

Second Sunday of Lent

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Lent is well started, and it is always amazing to me, how Church in her wisdom on 2nd Sunday of Lent gives us the Gospel of transfiguration of Jesus before his disciples. The message is clear, that the purpose of Lent is to bring us to the encounter with God. The purpose of Lent is to bring us to individual transfiguration before God. Christ will transform us if we let him guide us, if we listen to his voice and follow him, if we accept his invitation to his friendship. He will transform not only our looks, but above all our hearts. He will transform our lives if we let him take us on the journey of Lent.



Lent, it is a path to transfiguration after meaningful meeting and experience with God, with Christ, with the Prophets, with the Saints. Ultimately one finds oneself, the way that God meant us to be: - this is my beloved son, - this is my beloved daughter in whom I am well pleased, says the Lord. This is the goal of Lent, and of Christian life, this is the best that we can be, this is - the best version of ourselves - as Matthew Kelly would say.

This is the promise of the Gospel, to arrive at the Father's house in heaven. So letting oneself be transformed, is to let oneself to taste the things of heaven. As the disciples said to Jesus: - let us make three tents here and stay, it is so good to be here - so it is wonderful to make that experience of transfiguration - of experience of God, that leads us to transformation of our lives.

So the purpose of Lent is totally positive, even if it looks like it was negative and penitential. There is a purpose in conversion, it refers to abandoning our sinful inclinations, confessing our sins and becoming free for Christ. So, that purification process is the first, accomplished by admitting to our brokenness and need for transformation, for improvement, for conversion. Penance, is the good way of learning of our brokenness. Who of us don't need purification ???, who doesn't need conversion ???, who doesn't need transformation ??

We all want to experience Christs transfiguration, but to get there we may be invited to go to the desert as Jesus was 40 days in the desert - 40 days of Lent, to be tempted, to be exposed for weakness that we have, weakness that we need to deal with. Repent and believe in the Gospel!!! Take this 40 days with prayer, fasting and almsgiving, and surely the Lord will transform you, and if we be faithful to it Christ will be transfigured before us giving us the glimpse of glory, that will inspire us for the time to come and motivate us in our Christian lives. Come Lord Jesus!!!

Let's take this invitation to make this Lent best ever, by implying ourselves in stepping with Jesus into the desert of our lives, and opening ourselves to the possibility of an encounter with God. -Then the Angels ministered to Him, - as the Gospel says. Let us look into the calendar of events for this Lent in the bulletin, and let us participate in them, giving the Lord the opportunity to Transfiguration before us, and opportunity to transform our lives for better.

Taizé Prayer

Imagine the scene. Silence, Church lights dim. In front of the Altar, the Image of the Crucifixions, surrounded with candles flickering.

In our pews, you and me and many more parishioners hold their own candles, long and slim, then light each others one by one until the church is alive with even more candlelight. We chant together, if you want, over and over as we rise and carry our candles toward the altar, adding our own flames to the ones already burning.

We then sit in silence just beholding this magical scene: hundreds of small flames on and around the altar like a sunburst in shadowy darkness. There is no other light. There is no sound. And nothing moves, except the flames, which dance.

This is a Taizé Prayer Service.

SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Baptism: For children under 5, please contact the Parish Office (273-8113) for an appointment to speak with a Priest or Deacon at least several weeks before the Baptism. For older children, contact the Office of Family Faith Formation (231-7344).

First Holy Communion: Children usually begin Religious Education studies in the First Grade and are prepared for Communion in the Second Grade. Call the Family Faith Formation Office (231-7344) to register your child the summer before the school year begins.

Confirmation: This Sacrament is currently celebrated in the Eighth Grade after 2 years of preparation. Please call the Religious Education Office (231-7344) for more information.

SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

Sacrament of the Sick: Call the Parish Office at any time to arrange for the Anointing of the Sick either at home or in the hospital.

Reconciliation: The Sacrament is celebrated every Saturday from 4:00 - 4:45 PM in the Church or by appointment.

SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

Marriage: Congratulations! Couples planning to marry should make an appointment with a Priest or Deacon at least eight (8) months in advance of the wedding to allow time for adequate preparation.

Holy Orders: Is God calling you? Call a Priest or Deacon to discern a possible vocation to the Priesthood, Diaconate or the Religious life.







SEGUNDO DOMINGO DE CUARESMA

La 1a Lectura de este domingo nos habla de *Abraham*, "nuestro padre en la fe" (del pueblo de Israel y de la Iglesia), le fue reputada como justicia esa fe aun antes de conocer enteramente la *soberanía de Dios*. Junto a este personaje del AT, también tenemos a *Isaac*, su hijo, que viene a ser *figura de Cristo* que entregará la vida por la humanidad, "el muchacho pregunto, donde está la victima para el sacrificio, el padre contesto, 'Dios proveerá' (Gen 22,8). La 2a

Lectura nos aclara el escenario, "el que no escatimo a *su propio Hijo*, sino que lo entrego por sotros" (Rm 8,32). El Evangelio nos relata la *Transfiguración del Señor en el Monte Tabor*, "aparecieron Moisés y Elías que conversaban con Jesús" (Mc 9,4). También hubo testigos (Pedro, Santiago y Juan). Y se dio una *Teofanía*, "este es mi Hijo amado, escúchenlo". Este día se repite la escena, hay un Monte (el Templo), una víctima incruenta (Cristo en la eucaristía), unos Testigos (la Asamblea), y una Teofanía (la Homilía); alguno podrá decir, "que bien se está aquí, hagamos tres tiendas" (Mc 9,5), pero eso no es lo que Dios quiere, igual que en el Evangelio del I Cuaresma, el seguimiento de Jesús "no tiene nada que ver con "vida monjil" apartados de todo y de todos, NO, la invitación de Jesús que volvió del desierto y hoy baja del Monte son solo momentos de silencio para escuchar la voz de Dios y acompañar a Cristo en su Misión, El ya dio la vida por nosotros, ahora somos nosotros que en su Nombre debemos dar testimonio. Una última cosa, Jesús nos invita a reconocer su rostro transfigurado en los pobres, en el Domingo, más que ayuno y abstén encía, la acción de gracias y la caridad es lo que debe matizar nuestra jornada. Continuemos nuestro itinerario hacia la Pascua. P. Victor

- 1, 2 cans of tuna, drained




