Dear Sisters and Brothers,

After we honored All Saints and All Souls, comes time we remember our living heroes. In the group of living people our gratitude goes first to Veterans, to whom we owe respect for the conditions in which we live today, as they were first to serve us in protecting our freedom, and then moved to realize their own goals of life. It is very honorable thing to do, and it is something to be remembered and lesson taken from. It is something totally different from what politicians do to the system, when they use public service as excuse for their own survival. They make it their own supposed job to govern everyone, as if they were the only persons who know how to serve us, even when we don't need their services. They become indispensable, but it is motivated by their own incapacity to do anything else in life except to manipulate the system for their own advantage.

Veterans are totally different class of people. They made their service of support of our freedom, and then they moved to their private and family lives.. Some veterans come from longer military service as they enlisted for professional service for more years or for life, but it always comes with a great sacrifice on their part and the part of their family, as it implies alot of restrictions due to being employed where one is needed not where one wants. It always comes with risk of ones own life, as we can see how many casualties happen even in time when we are apparently in peace, but we are in reality in war with the Islamic terrorism that killed people on 9/11, and continues to kill people all over the world. We can't let it go unchecked, as they tell us that they will attack us as they did before.

So we need VETERANS, we need people who want to be even for a time in the military to protect our freedom. That service stand before anything else, as we couldn't be here today if it were not for the VETERANS.

Something very similar is happening in regard to Police forces as they take on the job of eliminating the violent element from our society, as it is with gangs even here in our own community. The officers take on the responsibility to search for and to take off the streets people who decided to be violent to others as their way of life.

Veterans Day, it is a reminder to us about those great people who did their service for us all, so that we can live our peaceful lives protected from evil people. We always need service men and women to be vigilant, as we see that violent and evil people are around ready to strike anyone and anywhere. We depend on their service to be able to live peacefully.

Thank You Veterans for putting others before yourself !!! Thank You Service Men and Women for all you do for us every day to protect us !!! Thank You Lord for inspiring people to be noble and selfless, to be generous like You who came as You said : "to serve not to be served".

This honorable desire to serve the family, the community, the nation, the humanity surprisingly is found in the Gospel first. But it comes with the warnings that we don't do it for selfish reasons of self serving, or superiority impression as if we were indispensable, or for vain glory or false pride. Jesus warns us not to use our privilege of service, to make us self serving. He tells us to remember that there is but one teacher, and we all are brothers. He tells us that there is but one Father in heaven, and we have but one master, the Christ. Than Jesus continues:" The greatest among you must be your servant. Whoever exalts himself will be humbled; but whoever humbles himself will be exalted."

In the Church we are called to serve, even The Holy Father calls himself the Servant of the Servants of God. We need to maintain that humble attitude, or we will be self serving. It is something we want to learn from Christ and as well from our veterans. There is something common here, in the capacity to offer ones own life for others as Christ did it, and many of our veterans did.

We all would like to be humble persons, but we don't realize, that in order to become a humble person we must learn to accept sometimes even the humiliations, otherwise we will never become that humble person. It is something we need to ponder and reflect upon. It would be good to discuss this topic with close friends who could give us feedback on ways we can prove how humble or how un-humble we are or might be. It could be discussed with ones spiritual director or confessor. By the way, when was the last time you went to Confession? Or maybe you have no sin ? So you could throw the first stone at the public sinner if you feel offended by anyone.

The answer to it lies in the capacity to love. Jesus knew how much he was loved, and so he loved without measure, and it was easy for him to be humble. As the Apostles tell us: " Love covers multitude of sins. " How much I believe in being loved without measure ? What is my measure of love ? Am I ready to take a humiliation for Christ ? Am I aspiring to be humble ? Am I considering my serving, to be my privilege to give something back to the Lord ?

The Veterans could be our good teachers. Humanly speaking a veteran it is a most Christ like person that we find in the society- it is one who offered his life for others by serving without much in return. God bless our Veterans !!! God bless everyone !!!

BRIDGE for PEACE

St. Anne's Church

NOVEMBER 9TH—7:00P.M.

In 1986, at thirty-four years of age, Annette was suddenly stricken with pain in her hands, knees and ankles. The diagnosis was rheumatoid arthritis. As the pain, weakness and fatigue increased she was prescribed medication which was moderately successful in relieving the symptoms. The condition forced her to reduce her work schedule as a sales manager for a Wall Street financial firm so she could avoid the commute from Long Island to New York City and be able to work from home.

In late 1987, desperate for help, she and her husband, Ed, attended a healing service at St Francis de Sales in Patchogue. Nothing changed immediately, but about a week later she began to notice a difference. Seven months later, she was totally free from arthritis. She resumed her work schedule in the spring of 1988. Several weeks later she was injured in a disabling automobile accident which left her bedridden with back pain, heavily concussed and with seizures, but she remained free of the crippling arthritis.

Seeking help from God she attended a home prayer group, healing services, and bible studies. Very slowly, her condition began to improve. It would be several years before she would be able to sit for long periods of time. Through prayer and study, Annette and Ed felt called by God to open a healing center. This was the beginning of Bridge for Peace and they began to make plans to purchase property in Wading River, NY for this purpose.

Annette was invited to speak about her own healing of rheumatoid arthritis at churches, conferences and retreats in the United States. In 1992, Ed's work through World Mission Crafts brought them to Pakistan where they assisted an oriental rug cooperative. They spent time speaking to and encouraging the Christian community, many of whom were experiencing persecution for their beliefs. In 2000, they were invited to Australia by a couple who had a healing ministry. Ministering with the Catholic Charismatic Renewal in churches and prayer groups, they witnessed many healings. After several trips, Bridge for Peace Australia was born.

In 1998 Ed & Annette began the first of the Rome Prayer Walks. We raise intercessors here in the US and around the world to pray for priests. We travel to Rome each February to pray for and encourage student priests that are studying in Rome. Currently there are about 25 student priest that are in the prayer group Bridge for Peace Rome. Most are in St Paul's and St Peters Collegios.

In 2006 Bridge for Peace began ministry in Uganda where it is now building an orphanage on land donated to them by the Catholic Diocese of Kasese. In 2007, Bridge for Peace Brazil was founded. There are also Bridge for Peace groups in Queens Village, NY, Kentucky and Ohio. They have ministered in Diocese of Arusha, Tanzania and will be returning there soon. In conjunction with Bridge for Peace RaphaEl Medical Mission, they have for the past 9 years complete 50 surgeries per year at no charge and brought healing to people in Zambia.

In twenty-five years, there have been over one hundred to twenty-three nations on all continents.

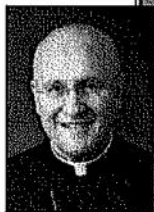

SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Baptism: For children under 5, please contact the Parish Office (273-8113) for an appointment to speak with a Priest or Deacon at least several weeks before the Baptism. For older children, contact the Office of Family Faith Formation (231-7344).

First Holy Communion: Children usually begin Religious Education studies in the First Grade and are prepared for Communion in the Second Grade. Call the Family Faith Formation Office (231-7344) to register your child the summer before the school year begins.

Confirmation: This Sacrament is currently celebrated in the Eighth Grade after 2 years of preparation. Please call the Religious Education Office (231-7344) for more information.

SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

Sacrament of the Sick: Call the Parish Office at any time to arrange for the Anointing of the Sick either at home or in the hospital.

Reconciliation: The Sacrament is celebrated every Saturday from 4:00 - 4:45 PM in the Church or by appointment.

SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

Marriage: Congratulations! Couples planning to marry should make an appointment with a Priest or Deacon at least eight (8) months in advance of the wedding to allow time for adequate preparation.

Holy Orders: Is God calling you? Call a Priest or Deacon to discern a possible vocation to the Priesthood, Diaconate or the Religious life.

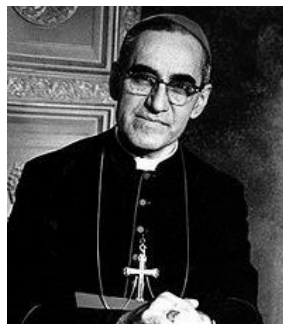

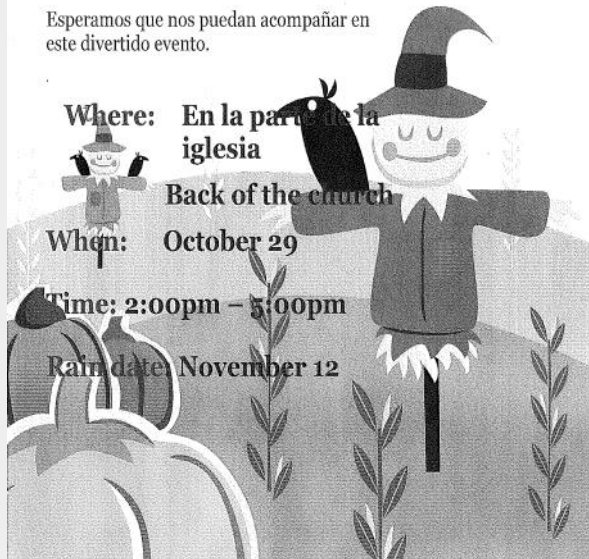

Dire et faire

Qui écoutons-nous? Celui qui trouve des accommodements avec la volonté de Dieu ou celui qui nous en annonce toutes les exigences. "Dieu ne demande pas tant", entendons-nous dire quelques fois. Si c'était vrai, s'il n'avait aucune exigence envers nous, il ne nous aimerait pas vraiment. C'est par la qualité de notre vie que nous annonçons la Parole de Dieu. Notre première lecture s'en prend avec véhémence aux prêtres juifs d'avant les origines chrétiennes qui se montraient infidèles a leur mission. le prophète Malachie leur reproche corruption et partialité ainsi qu'un enseignement propre a scandaliser les fidèles. La dénonciation de l'imposture sacerdotale culmine dans cette apostrophe divine: " Je maudirai vos bénédictions". Le ton de l'Evangile de ce

Dimanche est a peine moins virulent. Les diatribes de Jésus contre les scribes et les pharisiens stigmatisent la vanité, l'hypocrisie et l'autoritarisme des représentants officiels du Judaïsme. Mais l'Evangile de Matthieu note expressément que Jésus adresse griefs "aux foules et a ses disciples".

Il est donc probable que certaines au moins de ces paroles visent aussi les pasteurs des jeunes communautés chrétiennes.
