

A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR – 16th SUNDAY ORDINARY TIME

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

This Sunday we celebrate the feast of St. Anne, our Patroness. Together with St. Joachim they are the parents of the Blessed Mother. What an atmosphere of faith and love must have been present in their home, as God thought it fit to entrust them with this precious gift of the Immaculate Conception, the Blessed Mother herself. What a wonderful home must they have created for the Mother of God's Son. Yet, what a surprise and challenge they must have found in learning of the pregnancy of their daughter before she went to live with her husband Joseph? Only in heaven will we find answers to those questions, and surely, we will be amazed to learn how human they were and how God-fearing and faithful to God and to each other.

By now we know that Jesus is the only Savior of the World and of every human being. We all want to share in the work of Jesus, because we all want to share in his glory. We share in it by actively reaching out to people by word and witness of life, witness of caring for God and for others. We want to step out of ourselves towards others. So, let's be part of the work of the church, so we can be part of the festivities in heaven for eternal life after our death. Let the Word of God take good roots in our lives, and bear the good fruits of good deeds for eternal life ~ as Jesus was asking us last Sunday. The purpose of our lives is to get to heaven, so let's be on our way toward it.

In the Gospel of today, Jesus explains to us the important thing about the existence of evil in the world. Isn't it a part of our questions in life- why things do happen to us and to others? With today's parable, Jesus answers that question of how Evil came into the world, not by the making of the owner, but by the negligence of the servants. Evil cannot have its origin in God. Its reason and origin is, as well, beyond man.

"Death came into the world by the envy of the Devil, and is experienced by those who belong to him" (Wisdom 2,24). The sowing of evil came with the fault of the people, because they were not vigilant. This lack of vigilance is used by the enemy who sabotages the work of the farmer. The enemy sows a lie in the heart of the man, that produces distrust, despair, egoism (Genesis 3,1). Evil comes in darkness and enters unnoticed. The seeds of good and evil grow parallel in the heart of the man, the truth and lie exist next to each other and not always are we capable of recognizing it. Human efforts to eliminate external evil ends in hurting the human person who is identified with the evil, and that is mistake because no man is totally evil, there is always some good in every human being. We cannot condemn the good of the person because of our hatred for evil.

Even in the Church we can't totally eliminate the evil by making it the church of the pure, because it would be another distortion of truth, as the church of perfect people does not exist here on earth. It will be holy and perfect and glorious Church after the second coming of Christ. Today, the Church it is not a Sect of the pure and perfect, but it is an association of sinners in need of God.

God invites us to patiently wait for the time of harvest, when his Angels will separate the good from the evil, and until then, He allows the good and evil to coexist until the judgment day. By the design of God, the Evil will serve to become the place of revelation of God's greatest good, that is God's Mercy.

So, what is needed and expected of us is faith and acting upon it. As Scripture says: "Love covers multitude of sins" (1Peter 4:8). We are called to act with prudence: choosing good and avoiding evil. At the end of times, we will be judged by Divine Mercy and not by any human sense of justice. Only God knows what is in the heart of the man. God bless everyone always!!!

Let's have a great celebration of God's love in the sharing of our feast of Saint Anne! Let's see how God chooses the winners of the raffle, how children enjoy the games, how everyone enjoys the food and each other. St Anne pray for us!

No podemos condenar el bien de la persona por nuestro odio al mal.

Incluso en la Iglesia no podemos eliminar totalmente el mal haciendo en la Iglesia de los puros o perfectos, porque sería otra distorsión de la vida, ya que la iglesia de personas perfectas no existe aquí en la tierra. Será una Iglesia santa, perfecta y gloriosa después de la segunda venida de Cristo.

Hoy, la iglesia no es una Secta de puros y perfectos, sino una asociación de pecadores necesitados de Dios.

Dios nos invita a esperar pacientemente el tiempo de la cosecha, cuando sus Ángeles separaran los buenos de los malos, y hasta entonces, El permite que el bien y el mal coexistan hasta el día del juicio. Por designio de Dios, el Mal servirá para convertirse en el lugar de revelación del mayor bien de Dios, que es la Misericordia de Dios. Entonces, lo que se necesita y se exceptúa de nosotros es la fe y actuar en consecuencia. Como dice la Escritura: “El amor cubre multitud de pecados” (1 Pedro 4:8). DECIMO SEXTO DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO

Jesús utiliza parábolas sencillas y ejemplos de la vida cotidiana para ilustrar qué significa el Reino de los cielos, el Reino de Dios. Dentro de las mismas, de una forma u otra, recurre en ocasiones a la imagen del sembrador que en su época era visible de forma habitual cuando alguien iba de camino de un pueblo a otro.

Hoy en día, sin embargo, estas imágenes pueden perder parte de su fuerza si no conocemos la tarea del sembrador y el mundo agrícola. Aunque siempre sean fuente de sabiduría y se comprendan en su mayor parte.

La parábola del trigo y la cizaña nos invita a reflexionar sobre la buena y mala semilla, yendo más allá de las apariencias externas, éstas nacen sin que el sembrador las haya sembrado, pero por ello, no puede levantar todo el sembrado, sino que espera con paciencia a que llegue el tiempo oportuno para recoger lo sembrado y desechar las malas hierbas, por ello, el Señor nos enseña a saber también ser pacientes con los tiempos de Dios y mirar nuestra propia cizaña, para respetar la buena semilla sembrada en nosotros. Y así poder distinguir los frutos buenos de los malos, en nosotros y en los demás y así confiar en la misericordia de Dios, que es el Sembrador de la Fe.






