## 2nd Sunday of Lent

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

What a great perspective that Lent gives us on our life and its spiritual journey. First with the scare of Ash Wednesday, it reminded us of inevitability of death "Remember that You are dust and to dust you shall return " and it invited us to do penance and good works," and the Father who sees what is hidden will repay you ". Then, the first Sunday of Lent with the readings of the fall of Adam and Eve, then with the Gospel on Temptations of Jesus we realize how did we get to the place where we are, a place of struggle and spiritual war.



Today, the Gospel shows us where Jesus wants to take us, to the place of light and transformation, to be able to dialogue with Moses and Elijah in heaven, to be able to see the Saints and to hear the voice of God speak directly to us, to see and live beyond death. The First Reading invites us to take a walk in faith with Abraham to that promised land, where God promises to make Abraham's name great, with all peoples finding blessings in him. Then St. Paul counsels us: " Bear your share of hardship for the Gospel with the strength that comes from God ..... our Savior Christ Jesus, who destroyed death and brought life and immortality to light through the gospel. " Here we have all of the explanation of the goal, and pathway of Lent. It's a journey towards heaven. It's about experiencing heaven already here on earth. As Peter and John, we all would like to make some spiritual or mystical experience. To see the Saints, to have conversations with them, to see the light of heaven, to see things the way that God sees them ??? So the path of Lent leads us to the Easter experience of Resurrection and the life of heaven, the life with God.

So now we know the purpose of Lent- it is supposed to bring us closer to God. And as traditionally we heard it on Ash Wednesday - it's through prayer, fasting and alms giving that we arrive at that goal. So let's ask ourselves what we planned to do this Lent ??? In what way will I set on this Lenten path of preparation for the experience of God ???

1. What prayer commitment am I making for this Lent ???
2. What fasting am I assuming ???
3. What alms am I going to give ???

Those questions need my answers if I am going to be serious this Lent, if I am going to be realistic about getting closer to heaven spiritually, as for sure we are getting closer to it physically - "you are dust and to dust you shall return ". Lord help us to be real and not to demand heaven, but to be humble and to work for getting there with the help of your grace. Let's be set for this spiritual and mystical experience of heaven.

**1. Prayer** - what extra prayer can I do for Lent ??? Maybe extra Mass that I could attend during the week ??? Maybe parish way of the cross that I could attend, maybe extra I could pray privately the Way of the Cross once a week or daily ??? Maybe I can attend the Bible study proposed by Deacon John ??? Or maybe extra reading of the Bible that I could make at home ???

**2. Fasting** - what did you decide to give up this Lent ??? Less food ??? , less TV ???, less internet???, Less complaining ??? More walking ??? What am I doing to strengthen my will of pursuing the goals that I set ??? Go to Confession ??? Reconcile with some one whom my relationship is not in good stand ??? Forgiving someone who has hurt me???

**3. Alms Giving** - being a better steward in the church by giving more in the collection ??? , giving something to Outreach program ??? Doing some volunteering in the parish by Teaching , Cleaning, or improving the facilities in any way, serving in any capacity ??? Participate in the raffle and other fundraising ??? Giving something directly to the poor people???

So many ways to express the Lenten Spirit of willingness and participation. Nobody can make us do anything if we don't want to. You see where you are, and you decide where You want to go. Don't you want to go to heaven ??? Start working on it !!!!! Lent is short- only 40 days.

God bless You !!!!

### SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

**Baptism:** For children under 5, please contact the Parish Office (273-8113) for an appointment to speak with a Priest or Deacon at least several weeks before the Baptism. For older children, contact the Office of Family Faith Formation (231-7344).

**First Holy Communion:** Children usually begin Religious Education studies in the First Grade and are prepared for Communion in the Second Grade. Call the Family Faith Formation Office (231-7344) to register your child the summer before the school year begins.

**Confirmation:** This Sacrament is currently celebrated in the Eighth Grade after 2 years of preparation. Please call the Religious Education Office (231-7344) for more information.

### SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

**Sacrament of the Sick:** Call the Parish Office at any time to arrange for the Anointing of the Sick either at home or in the hospital.

**Reconciliation:** The Sacrament is celebrated every weekday at 5:00p.m. also Saturday from 4:00 - 4:45 PM in the Church and at 8:30a.m. and 10:30 a.m. on Sundays or by appointment by calling the business office 631-273-8113.

### SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

**Marriage:** Congratulations! Couples planning to marry should make an appointment with a Priest or Deacon at least eight (8) months in advance of the wedding to allow time for adequate preparation.

**Holy Orders:** Is God calling you? Call a Priest or Deacon to discern a possible vocation to the Priesthood, Diaconate or the Religious life.

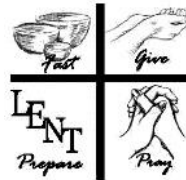

## **FAST & ABSTINENCE**

*Ash Wednesday and Good Friday*  
are obligatory days of fasting and  
abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during  
Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms  
on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59.

When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full  
meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not  
equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence

from meat are binding upon members of the Latin  
Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

Members of the Eastern Catholic Churches are to ob-  
serve the particular law of their own sui iuris Church.

### **A Reflection on Lenten Fasting**

*If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until  
the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the  
paschal fast to honor the suffering and death of the  
Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more  
fully and to celebrate more readily his Resurrection.*
