, too, that this reflection can only happen after a full examination of our own hearts. Let us pray that the Lord may help each one of us to see "what we have done and what we have failed to do." On this feast of St. Maximilian Kolbe, one whose life was offered during the Holocaust on behalf of another, let us seek his intercession for the prayerful reflection and courage we need to be a more powerful people of compassion, mercy and justice.

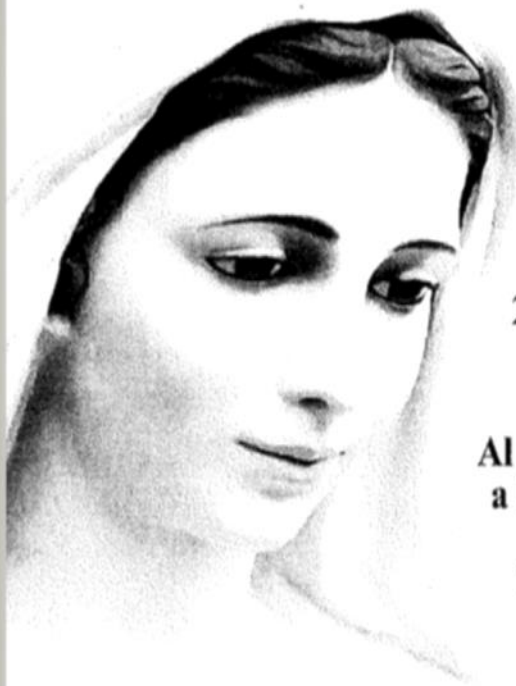

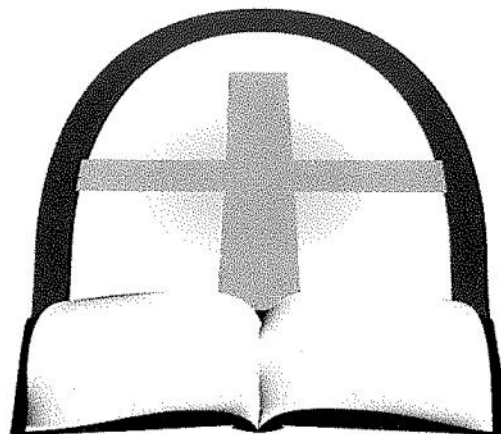
