### *Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time*

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Faith it is an integral part of: who we are, how we live, and what makes us happy. It helps us to determine our goals in life and helps us to reach those goals of fulfillment. As we read the Bible and hear the stories of faith represented to us by different personages, we see for ourselves the growth of humanity in understanding of itself, we see humanity growing in response to God's invitation into relationship. That dialogue is happening in the hearts of the believers, and it finds its manifestation in the way we live. Our faith, as a vision of life, determines our destiny and our happiness.

As we see in the persons of the readings for this Sunday : Job, St. Paul, Jesus, Peter's Mother in law, the disciples. Each one of them encounters the truth of life, and that truth defines the way they live their lives after. Their lives become lives of service to that truth.

Being deeply loved by God, persons of faith find strength and source in the relationship with God. Jesus living his communion with the Father in prayer, continues to bring others to that communion. That perception of being loved is fundamental to our capacity of loving others, of sharing our lives with others.

Job being assaulted by life, by the plan of the devil, refuses to lose his faith and hope in goodness of God. Being deeply aware of his misery and pain, Job survives because of the knowledge of God and of his love. That knowledge and experience, carries him over all troubles that life brings his way. We may ask how much experience one needs in order to believe and to survive the challenges of life ???

The answer is that each person is different, and what we need, are the positive experiences of love of God. And those are offered to us primarily by our family, than by friends and by extended community. Our mutual growth is nurtured by the good things that we accomplish, first to provide what is necessary for our own basic needs, than we share with others be it materially or spiritually, things that we consider good and edifying.

Our faith holds all things together in our soul, where all important values meet. Faith nurtures our soul with God's love and gives direction to our actions. Faith it is a compass directing our life, our actions, our words, our being into a promised happiness of heaven, that is the fulfillment of all God's promises.

Saint Paul received the gift of faith in Christ, after he was stopped by Christ himself on his way to perdition, than he becomes an Apostle of the new way, proclaiming the Good News, that Christ died for our sins, and is risen at the right hand of the Father, where He awaits all who believe in him. Saint Paul becomes all for all, to be able to bring some to Christ, and so he spends the rest of his life doing that.

As we look at Jesus, in the Gospel, after he takes on his public mission, he never stops from connecting people to God. He brings God's blessings, healing, mercy and love to the people and he lifts people to God by granting their requests for miracles and graces. He invites others to praise God for his countless blessings showered upon whole of creation. Jesus encourages personal relationship with the Father and helps it to mature.

It is interesting that Jesus helped many of those who sought his help, yet he had no interest in drawing attention to himself. He didn't want the evil spirits to speak about him. Early in the morning he went to deserted place where he prayed. Jesus is looking for solitude of prayer where he is recharged, replenished with his power, with love. But it's interesting that Jesus doesn't stay in same place for long, he doesn't return with the disciples to Simon's house. He didn't want to become a popular guy solving everyone's problems and troubles, but he witnesses to all, that God is present in their midst and walks with them and speaks to them through prayer in Synagogue, through personal prayer, through works of mercy doing good for others. Jesus brings the power of God to work in the midst of people. He brings assurance of God's Kingdom being present among people. Our question would be: *Is Jesus present to us in our time with this same power and strength as than ??? How can we get access to him ???*

Surely He is present and wants to be our Savior and healer, but we need to access to his love by loving him in return. *Do I love Him ??? Is His love meaningful to me ??? Is He my Savior and my everything ??? or I just need Him to be the addition to my ego, my hole filler, where I am the main actor and He has just a supporting role ???*

We want to learn humility from Jesus. If we would be humble, he could do so much through us, but are we humble enough to be instruments of his love ??? Jesus heal our brokenness, make us whole and mature in love of God and our neighbor, and keep us humble in your service.

Next Saturday, February 10th, we have our Saint Valentines Party. The tickets are still around, please support our Parish by expressing your friendship and love towards those that God placed in your life. Celebrating friendships we forge lasting relationships, we support each other, we share our lives and our faith. Soon after, on February 14th we will be celebrating Ash Wednesday, first day of Lent - do you believe it ???

**First Holy Communion:** Children usually begin Religious Education studies in the First Grade and are prepared for Communion in the Second Grade. Call the Family Faith Formation Office (231-7344) to register your child the summer before the school year begins.

**Confirmation:** This Sacrament is currently celebrated in the Eighth Grade after 2 years of preparation. Please call the Religious Education Office (231-7344) for more information.

### SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

**Sacrament of the Sick:** Call the Parish Office at any time to arrange for the Anointing of the Sick either at home or in the hospital.

#### **On January 13, 2018 a Federal Judge in California issued a Preliminary injunction on Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals -DACA:**

The Judge ordered for the reactivation of DACA. What does this means? This means that if a person's DACA expired or will expired, they now have the opportunity to send an application for renewal!

We recommend all DACA beneficiaries to send their DACA application as soon as possible, why? because the White House Administration is appealing this case and it will end up most likely in the Supreme Court. DACA Beneficiaries can take advantage, NOW that USCIS (U.S Department of Citizenship and Immigration Services) is now accepting applications for renewal.

#### **Need help paying for the renewal of DACA? MAY if offering financial help.**

- You will receive a check for \$495 made out to the U.S. Department of Homeland Security within 5 days
- Application takes 10 minutes
- This program is a grant and does not need to be repaid
- MAF is only able to offer a fee assistance grant in the form of a check made payable to the U.S. Department of Homeland Security. As such, we are not able to issue reimbursements at this time.

Souviens-toi, Seigneur

La première lecture et l'évangile de ce dimanche évoquent les multiples visages de la détresse humaine. Or, travers Job et Jésus, la Bible nous présente deux attitudes différentes à l'égard du malheur. D'un cote, c'est le cri douloureux et désabusé de l'homme cruellement éprouvé, qui n'attend plus rien de la vie. Mais malgré sa misère et celle qui l'entoure. Jacob croit que Dieu se souvient des hommes. Le cri de Jacob est celui de tant de malades, de personnes âgées, isolées et oubliées, de malheureux qui trainent une vie de misère, et des jeunes prisonniers de la drogue et de l'alcool. Comment leur dire: "Dieu se souvient de toi", si notre vie n'est pas un Evangile vivant. D'un autre cote, Jésus, lui, a décidé de se battre contre le mal et la souffrance. Nous le voyons guérir de nombreux malades et chasser des esprits mauvais. Ce faisant, Jésus discerne parfaitement le piège à éviter, à savoir la séduction que peuvent exercer les prouesses d'un guérisseur. Il nous appartient aujourd'hui de réinventer, dans la vérité de nos paroles et des rencontres, les gestes libérateurs de Jésus.
