

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

As we read today's Gospel we see Jesus cure a man who was deaf and mute. The two impediments connected to each other, profoundly affecting the human capacity to communicate and to live independent life. Both of those capacities add greatly to the quality of life of human person, even if they aren't indispensable for the person to live. All of human senses play great role in dealing with the reality of life. There are five basic senses of sight, hearing, smell, touch and taste, but some people speak of as many as twenty one different senses and capacities depending on their definition. To the list of five they add others senses like: hunger, thirst, intuition, balance, orientation, temperature, pain, memory, self awareness, fear, love, happiness and common sense, etc.



All those senses, capacities and sensations add to the plenitude of our experience of life, increase our capacity to interact with the world around us and with each other. Normally we don't think about those capacities, until we find ourselves in difficulty to exercise any of them. Then we become aware how useful that particular capacity is. To have the totality of them is very convenient, and seems so normal and natural, but it is not always that we have them all, or in same 100% degree. All those senses are very powerful and have capacity to give us perception of the world around us, enhancing our life or even protecting it. It is good that we can use them automatically as the necessity arises and they spontaneously respond. When Jesus responds to the persons needs in the Gospel, he wants to improve dramatically their capacity to perceive and to communicate, to experience and to share in quality of life. As people said of Jesus- he has done all things well.

Jesus blesses us with the same power and capacities, to improve the perception and quality of life for ourselves and for others. We just need the awareness of what we have, for what purpose, and of what are we missing. What is our perception of life and reality, and what is Divine perspective on life we live ? That is the whole purpose of giving us the senses in the first place?, Than comes the way we use them for the right purpose, to perceive and communicate life and love.

Jesus improves our experience of life on earth, so we could see our perspective of life in heaven. It all has one finality in it, and for this we need all the senses to be employed for that purpose. It is a paradox, that sometimes in order to see what is obvious, we need to be deprived of something in order to see the value that is enclosed in that particular gift or capacity. As St. James tells us in the second reading, our human judgment may obscure the reality, in fact it may falsify it, it may twist it in human presentation and interpret it according to erroneous principles. Our senses that were given to us to see God given reality, we may obscure to bring us darkness and selfish destruction.

Jesus teaches us the power of good, the power of love, the power of self sacrifice in perusing of God's plan of salvation for all people of good will. Those who will want to see and to practice the perception and perspective of life presented to us by Jesus. For this purpose, that God has given us all senses and capacities, and Jesus enhances and sharpens them for us with the perspective of faith, so that we may have life and have it abundantly.

We pray for good weather for our procession on Saturday morning. I hope many of us will share the sense of faith on that small pilgrimage, walking the streets of Brentwood with Jesus and Blessed Mother.

Let us build our sense of faith, it is one of major importance and it is composed of faith in God, faith in others, and faith in our own capacity to achieve happiness in this life and heaven in the next.

This week we commemorate 9/11. We pray for all victims and families affected by that terrible act of terror. Let's pray for all victims of violence on our streets, and for all victims of any abuse. May the Lord heal the broken hearts of all who suffered unjustly.





DOMINGO 23º DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO - B

Los capítulos 34 y 35 del libro del profeta Isaías se sitúan en el contexto del destierro de Babilonia (s. VI). En el Cap. 34 se anuncia el castigo de Edom...que es un pueblo vecino del sur, enemigo de Israel, que colaboró con los babilonios para destruir Jerusalén. El Cap. 35 anuncia la futura restauración de Judá y de Jerusalén. Judá atravesará de nuevo el desierto, el retorno incluye aun aquellos imposibilitados para el viaje. El autor se sirve de dos imágenes: 1ª... personas discapacitadas que recuperan los sentidos y la movilidad: el mudo el habla, el sordo el oído, el ciego la vista; *el cojo salta como un ciervo*. 2ª...de la naturaleza: desiertos y paramos que recuperan la frescura y la abundancia de agua. El profeta quiere erradicar el miedo y recuperar la esperanza.

En la segunda lectura, continuamos leyendo la carta de Santiago (una de las cartas "universales", se dirige a toda la Comunidad y a nadie en particular), parece que hay un problema con el grupo de los judeo-cristianos que se aferran a las concepciones del A.T. Para darse entender pone un ejemplo gráfico haciendo referencia "a aquellos que hacen acepción de personas en la Asamblea", o que prefieren a los bien ataviados y desprecian a los pobres, si eso sucede, la Iglesia no está a la altura del Evangelio que tiene como criterio la igualdad para todos los bautizados, de lo contrario el criterio es mundano. De aquí pasa a una concepción teológica audaz: "los pobres no solo tienen la misma dignidad de los ricos, sino que incluso son predilectos de Dios"...idea que en el s. XX se reformuló en la Iglesia como "opción preferencial por los pobres".

Mc. 7, 31-37. El largo viaje de Jesús por Tiro y Sidón (habitada por paganos), quiere ser un "ensayo" de apertura del horizonte universal que tiene el Evangelio, es decir, de Palestina (lugar sagrado) a Decápolis (territorio pagano) para anunciar la Buena Nueva. En principio, Jesús no quiere realizar milagros que no despierten la fe en el Reino, sin embargo, movido por la compasión pasa a curar a un sordo-mudo, que en la mentalidad palestina son castigo por el pecado...Cristo devuelve la salud y reintegra al marginado a la vida social y religiosa. Para Jesús la incapacidad puede estar en un pagano que "no conoce de Dios" o en un discípulo "que aun no ha comprendido el mensaje del Reino".


