Message from the Our Pastor – Third Sunday of Easter

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

The Third Sunday of Easter presents us with one of the most beloved resurrection narratives in all of Scripture: the journey to Emmaus (Luke 24:13–35). It is a story not only about two disciples walking away from Jerusalem, but about all of us who, at times, walk away from hope. The Gospel begins in disappointment. The disciples had trusted in Jesus; they believed He was the one to redeem Israel. Yet the crucifixion shattered their expectations. “We had hoped…” is one of the saddest phrases in the New Testament. It captures that moment when faith feels eclipsed by suffering, when God seems silent, and when the future looks uncertain. And yet, it is precisely on this road of confusion that the risen Christ draws near. Significantly, the disciples do not recognize Him. Their eyes are prevented from seeing. This detail speaks to a profound spiritual truth: Jesus is often present even when we do not perceive Him. In moments of grief, doubt, or disillusionment, God has not abandoned us. Rather, He walks beside us—patiently, quietly, faithfully.

Jesus begins not by revealing Himself, but by listening. He asks, “What are you discussing?” He allows them to voice their sorrow and confusion. Only then does He interpret the Scriptures, showing how the Messiah had to suffer and so enter into glory. Here we see that the Resurrection cannot be understood apart from the Cross. Glory is not a denial of suffering but its transformation.

As they approach Emmaus, the disciples urge Him to stay: “Remain with us.” This simple invitation becomes the turning point. At table, Jesus takes bread, blesses it, breaks it, and gives it to them. In that moment, their eyes are opened—they recognize Him in the breaking of the bread. This Eucharistic gesture reveals the enduring presence of Christ in the life of the Church. The same Lord who walked with the disciples continues to make Himself known in Word and Sacrament. The Mass becomes our Emmaus, where Scripture is opened and bread is broken, where hearts burn within us and eyes are opened in faith.

The transformation in the disciples is immediate. From sorrow to joy, from confusion to clarity, from retreat to mission. Though night has fallen, they return at once to Jerusalem. Encounter with the risen Christ is never meant to be kept private; it compels us outward, back into the community, back into witness. This Sunday invites us to reflect on our own journeys. Where are we walking away in discouragement? Where have our hopes faltered? And perhaps most importantly: do we recognize the Lord walking beside us? Christ meets us where we are—not where we think we should be. He listens to our struggles, illuminates our understanding, and nourishes us with His presence. The invitation remains the same: “Stay with us.” When we extend it, we discover that He has been with us all along.

In a world still marked by uncertainty and division, the message of Emmaus is both timely and timeless. Hope is not an illusion; it is a Person. And that Person walks with us, speaks to us, and feeds us—until our eyes are opened and our hearts set ablaze. “Were not our hearts burning within us while He spoke to us on the way?” May that same fire be rekindled in us this Easter season.

Queridos Hermanos y Hermanas,

El Tercer Domingo de Pascua nos presenta uno de los relatos de la resurrección más queridos de toda la Escritura: el camino a Emaús (Lucas 24, 13–35). Es una historia no solo sobre dos discípulos que se alejan de Jerusalén, sino sobre todos nosotros que, en ocasiones, nos alejamos de la esperanza. El Evangelio comienza con la desilusión. Los discípulos habían confiado en Jesús; creían que Él era el que iba a redimir a Israel. Sin embargo, la crucifixión destrozó sus expectativas. “Nosotros esperábamos...” es una de las frases más tristes del Nuevo Testamento. Expresa ese momento en que la fe parece eclipsada por el sufrimiento, cuando Dios parece en silencio y el futuro se presenta incierto. Y, sin embargo, es precisamente en ese camino de confusión donde el Cristo resucitado se hace cercano.

Es significativo que los discípulos no lo reconozcan. Sus ojos están como impedidos de verlo. Este detalle revela una verdad espiritual profunda: Jesús está presente incluso cuando no lo percibimos. En momentos de dolor, duda o desilusión, Dios no nos ha abandonado. Más bien, camina a nuestro lado—con paciencia, en silencio y con fidelidad. Jesús comienza no revelándose, sino escuchando. Les pregunta: “¿De qué van conversando?” Les permite expresar su tristeza y confusión. Solo después interpreta las Escrituras, mostrando cómo el Mesías tenía que padecer para entrar en su gloria. Aquí vemos que la Resurrección no puede entenderse sin la Cruz. La gloria no niega el sufrimiento, sino que lo transforma.

Al acercarse a Emaús, los discípulos le suplican: “Quédate con nosotros.” Esta sencilla invitación se convierte en el punto de inflexión. A la mesa, Jesús toma el pan, lo bendice, lo parte y se lo da. En ese momento, sus ojos se abren: lo reconocen al partir el pan. Este gesto eucarístico revela la presencia permanente de Cristo en la vida de la Iglesia. El mismo Señor que caminó con los discípulos continúa dándose a conocer en la Palabra y en el Sacramento. La Misa se convierte en nuestro Emaús, donde se abren las Escrituras y se parte el pan, donde el corazón arde y los ojos se abren a la fe.

La transformación de los discípulos es inmediata. Pasan de la tristeza a la alegría, de la confusión a la claridad, de la huida a la misión. Aunque ha caído la noche, regresan enseguida a Jerusalén. El encuentro con Cristo resucitado nunca está destinado a guardarse en privado; nos impulsa hacia afuera, de regreso a la comunidad, al testimonio.

Este domingo nos invita a reflexionar sobre nuestro propio camino. ¿De qué estamos huyendo por desánimo? ¿Dónde han flaqueado nuestras esperanzas? Y quizá lo más importante: ¿reconocemos al Señor que camina a nuestro lado? Cristo nos encuentra donde estamos, no donde creemos que deberíamos estar. Escucha nuestras luchas, ilumina nuestra comprensión y nos alimenta con su presencia. La invitación sigue siendo la misma: “Quédate con nosotros.” Cuando la hacemos, descubrimos que Él ha estado con nosotros todo el tiempo.

En un mundo todavía marcado por la incertidumbre y la división, el mensaje de Emaús es a la vez actual y eterno. La esperanza no es una ilusión; es una Persona. Y esa Persona camina con nosotros, nos habla y nos alimenta—hasta que nuestros ojos se abren y nuestro corazón se enciende. “¿No ardía nuestro corazón mientras nos hablaba en el camino?” Que ese mismo fuego se reavive en nosotros en este tiempo pascual.

Dios los bendiga a todos siempre!!!

“Ardía nuestro corazón: el encuentro con Cristo en el camino”

El III Domingo de Pascua nos presenta uno de los relatos más profundos y cercanos del Evangelio: el camino de Emaús (cf. el Evangelio según San Lucas 24, 13-35). En él, dos discípulos caminan tristes, desilusionados, cargando el peso de una esperanza que parecía haber muerto con Jesús. Sin embargo, es precisamente en ese camino de confusión donde el Señor resucitado se hace presente, aunque al inicio no sea reconocido.

Este pasaje ilumina una verdad esencial de la vida cristiana: Cristo camina con nosotros incluso cuando no somos capaces de verlo. Muchas veces, como aquellos discípulos, también nosotros experimentamos momentos de oscuridad, dudas o desaliento. Pero Jesús no se aleja; al contrario, se acerca, escucha y, poco a poco, enciende el corazón mediante la Palabra. El momento culminante ocurre en la fracción del pan. Allí se abren sus ojos y reconocen al Señor. Este gesto nos remite claramente a la Eucaristía, donde Cristo sigue haciéndose presente y dándose a conocer. La experiencia de Emaús nos recuerda que la Palabra y el Pan son inseparables: primero arde el corazón al escuchar; luego, se ilumina la mirada al recibir. Las otras lecturas refuerzan este mensaje. En los Hechos de los Apóstoles, Pedro proclama con valentía

la resurrección, afirmando que la muerte no pudo retener a Jesús. Y en la Primera Carta de San Pedro, se nos recuerda que hemos sido rescatados por la sangre de Cristo, llamados a vivir con esperanza y coherencia.

Así, este domingo nos invita a dejarnos encontrar por Cristo en nuestro propio camino, a redescubrirlo en la Escritura y en la Eucaristía, y a volver, como los discípulos, con alegría renovada para anunciar que verdaderamente el Señor ha resucitado.

En este mismo espíritu pascual, no quiero concluir sin expresar mi más sincero agradecimiento por haber podido compartir con ustedes esta Semana Santa y estos días de Pascua. Han sido momentos de gracia, de fe viva y de comunión que llevo profundamente en el corazón.

Gracias por su generosidad, por sus oraciones y por tantas muestras de cariño que he recibido. En cada gesto he podido experimentar el amor de Dios que se hace cercano a través de la comunidad.

Ahora me dispongo a regresar a Roma para continuar con mis estudios, confiando en que el Señor seguirá guiando cada paso. Les pido que me acompañen con sus oraciones, así como yo los tendré muy presentes en las mías.

Si Dios lo permite, nos volveremos a ver pronto...

Frères et sœurs,

En ce troisième dimanche de Pâques, la Parole de Dieu nous invite à ouvrir les yeux et le cœur à la présence du Christ ressuscité dans nos vies.

Dans l'Évangile selon Évangile selon saint Luc, les disciples d'Emmaüs marchent avec Jésus sans le reconnaître. Ils sont tristes, découragés, enfermés dans leurs attentes déçues. Combien de fois cela nous arrive-t-il aussi ? Nous marchons, nous prions, mais nous ne voyons pas que le Seigneur est déjà à nos côtés.

Et pourtant, Jésus s'approche. Il écoute, il explique les Écritures, et surtout, il se fait reconnaître à la fraction du pain. Ce moment est essentiel : c'est dans l'Eucharistie que nos yeux s'ouvrent et que notre cœur brûle.

Dans la première lecture des Actes des Apôtres, Pierre proclame avec force que Jésus est vivant. Lui qui avait eu peur devient courageux, car il a rencontré le Ressuscité. Voilà la transformation que Dieu veut accomplir en chacun de nous.

Le message est clair : le Christ est vivant, il marche avec nous, même quand nous ne le reconnaissons pas. Il se révèle dans la Parole, dans l'Eucharistie, et dans nos frères et sœurs.

Demandons aujourd'hui cette grâce : que nos yeux s'ouvrent, que notre cœur brûle, et que nous devenions, comme les disciples d'Emmaüs, des témoins joyeux de la Résurrection.

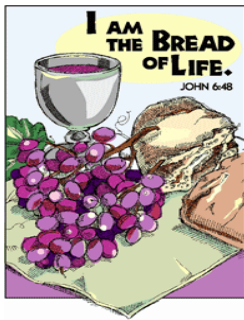
