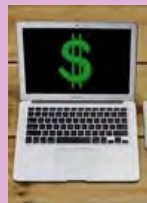

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

With the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, the Christmas season comes to a close and we will continue with so called Ordinary Time. The Child of Bethlehem now steps into the waters of the Jordan, and His public ministry begins. What appears at first to be a simple moment quickly becomes a profound revelation of who Jesus is — and who we are. Jesus comes to John not because He needs repentance, but because He chooses solidarity. He enters the waters alongside sinners, taking His place with humanity in all its brokenness and hope. In doing so, He shows us the heart of God: a God who does not stand at a distance, but who steps into our lives fully and freely.



As Jesus emerges from the water, the heavens open. The Spirit descends like a dove. And the voice of the Father is heard: “This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased.” This is not only a revelation of Jesus’ identity; it is also a revelation of ours. Through our own baptism, we are joined to Christ. What the Father speaks over Jesus, He now speaks over us: You are my beloved. Before we do anything, before we prove ourselves worthy, before we succeed or fail — we are claimed by God’s love.

Baptism is not simply a ritual from the past or a family tradition. It is the foundation of Christian life. It is the moment when we are washed clean, filled with the Holy Spirit, and sent into the world as disciples. Just as Jesus’ baptism marked the beginning of His mission, our baptism marks the beginning of ours. This feast invites us to remember our own baptism — perhaps not the day itself, but the grace that still flows from it. It calls us to renew our commitment to live as God’s beloved children: rejecting sin, choosing holiness, and bearing witness to Christ in our daily lives.

As we leave the Christmas season behind and return to Ordinary Time, the message is clear: the light revealed at Christmas now shines through us. Strengthened by our baptism, may we live with confidence in God’s love and courage in our calling, knowing that we, too, are beloved sons and daughters of the Father.

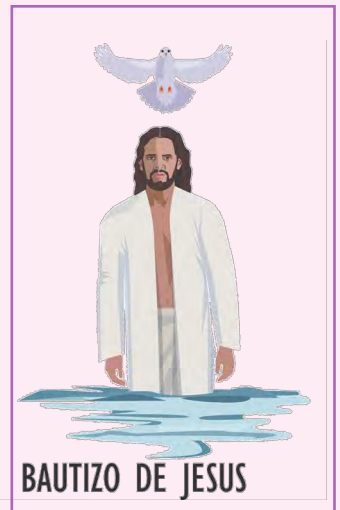

Queridas hermanas y hermanos:

Con la Fiesta del Bautismo del Señor, el tiempo de Navidad llega a su fin continuamos con el llamado Tiempo Ordinario. El Niño de Belén entra ahora en las aguas del Jordán y comienza su ministerio público. Lo que a primera vista parece un momento sencillo se convierte rápidamente en una profunda revelación de quién es Jesús — y de quiénes somos nosotros. Jesús acude a Juan no porque necesite arrepentimiento, sino porque elige la solidaridad. Entra en las aguas junto a los pecadores, tomando su lugar con la humanidad en toda su fragilidad y esperanza. Al hacerlo, nos muestra el corazón de Dios: un Dios que no se mantiene a distancia, sino que entra plenamente y libremente en nuestras vidas.



Cuando Jesús sale del agua, los cielos se abren. El Espíritu desciende como paloma.

Y se oye la voz del Padre: «Este es mi Hijo amado, en quien me complazco». Esto no es solo una revelación de la identidad de Jesús; es también una revelación de la nuestra. Por nuestro propio bautismo, somos unidos a Cristo. Lo que el Padre proclama sobre Jesús, ahora lo proclama sobre nosotros: Tú eres mi hijo amado. Antes de hacer nada, antes de demostrar nuestro valor, antes de tener éxito o fracasar — somos reclamados por el amor de Dios.

El Bautismo no es simplemente un rito del pasado ni una tradición familiar. Es el fundamento de la vida cristiana. Es el momento en que somos purificados, llenos del Espíritu Santo y enviados al mundo como discípulos. Así como el bautismo de Jesús marcó el inicio de su misión, nuestro bautismo marca el comienzo de la nuestra. Esta fiesta nos invita a recordar nuestro propio bautismo — quizá no el día exacto, pero sí la gracia que aún fluye de él. Nos llama a renovar nuestro compromiso de vivir como hijos amados de Dios: rechazando el pecado, eligiendo la santidad y dando testimonio de Cristo en nuestra vida diaria.

Al dejar atrás el tiempo de Navidad y volver al Tiempo Ordinario, el mensaje es claro: la luz revelada en Navidad ahora brilla a través de nosotros. Fortalecidos por nuestro bautismo, vivamos con confianza en el amor de Dios y con valentía en nuestra vocación, sabiendo que también nosotros somos hijos e hijas amados del Padre. Con el cambio de las estaciones, quiero aprovechar la oportunidad para expresar mi sincero agradecimiento a todos ustedes por su apoyo a la parroquia durante todo el año y por su generosidad. Quiero dar gracias a todos los que sirven a la parroquia en cualquier capacidad y en cualquier ministerio: ujieres, monaguillos, lectores, ministros extraordinarios de la Comunión, y a todos los que participan en grupos de oración. Gracias por su ayuda en las tareas de limpieza de nuestros edificios y de los terrenos parroquiales, y por la decoración de la iglesia en las distintas temporadas del año. Agradezco a los coros, y a quienes organizaron las posadas y las representaciones antes de Navidad. Sin toda su ayuda y apoyo, no podríamos realizar el ministerio ni todo lo que sucede en nuestra parroquia. Gracias también por nuestro ministerio de alcance comunitario y por su apoyo al mismo. El Bautismo del Señor: redescubrir nuestro propio bautismo

La Fiesta del Bautismo del Señor marca el inicio de la vida pública de Jesús. Al entrar en las aguas del Jordán, Jesús no se bautiza porque lo necesite, sino para solidarizarse con la humanidad y santificar las aguas. En ese momento se revela el corazón de nuestra fe: el Padre lo proclama Hijo amado, el Espíritu Santo desciende sobre Él y comienza su misión. Este acontecimiento ilumina también nuestro propio bautismo.



El bautismo no es una simple tradición ni un recuerdo del pasado. Es un nuevo nacimiento. Por él nos convertimos en hijos e hijas de Dios, quedamos unidos a Cristo, recibimos el Espíritu Santo y pasamos a formar parte de la Iglesia. Dios nos regala su vida antes incluso de que podamos comprenderla plenamente.

Por eso la Iglesia bautiza también a los niños: porque el bautismo es un don gratuito, no un premio que se gana. Los padres y padrinos asumen el compromiso de educar en la fe para que ese don crezca y, con el tiempo, sea asumido de manera personal y consciente.

Ser bautizado implica una forma concreta de vivir. El cristiano está llamado a caminar como Jesús: hacer el bien, practicar la justicia, vivir desde el amor y la misericordia, sabiendo que es profundamente amado por Dios. Como recuerda el libro de los Hechos, Jesús “pasó haciendo el bien”; ese es también el camino del bautizado.

Celebrar el Bautismo del Señor es una invitación a renovar nuestra identidad cristiana, agradecer el don recibido y vivir con coherencia la fe que un día comenzó en el agua y el Espíritu.

En ce temps, cette fête nous invite à renouveler notre baptême : vivre comme des enfants de Dieu, laisser l'Esprit Saint nous guider, et être, à notre tour, des porteurs de paix, de justice et d'amour autour de nous.
